


PIRANHAS Swim Team Open Registration Begins Online MONDAY, FEBRUARY 9th, 2009.



2008-2009 Snow Removal Guidelines

Within this section, you will find a list of streets indicating which entity is responsible for snow removal. *Please reference this list to determine who to call with snow removal concerns.* Broadlands Association provides snow removal for the private streets that have been completed by the builder and are owned by the Association. As the public streets in the single family home sections are accepted into the state road system, they will be maintained by the Virginia Dept. of Transportation (VDOT). Owners in new construction areas in Broadlands should contact their builder, Van Metre, unless their section/street is included in the HOA or VDOT areas to plow. Major roadways such as Claiborne Parkway, Demott Drive, Vestals Gap Drive, Ellzey Drive, Chickacoan Trail Drive, Glebe View Drive, Truro Parish Drive and Route 625 (Waxpool Road) are considered priority snow removal routes. After these roadways are cleared, work will begin on the secondary residential streets.

Snow plowing is to begin after there has been an accumulation of 2 inches of snow. Sand and/or chemicals will be used at critical intersections and as needed on streets.


In addition, there is a Loudoun County ordinance (Chapter 1022) that requires the owner/occupant of a property which has a public sidewalk adjoining or touching the property in front, rear or either side, to clear or treat that sidewalk for snow and ice within 6 hours of a snowfall (by 12:00 noon for overnight snowfall). Property owners abutting common areas (i.e. along Ellzey Drive) are also responsible for clearing those sidewalks. This will provide a safe walkway for children going to school. The County Department of Building and Development is responsible for enforcement of this ordinance.

Broadlands Association Board of Directors Meeting November 11, 2008 Board Actions

The meeting was called to order at 5:33p.m. with the following Board members in attendance:

Cliff Keirce Brian Beahm Denise Harrover Staci Kapinos Eric Bazerghi (via speaker phone) Mark McIntosh Tom Marable Wes Schroeder, General Manager Three Homeowners

Cliff Keirce moved to approve the minutes from the October 14, 2008 Board Meeting with an amendment to Item M and was seconded by Brian Beahm. The motion was approved 6/0/1 with Mark McIntosh abstaining.

Staci Kapinos brought up a request from staff to increase the newsletter's classified advertising pricing for 2009 approximately 12%. This is in line with other community newsletters in the area. Staci Kapinos moved to increase the classified advertising pricing for the newsletter approximately 12%. Brian Beahm seconded the motion. The motion passed 7/0/0.

Tom Marable notified the Board that Wynridge Drive was to be paved beginning November 12th and striping was scheduled for the following Wednesday. Cliff Keirce and Denise Harrover reported they had attended the CAI Leadership Conference.

A homeowner attended the meeting requesting clarification regarding his compliance with the Board's suggested remedy and whether compliance would release him from further claims regarding the issue. He was informed that was the Board's intention and Management was directed to draft a letter stating compliance would resolve the issue with the Board of Directors but any future modifications were a separate issue.

Ridgeway Drive and various methods to ease traffic and speeding were discussed. Laurier Drive's use as a cutthrough and whether it could be closed were also discussed.

Additional website advertising was still being discussed and information was being gathered by the Technology Committee.

Brian Beahm moved to adopt additional portions of the following roads: Broadlands Boulevard, Claiborne Parkway, Shellhorn Road, Waxpool Road, Truro Parish Road and Glebe View Road in its entirety. Staci Kapinos seconded the motion. The motion passed 6/0/0.

Denise Harrover moved to approve the proposal submitted by Hadsell Sun & Shade to install the pool covers at the Summerbrooke main and wading pool. Staci Kapinos seconded the motion. The motion passed 6/0/1 with Eric Bazerghi abstaining.

The Board members who attended the meeting with the trash companies reported on their impressions from the meeting and current and proposed pricing was compared. Staci Kapinos moved to approve Patriot Disposal's proposal to be the Association's trash contractor starting April 1, 2009 for a period of three years. Eric Bazerghi seconded the motion. The motion passed 6/0/1 with Denise Harrover abstaining.

The Board expressed a preference towards switching pond maintenance companies but requested clarification regarding the meaning of minor maintenance of the aeration system at the Nature Center Pond.

After Management's report of its review of settlement sheets Brian Beahm moved to assess the homeowners on Thornblade Circle the Single Family Private Street rate as of October 1, 2008. Prior assessments will remain at the rate assessed. The motion was seconded by Denise Harrover. The motion passed 6/1/0 with Cliff Keirce dissenting.

Ten hearing notices were sent to be heard at the meeting. Four violations were for Trash cans in view, four were for lawn maintenance, one for an inoperative lamp post and one for a derelict vehicle. Five homeowners resolved the issue prior to the meeting and one gave a completion date of 11/30/2008. The Board authorized following normal assessment of charges procedures for the remaining violations.

The Board of Directors reviewed the draft budget submitted and made some minor changes to the budget. Staci Kapinos moved to approve the budget as amended. Eric Bazerghi seconded the motion and it passed 7/0/0.

Staci Kapinos moved to approve the Earth Day Resolution submitted by Oya Simpson of the Habitat Committee as amended. Eric Bazerghi seconded the motion and it passed 7/0/0.

Staci Kapinos left the meeting at 7:00p.m. continued on page 24

There is a drop box available for after-hours submissions. A response to your application is generally mailed within one week of the meeting.

"Free Security Scan" Could Cost Time and Money

Messages telling you to install and update security software for your computer seem to be everywhere. So you might be tempted by an offer of a "free security scan," especially when faced with a pop-up, an email, or an ad that claims "malicious software" has already been found on your machine. Unfortunately, it's likely that the scary message is a come-on for a rip-off.

The free scan claims to find a host of problems, and within seconds, you're getting urgent pop-ups to buy security software. After you agree to spend \$40 or more on the software, the program tells you that your problems are fixed. The reality: there was nothing to fix. And what's worse, the program now installed on your computer could be harmful.

According to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), scammers have found ways to create realistic but phony "security alerts." Though the "alerts" look like they're being generated by your computer, they actually are created by a con artist and sent through your Internet browser.

These programs are called "scareware" because they exploit a person's fear of online viruses and security threats. The scam has many variations, but there are some telltale signs. For example:

- you may get ads that promise to "delete viruses or spyware," "protect privacy," "improve computer function," "remove harmful files," or "clean your registry;"
- you may get "alerts" about "malicious software" or "illegal pornography on your computer;"
- you may be invited to download free software for a security scan or to improve your system;
- you could get pop-ups that claim your security software is out-of-date and your computer is in immediate danger;
- you may suddenly encounter an unfamiliar website that claims to have performed a security scan and prompts you to download new software.

Scareware purveyors also go to great lengths to make their product and service look legitimate. For example, if you buy the software, you may get an email receipt with a customer service phone number. If you call, you're likely to be connected to someone, but that alone does not mean the company is legitimate. Regardless, remember that these are well-organized and profitable schemes designed to rip people off.

How Do the Scammers Do It?

Scareware schemes can be quite sophisticated. The scam artists buy ad space on trusted, popular websites. Even though the ads look legitimate and harmless to the website's operator, they actually redirect unsuspecting visitors to a fraudulent website that performs a bogus security scan. The site then causes a barrage of urgent pop-up messages that pressure users into downloading worthless software.

What to Do

If you're faced with any of the warning signs of a scareware scam or suspect a problem, shut down your browser. Don't click "No" or "Cancel," or even the "x" at the top right corner of the screen. Some scareware is designed so that any of those buttons can activate the program. If you use Windows, press Ctrl + Alt + Delete to open your Task Manager, and click "End Task." If you use a Mac, press Command + Option + Q + Esc to "Force Quit."

If you get an offer, check out the program by entering the name in a search engine. The results can help you determine if the program is on the up-and-up. *continued on page 33*

Soon winter weather will hit Loudoun County and it will be time to let birds know you want their business. The best time to start feeding them is in the fall so they can become familiar with your backyard. However it's never too late to help our feathered friends.

Attract birds to your yard by providing seed mixtures, and seed specifics like thistle, safflower and sunflower seeds. Birds also like to eat suet, fruit and grains.

A constant source of fresh water is important as well. Provide it by placing a plastic tub, plant saucer etc...out in the open. Water levels should not be deeper the 2-3 inches

and should be cleaned frequently. Make sure there is shrubbery at least 15 feet away from the feeder to provide birds with cover and places to perch and preen.

Consider placing various kinds of shelter opportunities in your backyard. Brush piles and evergreen or deciduous shrubs are great windbreaks, perches and possible food sources. Provide nesting material like yarn, string, hair or feathers in your backyard. Hang them on a railing or place them in an onion bag.

Place nest boxes for wrens, chickadees, bluebirds,titmice, house finches and wood peckers in your yard. Make sure the placement and dimensions of the box are correct for each individual bird.



The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling Ashburn Village Animal Hospital "Pinching Pennies on Your Pets"

With the economy the way it is, we're all watching where our dollars go. That goes for pet care, too. By focusing on prevention, you will keep your pet healthy and avoid expensive procedures without sacrificing Fluffy or Fido's health.

Here are some tips:

Keep pets fit and trim – Many pets we see are overweight, and that extra weight increases the chance of some serious health threats such as arthritis, diabetes, or cancer. To help maintain a normal weight on your pal (you know when you can feel the ribs on your dog, or see a waist line on your cat), make sure to measure your pet's food (with an actual measuring cup – not a "coffee can"!), minimize the treats, and work in a daily exercise regimen.

Do It Yourself - You can learn basic grooming at home, from bathing to nail trims. Don't know how? Ask your groomer or vet how they do it and you can

save some money! Also, learn to brush your pet's teeth, or find the right chew toys to use to lengthen the time between potentially pricey cleanings.

Buy Smart- You can still buy toys for Shadow or Sadie, but you don't need to get designer clothes, collars or pillows. Also, when getting food or litter, buy in bulk to take advantage of the savings, and store the product in airtight containers.

Work with your Vet- Ask your vet if Bowzer or Brenda need all the shots that they are recommending (but don't stop going in at least once a year). Wellness exams can spot problems when they are smaller and usually easier to treat. And ask your veterinarian to write prescriptions for expensive medications that can be filled at wholesale places like Costco, or to prescribe the generic form when possible. Finally, take advantage of monthly specials that some veterinarians offer. Be Prepared - Pet insurance is growing in popularity because many people don't want the cost of treating their four-legged friend to dictate whether they seek veterinary care or not. There are many different plans and options (I like Pets Best Insurance personally), so check them out before deciding.

I hope you all are weathering the financial storms we're going through, and I wish all of you a happy and healthy holiday season, and all the best for 2009!


In Need of a Long Winter's Nap? By Shannon Pecora, M.A. Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

The kids have a couple of days or weeks before they have to go back to school or college, and maybe you were able to take a bit of time off work, too. You want nothing more than to plop down on the sofa and enjoy a mindless movie or a good book.

After all, shopping, party planning, schedule-coordinating, and traveling have left many of us pretty darn frazzled by January 2nd, and we deserve a relaxing break. Our families have earned it! But don't forget your family pets—our holiday stress can rub off on them as well. If you've had a house full of guests or an unusual vacation schedule, you may notice that Polly Parrot is molting, Tabby won't come out from under the bed, or Fido has been nervously licking his right front paw. You could find that your pets appear stressed and depressed, and you'll need to help them wind down, too. As Economy Sinks, Demand Rises at Loudoun Community Health Center Community Support Sought

The demand for the Loudoun Community Health Center's medical services has increased significantly over the past three months, largely due to the economic downturn that has left many people unemployed or without benefits due to employer cut-backs.

The health center's patient population has risen from 1,200 people a year ago to more than 5,000 patients today. With the demand for its low-cost medical services growing daily, the community health center, which receives no federal or state funding, is in dire need of contributions to help keep up with the increasing number of people who would not otherwise be able to afford to see a doctor. "We are tangibly seeing the effects of the national economic crisis right here in Loudoun County, the wealthiest county in the nation," said Debra Dever, CEO of the Loudoun Community Health Center.

As a result, the Loudoun Community Health Center today announced a special fundraising appeal to help provide medical care for needy Loudoun residents. The health center provides medical care to anyone in need, regardless of their ability to pay, whether they have insurance or not. Unlike the local free clinic, which only treats adults between the ages of 18 and 64, the Loudoun Community Health Center is the only charity in the area caring for patients of all ages, including children and senior citizens. Since opening in May 2007, more than 1,600 children, most from low-income families, have been cared for, and 500 of those are babies under the age of 1. Approximately 40-50 newborns are seen every month at LCHC.

According to Dever, the goal is to raise \$300,000 before the end of 2008. Donations will be used to provide medical care to low-income and uninsured residents of Loudoun County. "Donors will make an immediate impact on our medically underserved neighbors, which is a very rewarding feeling," said Dever.

"As Loudoun's newest charity, we are filling a void not offered by other organizations in the community," said Dr. Lauren Cianciaruso, Chief Medical Officer at LCHC. "Our patients tend to have more complex health problems because they have put off seeing a doctor until a problem can no longer be ignored. Now that LCHC is here to help them, these people can finally afford to seek medical care."

The Library Corner January 2009

The New Year brings cold weather and opportunities. The county faces a budget crisis, and the Loudoun County Library Board of Trustees has been asked to approve drastic cuts to programs, personnel, collections and even libraries by the County Administrator as options for the Supervisors.

In difficult economic times, Libraries are a refuge, a source of solace, free services and learning, and a resource to find employment. Our library system was recently ranked tenth in the nation in our population category by Hennen American Public Library Rankings (www.haplr.com), a ranking we've earned three times before. Our excellent librarians and staff are the backbone of our success. The Library, as with all other departments in the county, has been asked to submit the preferred scenarios to cut 5%, 10%, 15%, 20% and 30% from our current costs. Due to the predominance of personnel related costs in our budgets, we will have no alternative but to cut staff, cut hours and reduce the collection to achieve even moderate budget reductions. The entire library budget is less than one percent of the entire county budget. At a 20% reduction, we lose 37 positions, we can only stay open eight hours per day and close Sundays and we must cut our collection budget by almost \$350,000. At a 30% cut, we lose a total of 65 positions, and must go to a five day, 40 hour week or close two of our eight branches. The residents of the county deserve better than that. If you value the programs and services offered by your library, you have the opportunity to help. You must write to the Board of Supervisors at bos@loudoun.gov and urge them not to cut the library budget as part of the overall reduction in the County budget process.

Recipes Fit For the President and Perfect For Super Bowl Sunday

Barack's Chili

"I've been using this chili recipe since college and would bring it to any potluck. I can't reveal all the secrets, but if you make it right, it's just got the right amount of bite, the right amount of oomph in it and it will clear your sinuses."

Add red wine vinegar, tomatoes and let simmer, until tomatoes cook down. Add kidney beans and cook for a few more minutes. Serve over white or brown rice. Garnish with grated cheddar cheese, onions and sour cream.

For the Garlic Butter:

- 1 head garlic 1 stick unsalted butter, softened
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- 1 teaspoon champagne vinegar Kosher salt



breathe and direct our focus on our own well-being. Repeat after me, "It is ok to do something good for me."


Some quick tips to keep you honest:



Low Light, Low Maintenance House Plants

I must confess, I like to watch Home & Garden TV. You can pick up some useful ideas from many of the shows. An opinion held by many of the realtors on these shows who are appraising homes for their value or to put on the market is to get rid of any artificial plants and replace them with beautiful living plants. Of course this is TV you know, they are telling you how to stage your home to sell it and are not worried about the ongoing maintenance of a live plant!

Even though I am a horticulturist, indoor plants are not my favorites. I much prefer an expensive artificial look-a-like that you just need to dust a couple of times a year! I struggle with the potted plants that I over-winter inside each year. By the time spring rolls around, they are looking pretty sad and are in desperate need of light and some fresh soil & fertilizer.

That said, houseplants can be beautiful & can help reduce indoor air pollution. The best way to avoid problems is to select plants that are tolerant of interior conditions. Below is a short list of some houseplants that are pretty much foolproof.

Janet Craig Dracena - Dracaena deremensis "Janet Craig". All members of this genus have excellent tolerance to low light and humidity, but Janet Craig is absolutely the best. Its decorative dark green, strap-like leaves are 12-18" long and 2-3" wide and will fill the need for dark foliage in any interior.

Heartleaf Philodendron - *Philodendron scandens oxycardium*. This plant can survive for long periods under very low light conditions. For this reason, it can be found growing in almost any office. It's often planted in a jar of water or in a dish garden. Potting soil and a pot with a hole in the bottom to ensure good drainage would be better, but the fact that Heartleaf Philodendron does well even with adverse root environments indicates just how tough it is.

Devil's Ivy - *Epiprenum aureum*. This plant looks a lot like Heartleaf Philodendron and, in fact, is often called "Philodendron". To further confuse matters, it is also called "Pothos". But, whatever you call it, it is easy to grow. This plant can also be grown in water. The best variety of Devil's Ivy is "Marblequeen". The leaves of this variety are variegated and the variegation is more intense in bright light.


Snake Plant – *Sanseveria* (various species). Another common name for this plant is mother-in-law's tongue. This may be the toughest plant on the list. It, too, can tolerate low light and humidity. The leaves are thick and leathery, so it is also able to withstand occasional dry periods. There are two common forms of Snake Plant — one that makes a compact rosette of leaves and one that makes a tall erect plant. There are varieties with silvery horizontal leaf bands, entirely green leaves, or bright yellow leaf margins.

Cast Iron Plant - *Aspidistra elationr*. This plant earned its reputation for toughness during the Victorian Era. Its ability to survive cold, dimly lit rooms, and the fumes of coal gas made it a very popular plant. It is a slow grower with long dark green or green and white striped leaves. The variegated variety requires medium to bright light to maintain its variegation.

Remember, all plants must have some light; however, the above plants require low light and very little care. Over or under-watering is a major problem with houseplants. You should use the "finger method" to tell when the plant needs water. For a 8" container stick your index finger in the growing media up to the first joint. If the soil is moist, no water is needed. If it is dry you should add enough water so that about 10% comes out the bottom of the container. Houseplants should only be fertilized when they are actively growing. Those growing in very low light can actually be damaged from over-fertilization. For information on culture of indoor plants go to: <u>http://www.ext.vt.edu/pubs/envirohort/426-100/426-100.pdf</u>.

The security software that was installed on your computer when you bought it generally works for just a short time — unless you pay a subscription fee to keep it in effect. 
