Why Is The Refrigerant For My Air Conditioner So Expensive? By Sonny Swann, Vice President of Climatic Heating and Cooling

Anyone who has had a repair to their air conditioner recently can be left wondering why it was so expensive. Much of the cost increase can be attributed to the rising cost of the refrigerant, R-22. As a result of the Montreal Protocol and the 1990 Clean Air Act, the EPA has begun to phase out all ozone depleting substances, including R-22. R-22 is commonly called Freon by homeowners. Beginning in 2010, Freon could not be used in new HVAC installations, and it has been replaced by R-410a, commonly called Puron.

How does this affect you? The industry recognized the refrigerant would be needed in the years to come for servicing and repairing and would need to be continued to be produced until 2020. Despite that, the EPA recently proposed an accelerated phase out of R-22 which caused the price to increase by 400% over the past two months. There is still enough R-22 available for your HVAC service company to complete repairs, but those repair bills will be considerably higher. Industry experts are predicting the cost of Freon to continue to rise.

Here are some guidelines on how to act on this information:

If your system is over 10 years old:

This would be a good time to take a proactive look at replacing your system with a more efficient one that uses R-410a.

If your system has R-22 and is operating well:

As long as the system is operating well, you can feel comfortable using it. Your service provider will have R-22 available, but expect higher repair bills.

If your system has R-22 and the compressor fails or you have a refrigerant leak: This is where the cost of repairing an older unit may be counterproductive. Investing in a major repair of a system that uses the older refrigerant can be very costly, in fact, only slightly less expensive than a new system. Many homeowners will benefit in efficiency and cost of ownership by upgrading to a new system at this time.

The Exotic Side of Medicine

When most people think of pets, they envision a cat curled up on a sofa or a dog wagging his tail and playing fetch. In my world, pets are "exotic". Rabbits, guinea pigs, hedgehogs, ferrets, sugar gliders, snakes, lizards, parrots, chickens...the list goes on and on. For many reasons, people are now choosing different types of pets for their family beyond the



mainstream felines and canines. Allergies to feathers and dander have made snakes the optimal pets for some families. For some people living in apartments, a caged pet is more appropriate than one that free roams the house. Some people move frequently and need pets that are easy to transport. And for some, it is just what feels right. If you haven't owned an exotic pet, it may be hard to understand why someone loves their turtle, snake, or hamster. Perhaps I can shed some light.

Exotic animals and birds are full of personality. You just have to know how to read them. Rabbits for example, can be frisky, playful and fun. A dominant rabbit expects to be petted on the head or groomed on the head by the mate. A happy rabbit may jump sideways ("Boing") or purr. Often when I discuss nutrition and diet with rabbit owners we have to discuss backing off on over feeding treats like carrots or fruit. But I have to warn my clients, they may have to deal with some tantrums from their fuzzy friend. Foot stomping, turning their butt towards the owner, knocking over empty dishes may all be signs of an angry rabbit that isn't getting his or her way.

Emotional outbursts are not limited to the exotic mammals. Turtles will beg for treats and give the cold shoulder if not getting what they want. I once had a client tell me that any time her iguana heard my voice on the answering machine, he would get very upset, get dark in color and high tail out of the room. A client with an African Grey Parrot would tell me stories of the bird calling the dog over using his voice and laughing when the dog came. Now that's a sense of humor! Another parrot would purposely drop food for the dog to eat so he would come on over.

If you are thinking that you may want to consider adopting a bird or an exotic animal for yourself or a young family member, you do want to make sure you do your research on proper diet and housing. Even the smallest of pets have specific needs to keep them healthy. I will highlight a few pets in this article and focus on specific husbandry needs.

Rabbits are very popular and make great family pets. They are interactive, entertaining, and can be very affectionate. Small breed rabbits can live 10-15 years so there is a commitment once you adopt one of these critters. Larger breeds tend to have a life span of 5-7 years. If you are considering a bunny, I do recommend visiting one of the many rescue groups rather than pet stores since there are so many that need good homes. Often, you can adopt a spayed male or female or a bonded pair of bunnies from the rescue groups.

Proper housing is really important for rabbits. Even rabbits that receive plenty of exercise and free roam should have a cage setup and be supervised whenever they are out of the cage. The cage itself should be appropriately sized for the size of the rabbit. The cage bottom should not be wire or mesh which can cause foot injuries but rather a plastic base. Substrates (litter) that can be used include recycled paper pulp, shredded newspaper, or pressed paper pellets. Avoid shavings like pine, aspen, and cedar to reduce risk of respiratory infections, allergies, and the absorption of toxic compounds—which is a specific concern with cedar shavings. Clay cat litter should never be used as it would be dangerous if ingested and can be very irritating to the rabbit's skin.



Diet is a critical aspect of rabbit health. A fresh water bowl or bottle of water should be provided daily, and the mainstay of the food is good quality hay like timothy hay or orchard grass. This should be free fed, meaning available all of the time. A small quantity of timothy hay based pellets can be offered along with a cup or two of greens. Romaine lettuce, or Boston lettuce are some of the better choices of greens. A few hours a day of exercise is helpful for the health and happiness of the rabbits.

Yearly vet visits to check the bunny's teeth, weight, and overall health, are part of bunny care and maintenance. Yearly bloodwork and fecal exams are also highly recommended. Common rabbit ailments that need veterinary care include respiratory infections, overgrown teeth, GI stasis, loose stools or diarrhea, urinary tract infections and ear infections.





Another popular exotic pet is the budgerigar, aka budgie, or parakeet. These little colorful birds can be found in pet stores, purchased from private breeders, or adopted from bird rescue groups. The original budgie is native to Australia and the wild colors are green with some yellow and black stripes on the head and markings on the wings. Breeders have created a variety of color morphs along with a slightly larger version usually referred to as the English Budgie. On average, budgies can live 5-to 7 years but sometimes well into their teens.

Budgies should be housed in cages of appropriate size for small birds. The cage bars must be fairly close together to make sure they cannot get their head through the bars. When housing any bird, you want a cage that is larger horizontally rather than vertically and it is at least 2.5x the wing span of the bird. I recommend using newspaper or paper towels as the substrate at the bottom of the cage and avoid shavings, walnut shells and corn cob. These types of substrates can predispose the birds to respiratory

and intestinal infections.

Once again, diet and proper nutrition is critical for good health. Providing fresh water daily is very important and the food and water dishes should be washed daily. Many budgies are on a seed diet but ideally should be receiving a formulated pelleted diet that is balanced in protein, vitamins and minerals. A little fresh greens and millet can be given as treats as well. Please discuss any food and diet recommendations with your vet prior to making the changes at home.

These little birds can benefit from veterinary care as well. Yearly exams and fecal checks are part of routine care. A one time test for a bacterial infection called Psittacosis is recommended since this is a bacterium that can transmit to humans. Common medical ailments of budgies include respiratory infections, intestinal infections, traumatic injuries, tumors, and malnutrition. In general, these birds can live from five to 10 years but have been known to live well into their teens.





Easy to Make Dessert for Mother's Day



WHITE CHOCOLATE MOUSSE PIE

Ingredients

CRUST

13 chocolate cream-filled sandwich cookies, ground (such as Oreo)
3 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted
17 oval vanilla-and-chocolate sandwich cookies (such as Pepperidge Farm Milano)

FILLING

1-1/4 teaspoons unflavored gelatin
1-1/4 cups heavy cream
4 ounces cream cheese, softened
12 ounces white chocolate, chopped

Directions

CRUST ~ Set aside 1 tbsp of ground chocolate cookies for garnish. Stir together remaining ground cookies and butter in bowl until combined. Press mixture evenly over bottom of 9-inch pie plate. Arrange oval cookies around edge of pie plate, alternating with vanilla and chocolate facing out.

FILLING ~ In small glass measuring cup, sprinkle gelatin over 1/4 cup of cream. Let stand 5 mins to soften. Combine cream cheese, white chocolate and gelatin mixture in small saucepan. Heat over medium-low heat for 6 mins, stirring until smooth. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla. Pour into large bowl; place over ice bath. Stir until thickened and cooled. Whip remaining 1 cup heavy cream in a large bowl until soft peaks form. Fold a third of the whipped cream into white chocolate mixture until well-combined. Gently fold in remaining whipped cream until blended. Spoon mixture into prepared crust and refrigerate at least 3 hours or overnight. GARNISH ~ Before serving mound whipped topping in center of pie. Sprinkle with berries and reserved cookie crumbs.

GARNISH

1 pint strawberries, hulled and halved 2 cups frozen whipped topping (such as Cool Whip), thawed

Pool Season is Coming Up... Do You Know Where Your Pool Passes Are?

It's time to start looking in the bottom of your pool bag or maybe in the drawer with the swimsuits for your Broadlands Photo ID pool passes. Everyone aged 5 and up who wishes to gain admission to the pools will need one. If you are an owner and have the pool passes you used last year, you do not need to reapply. We will electronically reactivate them. If you cannot find your passes, new ones can be issued free of charge prior to the opening of the pool on May 26, 2012. After the pool opens, replacement cards are \$5.00 each. If you want a new picture for your replacement pass there is a charge of \$7.00 regardless of when the pass is issued.

New Residents, must fill out an application, return it to the Nature Center and have your photos taken. Applications are available at the Nature Center, in this newsletter on page 29, or online at www. broadlandshoa.org. Click on Pool Information in the Directory on the left hand side of the home page. Pool passes are issued to each individual age 5 and up living in the household. A household consists of all persons **permanently** living in the dwelling, including live-in caretakers and any unmarried children who are students and/or from a previous marriage and who will be residing with the owner for the summer.



<u>Tenants</u> must also apply for pool membership. <u>The owner and tenant must complete a Tenant Membership application for the 2012 season even if the tenants were members in 2011.</u> Tenants may use the passes they have, but they will not be activated until an application is received at the HOA office. Applications are available at the Nature Center, in this newsletter on page 30, and online at www.broadlandshoa.org.

Residents If any of your children have turned five since last summer or will be five by June 1, 2012, they must have a picture taken and a pass made. Please use the resident application form on page 29 and return it to the Nature Center to add them to your family data base. Any individual who has turned 18 since last pool season will need a new adult card made as well.

Beginning April 2nd, pictures will be taken at the Nature Center from 9 am to 5 pm Monday through Friday on a first-come, first-served basis. Additionally, the Nature Center will be open for photographs on **May 6**th **and May 12**th **from 10:00a.m. to 2:00p.m. and on**

May 17th from 6:00p.m. to 9:00p.m.

Prior to having the photo taken, all adults 18 and up must show a photo ID and proof of address.

Photos will not be taken if acceptable proof of identity and address are not available.

Acceptable photo IDs include:

- Driver's License
- School, Military or Work Photo ID
- State Issued Non-Driver Photo ID
- Current Passport
- Current Resident Alien Photo ID

Acceptable Proof of Address include:

- Payroll Stub issued within the last 60 days
- 2011 W-2 or 1099
- Original Bank Statement issued within the last 60 days
- Utility bill issued within the last 60 days
- Current Virginia Voter Registration Card
- Settlement Papers or Deed
- Current Homeowners Insurance Policy



Non-resident caregivers are able to obtain a pass for \$40 for the season. They should be noted as non-resident caregivers on the resident's application. The fee must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the care giver to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Up to 5 long term house guests may obtain pool passes for \$40 per person for the season or \$15 per person for a month (30 consecutive days) or \$5 per person for seven consecutive days. They must be noted as non-resident house guests on the resident's application. The fees must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the guests to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Ten guest passes are allocated to each <u>residence</u>. Additional guest passes, good for 10 visits may be purchased for \$20. Guest passes are added to the electronic account. No physical pass will be issued. Guests must be accompanied by a pool pass holder to gain admittance to the pool facility.


