National Work and Family Month

The United States Senate declared October to be the National Work and Family Month, believing that supporting a balance between work and personal life is in the best interest of worker productivity and, that reducing the conflict between work and family life should be a national priority. A 2013 national poll surprisingly showed that the majority of workers are satisfied with the work/family boundary and do not feel pressured to



respond to work-related emails or phone calls outside of work hours. This same majority also feel that technology has not worsened work related stress. I guess I'm in the silent minority on this one, as I am a believer that while technology has greatly improved communications, efficiency, and the ability to work remotely, I also feel it has compromised the line between work and non-work hours, extending the work day due to smart phones buzzing from the constant emails, phone calls, and text messages at all hours of the day and night. Along with this, the expectation of immediate response has become out of control, with many people expecting instantaneous responses to electronic communication, with more than half of the public saying that they expect a business to be available 24/7.

While the majority of respondents indicated they are satisfied with boundaries between work and family, taking time off is another story. The majority of workers do not feel comfortable taking a full week off work. 45 percent of those polled feel compelled to check in on work while on vacation, and 34 percent feel their supervisor expects them to do so. Not taking time away from the office can negatively impact employee productivity the same way that always being 'plugged in' or working 70 hours a week can. Make sure you take advantage of the benefits offered by your employer, including paid time off. Sometimes a sick day is needed as mental health day. So, get out and enjoy this most beautiful month in the state, and find that balance between work and family time.

MODIFICATIONS & COMMUNITY INFORMATION

MODIFICATIONS SUBCOMMITTEE

The Subcommittee meets at 7:00p.m. in the Nature Center conference room on the first and third Wednesdays, March through October, and only the third Wednesday, November through February.

Applications must be submitted by noon on the Thursday before the meeting to the Secretary to the Modifications Subcommittee, Robin Crews. Submissions may be emailed to *rcrews@broadlandshoa.com* or delivered to the Association office in the Nature Center, 21907 Claiborne Parkway. For your convenience, there is a drop box available for after-hours submissions.

The Modifications Subcommittee has updated the design guidelines for Tree Removal and Landscaping. Approval is required to remove any tree either dead or alive whose trunk measures 4" or more in diameter when measured at a height of 4' from the ground. Tree stumps must be removed below ground level and the area reestablished.

In general, approval for vegetable gardens is not required. Vegetable gardens must be an appropriate size for the area in which they are planted. Any significant hardscape elements such as a retaining wall, associated with vegetable gardens or gardens that are significant in size require approval.

Please review these guidelines and the updated changes on our website. Visit *broadlandshoa.org/for-residents/designguidelines*/for complete guidelines and information required to be submitted with your application, as failure to include all information will delay review of your application. A response to your application is generally sent within one week of the meeting.

SAVE YOURSELF TIME, MONEY AND AGGRAVATION

Before you make any modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the owner's responsibility to file an application for all exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this requirement. The process is easy if you apply before work commences.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee of up to \$900, which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made. You may be taken to General District Court for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which you provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines on the website for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in order to obtain approval prior to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions. COVENANTS CORNER

During the month of October, the Inspectors will be focusing on homes with basketball goals, hockey nets, soccer goals, and other play equipment in the VDOT right of way or with play situated in the street. Play equipment in unsafe locations will not be permitted.

Basketball is a fabulous sport for kids! It increases aerobic capacity, improves agility, builds confidence and teaches team building skills. However, the Association does not endorse playing in the streets, nor can it approve the location of play equipment that encourages play on the streets. This is for the safety of the players as well as drivers. Streets are designed for vehicular traffic.

Prior to installing a portable basketball net, an application must be submitted to the Modifications Subcommittee. There are also specific guidelines as to the location where the net can be placed. Nets may not be placed in the VDOT right of way - which extends approximately 10 feet (measured from the curb towards your home) from the street towards your home, but not less than the length of the driveway apron. They also may not be located on the sidewalk, on the street, or on the manhole covers over the storm water drains. On private streets basketball goals must be located above the driveway apron. The same goes for hockey and soccer nets or other types of play equipment.

Additionally, basketball goals must be stabilized by filling the base with water or sand or by staking the base to the ground according to the manufacturer's direction. Using cinder blocks or bagged sand is not an acceptable method of stabilizing.

If the topography of your lot precludes the approved installation of a portable goal, remember there are facilities available to play at the Nature Center, the Southern Walk Pool, Eagle Ridge Middle School, Hillside Elementary School and Mill Run Elementary.

Please reference Virginia Code 46.2-932-Playing on highways:

No person shall play on a highway, other than on the sidewalks thereof... or on any part of a highway... designated... exclusively for vehicular travel.

If a violation is noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing thirty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent.

If you have questions regarding this process, or if you receive one of these letters and are unable to correct in the time allotted, you may contact the covenants inspectors at covenants@broadlandshoa.com to request a reasonable extension to rectify the issue.

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors inspect the homes in the community for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in view to parking issues and unapproved modifications to leftover holiday decor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular violations that occur with high frequency.

COMMUNITY LANDSCAPE UPDATE...



Fall brings cooler temperatures, increased chance of precipitation, and a good opportunity for landscaping improvements in the community. Following are some landscaping related items we project to take place in October:

- As part of the routine maintenance contract, HLS will continue mowing the common areas and units at the courtyard and villa homes every 7-10 days. Turf is cut to 2.5 to 3.5 inches, and is trimmed along shrub beds, walkways and curbs, obstructions and foundations.
- Trash and litter are policed, and mulched areas are groomed and weeded. Minor pruning and trimming of ground cover take place as necessary. Sidewalks and curbs are edged.
- HLS will continue to empty waste from all common area trash cans and pet stations weekly on Mondays, as well as sweep the three tunnels and provide median advertising sign and dead animal pickup as needed.
- As the leaves begin to fall around the community, they are initially "mulched" with the mowers. The "mulching" chops the leaves up allowing them to decompose quickly. This process returns nutrients and organic matter to the soil. This

organic material helps make lawn areas more fertile and assists with breaking up the clay soils that are found throughout Northern Virginia.

• Not only are we performing Core Aeration and Overseeding with a triple blend fescue, but we are also in the process of power seeding thin and bare areas as well as adding compost to those areas to improve







the soil and increase the rate of germination for the seed.

• Fall flowers will be installed around the second week of October, weather pending. These are the blue and white Viola flowers you see at the entrance signs.



- Rose pruning will start at the end of October
- Selected landscape beds will be renovated, reduced, or created in accordance with board approved proposals.
- Tree replacement will start around the end of October and finish up in mid-November, weather pending. This is the ideal time to plant trees as they need the least amount of hand watering and will go dormant as the cold weather sets in. The snow will help hydrate them through the winter.
- Turf applications will start around the end of October, weather pending. All common area turf will receive a slow-release granular fertilizer.
- Lime will be applied to approximately 1/3 of the common area, mostly in the northern (older) side. Soil testing performed both by the Loudoun County Master Gardner's Association and HLS identified specific areas low in ph, so these areas will receive the treatment.

Animal Rehabilitation Certification Through Wildlife Veterinary Care

Tuesday, October 25, 2016 at the Nature Center 7:00pm - 8:30pm Fee: \$7:00 per person. The certification is required & free if you are enrolled in the Youth Naturalist Adventurer Program! Participation Ages: 8-88 years old!

We are inundated with injured and lost animals, particularly in the spring, that are brought to the Nature Center. Until now we have redirected you, the members of our community, to the Wildlife Rescue League, (703) 440-0800.

But the reality is that rehabilitation centers throughout Virginia are overwhelmed with birds with broken wings, turtles that have wandered from their water source, and run-over but still fighting for life raccoons, foxes, and baby deer.

We are creating a league of experts for our community in animal rehabilitation response. You will be the first responders when an animal is lost or injured in our community. Dr. Burwell of Wildlife Veterinary Care is coming to provide the training for this work. To sign up visit: **broadlandshoa.org/event/animalrehab**

She will provide the emergency response training for animals in need and will give us checklists of whether the animal should be returned to the wild, taken to a care provider, or cared for locally.

Many of you contact us with care for the animals in our community. This is your chance to learn the skills needed to be a first responder, and to make our community more friendly to all the things that fly, swim, and creep upon the earth.

HIKE STREAK

I don't know exactly how it happened, but we started a hike streak.



It was June 7th, 2015 and I took my 5 year old kid, Jack, on a hike. It was a moderate distance (just over 2 miles) on a moderate trail at Red Rocks Park in Leesburg along the Potomac. Jack seemed to enjoy himself and confirmed that the next week when he asked to go again. The following week after that we went again. After 4 weeks he said he wanted to start a "hike streak" and I privately questioned whether, when he quit after 2 months, we could still call 8 weeks a "streak". This past weekend, now 6 year old Jack, completed week 67. He says we're gonna hit 100 weeks and I don't question him anymore. We made it 67 weeks, through rain, a blizzard, extreme heat, sickness, tiredness, time constraints...all of it. Even when he was sick as a dog, Jack insisted. Even if daddy might have wanted to bail on a week or two, we went. His max is 7.5 miles and our average is probably in the neighborhood of 3-4 miles, so he's logged over 200 miles. I'm amazed, proud and even humbled by his dedication and drive. I'm not sure I've ever done anything 67 weeks in a row, much less hike as a little kid. Crazy. In making small talk with a local park ranger, he encouraged that I share





this story, so here we are Broadlands newsletter readers!

Our hikes have happened over 4 states so far, VA, MD, NC and SC and we're looking forward to a WVA trip soon. One of our highlights was the Billy Goat Trail on week 52. I've always loved the BGT since I was a kid (though older than 6!) and I wanted to share this with him. For those that have done this hike. it's a challenging one. It was a hot and humid day and all in total, it was 5.5 miles. Leaping from rock to rock, high above the Potomac on the Maryland side, we climbed hand over foot on the rock wall scramble, a true challenge for a 6 year old and Jack ate it up. The walk back on the tow path was spent talking about our favorite parts, planning our next visit and pointing out turtles. A highlight of all our hikes has been our talks, sometimes nothing too serious (the merits of various lightsabers in Star Wars), and sometimes those deep 6 year old questions (the contents of outer space, earth's creation, or how lucky we are not to be living with dinosaurs because they probably wouldn't share)... regardless of the subject, it's been a great time to connect. I hope he doesn't grow up too quickly and realize I'm not cool.

Other highlights have been Bear's Den, a short easy hike that touches the Appalachian Trail with some interesting things to see and a great view, or visiting Stony Man Mountain in Shenandoah where I proposed to my wife Jenny so many years ago. Nantahala National Forest in NC during my sister's wedding week gave us great views of waterfalls!

Exploring our local trails and finding our favorites was fun, many within a few miles of Broadlands. It was neat stopping and sitting along the most remote trails and listing what we heard - birds, wind in the trees, a creek, a far off airplane. Our hikes included animal spotting: deer, hawks, blue heron, muskrat, snakes and a fox. We had lunch on a log, water breaks on the river, and many more endless amount of moments to create memories.

Along with sharing this story of Jack, I was asked to include advice and tips on how to hike with kids. My parenting style may be different than yours so please use your best judgement.

Make it fun. Kids don't usually like things that aren't fun. Pick spots that go along the river, or have rocks to climb over, or where there are old buildings to look at, such as something they may not see on a regular day.



Be patient. Some miles, even on moderately easy trails, average 45 minutes. There is a lot of stopping, exploring, asking questions, etc. I've tried not to rush through it, just taking it easy and taking it all in.

Start slow. A mile or two to get their feet wet. But don't worry about their ability to hike long distances...if you keep them entertained, these kids

can run circles around us old folk. A ten minute snack break and they'll be completely re-energized.

Be prepared. I carry a backpack with 2 liters of water, more if it's really hot and the hike is long. Something to eat like 2-3 granola bars or trail mix. Keeping



'em fueled and hydrated is crucial. Also a first aid kit could come in handy.

Cheat. I pack a Dum Dum or two... when you're 4 miles into a 5 mile hike, sometimes you need a kid-PED to push through.

Use tech, but don't. Use your phone for Map My Walk and as a camera, but no text/email/calls. Tell them you're shelving the phone, they'll appreciate the sentiment.

Bring the family. The majority of our hikes have been Jack and Daddy time, but we've been joined by wife/ mommy, our younger boy Wyatt, Jack's grandfather, or Jack's aunt.

Beat the ticks. Ticks are everywhere. Early on we had a hike and counted 14 on us when we got back. So I researched. You'll want Permethrin for your clothes and backpack (use liberally) and a bug spray with a kid-friendly amount of deet for the skin. And I'm sure Pintrest has a recipe for lemon oil/tea tree/eucalyptus for the interested parents to make. Dress the part. Depending on the season, trail shoes or boots are best with high socks. If it's cool out, wear pants but no jeans (they stay wet). Dri-Fit shirts in the heat. Cooling towel on the 100+ degree days may help as well.

Go off the trail, kind of. I know, this is the WORST advice, and no one should advocate leaving the trail, lest one be mauled or damage the earth. That said, we often take jaunts off the trail in a judicious manner...it makes them feel like super explorers! Just do it right.

Don't litter. C'mon, don't be those people. And, when you're out on your hike and you see a kid who resembles a blond lollipop and his overgrown dad, stop and say hi and we'll share some of our favorite secret spots we've found! - Jack and Tom Jennrich, Broadlands Residents
