



### Luis Rosado and Son Broadlands 2010 Tennis Programs

Luis Rosado and Junne Choi were awarded the Broadlands tennis contract for the 2010 tennis season. In the spring, Luis and Junne will host junior and adult tennis programs to introduce the Broadlands Community to the sport in a fun, group environment. The programs offer athletic instruction, games and social activities and are organized by local USPTA certified tennis-teaching professionals.

### Luis Rosado - Tennis Professional

Luis has been involved with tennis for over 20 years, first as a player and then as a teaching professional. Luis has taught tennis in Mexico, Florida, New York, North Carolina, Maryland and Virginia. He was a nationally ranked top 4 in Mexico (18 years & under) and played tournaments in Europe and South America. After receiving a full scholarship and playing the #1 spot for James Madison University, Luis graduated with a bachelor's degree in Finance. His mission is to "give people the opportunity to learn about tennis, a sport that can help them in many ways."

### Junne Choi - Tennis Professional

Junne has taught junior programs at the Fairfax Racquet Club. He taught from Quickstart (4-5 year olds) to Team Classes (High School age kids) and has spent extensive time teaching the fundamentals: proper technique, footwork, and basic strategy. Junne's mentors are two well known top class instructors: Roy Coopersmith (taught Jelena Jankovic-WTA #1 and Jamea Jackson-WTA #58) and Gene Russo who was a Wimbledon Doubles Quarterfinalist. Junne played two years as #1 in singles for the USTA League Team. His team made 2009 USTA Districts. He also played GMU Club Tennis.

The Tennis Programs, a series of high-energy, on-court tennis activities for children ages 3 to 13, teens ages 14 to 17 and adults, will run from March through November 2010, with the first 8 week session scheduled from March 22 through May 16. Beginner students will learn basic tennis and motor skills that will develop a good foundation of footwork and proper stroke mechanics. Intermediate students will learn to rally and develop match play habits and knowledge. Advanced Intermediate students will learn to play "Real Tennis" through drills that will develop footwork, strategy and consistency at full court.

### **Neighborhood Watch**

As you begin a new year and put the holidays behind us, remember, thieves are still afoot. When discarding boxes and wrapping from the holidays, please keep in mind that you do not want to advertise what you may have received as gifts. Burglars will watch trash to gain information concerning items of interest. By watching the outgoing trash, burglars can plan their crime to take expensive items such an HD television. By following a few easy tips you can make it more difficult for burglars to know what valuable items can be found in your home:

1) Cut boxes down and place in garbage bags.

2) Do not place trash out at the curb until the morning when trash pickup is taking place.

3) Keep instruction manuals in a safe location. Do not discard right away.

4) Report any suspicious persons you may see in your neighborhood.

Additionally, please be sure to check your credit and debit card statements very carefully. The holidays always bring an influx of identity theft and credit card theft incidents. In many cases, victims of identity and credit card theft are not aware of the theft for months. This is especially true during the holidays when we make so many purchases in such a short period of time. Also, January is an excellent time to run your annual free credit report and look for any unusual accounts or inquiries. Remember: The sooner these types of crime are detected, the faster the matter can be corrected. The more monetary damage that is done, the more paperwork and time it will take to get the matter resolved with financial institutions.

### Help Make Snow Plowing Easier and Faster

When a snow storm has been predicted, especially overnight, the snow plows will be working during the early morning hours. The best way to ensure that the plowing crews can clear the streets better and faster is to park in driveways and parking spaces. In many of the townhouse and private streets sections, a vehicle parked in the street can severely restrict the ability of the plows to do their work.

Help your community by parking in garages, driveways and marked parking spaces. Thank you for your assistance.

### Winter is Here - Please be Prepared!

Both Virginia and Loudoun County Codes require that the occupant - whether an owner or a tenant - remove all snow and ice from any walkway adjoining any part of their property within 6 hours after the snowfall has ceased.

If the snow or ice fell during the night, it must be removed by noon the following day. Should the storm occur on Sunday, the accumulation must be removed by noon on Monday. Failure to comply with the Code can result in a fine of \$250.00 imposed by the county.

Please be a good neighbor and a good citizen, clear your walkways and keep Broadlands a safe environment for all our residents. If you know someone who may be physically unable to keep their walkway clear, please consider giving them a helping hand.

### Notes from Your Neighbors...... Ashburn Volunteer Fire Rescue Department www.ashburnfirerescue.org

No matter your age, everyone should have a fire escape plan that they've prepared and practiced with all members of the household.

- You should have two ways out of every room in your home.
- Practice your plan during the day and even hold one drill at night to see if everyone wakes up to the sound of the smoke alarm.
- Clear the way:

- If there is a fire, you may have as little as 3 to 3 minutes to get your family to safety. You have to snap into action and get You have to snap into action and get out fast! Keep your exit routes clear at all times. routes clear at all times.

- Move everything off the stairs and out of the way. Make sure all doors and windows open easily.

- For the hearing impaired, there are special smoke alarms that vibrate or have lights that flash to alert someone of a potential fire. There are also special alarm systems that can alert fire departments of a fire or other problems if an older adult or disabled person lives by themselves.
- For both young children and older adults, assign an adult to each person that needs help getting out.

### Broadlands Parking Rules Enforcement to Begin March 1, 2010

The Broadlands HOA has contracted with Battlefield Towing to enforce the HOA parking rules and regulations starting March 1st 2010. Please become familiar with the Broadlands parking rules and regulations below to avoid being towed.

### **Broadlands Parking Rules and Regulations**

- No vehicle may be parked in a Fire Lane or in violation of any posted sign.
- Vehicles cannot be parked in a manner that obstructs vehicular or pedestrian traffic or on a sidewalk or any grassy or landscaped area. Cars parked in driveways but completely blocking the sidewalk are subject to towing.
- Commercial vehicles, school buses, church buses, recreational vehicles of any type boats, campers, motor homes and/or any vehicle which could not normally be used for daily transportation - may not be parked or stored in open view of any residential property, residential streets or open space or other Common area.
- Junk or derelict vehicles may not be parked or stored in open view of any residential property, residential streets or open space or other Common area.
- Vehicles must conform to all State and County codes, ordinances and statutes with regard to stickers, registrations and certifications.
- Vehicles may not be parked with any type of "For Sale" sign displayed on the vehicle on any roadways
  or common area.
- Vehicles may not park within ten feet on either side of a mailbox.

Vehicles parked in violation of any of these regulations may be towed at the owner's sole risk and expense. If you have any questions regarding parking in the Broadlands please call the HOA office at 703-729-9704 Monday through Friday from 9 am to 5 pm. Should your vehicle be towed, you must contact Battlefield Towing directly at (703) 378-0059.

Any vehicle parked in violation of state, local or HOA regulations is subject to towing. Offending vehicles parked on VDOT roads can be towed by order of the Loudoun County Sheriff's Department. Offending vehicles parked on HOA maintained roads and parking lots can be towed by order of the Broadlands Homeowners' Association. Private HOA maintained roads are listed below.

### 2009-2010 Snow Removal Guidelines

Within this section, you will find a list of streets indicating which entity is responsible for snow removal. *Please reference this list to determine who to call with snow removal concerns.* Broadlands Association provides snow removal for the private streets that have been completed by the builder and are owned by the Association. As the public streets in the single family home sections are accepted into the state road system, they will be maintained by the Virginia Dept. of Transportation (VDOT). Any new construction areas in Broadlands would contact their builder, Van Metre, unless their section/street is included in the HOA or VDOT areas to plow. Major roadways such as Claiborne Parkway, Demott Drive, Vestals Gap Drive, Ellzey Drive, Chickacoan Trail Drive, Glebe View Drive, Truro Parish Drive and Route 625 (Waxpool Road) are considered priority snow removal routes. After these roadways are cleared, work will begin on the secondary residential streets.

Snow plowing is to begin after there has been an accumulation of 2 inches of snow. Sand and/or chemicals will be used at critical intersections and as needed on streets.

In addition, there is a Loudoun County ordinance (Chapter 1022) that requires the owner/occupant of a property which has a public sidewalk adjoining or touching the property in front, rear or either side, to clear or treat that sidewalk for snow and ice within 6 hours of a snowfall (by 12:00 noon for overnight snowfall). Property owners abutting common areas (i.e. along Ellzey Drive) are also responsible for clearing those sidewalks. This will provide a safe walkway for children going to school. The County Department of Building and Development is responsible for enforcement of this ordinance.

### The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling "Family Feud, Part 2"

Angus and Eddie, two tabby cats, didn't get along. Angus would stalk Eddie all the time, including when Eddie would try to eat, sleep, or go to the litter box. Eddie got to hiding in Mr. and Mrs. Jones' bedroom, and that's also where he decided to "relieve" himself. That's about the time when Mrs. Jones gave us a call here at the animal hospital.


Last month's article dealt with interdog aggression, and as you can tell from above, this month's article deals with intercat aggression. There are many different types of aggressive behavior in cats, including blocking access to territory, staring, chasing, hissing, growling, biting and of course attacking. This can lead a "victim" cat to hide, stop eating, or stop grooming, for example. Litter box use by all cats should be examined since social issues (along with medical) often contribute to non-litter box usage (as in the above case). Further, in order to achieve a diagnosis and then hopefully a resolution, the aggressive behavior should be categorized into territorial, social status, redirected (as when an indoor aggressor cat sees a stray cat outside the window, then "takes it out" on the victim cat), fear, defensive, offensive or intermale. As you can see, with so many different scenarios, a history of the behavior is imperative. We typically ask people to fill out a 2-3 page history of what's been happening at home. Once that is in place, then we can see how to solve the problem. For instance, in territorial disputes, one cat will usually chase another. This may result in one cat living in a restricted area to keep away from the aggressor. Therefore, it may be necessary to create separate areas for food, resting places, and litter boxes for each cat in order to create harmony. Cats don't usually share space equally, so this can be a challenge for people. It also helps for the aggressor to wear a quick release elastic collar with a bell on it to forewarn the victim of their approach and thus allow escape. When territorial aggression is severe, cats may need to be separated at all times to avoid injury, or alternate living arrangements found for one of the cats.

Fortunately for Mr. and Mrs. Jones, we were able to get Angus and Eddie to get along through a combination of separation, synthetic pheromones (Feliway aerosols), and time. There were controlled interactions, and after 3 months, Angus stopped beating up on poor Eddie. Yay! If you are having any frustrated feline issues, give us a call.

p.s. After a fight, be careful if you pick up your cat. They may be so agitated that doing so may trigger your kitty to lash out at you! It's better to throw a big blanket over your cat and then pick it up.



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### Crisis at the Loudoun Museum

The Loudoun Museum is facing a critical situation. Issues with the museum's historic building, built in the 1840s, require that the museum finds a new place to store its collection of 7600 historic artifacts documenting the county's past.

This crisis could not come at a worse time. The economic situation is well known by everyone, and the Town and County budgets are stretched past their limits. The Town is making improvements to the building, but the building's age and construction cannot accommodate the weight of these irreplaceable treasures.

For 42 years, residents of Loudoun County have donated priceless family heirlooms to the museum for safe keeping. Artifacts include documents, quilts, clothing, furniture, farm implements, tools, paintings, weapons, and photographs.

The museum must find a secure, climate-controlled storage facility of 1200 - 1400 square feet. Without this storage space, the museum will no longer be able to preserve this precious collection. The worse case situation is the collection will have to be dispersed and the treasures of Loudoun's past will be lost forever. The Loudoun Museum is an independent 501(c)3; all donations are tax deductible to the full extent allowed by law.

### Fresh Ideas for the New Year By: Nan McCarry - Audubon Naturalist

For your New Year's resolution, try getting more outdoor exercise and giving back to the community.

One of my favorite volunteer opportunities is the Loudoun Amphibian Monitoring Program through Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy. Citizens monitor amphibian populations as they emerge for the breeding season—which, you may be surprised to know, starts in February for the earliest breeders such as the wood frog. Monitoring is done either by driving a specific route and stopping to listen for calls, or adopting a site and checking it periodically for signs of amphibians. Even a ditch can be a nice breeding ground for some amphibians.

The data that we "citizen scientists" collect is useful to scientists in keeping track of the distribution of amphibians. This is important because amphibians are greatly affected by changes in habitat and other environmental changes. In fact, they are called "environmental indicators," which means that they are particularly sensitive to pollution.

Monitoring species such as amphibians can be a relaxing, almost meditative activity. It's nice to get out and smell the evening air. If you're interested in amphibian monitoring, go to http://www.loudounwildlife.org/Amphibian\_Monitoring.htm to find out more.

Other citizen science opportunities, which you may already be familiar with, are bluebird nestbox monitoring (http://www.loudounwildlife.org/Bluebird\_Monitoring.htm) and stream monitoring (http://www.loudounwildlife.org/Stream\_Monitoring.htm).

Habitat restoration is an important community service that requires only a few hours of your time. Restoring habitat usually involves planting trees and bushes along streams—enhancing the "riparian buffers" that control erosion and hold back pollutants from entering the streams. To find out when a habitat restoration project is planned you can check http://www.loudounwildlife.org/Habitat\_Restoration.htm.

You'll be able to enter specific criteria about what you're looking for in an outing and the system will display suitable choices.

resting place is marked by the memorial stone pictured here. She is greatly missed.

### The (Pet) Healthcare Debate by Shannon M. Pecora, M.A. **Stream Valley Veterinary** Hospital



If you're lucky enough to have a great insurance plan, you can feel safe with the knowledge that a \$25 copay and a \$10

prescription fee will be all that you need if you suffer an illness or injury. But with all that we've heard and seen in the news over the past year or so, we know this isn't the case for everyone. Our own healthcare is a big enough challenge that, if someone were to ask how we plan for our pets' healthcare, we may not be able to answer.

It's always a good idea to save and budget for routine veterinary visits: semi-annual exams, vaccines, lab work, and preventives. Pet insurance, from agencies such as VPI or the ASPCA, can help you manage these and other costs, sometimes including spay or neuter surgery, dental cleanings, or emergency visits. Coverage will depend on the policy you choose. So, again, if you have a sound insurance plan, medical bills (even for your pets) aren't particularly worrisome.

However, pet insurance may not cover all procedures or treatments. Or, you may not have pet insurance anyway. Then one day, your cat becomes blocked, your dog eats a pair of socks, or your bird begins feather-plucking. During your pet's office visit, the veterinary staff should present you with their "Plan A"-their best-case scenario for diagnostics and treatments. You should ask for an estimate if you have any concerns, and sometimes this ideal plan may be beyond your means. This can be a scary thought when you worry about your beloved pet's well-being.

But you don't have to feel stuck. One important step to take is to ask questions and voice your concerns. Veterinarians call their ideal suggestions "Plan A" because they often can develop a "Plan B" if needed. Let the staff know of your constraints, and you can work together with your pet's best interests and those constraints in mind. Also, companies like CareCredit and Wells Fargo may be able to offer you third party payment options, so you can take care of unexpected expenses over time. You don't necessarily need to sacrifice your pet's health in a tight situation.

From recent experience, we all know that there is no quick fix for the country's healthcare issues. This includes the costs of veterinary care, which tend to increase with advances in research, technology, and treatments. The best thing we can do is plan ahead when possible and know all of our options when the unforeseen occurs. Hopefully, this strategy can help all members of our families.



### Quinoa and Spinach Soup

This satisfying soup gets its thick texture from quinoa, a glutenfree whole grain. Feel free to throw in 2 cups of your favorite frozen vegetables to add flavor and nutrients. Serves 6

#### Ingredients:

- 1 medium red onion, diced (1¼ cups)
- 3 cups low-sodium vegetable broth
- ¾ cup quinoa, rinsed

1 14.5 oz can diced tomatoes with basil, garlic, and oregano 10 oz spinach leaves

### Directions:

Coat large saucepan with cooking spray, and heat over medium heat. Add onion, and sauté 5 minutes, or until soft. Stir in broth and 4 cups water, and bring to a boil. ### Cheeseburger Soup

This is a rich soup in which ground beef is sauteed in butter with vegetables and herbs prior to adding milk, cubes of cheddar cheese and sour cream. Serves 8.

### Ingredients:

1/2 pound ground beef 3/4 cup chopped onion 3/4 cup shredded carrots 3/4 cup chopped celery 1 teaspoon dried basil 1 teaspoon dried parsley 4 tablespoons butter

3 cups chicken broth 4 cups cubed potatoes 1/4 cup all-purpose flour 2 cups cubed Cheddar cheese 1 1/2 cups milk 1/4 cup sour cream

### Directions:

In a large pot, melt 1 tablespoon butter or margarine over medium heat: cook and stir vegetables and beef, until beef is brown. Stir in basil and parsley. Add broth and potatoes. Bring to a boil, then simmer until potatoes are tender, about 10-12 minutes. Melt the remainder of butter and stir in flour. Add the milk, stirring until smooth. Gradually add milk mixture to the soup, stirring constantly. Bring to a boil and reduce heat to simmer. Stir in cheese. When cheese is melted, add sour cream and heat through. Do not boil. There are three species of these colorful North American birds. Eastern and western bluebirds have a reddish brown breast, which contrasts with their predominately blue plumage. Their relative, the (male) mountain bluebird is entirely blue. Eastern bluebirds are primarily found east of the Rockies, and range from Canada to Mexico and Honduras. They are much admired for their lovely coloring and for a distinctive song that many hear as "chur-lee, churlee." The eastern bluebird is the state bird of both New York and Missouri. Western bluebirds are found west of the Rocky Mountains from Canada to Mexico. The mountain bluebird also inhabits much of western North America - often at elevations above 7,000 feet (2,133 meters). Bluebirds eat small fruits and hunt insects, spiders, and other creatures from above. The birds perch, watch, and then swoop to the ground to pounce on their prey.

Pairs mate in spring and summer, when they construct small, bowl-shaped nests. Females lay four or five eggs and incubate them for about two weeks. Young remain in the nest, cared for by both parents, for an additional 15 to 20 days. Bluebirds often have two broods in a season. Sometimes, a young bluebird from the first brood will remain in the nest and assist its parents in caring for the second. Bluebirds living in higher latitudes may head south if food becomes scarce or temperatures too cold. Mountain bluebirds typically migrate to lower elevations during the same lean seasons.

Bluebirds are considered fairly common, but their numbers have declined substantially during the last century. Populations have been given a boost by the birdhouse boxes that have become popular in many parks and backyards. Interested individuals please contact Oya Simpson 703-725-8040

Mason currently offers a number of courses at a site in Sterling, Va., in areas such as nursing, education, information technology and management. It also offers undergraduate general education courses and Osher Lifelong Learning Institute courses.
