The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling

"Take 2 pets and call me in the morning"

"I think dogs are the most amazing creatures; they give unconditional love. For me, they are the role model for being alive." - Gilda Radner

With all the stress of the economy, a war overseas, a lousy housing and job market, bills to pay, and oil disasters, it's nice to know that a pet can help take your mind off of all that. In fact, research now seems to confirm what most of us pet owners have known for years – that pets make us feel good!

Recent studies have demonstrated the healthful benefits of having pets. One study showed that people watching movies with dogs in them had significantly lower levels of cortisol, the "stress" hormone, right after watching the show. One study by an animal behaviorist measured that oxytocin, a "feel-good" neurotransmitter in the brain, increased merely by petting a dog. Another amazing study involved Alzheimer's patients. They often lose interest in eating, yet in 2002, the placement of live fish in fishbowls on the dining room tables of nursing facilities seemed to correlate with an increase in appetite.

Furthermore, dogs not only make us feel good, but they also encourage us to move around and exercise (good for the heart of course), while a 2008 study concluded that cat owners are 40% less likely to suffer from a heart attack than those without one. And at the Mayo Clinic in Minnesota, oncologists have begun "prescribing" pets to people to aid in their treatment. So in these rough times, I hope you take solace from the fact that your four-legged friend is not only a companion, but in many ways a bit of a lifesaver.



"Bumps" in the Road By Shannon M. Pecora, M.A. Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

Recently, while giving one of my dogs his daily tummy rub, I noticed a small lump on his chest. As he is almost twelve years old, I wasn't entirely surprised, but I will admit to a small surge of panic. This is one of my furry babies, after all, and I just discovered something that could be a simple "old dog" fatty mass or scary cancerous tumor.

Many pet owners can relate to this scenario, and it's not just older pets who develop lumps. Masses are pretty non-discriminatory, and they can crop up for a myriad of reasons. Allergies, hair follicle inflammation, insect bites, bacterial infection, viruses and cancers can all create lumps and bumps. Some masses may simply "go away" and resolve on their own, some can be drained, some can be treated with medications or creams and some will require surgical intervention. The problem is that you can never be quite sure which of these will be the case without a full work-up by your veterinarian.

So what should you do if you find a lump on your pet? First, make sound note of its location, size, feel and appearance. With long- or thick-coated pets, it can be helpful to trim or shave the area. This information and marking will aid you when you make an appointment with the vet. You'll be able to find the mass more easily to show the doctor, and, especially if a few days pass before your appointment, you can track any growth or changes. However, we do recommend an exam as soon as possible when you first notice a lump. And if you see that the lump is bleeding, ulcerated, oozing, painful or rapidly growing, it may be considered an emergency.

The vet will likely want to sample the mass, for example via needle aspirate or biopsy, or even schedule surgery to remove the mass altogether. The goal is to obtain a sample of cells or tissue to help identify the type of mass. Under the majority of circumstances, it is virtually impossible to identify a mass with 100 percent certainty using only sight or feel. Sometimes technicians and doctors can view the sampled cells under a microscope and tell what they are dealing with. They may also choose to send the cells or tissue to a pathologist at an outside lab to help them make a diagnosis. Though surgical removal can offer a sense of relief that the lump is "gone," we still recommend that removed masses be sent out to these pathologists. Particularly if the mass turns out to be cancerous, there is the chance that it could return, and with a firm diagnosis, we can develop a treatment plan as needed.

When I had my dog's mass aspirated, thankfully it turned out to be a lipoma, or a benign fatty mass. Though it wasn't necessarily dangerous or bothersome, I opted to have it removed during a dental cleaning that same month. There is a chance that non-cancerous masses can continue to grow until they inhibit day-to-day life; depending on where the mass develops, a pet can experience trouble moving around or even just sitting or laying down comfortably. I decided it would be best to remove my dog's mass before it got to that point. He recovered wonderfully, and, though I could have safely waited a while for diagnosis and treatment, taking care of it right away gives me peace of mind in regard to my fuzzy buddy's health.

Where Does Our Water Go?

Water seems to be everywhere and abundant, but is it? Due to rapid urban development, our water is running off at an alarming rate. The result of the run off is higher sediment in our drinking water and stream erosion often contaminated by contributing run off from our gardens. Protecting natural areas is critical to our future drinking water quality.

Wherever development occurs, there is loss of permeable ground. Instead of water seeping into the ground and filling the underground aquifers (which are underground beds or layers of permeable rock, sediment or soils that yield water), the water runs rapidly off. The amount of water moving through the streams is more than the capacity of the stream bed. Often developers remove the natural streamside filters (or buffers), which are the mature trees, shrubs and grasses, resulting in high flow rates during storms. Sediment, herbicides, pesticides and fertilizers, in addition to any other debris that is caught up with the flowing water, fill up the streams and ultimately cause high rates of erosion in the streams.

This polluted water moves through our watershed. A watershed is the area of land where all of the water that is under it or drains off of it goes into the same place (EPA definition). This water is often stored in reservoirs or goes to the rivers. Broadlands run off goes to the Potomac and then onto the Chesapeake Bay. The more sediment and pollutants in the water, the more it has to be processed and the higher the cost of our water.

You might wonder what you can do to help. Fortunately for you, you live in Broadlands, a community that is aware of its part in preserving the natural areas. Each homeowner, though, can consider using only environmentally safe products on their lawn and garden, and water only when absolutely necessary and not so much that water is running down the road. Consider putting in a rain garden for the more swampy areas of your gardens and rain barrels to hold water in your garden for use in times of drought, washing your car or watering your house plants.

Awareness, concern and action are needed by everyone to ensure that we will have clean and safe drinking water in our future. Please check out the following links to see what you can do to be part of the solution.



Ear Wax Wieners - Appetizer

Toothpicks Cotton balls

Melt butter in small pan over low heat. Place franks on broiling pan and carefully brush with melted butter. Broil franks until evenly browned, turning 2 or 3 times. 

Women on Weights: Separating Fact from Fiction

As a Personal Trainer I hear many concerns from prospective clients about starting an exercise program. With 90% of women that I meet, I will hear the following, "I want to workout, but I don't want to get huge".

Fitness Myth: Basic weight training will turn you into Arnold Schwarzenegger.

There are a couple of components to look at when considering this concept. First, basic anatomy, men and women respond differently to similar stimulus due to a difference in testosterone. While all women have slightly different ratios of testosterone to estrogen, women in general do not have enough testosterone to create muscles of the gods through basic weight training.

I can hear some of you correcting me already as you may have muscular calves or shoulders or quads. This takes me to the second consideration, DNA. We are all designed by our specific genetic make-up. DNA tells our body where to distribute different types of muscle fibers and how much of each type. Wrapped up in DNA is body type. There are three basic body types: mesomorphs are muscular and tend to have large bones, endomorphs are round and may be described as curvy, ectomorphs are long and lean. Some people don't fit neatly into one type, but are a combination. Body type and DNA can predispose a person to certain muscular traits, i.e. mesomorphs tend to build muscle easily; ectomorphs have a hard time gaining muscle.

Based on this knowledge, a trained professional can develop a program that is right for your body type and meets your goals. No two people are exactly alike, so that means that we cannot expect a cookie cutter workout to fulfill every woman's needs. So, our mesomorph girlfriend would want to focus on moderate weight and higher repetition to counteract her predisposition to gain muscle too quickly, while our ectomorph sister will want to lift heavier weights with lower repetition.

Due to a fear of "bulking up" or maybe just a fear of the weight room, many women forgo weights and trek it on cardio equipment alone. Cardiovascular training is wonderful and very necessary, but consider this...

Weight Training

- strengthens bones and reduces risk of osteoporosis
- reduces risk of low back injury
- improves balance and coordination
- boosts mood and reduces depression
- increases metabolism=burning more calories/day
- decreases cholesterol and lowers blood pressure

Before beginning a weight training routine, meet with a personal trainer or exercise professional. It is worth it to get set up on the equipment properly and most trainers will design a program for your specific needs in mind. Many gyms offer one free session, so ask your club and take advantage of the opportunity. Remember to start slowly and progress. Your body needs time to adapt to the changes that you are making. Last but not least, don't forget to let your body recover. After strength training, give the worked muscles at least 24 hours to rest before you re-work them.


Morven Park to Host Two Exciting Equestrian Events in October
