What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)?

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) is any waste produced in the home that is dangerous or potentially harmful to our health or the environment (Source: EPA - <u>Hazardous Waste</u>).

What Can Be Brought to HHW Events?

Do you have a question about an item not listed here, or would like to see an item added to the list, please send us a request by <u>email</u>.

Limit per Household:

- 15 gallons of liquid HHW
 - Container size may not exceed 5-gallons
- 40 pounds of solid HHW

Note: These events are for Loudoun County residents only. No commercial waste or waste from businesses will be accepted. Residential property management agencies are not authorized to bring materials generated from residents or grounds.

**Liquid latex paint is not hazardous. The cost for the County to dispose of latex paint as a hazardous waste is much higher than disposing of it at the landfill. Residents are strongly encouraged to take latex paint to the Loudoun County Landfill for disposal (fee applies, \$6 for the first 180 pounds).

^{*}May be taken to the <u>Loudoun County Landfill Recycling Center</u> and poured into the proper collection tank (no charge). Do not recycle empty containers for motor oil, antifreeze, or other automotive fluids. Discard empty containers in waste receptacles provided next to collection tanks.

RECYCLING/DISPOSAL OPTIONS FOR ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED AT HHW EVENTS

Ammunition

• Call the Fire Marshal's Office for disposal at 703-737-8600.

Asbestos

- Should only be removed by trained contractor.
 - o Search for Asbestos Abatement contractors online.
- Residents Only: Certain types of non-friable asbestos (roofing shingles and floor tiles only; no siding) may be brought to the Loudoun County Landfill for a fee.

Automotive Batteries/Lead-Acid Batteries

 May be taken to the <u>Loudoun County Landfill Recycling Center</u> and placed on the pallets for recycling (no charge).

Carbon Monoxide Detectors

- May be disposed of in regular household trash.
- Contact manufacturer for any take-back programs.

Commercial Waste

• Waste originating in Loudoun County may be brought to the Loudoun County Landfill for a fee.

Cooking Oil

May be disposed of in regular household trash.

Drywall Mud/Joint Compound/Mastic

 Check with your curbside waste service provider, or may be brought to the <u>Loudoun County</u> <u>Landfill</u> for a <u>fee</u>.

Electronics

Explosives

• Call the Fire Marshal's Office for disposal at 703-737-8600.

Fireworks

• Call the Fire Marshal's Office for disposal at 703-737-8600.

Helium Tanks

- Empty helium tanks may be brought to the Loudoun County Landfill for a <u>fee</u> and placed in the scrap metal pile for recycling.
- To ensure tanks are empty, remove tab on top of tank.

Household Trash

Waste originating in Loudoun County may be brought to the Loudoun County Landfill for a fee.

Industrial Waste

Waste originating in Loudoun County may be brought to the <u>Loudoun County Landfill</u> for a <u>fee</u>.

Medical Waste

- Residential medical waste originating in Loudoun County may be brought to the <u>Loudoun</u> <u>County Landfill</u> for a <u>fee</u>.
- Medical waste produced outside of residential usage is <u>NOT</u> accepted at the Loudoun County Landfill.
 - Contact a regulated medical waste contractor for disposal.

Oil-Filled Space Heaters

• May be brought to the Loudoun County Landfill for a fee.

Propane Tanks

- May be brought to the Loudoun County Landfill for recycling for a fee (surcharge applies).
- Check with area of purchase for return/disposal options.

Radioactive Materials

- These materials must be handled with extreme care.
- Search hazardous waste/radioactive material disposal online for qualified disposal companies.

Sharps, Syringes, and Hypodermic Needles

- Residential medical waste, including sharps, syringes, and hypodermic needles, originating in Loudoun County may be brought to the <u>Loudoun County Landfill</u> for a <u>fee</u>.
 - Place items in sharps container or rigid plastic bottle. If a rigid plastic bottle is used,
 please tape the top and mark it "Do Not Recycle."
 - Bringing it to the landfill reduces risk of container being crushed inside commercial trash trucks.
- Check online for mail-back sharp container programs.
- Medical waste produced outside of residential usage is NOT accepted at the Loudoun County Landfill.
 - Contact a regulated medical waste contractor for disposal.

Shock Sensitive Materials

- These materials must be handled with extreme care.
- Search hazardous waste/shock-sensitive material disposal online for qualified disposal companies.

Smoke Detectors

- May be disposed of in regular household trash.
- Contact manufacturer or visit our <u>A-Z Local Recycling Resources</u> page for any take-back programs.

Unknown Materials

- Items without identification need to be tested for proper disposal.
- Hazardous waste companies can typically do this on-site during HHW events.
 - o However, this does not guarantee that item will be able to be taken at HHW events.
 - If you have an unknown material that you suspect to be hazardous, please contact us via email prior to the event.

Unused Medications

- May be thrown away in regular trash or brought to the Loudoun County Landfill for disposal for a <u>fee</u>.
 - Mix medicines with unpalatable material, i.e., coffee grounds or kitty litter in sealed plastic bag.
