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
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

Residents are welcome to observe the public portion of meetings and to address the Board during the 'Homeowner Forum' section of the meeting.

COVENANTS CORNER

May Covenants Corner

During the month of May as the turf and plants become active, the Inspectors will be focusing on lawn maintenance. Lot owners and residents are required to mow, weed, and prune the front and back of their lots on a regular basis, with detailed guidelines outlined in the Procedures and Standards Relating to Yard and Lawn Maintenance (see For Homeowners>Rules and Regulations on the website). This resolution was adopted by the Board of Directors for the benefit and protection of all owners in order to ensure that all lot owners maintain their yards and lawns in a neat and orderly condition.

Lawn maintenance violations include: turf in excess of 6 inches; excessive weeds, overgrown or unsightly shrubbery or other plant growth; yards with litter, trash, debris or other objects; other unsightly conditions.

If these conditions are noted, a Warning and Hearing Opportunity letter will be issued to the property owner, providing ten days to correct the issue. If the violation is not corrected within ten days and a Hearing is not requested, the HOA or its contractor will enter the lot and correct the violation, and the resulting repair costs as well as an administrative fee will be charged back to the owners' account.

If you have questions regarding this process, or if you receive one of these letters and are unable to correct in the time allotted, you may contact the covenants inspectors at covenants@ broadlandshoa.com to request a reasonable extension to rectify the issue.


Covenant Inspectors regularly canvass our neighborhood to help preserve the property values for home ownership, to promote community harmony and to ensure the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained.

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors routinely inspect homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications, and leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections where violations may occur with high frequency.

ANNUAL MEETING INFO

The most important meeting of the year will be held on Wednesday, May 10th at 7:00pm at the Broadlands Clubhouse the Annual Meeting of the Membership. This meeting, held every year in order to elect the Board of Directors, is required by the Bylaws for Broadlands Association, Inc. and the quorum requirement is at least ten percent of the total number of votes of the association must be present in person or by proxy. You should have received official notification of this meeting via USPS mail around April 1.

This year, we have three open positions for a three year term and one open position for a one year term. We received



nominating forms and petitions from two candidates, Cliff Keirce and Joe Wagner. Their nominating forms are included on pages 10 & 11 of this newsletter.

Some of the powers and duties of the Board include: providing goods and services in accordance with the documents and providing for the upkeep of the common area; designating, hiring, and dismissing personnel necessary to providing for the upkeep of the common area and providing goods and services; collecting and depositing assessments; adopting and amending rules and regulations; opening bank accounts; enforcing provisions of the documents; obtaining and carrying insurance; paying for authorized goods and services; charging reasonable fees for the use of the common area; suspending the right of an owner or occupant to vote or to use common areas; preparing and adopting an annual budget and establishing assessments; borrowing money on behalf of the association; and employing a managing agent. The full list of powers and duties can be found in the Bylaws for Broadlands.

The Articles of Incorporation provide that the Board be comprised of nine people elected to serve in staggered terms of three years. Eligible Board Members include owners, owner's spouses, an officer, trustee, general partner or agent of an owner, the Declarant or designee of the Declarant, or a mortgagee or designee of the See Annual Meeting on page 6

The Subcommittee meets at 7:00p.m. in the Nature Center conference room on the first and third Wednesdays, March through October, and only the third Wednesday, November through February.

Applications must be submitted by noon on the Thursday before the meeting to the Secretary to the Modifications Subcommittee, Robin Crews. Submissions may be emailed to rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or delivered to the Association office in the Nature Center, 21907 Claiborne Parkway. For your convenience, there is a drop box available for after-hours submissions.

Please review these guidelines and the updated changes on our website. Visit broadlandshoa.org/for-residents/ designguidelines/ for complete guidelines and information required to be submitted with your application, as failure to include all information will delay review of your application. A response to your application is generally sent within one week of the meeting.

HOW AM I NOTIFIED OF MY RESULTS?

The Modifications Subcommittee is using new software to process applications in order to increase efficiency and provide quicker response time to residents regarding the status of their modification applications. Once the Subcommittee has reached a decision, the results letter will be delivered via email. If an email is not provided, then the results letter will be mailed. There have been reports that some emails are being delivered to residents' junk/spam folder. Therefore, please check your inbox and junk/spam folders for your results letter or contact the HOA office at 703-729-9704.

mortgagee. Owners or representatives of owners may not be more than sixty days delinquent in meeting financial obligations to the association.

In 2015, the Board of Directors moved from a paper voting system to an online voting system by hiring The Inspectors of Election. Official meeting notices are still mailed to all owners of record, but are also emailed with a link to the website to those owners for which we have valid email addresses. This step made it possible for the HOA to achieve a quorum of owners for the first time, other than at the Transition Meeting in 2009. Every other year, the Declarants' attendance made quorum possible because less than 10% of the membership participated at the meeting in person or by proxy.

Please take a few moments to log onto **tieivote.com** with your unique username and password (provided to you in the official mailing and via email for those previously registered) to submit your proxy if you are unable to attend the meeting in person. You may elect to use your proxy for quorum purposes only or you may cast votes for up to four candidates. DESIGN GUIDELINES UPDATE GEO THERMAL HEATING/COOLING SYSTEM & TRASH ENCLOSURE

Before you make any modification change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review.

Please refer to the new design guideline for **GEO Thermal Heating/Cooling System**. For more details and submission requirements: broadlandshoa.org/for-residents/designguidelines/ and click on "028.1_GEO Thermal Heating/ Cooling System" under the Type of Modifications section.

Update to the **Trash Enclosures** design guidelines. Material used for a trash enclosure has been updated to include vinyl and composite material. The enclosure should be finished to match the siding, stained or left to weather. Vegetation such as a tree or bush does not serve as screening for trash or recycling containers without an approved trash enclosure. Trash/recycling containers stored inside of a fenced in yard are acceptable.

ARE YOU SELLING YOUR HOME?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidently placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed it notifies the HOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, structures that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the owner's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement then, the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. SAVEYOURSELFTIME, MONEY AND AGGRAVATION

Before you make any modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well-meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the owner's responsibility to file an application for all exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this requirement. The process is easy if you apply before work commences.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee of up to \$900, which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made. You may be taken to General District Court for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which you provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines on the website for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in order to obtain approval prior to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions.

NATURE CENTER NEWS

Nature Center Reservation

Did you know that the Nature Center is available for parties or learning events? Birthdays, Family Reunions, Scouting and whatever other party you are interested in hosting, we are now taking reservations. And we've cut our costs so that it will be a better service for you our neighbors.

Scouting events typically last an hour and a half. This allows 45 minutes for work with the naturalist on the badge work of your choice plus time on either end of your visit to do troop business and have some time to run around and visit the animals. Scouting events are \$7.00 per scout with a minimum of \$75.00. This is less than half of our previous costs, so take advantage of our space and our many practiced badge experiences.

New for this year we also are able to reserve outside space of the Nature Center. For \$75.00 per hour you may use the back patios and greenspace including the new fire pit that we are installing. You also have access to the bathrooms indoor, although touring the Nature Center is not included for an outdoor only rental.

Birthday parties are our most common event at the Nature Center. We give you 3 hours which allows a set up and clean-up period on either end of a 2-hour party. The party includes a class with the Naturalist (including taking care of and interaction with the animals). Yes, we will get out the snake (only if you like) and the turtles, gecko, toad, and bunny. The cost is \$175.00 for the three hour period. Scheduling for a party is available seven(7) days a week. We simply need to

Family Campouts

Every month now through October we will have two Friday campouts per month. This will allow you to come and pitch a tent, enjoy S'mores and a fire pit, come inside and pet the animals and have bedtime stories. You can come to the Nature Center lawn and pitch your tent at 4:00pm, but we don't light the fire until around 7:00pm. 



The Perfect Burger

1 egg

1 teaspoon mustard (regular or Dijon)
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1 small onion, finely grated
1 clove garlic, minced
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1 lb. medium ground beef

Optional, add 1-2 teaspoons of the following:

Greek salad dressing, chopped sun-dried tomato, yogurt, grated fresh lemon or lime rind, lemon pepper, dried oregano, thyme, rosemary, fresh chopped jalapenos.

Lightly oil grill& heat BBQ to medium. Whisk egg in a bowl& add next 6 ingredients. Add any of the "stir -ins" that appeal to you. Crumble in beef& using your hands or a fork, gently mix together. Handle the meat as little as possible – the more you work it, the tougher it gets. Gently shape (don't firmly press) mixture into burgers about ¾ inch thick. Using your thumb, make a shallow depression in the center of each burger to prevent puffing up during cooking. Place burgers on the grill, close lid& BBQ until NO LONGER PINK INSIDE, turning once, about 6 – 8 minutes per side. An instant read thermometer should read 160F. Tuck into a warm crusty bun & add your favorite toppings. Servings: 4 Food.com

Perfect Salmon Burgers

1 1/4 lbs. center-cut salmon fillet, skin and pin bones removed

2 tablespoons Dijon mustard

1 tablespoon mayonnaise

1 tablespoon lemon juice

1/2 teaspoon grated lemon zest

Pinch of cayenne pepper

2 scallions, chopped


1 cup plus 2 tablespoons panko (Japanese breadcrumbs)

Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for brushing

4 brioche buns, split

Tartar sauce and arugula, for topping



Cut three-quarters of the salmon into 1/4-inch pieces. Put in a large bowl. Cut the rest of the salmon into chunks; transfer the chunks to a food processor along with the mustard, mayonnaise, lemon juice, lemon zest and cayenne. Pulse to make a paste. Add the pureed salmon mixture to the bowl with the diced salmon. Add the scallions, 2 tablespoons panko, 1/2 teaspoon salt, and black pepper to taste. Gently mix until just combined. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper and brush with olive oil. Divide the salmon mixture into 4 mounds on the parchment paper. With damp hands, pat into 4-inch-wide, 3/4-inch-thick patties. Cover loosely with plastic wrap and refrigerate at least 30 minutes. Preheat the broiler. Spread the remaining 1 cup panko on a plate. Press both sides of the salmon patties in the panko. Heat the olive oil in a large nonstick or cast-iron skillet over medium-high heat. Add the patties (in batches if necessary) and cook until browned on the bottom, 3 to 4 minutes, adjusting the heat if necessary. Turn and cook until the other side is browned and the patties feel springy in the center, 3 to 4 more minutes. Transfer to a paper towel-lined plate to drain; season with salt. Meanwhile, arrange the buns, cut-side up, on a broiler pan and broil until toasted, 1 to 2 minutes. Serve the patties on the buns; top with tartar sauce and arugula. Yield: 4 burgers Foodnetwork.com





Pool Season Begins May 27th... Do You Know Where Your Pool Passes Are?

It's time to start digging around in the bottom of your pool bag or in the drawer with the swimsuits for your **Broadlands Photo ID Pool Passes.** Everyone aged 5 and older will need one to gain admission to the pools. If you are 18 or older, you must provide proof of residency in order to obtain a pool pass. IF YOU ARE AN OWNER AND HAVE THE POOL PASSES YOU USED LAST YEAR, YOU DO NOT NEED TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION. Passes will be electronically reactivated. If you cannot locate your passes, replacements can be issued free of charge during the month of April. Beginning May 1st, reprints will cost \$5.00 each. If you want a new picture for your replacement pass, the cost is \$7.00, regardless of when the pass is issued. Children whose passes have not been updated in the last five (5) years should be brought in for an updated photo at no charge. Any individual who has turned 18 since the last pool season will need a new adult pass, provided free of charge, and will be required to bring proof of residency.

All applications and forms referenced in this notice can be found in this newsletter, online at www.broadlandshoa.org under pool information, or at the HOA office located in the Nature Center.

New Owners: You must complete an "Owner - 2017 Pool Membership Application", return it to the HOA office at the Nature Center and have your photos taken to be issued pool passes. Pool passes are issued to each individual aged 5 and older living in the household. A household consists of all persons living in the dwelling, including college students, other non-resident children spending the swim season in Broadlands and live-in care providers or others showing proof of residency in the form of a valid driver's license or other government issued ID or utility bill.

Tenants (new and existing): If an owner wishes to transfer their pool rights over to their tenant, then the owner must complete the "Absentee Owner Statement (AOS) - Facilities Use Agreement for Tenants" form and submit it along with the lease to the HOA office. Tenants must then complete and sign the "Tenant - 2017 Pool Membership Application" form for membership. In this instance, passes will only be issued to the tenants; not the owners. Existing tenants with AOS forms on file may use previously issued passes, but will only be valid through the lease date. If a lease date has expired and will be renewed, it is the tenant/owner responsibility to complete a new AOS form and submit it along with a copy of the new lease to the HOA office.

Children: Children who have turned 5 years old since last summer, or will be 5 years old by June 1, 2017, must have a pool pass for the upcoming pool season. A pool application must be filled out and a picture taken so a pass can be issued. Please return completed pool applications to the HOA office at the Nature Center to add your child(ren) to your family data base. Children under 5 years old may obtain a pool pass in order to bring in guests to the pool. This will allow our 5 and under members the opportunities to have an older guest accompany them when other family members are not available.

Long-Term Guest Passes: Long-Term Guess Passes are offered to allow visiting guests to use the pools unaccompanied by residents. The cost for the entire 2017 season is \$100 per person. This price will reduce on July 1 to \$75 per person and again on August 1 to \$50 per person. They should be noted as a long-term guest on the pool application. The fee must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass is issued. The resident member must accompany the long-term guest to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Guest passes: 10 resident guest passes are allocated to each residence. Additional guest passes, good for 10 visits, may be purchased for \$20. Members are limited to bringing 3 guests per member per visit to the pool. Guest passes are added to the electronic account of each residence and no physical passes will be issued. Guests must be accompanied by a pool pass holder to gain admittance to the pool facility. Rules regarding the use of guest passes can be found online at www.broadlandshoa.org.

Pictures: Beginning April 3, 2017, pictures will be taken at the nature center from 9:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday on a first come first served basis. Walk-in applications will not be processed for same day delivery if received after 4:30pm. In order to expedite lines and shorten your wait time, you may submit your application in advance via email to info@broadlandshoa.com or mail/hand delivery to 21907 Claiborne Parkway or fax to 703-729-9733.

Proof of Residency: Prior to having a photo taken, all adults 18 and older must show a photo ID with proof residency at a Broadlands Association residential address. Photos will not be taken if acceptable proof of identity and address are not available.

Acceptable photo IDs include:

If your ID does not show a Broadlands Association address, the following will be accepted:

- Driver's License
- School, Military ID
- Current Passport
- Utility bill issued within the last 60 days
- Settlement Papers or Deed
- Current Virginia Voter Registration Card

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

WORK TO BEGIN THIS SPRING ON HILLSIDE PTO "HAWK'S NEST" SHADE STRUCTURE AND OUTDOOR **CLASSROOM**

The Hillside Elementary PTO is excited to share our plans for the 2015-2017 Hillside PTO 'Hawk's Nest,' Shade Structure and Outdoor Classroom, that will become a welcome and permanent addition to the Hillside Elementary campus, located at 43000 Ellzey Drive.

The new structure will be constructed at the back of the school, and centrally situated in the currently open space between the asphalt basketball courts, the baseball field backstop, and the sidewalk. The 30' x 40' structure will stand 10' tall at the sides, with a peaked, elevated interior that will climb to 15' at center. A fully bordered edge will skirt the entire perimeter and contain a hardwood mulch floor. Inside will will be six permanently mounted 6' x 6' picnic tables, each with seating for six to eight. The picnic tables will be steel covered with PVC vinyl to ensure a long life. The shade and tables will be coordinated to tastefully reflect the school colors (maroon and navy). The shade will consist of sun and weather resistant material, and will be removed each winter to increase longevity and ensure many years of use by Hillside students, families, and staff.

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
