



## Are You Ready to Go Back to School?

#### **BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS**

# MODIFICATIONS & COMMUNITY INFORMATION

#### MODIFICATIONS SUBCOMMITTEE

The Subcommittee meets at 7:00p.m. in the Nature Center conference room on the first and third Wednesdays, March through October, and only the third Wednesday, November through February.

Applications must be submitted by noon on the Thursday before the meeting to the Secretary to the Modifications Subcommittee, Robin Crews. Submissions may be emailed to rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or delivered to the Association office in the Nature Center, 21907 Claiborne Parkway. For your convenience, there is a drop box available for after-hours submissions.

The Modifications Subcommittee has updated the design guidelines for Tree Removal and Landscaping. Approval is required to remove any tree either dead or alive whose trunk measures 4" or more in diameter when measured at a height of 4' from the ground. Tree stumps must be removed below ground level and the area reestablished.

In general, approval for vegetable gardens is not required. Vegetable gardens must be an appropriate size for the area in which they are planted. Any significant hardscape elements such as a retaining wall, associated with vegetable gardens or gardens that are significant in size require approval.

Please review these guidelines and the updated changes on our website. Visit broadlandshoa.org/for-residents/designguidelines/for complete guidelines and information required to be submitted with your application, as failure to include all information will delay review of your application. A response to your application is generally sent within one week of the meeting.

These signs may be placed no more than 60 days prior to an election date and must be removed 5 days following the election. No application is required for these signs.

# BROADLANDS COMMUNITY INFORMATION

#### SAVE YOURSELF TIME, MONEY AND AGGRAVATION

Before you make any modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the owner's responsibility to file an application for all exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this requirement. The process is easy if you apply before work commences.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee of up to \$900, which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made. You may be taken to General District Court for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which you provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines on the website for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in order to obtain approval prior to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions. #### **COVENANTS CORNER**

During the month of September, the Inspectors will be focusing on several issues: homes with rotten wood trim, faded shutters and doors, and homes with fencing issues. Rotten wood can often be identified by paint that is cracked, peeling, or blistering, or wood that's darker than the surrounding area or green with algae. Shutters and doors that have faded from their original color should be freshened up. Fencing must be maintained in such a way that it is safe and visually appealing. Fencing that is leaning, has broken, bent, or missing boards, discoloration or mildew, or other damage should be repaired in order to maintain the integrity and visual appearance of the community.

The Inspectors will also continue performing house to house inspections, checking the front, back, and sides of each unit for improvements that have been made without prior approval from the Modification Subcommittee.

If any violation of these types are noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing sixty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent, and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$10/day for a maximum of ninety (90) days.

If you have questions regarding this process, or if you receive one of these letters and are unable to correct in the time allotted, you may contact the covenants inspectors at covenants@broadlandshoa.com to request a reasonable extension to rectify the issue.

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors inspect the homes in the community for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in view to parking issues and unapproved modifications to leftover holiday decor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular violations that occur with high frequency.

#### Board Adopts Amendments to County's Noise Ordinance; **Enforcement Begins September 1**

The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office will begin to enforce the recent changes to county's noise regulations on September 1, 2016. The amendments to Chapter 654.02 of the county's Codified Ordinances were adopted by the Board of Supervisors during its July 13, 2016, public hearing.

The amendments to the ordinance prohibit some noise based on time of day or duration of sound. For example:

- Music may not be plainly audible and discernable within 100 feet or more from the sound's source during a private party or other similar nongovernmental event between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
- A horn or alarm on any motor vehicle, motorcycle, bicycle, or other vehicle on a street or in a public place cannot be sounded for more than 20 consecutive seconds except as a danger warning or as permitted by law.
- Spinning of tires and racing of engines in a motor vehicle or motorcycle are prohibited as well as the emission of noise created by the absence of a muffler.

The amendments exclude some sound generating activities from regulation, including agricultural operations; sounds from places of worship such as bells and chimes; sounds from emergency operations such as sirens; parades and fireworks and similar county-approved events; operations of a public facility; and school-sponsored or organized youth athletic contests or practices, or other school activities.

Violations of the noise ordinance range from a Class 3 misdemeanor, which carries a maximum fine of \$500, to a Class 1 misdemeanor, which carries a maximum penalty of twelve months in jail and a \$2,500 fine. Over the next several weeks the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office will conduct an education phase prior to any citations issued for violations of the ordinance. Warnings will be issued to educate residents on noise levels that are now in violation of the county code. During the education phase, repeat violators may be subject to a citation after their initial warning.

Since the Virginia Supreme Court struck down the noise ordinance of the City of Virginia Beach (which was very similar to the former Chapter 654.02) as unconstitutionally vague, the county has lacked an enforceable ordinance addressing noise. The amendments to Chapter 654.02 establish a clear definition of what constitutes noise, requiring that the sound be audible and discernable inside a residential dwelling. The amended regulations may be found online here. For more information about enforcement of the new regulations, visit www.sheriff.loudoun.gov/noise-ordinance.

The Board of Supervisors also is currently considering changes to the Noise Standards section of the county's Zoning Ordinance. Unlike the noise regulations enforced by the Sheriff's Office, the Zoning Ordinance primarily regulates noise from commercial and other non-residential uses. The Board is scheduled to take action on the proposed Zoning Ordinance amendment at its business meeting on September 22, 2016. More information is online at https://www.loudoun.gov/NoiseZOAM.

Goodbye Summer continued from page 5 Broadlands has three underground tunnels to help keep our residents safe; one on Claiborne Parkway connecting Hillside Elementary with Harvest Glen Court, another on Claiborne Parkway which connects the Nature Center with Village Drive, and a third on Waxpool connecting the Community Center with the LeFevre Stone House. We encourage all bicycle and pedestrian traffic to utilize the tunnels rather than cross these main roads. Heritage Landscape Services sweeps each tunnel for debris and graffiti every Monday in conjunction with their trash removal to help keep these tunnels clean and safe for school children as well as the walkers, runners, and bikers who regularly use the path. If you are aware of an unsafe or vulgar condition in the tunnels, please report them the HOA office at 703-729-9704.

If you have a child attending school this year, please be sure to check out the article on page 17 all about back to school safety. The HOA has agreed that the Nature Center can be used as an official safe house for the schools in case of an emergency. We are open Monday through Friday from 9am-5pm, with staff members available to assist in contacting the police in case of an emergency. Please stop by to ensure that your child knows where we are located. They may want to stop by regularly on their way home from school just to visit our friendly



# BACK TO SCHOOL

#### BEFORE THE BELL RINGS: BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY

As boys and girls throughout the community sharpen their pencils and get ready to head back to class, it's important to ensure they have a safe school year. Here are some tips on how your family can be proactive and avoid potentially harmful situations:

- Make sure your school has your child's updated emergency contact information. Write down any specific instructions that should be followed in case of an emergency, and have the school keep them in your child's file.
- Talk to your child's teachers before classes start and alert them to any medical issues your child has. Also, explain to the teacher what he or she should do if the medical issues arise—such as an allergic reaction, asthma attack or seizure—

- and provide school personnel with emergency medication such as EpiPens® (Épinephrine Auto-Injectors) and inhalers.
- Help your children memorize important phone numbers so that they know how to get in touch with you and other trusted adults. Also, make sure those numbers are programmed into their cell phones, or provide them with a list of phone numbers that they can keep in their backpacks or wallets at all times.
- Let your children know exactly who they can go home with after school if their regular ride can't pick them up, and make sure they know not to accept rides from people who aren't on the list.
- If your children will be walking to school, walk the route with them

- several times before classes start to make sure they understand traffic laws and can walk the route on their own. Also, find a friend or sibling they can walk with, and make sure they always use the buddy system.
- Show your children which houses or offices in the neighborhood they can go to in case no one is at home after school. The HOA has agreed that the Nature Center can be used as an official safe house for the schools in case of an emergency.
- Report reckless drivers to the police to help make sure the neighborhood remains safe, particularly during times when kids are going to and returning from school.

We are inundated with injured and lost animals, particularly in the spring, that are brought to the Nature Center. Until now we have redirected you, the members of our community, to the Wildlife Rescue League, (703) 440-0800.

But the reality is that rehabilitation centers throughout Virginia are overwhelmed with birds with broken wings, turtles that have wandered from their water source, and run-over but still fighting for life raccoons, foxes, and baby deer.

We are creating a league of experts for our community in animal rehabilitation response. You will be the first responders when an animal is lost or injured in our community. Dr. Burwell of Wildlife Veterinary Care is coming to provide the training for this work. To sign up visit: broadlandshoa.org/event/animalrehab

She will provide the emergency response training for animals in need and will give us checklists of whether the animal should be returned to the wild, taken to a care provider, or cared for locally.

Many of you contact us with care for the animals in our community. This is your chance to learn the skills needed to be a first responder, and to make our community more friendly to all the things that fly, swim, and creep upon the earth.



#### Parmesan Chicken Nuggets

- 2 lbs. boneless/skinless chicken breasts (or tenderloins), cut into pieces
- 1 Cup milk
- 1 egg
- 1 Cup gluten-free bread crumbs
- 1/2 Cup Parmesan cheese, grated
- 1 tsp seasoning salt, i.e. Lawry's Seasoned Salt

Preheat oven to 350° F. In a medium bowl, whisk together the milk with the egg. Cut chicken breasts into bite size pieces and place in the bowl to soak. In a large bowl, or gallon-size zip-style bag, mix together the bread crumbs, grated Parmesan cheese, and seasoning salt. #### Zucchini Cakes

4 medium zucchini
2 large shallots
1/2 cup diced parsley
1/2 cup diced basil
2 large eggs
1/3 cup grated Parmesan cheese
Salt & pepper to taste
2 tablespoons olive oil
Lemon juice for flavor

Shred zucchini into colander. Shred or mince shallots and add to zucchini. Add 1/2 teaspoon salt to zucchini mixture and mix well. Leave out (over a bowl) for 2 to 4 hours to drain liquid. Put zucchini, a few handfuls at a time, in a clean kitchen towel and squeeze out as much liquid as possible. Beat eggs in large bowl; add zucchini, parsley, basil, cheese and salt and pepper. If still a little wet, add 1 to 2 tablespoons of gluten-free flour and mix well. Place mixture back into colander. Heat a non-stick frying pan or grill pan, add olive oil to pan. Using a scoop or 1/3 cup measuring cup, add zucchini mixture to hot pan, flatten slightly and cook until golden. Drizzle with a little more olive oil and sprinkle with salt and turn over to cook until brown on second side. When done, remove from pan and place on cooling rack. Squeeze lemon juice for added flavor. Provided by Marcia Adams

#### Othellos - Yummy Chocolate Chips Cookies

8 oz. bittersweet chocolate, chopped - for melting

- 2 tablespoon unsalted butter
- 3 tablespoon gluten-free Flour
- ¼ teaspoon Baking Powder
- 2 extra large eggs, at room temperature
- 2/3 cups sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 2/3 cups (10oz) semisweet chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 350. Melt bittersweet chocolate and butter in a double boiler. Let cool slightly. Combine flour and baking powder. Combine egg, sugar, and vanilla extract. Beat until light and fluffy. Fold in melted chocolate mixture, then the flour mixture, then the chocolate chips. Don't overmix. Scoop mounds of batter onto prepared baking sheets



(parchment or foil), approximately 1 tablespoon placed 1.5 inches apart. Bake for 6 minutes. Then turn sheet 180 degrees, continue to bake until tops appear dry - approximately 3-5 minutes.
