

Residents are welcome to observe the public portion of meetings and to address the Board during the 'Homeowner Forum' section of the meeting.

BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following actions were taken by the Board of Directors at their meeting held on October 4th, 2016:

- Approved minutes of September 13, 2016 meeting
- Discussed zoning applications submitted by Broadlands Commercial Association to Loudoun County
- Denied a modification appeal from an owner for black gutters
- Assessed violation charges to an owner for future sign violations
- Moved the November 8th meeting to November 1st due to Election Day conflict
- Discussed an annexation fee for new townhome units in section 108
- Assessed violation charges of \$10/day for a maximum of 90 days for a fence repair violation

MODIFICATIONS & COMMUNITY INFORMATION

MODIFICATIONS SUBCOMMITTEE

The Subcommittee meets at 7:00p.m. in the Nature Center conference room on the first and third Wednesdays, March through October, and only the third Wednesday, November through February.

Applications must be submitted by noon on the Thursday before the meeting to the Secretary to the Modifications Subcommittee, Robin Crews. Submissions may be emailed to *rcrews@broadlandshoa.com* or delivered to the Association office in the Nature Center, 21907 Claiborne Parkway. For your convenience, there is a drop box available for after-hours submissions.

The Modifications Subcommittee has updated the design guidelines for Tree Removal and Landscaping. Approval is required to remove any tree either dead or alive whose trunk measures 4" or more in diameter when measured at a height of 4' from the ground. Tree stumps must be removed below ground level and the area reestablished.

In general, approval for vegetable gardens is not required. Vegetable gardens must be an appropriate size for the area in which they are planted. Any significant hardscape elements such as a retaining wall, associated with vegetable gardens or gardens that are significant in size require approval.

Please review these guidelines and the updated changes on our website. Visit broadlandshoa.org/for-residents/design-guidelines/ for complete guidelines and information required to be submitted with your application, as failure to include all information will delay review of your application. A response to your application is generally sent within one week of the meeting.

Per Broadlands guidelines *no more than three political campaign election* signs are allowed and each sign shall not exceed (4) square feet maximum. These signs may be placed **no more than 60 days prior to an election date** and must be removed 5 days following the election. No application is required for these signs.

PATRIOT DISPOSAL HOLIDAY TRASH, RECYLING AND CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP SCHEDULE 2016-2017

Thanksgiving Day: Office is closed and no services will be provided. If trash collection falls on this day, your service will resume on your next scheduled service day. Recycling collection make up day will be on Wednesday, the day BEFORE the holiday, November 23rd.

Christmas Day and New Year's Day: Service schedule will not be impacted since both holidays are on Sunday this year. Services will be provided as usual on the Monday following each holiday; however, our offices will be closed.

Christmas Tree Collection: Christmas trees will be collected on trash collection days during the weeks of January 2nd and January 9th. All tinsel and decorations must be removed and trees should not be placed in plastic bags.

SAVE YOURSELF TIME, MONEY AND AGGRAVATION

Before you make any modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the owner's responsibility to file an application for all exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this requirement. The process is easy if you apply before work commences.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee of up to \$900, which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made. You may be taken to General District Court for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which you provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines on the website for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in order to obtain approval prior to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions. COVENANTS CORNER

Light the Night

During the month of November, the covenants inspectors will focus on homes whose pole lights in their front yards are burned out. As winter rapidly approaches and the days get shorter, it is more important than ever to keep your exterior pole light functioning both for security and safety purposes.

In accordance with the Association Documents, should you fail to bring your lot into compliance, the Board of Directors may take action to enforce compliance. If a violation is noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing thirty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fourteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a Hearing Notice is sent and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$10 per day for a maximum of 90 days.

Keeping these lights functional is the responsibility of the homeowner whether you own a single family, semi-attached or a town home. Should replacing the light bulb not resolve the problem, you may have a tripped circuit breaker in your home or you may need to replace the photoelectric cell. An electrician can help you. The HOA does not provide this service.

Keep your pole lights operational and keep your home and neighborhood

If you have questions regarding this process, or if you receive one of these letters and are unable to correct in the time allotted, you may contact the covenants inspectors at covenants@broadlandshoa.com to request a reasonable extension to rectify the issue.

Covenant Inspectors regularly canvass our neighborhood to help preserve the property values for home ownership, to promote community harmony and to ensure the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained. Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors routinely inspect homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications, and leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections where violations may occur with high frequency.

Soon thereafter, Larry and AnnMarie pursued their dream of opening a music school for students of all ages; Minton's Academy of Music. With his creativity and her business acumen, Larry and AnnMarie made a great team, and for over a decade later, the Ashburn school continues to thrive offering excellent musical instruction.

Larry had many passions. He loved all instruments but always excelled at the drums and vocals. He loved to teach, put on a show, and go the extra mile to help someone in need. He built things, hand-crafted tables, walls, stages, lofts, decks and more. He was a wealth of information and was always in a fabulous mood. He could light up an entire room, almost effortlessly. He loved the Yankees. He was absolutely hilarious and was notorious for telling "Dad Jokes." He loved spending quality time with his family and closest friends during the holidays. But most importantly, he treasured his life with his soul mate, AnnMarie.



VANDALISM

There have been vandals in our neighborhood targeting three primary locations: the Nature Center, the Stone House and the Community Center. Empty bottles of alcohol and cough medicine have been left behind causing an unsightly mess. Fires have been started and cigarette butts have been discarded by the hundreds, creating the potential for a fire to spread uncontrollably. These are just some of the recent findings around our neighborhood.

The HOA has to incur costs throughout the year to clean-up the destruction of vandals. Likewise, residents have to also incur costs when vandalism strikes their individual dwelling. The disregard that vandals have for people's property can be exasperating and frightening when something of theirs – such as a mailbox, a garden or a car, is destroyed for no apparent reason.

Most vandals are young people, from grade schoolers to teens to young adults, who damage property for one or more of the following reasons: Boredom, Anger, Revenge, Defiance, and Alliance.

You can help prevent vandalism by educating your children, reporting issues to the Sheriff's department, networking with your neighbors and also notifying the Broadlands HOA when an incident occurs on HOA property. Remember, vandalism is a crime.

IN THE GARDEN...

Three Uncommon Fruit Trees Anyone Can Grow By Nancy Caldwell Virginia Cooperative Extension Loudoun County Master Gardener



Ever thought it would be nice to grow fruit in the garden, maybe beyond the usual blueberry bush or strawberry patch? Perhaps you believed you didn't have the space, or that fruit trees require too much effort. Here are three maintenancefree native trees to consider that do double duty, not only adding beauty to the landscape, but also providing food for us and for wildlife.

American Persimmon (Diospyros virginiana)

The American Persimmon, whose Latin name translates to "fruit of the gods," is a medium-size tree with glossy, leathery leaves and interesting fall color. When ripe, this tree's sweet orange fruit tastes somewhat like dates. The fruit

can be eaten fresh or used to make puddings, cakes, and beverages. In the wild, persimmon trees need a male and female to set fruit. Many cultivated varieties, though, are self-fruiting, so be sure to ask before you buy.

Elderberry (Sambucus Canadensis) The American Elderberry is a native woodland shrub or tree with bright green leaves, a graceful arching habit, and clusters of dark purple berries in fall. It has been used for centuries in folk remedies. to make teas and wine, in foods. as well as for dyes and basketweaving. Its flowers attract a variety of insects including native bees, and its fruit is an important food source for many species of birds and small mammals. This

small, fine-textured tree would be a nice addition to a native or woodland garden.

PawPaw (Asimina triloba) The PawPaw is a large multistemmed shrub or small tree with a distinctly tropical feel. In early spring it bears l" maroon flowers that hang from bare stems, followed by very large drooping pale green leaves. Its oblong yellow-green fleshy fruits have been likened to vanilla custard. or bananas, or even crème brulee. Pawpaw fruit can be eaten raw, or made into jellies, custards, muffins, and pies. This native woodland tree is also an important butterfly plant, and the sole food for the caterpillars of the zebra swallowtail. Pawpaws usually grow in low wet woodland areas but can be grown in a sunny yard if it's not too dry. For trees to set fruit, you will need two different varieties for cross-pollination.

What Is Topping?

Topping is the indiscriminate cutting back of tree branches to stub or lateral branches that are not large to assume the terminal role. Other names for topping include "heading," "tipping," "hat-racking," and "rounding over". The most common reason given for topping is to reduce the size of the tree. People often feel that their trees have become too large for their property. They fear that tall trees may pose a hazard. Topping, however will make a tree more hazardous in the long term.




Topping Stresses Trees

Topping often removes 50-100% of the leaves in a tree. Since the leaves are the 'food factories' of a tree, this can temporarily 'starve' the tree. The severity of the pruning triggers a sort of survival mechanism. The tree activates dormant buds under the bark which forces the rapid growth of multiple shoots between each cut. The tree does this in order to produce a new crop of

leaves as soon as possible. If the tree does not have enough stored energy to produce the new leaves, the tree can be seriously weakened and can possibly die. A stressed tree is more vulnerable to insects and disease. Large, open wounds expose the sapwood and heartwood to attack. The tree may lack sufficient energy to 'defend' the wounds against invasion. Some insects are attracted to stressed trees by chemical signals which occur when the tree is in stress.

Topping Causes Decay

The proper location to make a pruning cut is just beyond the branch collar where the branch is attached. The tree is biologically equipped to close these wounds at a relatively quick pace. Cuts made along a limb and between branches create stubs with wounds that the tree may not be able to close. The exposed wood tissues then begin to decay. Normally, trees can 'wall off' a decay attack but when they are fighting on multiple fronts (such as growing new branches and leaves after topping occurs) they lack sufficient resources to properly halt the decay. This decay can then spread down the branches and into the trunk.



Topping Creates Hazards

The survival mechanism that causes a tree to produce multiple shoots below each topping cut comes at a great expense to the tree. These shoots develop from buds near the surface of old branches. Unlike normal branches that develop with a 'socketlike' attachment of overlapping wood tissues, these new shoots are attached only in the outermost layers of the parent branch. The new shoots grow very quickly - sometimes as much as 20 feet in one year. Given the poor attachment of these branches, they are very susceptible to breaking, especially in windy conditions. The irony is that while the goal was to reduce the trees height to make it tree safer, it is far more hazardous than it was before.

Alternatives

There are times when a tree must be reduced in height or spread and there are recommended techniques for achieving this. Branches should be removed back to their point of origin when possible. If a branch must be shortened, it should be cut back to a lateral limb that is at least 1/3 the diameter of the branch being removed. This method helps to preserve the health of the tree as well as the natural form. If large cuts are involved, however, the tree may not be able to close over the wounds. Sometimes the best solution is to remove the tree and replace it with a species that is more appropriate to the site.



Sliced Sweet Potato Roast

4 lbs of sweet potatoes (approx.2.5 inches in diameter)

3 tbsp olive oil
3 tbsp Butter
Sea salt
1/2 Crème
Fraîche
4 tsp sriracha
2 shallots peeled
and sliced
1/3 cup fresh
cilantro, minced



Preheat oven to 375°. Melt butter over low heat on the stovetop, then mix together with olive oil and set aside. Peel sweet potatoes, then slice crosswise as thinly and evenly as possible with knife or mandolin. (Between 1/8" and 1/16" is ideal.) Brush a healthy coating of the butter and oil mixture over the inside of an 8"- 9" baking dish or skillet, and sprinkle with a pinch of coarse sea salt. Arrange potatoes in the dish. Add a sliver of shallot between every few slices of potato, if desired. Then brush with the remaining butter and oil and sprinkle with the remaining salt. Roast potatoes for around 1 hour or until the middle of the potatoes are tender and the tops begin to brown and crisp. Remove from the oven and let rest for 10 minutes. While the potatoes are resting, whisk together crème fraîche, and sriracha in a saucepan over medium heat, until just warmed. Pour half of the sauce over top of the potatoes and sprinkle with half of the minced cilantro. Combine the remaining sauce and cilantro and serve alongside the potatoes. Reclaimingprovincial.com

Shaved Brussels Sprout and Shallot Sauté

1 3/4 pounds brussels sprouts, outer leaves removed

2 tablespoons (1/4 stick) butter

3 tablespoons olive oil

12 medium shallots, thinly sliced (about 2 cups)

6 garlic cloves, thinly sliced

4 tablespoons pine nuts, toasted, divided

2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

Preparation

Working in small batches, place brussels sprouts in feed tube of processor fitted with thin slicing disk; slice. Melt butter with olive oil in large pot over medium heat. Add shallots; sauté until almost translucent, about 3 minutes. Add garlic; stir 1 minute. Add brussels sprouts; increase heat to medium-high and sauté until tender, about 8 minutes. Stir in 3 tablespoons pine nuts and lemon juice. Season with salt and pepper. Transfer to bowl. Sprinkle with remaining 1 tablespoon pine nuts and serve. Epicurious.com



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

ABOUT YOUR FITNESS...

Often times when I meet new people and we start to chitchat about what we do and who we are, we get to our occupation and the conversation usually goes something like this:

Neighbor: "What do you do?"

Me: "I am a personal trainer and small

group instructor"

Neighbor: "Really? Great! What's the

best exercise?"

Man, that is a loaded question! First of all, what is your goal? Is it general fitness or do you have performance related goals? Additionally, I love fitness and there are so many fantastic and functional exercises out there. How could I ever choose just one?

With all of this in mind I decided to start a new 6-month series. Each month we will delve into one exercise that I think should be included in your fitness repertoire.

Each exercise will be chosen based on certain criteria:

- 1. Requires minimal to no equipment.
- 2. Can be done anywhere.
- 3. Utilizes major muscle groups to get the most bang for your buck.
- 4. Can be performed by most any fitness level by using regressions and progressions.

Month 1: Burpee

I know, I lulled you into a false sense of security and then hit you with it: burpee. Before you freak out and close the newsletter, consider this: burpee is just a term for an exercise that can be modified or progressed to fit your level. Burpees are great because no matter

which option you choose your body will be working on full-tilt to complete the move and all major muscle groups are firing resulting in major calorie burn and muscular recruitment.

In short, a burpee is simply starting in a standing position, getting down to the floor and getting back up. How you get down, what you do at the lowest level and how you get up is all up to you. Check out the levels below to find your ideal starting point.

If you are new to exercise or nursing a knee or back injury:

Your key word is "elevation." Getting down to the floor is hard, getting back up is harder. If this is a challenge for you then use a sturdy chair, bring your hands to the chair, step or jump out, step or jump back in then come back to standing. Repeat 10 - 20 times for 2-3 sets. As you progress, so too will your ability to reach the ground.

Weekend Warrior types:

You probably work out a few times a week, or at least run around with the kids playing sports. You don't have any conditions that hamper your ability to get to the ground. You will start by standing then squat down and place hands next to feet, jump out or step out to a full plank, then jump in or step back in to squat position, finally coming back to standing. Play with speed to challenge yourself or add a jump at the top as you come back up to standing.

Advanced Fitness Levels:

This is the group that trains like there is no tomorrow, trying to get the most out of every rep and or set. You have done



burpees before and people in this group probably even like burpees (crazy but true). Your mantra is variety. You want to keep this staple fresh and new so it continues to challenge you each time. You can add in push-ups at the bottom, try using gliding discs under the feet, try single legged or do simple but tough with max speed.

Whichever option you choose, whatever level you fall into, burpees should find a home in your fitness life. Good luck and enjoy!

LCSO Warns Residents of Fake Kidnappers Scam

Loudoun County-This week residents in Loudoun County have reported a frightening scam. The residents reported receiving phone calls where the caller claims to have kidnapped their family member.

The callers will contact you via an international phone number or a non-standard ten digit phone number saying, "I've kidnapped your relative," and naming a brother, sister, child or parent. "Send ransom immediately by wire transfer or prepaid card," they say, "or something bad will happen." In some cases the caller has had a young female scream for help in the background during the call to make the call more convincing. These callers hope that you'll panic and rush to pay ransom before checking the story. There's pressure to pay quickly, and the caller says not to contact anyone, including law enforcement. The scammers demand payment by wire transfer or prepaid cards. Why? Because it's difficult to trace or recover money sent that way.

The Sheriff's Office urges residents to stop and confirm the whereabouts of your family/friends that the scam is referring to. The Federal Bureau of Investigation calls this scam virtual kidnapping. Scammers scour the internet and social media sites, grabbing information about where people live, work, or travel, and names of friends and family. The cons use the details to pick a target and make their calls sound credible. To cut down on the information that scammers can find, think about limiting access to your networking pages — and encourage your family to do the same. Never post your Social Security number or account numbers online, and only share your phone number with your friends and contacts.

The Sheriff's Office recommends to never wire money, conduct account transfers or pay by prepaid card to anyone that you do not know personally. If you do receive a call like this, attempt to verify the validity by contacting the relative in question. If you are ever concerned about the safety of yourself, or anyone else, don't hesitate to call the Sheriff's Office at 703-777-1021. If you are an owner who leases your unit, we'd like to make the leasing experience successful and positive for everyone by informing you of your responsibilities. This will help preserve your property value specifically and maintain the association's property value in general.


Your tenants may not be familiar with common-interest community living. Please take a few minutes to explain to them that living in a community association is very different from living in a rental apartment community. Specifically, your tenants, like all residents, are subject to the rules and regulations of the association, and it's up to you to educate them and see that they comply. We recommend you provide your tenants with written copies of all policies and rules and advise them on the proper use of the association's facilities. You can obtain copies of these and other useful documents online. FirstService Connect has copies of all resolutions and Design Guidelines, as well as the recorded documents (Bylaws, Articles of Incorporation, and Declaration). The Broadlands Association website has copies of all policies and Design Guidelines, but not the recorded documents.

We strongly recommend that you have a written lease agreement with your tenant. As a lessor (landlord) of a home in a community association, the lease you use should require tenants to comply with the association's governing documents. In the event your tenant fails to comply with these documents, including the bylaws, declaration, and rules and regulations, a representative of the association will contact you in an attempt to remedy the problem. Both you and your tenants will receive a copy of the notice. If the violation is not corrected, the process will be escalated with additional letters, and ultimately a charge could be placed on your account for failure to comply with association guidelines.

Follow these simple steps and you, the tenants and the association will all have a positive community association living experience:

- · Provide your tenants with copies of association rules.
- · Educate tenants about the need to follow association rules, and see that they comply.
- · Advise tenants on the proper use of association facilities.
- · Use a written lease agreement.
- · Make sure your lease requires tenants to comply with all association governing documents.
- · Provide the association with contact information for you and your tenants.

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


