Please Secure Your Trash on Windy Days

Please be sure to bind newspapers with twine or place loose papers in paper bags

before setting out at your curb. Weigh down your bottles, plastics and cans by placing heavier recyclables on top. Ensure that the lid of your trash can is tightly secured. Put smaller lightweight bags of trash together in a larger heavyweight bag. Don't put trash out early and PLEASE no loose "peanuts" or other packing materials. Lastly, if the trash does blow over, or you see a bin out of place, please pick it up even if it isn't yours. Your HOA assessment provides for curbside trash



removal. There is no budgeted amount for litter removal. The Association relies on homeowners to keep their neighborhoods free of litter and their assessments reasonable.

NEED A MORE SECURE RECYCLING BIN?

Residents who currently have the smaller, open recycling bin through Patriot may swap out for the larger, lidded recycling toter at no additional cost. Please contact Patriot Disposal at 703-257-7100 to make this request. You are encouraged to keep a record of the serial number of your toter(s) should you need to identify it in the future.

SAVE YOURSELF TIME, MONEYANDAGGRAVATION

Before you make any modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the owner's responsibility to file an application for all exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this requirement. The process is easy if you apply before work commences.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee of up to \$900, which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made. You may be taken to General District Court for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which you provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines on the website for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in order to obtain approval prior to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions. COVENANTS CORNER

During the month of October, the Inspectors will be focusing on homes with basketball goals, hockey nets, soccer goals, and other play equipment in the VDOT right of way or with play situated in the street. Play equipment in unsafe locations will not be permitted.

Basketball is a fabulous sport for kids! It increases aerobic capacity, improves agility, builds confidence and teaches team building skills. However, the Association does not endorse playing in the streets, nor can it approve the location of play equipment that encourages play on the streets. This is for the safety of the players as well as drivers. Streets are designed for vehicular traffic.

Prior to installing a portable basketball net, an application must be submitted to the Modifications Subcommittee. There are also specific guidelines as to the location where the net can be placed. Nets may not be placed in the VDOT right of way - which extends approximately 10 feet (measured from the curb towards your home) from the street towards your home, but not less than the length of the driveway apron. They also may not be located on the sidewalk, on the street, or on the manhole covers over the storm water drains. On private streets basketball goals must be located above the driveway apron. The same goes for hockey and soccer nets or other types of play equipment.

Additionally, basketball goals must be stabilized by filling the base with water or sand or by staking the base to the ground according to the manufacturer's direction. Using cinder blocks or bagged sand is not an acceptable method of stabilizing.

If the topography of your lot precludes the approved installation of a portable goal, remember there are facilities available to play at the Nature Center, the Southern Walk Pool, Eagle Ridge Middle School, Hillside Elementary School and Mill Run Elementary.

Please reference Virginia Code 46.2-932-Playing on highways:

No person shall play on a highway, other than on the sidewalks thereof... or on any part of a highway... designated... exclusively for vehicular travel.

If a violation is noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing thirty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent.

If you have questions regarding this process, or if you receive one of these letters and are unable to correct in the time allotted, you may contact the covenants inspectors at covenants@broadlandshoa.com to request a reasonable extension to rectify the issue.

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors inspect the homes in the community for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in view to parking issues and unapproved modifications to leftover holiday decor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular violations that occur with high frequency.

ALL ABOUT PLATS

What is a Plat? Why is it Required For a Modifications Submission?

A plat is a survey of a piece of land to identify boundaries, easements, flood zones, roadway, and access rights of way. Most improvements require a "Property Plat/Site Plan" to be submitted with a modification application form for subcommittee review prior to commencement of the project. The plat shows the configuration of the lot, including the property dimensions, any easements, and building restrictions. You should have received a legal size document of your plat at the time of your settlement. Please include a copy of the original plat when submitting your modification documentation to the HOA.

What is the purpose of the plat? All architectural improvements must be drawn on the plat to show the location of your project such as a deck, patio, screened-in porch, play equipment, etc. The plat assists the Modifications Subcommittee in understanding the project and its impact on your property and adjoining properties.

If you cannot locate your plat, contact your Settlement Company or a local land surveyor. In some instances, the Broadlands Homeowners Association office has copies of plats from prior application submissions.

All exterior home improvements require review and approval from the Modifications Subcommittee prior to starting a project. It is beneficial for you to review the specific guidelines pertaining to the planned modification before getting estimates or meeting with contractors. This ensures that you are familiar with any restrictions pertaining to the proposed project and can disclose them to the contractor as needed.

FROM CHAIRMAN YORK

Waterside Will Spur Economic Growth Scott York, Chairman – Loudoun County Board of Supervisors

At the first meeting of the Board of Supervisors in September, we approved the Waterside development proposal. Waterside will give the County a vibrant mixed-use development that will by a catalyst for future economic development along the southern Route 28 corridor and help Loudoun realize the financial benefits of the Metrorail Silver Line.

Waterside was brought forward by Chantilly Crushed Stone, which owns a quarry on the eastern end of the Broad Run District. The site is located east of Route 28. both north and south of Route 606. The approved application will rezone their 335 acre property to create a five million square foot, mixed-use town center development. The centerpiece of the development proposal is to fill in the current 54 acre quarry to create a lake. I think this is a great re-use of an industrial site that will significantly raise the quality of development in this important entrance corridor to Loudoun County.

In terms of specific numbers, there will be 2.5 million square feet of office, 500,000 square feet of retail and 175 hotel rooms when the development is fully built out. The approved application includes approximately 2,600 multifamily residential units, with 395 of them designated as an age restricted community for persons over 55, which has far less of an impact on issues like traffic and schools. Because the quarry needs to be reclaimed and filled with water, residential development will not take place for at least five years.

Impacts to public services like schools are always a concern I have with development proposals. In addition to



being a highly tax positive development for the County; the nature of this type of transit-oriented mixed-use has much less of an impact on services like schools compared with traditional suburban development while delivering substantial economic development benefits. Additionally, as part of this development approval, the County received a public use site north of Route 606 that will be the location of a new fire and rescue station and could accommodate an elementary school if it's needed in the future.

In addition to school impacts, I know many are concerned about traffic. Waterside will build major roadway improvements, including completion of Davis Drive from Sterling Boulevard to Innovation Avenue (which can line up with a future bridge over the Toll Road to Fairfax County), widening Route 606 and widening and constructing new portions of Shaw Road.

The main reason the Board of Supervisors approved this development was its location close to the future Innovation Center Metrorail station. Last year, the County received recommendations from the Urban Land Institute on the key planning considerations in the areas proximate to the Metrorail Silver Line stations. Their recommendations called for Loudoun to encourage highvalue mixed use development that will create a sense of 'identity' around both Metrorail stations in the county, which is precisely what the Waterside development will do.

As part of the County's land-use planning process for Metrorail, we have received significant community feedback that this is exactly the type of development Loudoun residents want in this area. This Board of Supervisors has worked to channel future development into the right areas such as the Metrorail corridor while implementing an aggressive plan to 'catch-up' on infrastructure like roads and schools.

As many of you already know, Supervisor Shawn Williams resigned in September due to personal issues. I am grateful to Supervisor Williams for his service to the County and to the Broad Run District, and I would ask you to keep him and his family in your thoughts and prayers at this difficult time.

I want to assure you that the Board of Supervisors has a plan to make sure you continue to receive capable representation. At the time of writing this article, we are currently in the process of identifying and appointing the right individual to serve as the Broad Run District Supervisor through the end of December. On January 1, 2016, the winner of the November general election will take office.

Without drones. Because I don't have a drone. But I know some of you, my neighbors, do have drones as they fly around my home (and we chase them like we do the ends of rainbows...never able to figure out where they land). I would like to borrow your drone. For professional reasons, of course.

As the drone was lacking, I just had to stealthily sneak in with my camo jacket and forest green hat (that some other of you neighbors have taken to calling the Castro). "I may have borrowed some copies of their newsletters and calendars because I want to know what classes they offer that I want to offer since none of you have sent me an email saying what classes you want.

I'm disgruntled. I've got this giant menagerie of animal life and a huge backyard, and I don't know what to do with it. Well, come camping. Come camping October 9th for Night at the Nature Center.

So what follows are some ideas. I would teach or hire out to teach all of these classes if I saw a wee bit of interest. And by showing interest I mean sending me an email--my telepathic powers are running low.

The grand ideas (mostly borrowed from other--less fantastic, yet more established and class offering--nature centers)

For Littles and Middles

1. Wee Beasties- This is a weekly class for ages 5-10. Each week you bring home a new wee beastie (a hissing cockroach, crickets, snails...) we gather to learn how to care for each of the pets, and to share the stories of their care. 2. Geocaching. Family events. Kid events. Hidden treasures abound.

3. Babes in the Woods--hikes with a naturalist for parents who wear babies and are ready to explore some paths. Ages are obviously a tiny and a tall person.

4. Mythical creatures at the Nature Center--Basilisks, dragons, cyclops, Loch Ness Monster, Saskwatch, centaurs, chimeras, griffins, golems, unicorns, etc. are all descended from other animals we know. Learn the best guess we have of their biological family trees and the legends that surround them.

Two classes. One for littles (5+) and one for middles (10+)

5. Homeschooling at the nature center. We have a few groups that have said they are interested in doing a consistent science curriculum at our center. If you would like to hear the dates and times being considered please contact me.

6. Fiery science--an afterschool club where we explode things. And learn why they explode.

Two classes. One for littles (5+) and one for middles (10+)

7. Youth Naturalists. This already exists. But just to let you know, you can still join. It is for kids 8-18 (roughly we have a few 6-year olds and two 18+) we

take you if you want to serve our animals and go on a nature adventure once a month.

8. Campfire Storytelling. With help from our local speech and debate teams from the high schools. All ages

9. Nature Storytime. Ha! We already have this. It's the Fort Festival Mondays 9:30-10:15am and Tuesdays 1:30-2:15pm.

For Mature-ittles (not sure an age, more of just who is interested)

1. Primitive skills: Tracking, food foraging, bow and arrow creating, rescue shelter constructing- All ages. But offered in evenings or weekends so adults could take part (for safety and for knowledge)

2. Learning the skills of beekeepers (and taking part in the care of a hive and production of honey and wax when we get to that time)

3. Falconry. What is required to become a falconer? How to become an apprentice and meet our master falconer who rehabilitates injured eagles, hawks, and falcons.--All ages, but 12 is the minimum age of becoming a falconer as per Virginia wildlife law.

And then a few clubs that we could generate a local chapter for:

1. Northern Virginia Astronomical Society

2. Birding groups

3. Monthly hiking pack of nature nuts who like sore feet

4. Reading group (but of course our meetings will be by a campfire and our books will have at least some loose theme to nature. Like *Vampires in the Lemon Grove* and then we'll buy a lemon tree for the nature center).

ABOUT YOUR PET...

What Could Be Behind That Senior Slow Down? By: Shannon M. Pecora, MA of Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

The senior pet slow-down -- this isn't prescription diets, or pain medications

necessarily just benign "aging." It's easy to ascribe reduced mobility/ activity level to a calendar figure, but the truth is that old age itself is not a disease. No, we don't expect puppy or kitten playfulness out of a senior pet; however, our goal is to help your best bud stay comfortable and happy during those geriatric years. Let's look at three example causes for decreased mobility and what we may be able to do to help:

1. Fatigue - There may be a direct correlation between aging and reduced energy. Again, this doesn't make old age a disease, but age is part of a pet's signalment, or physical characteristics that we, your veterinary team, can use to point us toward likely health concerns. We consider pet signalment and the lifestyle information you provide when we make certain recommendations. The senior pet body varies greatly from the juvenile pet body, and we can work with you to find a diet that can meet your pet's energy needs and activities that can provide safe exercise opportunities.

2. Osteoarthritis - This chronic degenerative joint disease really starts to set in and cause problems as pets age. Often, our pets silently suffer through OA; they'll simply move more gingerly than previously and attempt to reduce movement in general in order to avoid the pain and stiffness. You may notice that your pet pants or whines more often, and he may be more restless and unable to find comfortable resting positions. But even in the absence of noticeable vocal complaint, arthritis pain is not something to ignore. If veterinary diagnostics reveal that your pet is truly arthritic, supplements,



may help, and again, your veterinary team can help you determine the best fit for your best friend. Because certain products can affect organs such as the kidney and liver, you should be aware that regular blood tests may be needed to ensure that the medications aren't causing more harm than good. For those of you whose pets are still juveniles or young adults, don't forget to ask about your pet's risks, too! There may be diets or supplements recommended as preventive measures to hold OA at bay for as long as possible.

3. Cognitive Dysfunction - You can think of this as senility, which unfortunately can develop in any senior pet. It might start with seemingly minor signs: restlessness at night, decreasing interest in play time, changes in eating routines. But as it progresses, it may seem like your pet really can't remember which corner of the room his bed is in or what area of the kitchen her water bowl is in. Some pets will begin to then give up. If he can't find his bed, he'll stop looking for it and lay wherever he happens to be. If she can't find her water bowl, she'll "bother" you instead of searching for the bowl. They may begin to do whatever they can to immediately alleviate a need, including regression from housetraining, rather

than wandering around, unable to find the previously-established solution. This may manifest in a day spent sitting or lying in one place because the pet doesn't know what else to do. In other words, she has slowed down and reduced her mobility because her brain isn't functioning to give her everyday life directives. Catching this degenerative process early is preferable, of course, so we can help

you find foods, supplements, and mental stimulus aimed at reducing the negative effects. However, even in advanced stages, cognitive dysfunction can be treated with products to reduce some of the anxiety, confusion, incontinence, and other related issues.

So, what are some of the symptoms that signal mobility trouble? Look for your pet to:

- move more slowly in general
- limp
- chew or lick a certain joint or area
- weight gain (with reduced movement)
- lose weight (if he won't get up or search for his food)
- regress in continence/housetraining
- whine, cry, and/or pant
- have difficulty sleeping
- lose interest in playing, going for walks, and spending time with the family in general

If you notice any of these signs, or if you'd just like a discussion personalized to your pet, contact your veterinary office. Remember, old age is not a disease! Work with your pet's health care team to make your pet's golden years as truly golden as possible!

PARKING

We would like to take this opportunity to remind residents of some of the parking rules and regulations governing our community. A complete version of the parking regulations is available on the website at www.broadlandshoa. org under For Residents>Rules and Regulations.

Following are general restrictions on the parking and storage of vehicles. These rules are applicable to common areas, common area parking lots, private streets, and roadways. For VDOT maintained roads, specific restrictions can be found in the Loudoun County Codified Ordinances.

Prohibited Vehicles

The following are examples of the types of vehicles that are **prohibited** in open view of residential property (including vehicles parked in an open garage), on residential streets, and on any open space or other common area in the association, except for authorized association owned or contracted vehicles.

- 1. Recreational vehicles including boats, jet skis, rafts or inflatables, motor homes, mobile homes, campers, and trailers.
- Commercial vehicles including any vehicle that is defined in a State Code or County Ordinance as commercial, vehicles with exterior racks or compartments, private or public school or church bus.
 *Passenger vehicles, pick-up trucks not exceeding ½ ton, or passenger vans having the name of the business written on the front doors in an area not exceeding two square feet are permitted.
- 3. Motorized vehicles other than

Association or Association contracted vehicles are not permitted on the trails or Common Areas within the community.

4. Junk or derelict vehicles, including vehicles that do not display valid state license plates/registration, current state inspection sticker, vehicles missing any necessary parts, such as tires, wheels, engines, door, truck, hood, wrecked or smashed body parts, etc. that are necessary for the operation of the vehicle, and vehicles with flat tires.

Parking Regulations

The following regulations exist with regards to the parking of vehicles.

- Vehicles shall not obstruct the safe, free-flow of moving vehicular traffic or other vehicles or pedestrians into or out of parking spaces on Public Streets, or Private Roads.
- 2. No vehicle shall be parked in violation of any posted sign.
- 3. All vehicles shall be parked wholly within space lines, as applicable.
- 4. No vehicle shall be parked on any grassy or landscaped area.
- 5. Vehicles may not be parked within 10 feet on either side of a mailbox.
- 6. No vehicle may be parked in a manner which blocks any portion of a sidewalk. Even partial obstruction of the sidewalk is considered obstruction and is prohibited.
- 7. No vehicle may be parked in a fire lane. Even partial obstruction of the fire lane is considered obstruction and is prohibited.

Enforcement

Vehicles parked in violation of state and local laws or HOA parking regulations are subject to ticketing, towing or other enforcement as provided by applicable State and County law or the parking resolution. The Sheriffs Department has full authority to patrol, ticket, and tow on both public and private roads within Broadlands.

Additionally, any vehicle parked on private roadways and parking lots maintained by Broadlands Association, Inc. in violation of these rules may be issued a Violation Notice by the Association or the authorized towing contractor. If the violation is not remedied, the vehicle may be towed at the sole expense and liability of the owner. Violation notices may be posted on the vehicle if the vehicle is parked in a common area or mailed to the lot owner if a vehicle is parked on a homeowner lot.

Any vehicle parked in a fire lane or which blocks the sidewalk may be towed **without warning**. A vehicle will be considered to have been parked in a fire lane when any portion of the vehicle overhangs or blocks any portion of a fire lane. A vehicle will be considered to be blocking a sidewalk when any portion of the vehicle overhangs or blocks any portion of a sidewalk.

GETTING TO KNOW YOUR NEIGHBORS

Jill McCabe; The (Inspiring) Girl Next Door

If you didn't know better you might think Jill McCabe is just like any other Broadlands mom. She cheers on her kids at swim meets, she takes daily jogs around the neighborhood and she is often seen shuttling off to work in the wee hours of the morning with coffee in hand. What you might not know is that Jill is an exceptionally accomplished physician who serves as Medical Director of four departments at Inova Loudoun Hospital, including the Pediatric ER. Outside of work, Jill is an endurance athlete who competes

in triathlons, "Century" 100 mile bike races and other grueling athletic competitions. She is also a regular volunteer at her children's school.

Jill's calm demeanor belies an inner strength that fuels her intense desire to do whatever she can to help others. Although she does so much to help our community already, Jill says she is ready to do more. Jill recently decided to run for a seat

on the Virginia state Senate representing Loudoun and Prince William Counties. If all goes according to plan, this November 3rd, our 'girl next door' will become a Virginia State Senator.

Jill's commitment to service began at age 5 when she decided she wanted to grow up to become a doctor. She followed through on that dream and attended Duke University for undergrad and medical school. She chose to specialize in pediatrics because she loves helping children. Before moving to Virginia, Jill was running a thriving pediatrics practice in the New York City metro area. Then September 11th happened. Jill and her husband of 20 years, Andrew McCabe, were deeply affected by 9/11. They

lost friends, colleagues and patients in the attacks. Andrew, an FBI agent, decided to focus his career on doing everything he could to prevent another terrorist attack. In 2006 he accepted a post in International Counterterrorism at FBI Headquarters. Out of respect for the importance of her husband's new role, Jill left her medical practice (with a few tears) and the McCabes relocated to Virginia. Since then, Andrew has risen through the ranks of the FBI and he now serves as Associate Deputy Director.

Through her political campaigning, Jill has had an opportunity to meet many of her neighbors. Jill says that knocking on doors and shaking hands is her favorite part of the political process. She even had a chance to use her medical skills recently while going door to door to campaign. Jill knocked on one door which was answered by a mom with a little boy who had a swollen knee. When Jill inquired about the boy's condition, the mother said she thought her son had a bad sprain. Jill suggested

> that the child get tested for Lyme disease. A few days later the mom posted a grateful note to Jill on Facebook her son's Lyme test had

come back positive.

Sometimes Broadlands neighbors come knocking on Jill's door. Every so often, she says, a concerned parent comes over to the McCabe's house late at night or on the weekend to ask Jill's opinion about their sick child. "I never mind

room wall as a daily reminder of their commitment to service.

Jill thought the family would stay in Virginia for a year or two but once they moved to Broadlands, they fell in love with the community. Nine years later, they are still here. "I really like living here," Jill says. "It's safe, there are lots of green spaces, most houses back to trees, people here are engaged in the political process...it's truly an idyllic community." Family time is also a priority for the McCabes. They eat dinner together most nights and they reserve Sunday afternoons for time with Maggie and George and their friends.
