Patriot Disposal is pleased to have been selected by the Broadlands Association to provide trash and recycling services for your community beginning on Thursday, April 2, 2009. Our employees and management team are eagerly anticipating the opportunity to provide you with reliable, efficient trash and recycling collection services.

About Patriot Disposal

Patriot Disposal is locally-owned and operated, and provides trash and recycling services for individual homeowners, homeowners associations and commercial businesses in Prince William, Fairfax, and Loudoun Counties. Customer satisfaction is our number one priority, and we are committed to becoming the most responsive and conscientious refuse hauler, rather than the largest.

An environmentally-conscious company, Patriot Disposal offers a curbside recycling program that extends well beyond those offered by other haulers. We have developed innovative and cost-saving methods to collect and recycle materials over and above those required by the County, and we are continuing to pursue methods to recycle additional materials and to expand our recycling program even further.

Services

Beginning in April 2009, Patriot Disposal will provide the following services for the Broadlands Association:

Trash removal, 2 times each week, on Monday and Thursday Recycling collection, 1 time each week, on Thursday Removal of yard waste, 1 time each week, on Monday Special item pick-up, 1 time each week, on Thursday

Containers

Patriot Disposal will provide one Toter for each residence for the collection of trash. Each town home will be provided with a 64-gallon, wheeled, covered container, and each single-family home will be provided with a 96-gallon, wheeled, covered container. Each town home and single-family home will also be provided with one recycling bin. Additional recycling bins are available for no additional charge.

Additional Toters are available for purchase at the following rates:

A 96-gallon Toter — \$100.00 A 64-gallon Toter — \$50.00

Patriot Disposal will coordinate the delivery of its containers with the pick up of the containers by the current contractor to ensure that the transition is as smooth as possible. You are encouraged to keep a record of the serial number of your Toter(s) should you need to identify it in the future.

Requests for additional recycling bins and Toters are now being accepted by phone at 703-257-7100.

Trash Removal

Each Monday and Thursday, Patriot Disposal will remove trash that has been placed at the curb for collection.

Please note the following requirements concerning trash removal services:

- Trash must be properly secured in plastic bags, standard trash cans, or wheeled carts. 1.
- Trash bags and containers shall not exceed 50 pounds in weight per bag or container. 2.
- 3. Trash must be placed at the curbside and/or designated area by 7 a.m. for collection.

Recycling

Patriot Disposal is committed to assisting the Broadlands community with its recycling efforts in every way possible, with the goal of becoming the first community to achieve a higher rate of recycling vs. trash.

Patriot Disposal's weekly curbside recycling program includes the collection of scrap metal (foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.), small electronics (computers, monitors, TVs, small printers, VCRs, DVD/CD players, cell phones, etc.), car batteries, and used motor oil, in addition to newspapers, mixed paper, cardboard, paperboard, glass bottles and jars, metal and aluminum cans and plastic bottles.

Each Thursday, Patriot Disposal will remove recyclable materials that have been placed at the curb for collection.

Please note the following requirements concerning recycling collection services:

- 1. Newspapers and magazines should be bundled and placed in paper grocery bags or tied with heavy twine.
- 2. Glass, plastic, aluminum and metal, food/beverage containers should be rinsed and placed in bags, cardboard boxes, or recycling bins.
- 3. Recyclables must be placed at the curbside and/or designated area by 7 a.m. for collection.
- 4. Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- 5. Patriot Disposal will remove and recycle packing boxes and cartons placed at the curb by residents.

Yard Waste

Each Monday, Patriot Disposal will remove yard waste that has been placed at the curb for collection.

Please note the following requirements concerning the collection of yard waste:

- 1. Yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash only during the months of January, February and March.
- 2. Brush must be cut into four-foot lengths, with limbs no larger than six inches in diameter.
- 3. Brush must be tied in bundles no larger than two feet in diameter.
- 4. Yard debris must be placed in separate containers, marked "yard waste" or in biodegradable bags. Yard waste that is put out at the curb in plastic bags will not be picked up.
- 5. Yard waste must be placed at the curbside and/or designated area by 7 a.m. for collection.
- 6. Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.
- 7. The weight limit for yard waste is 35 pounds per bag or container.

Special Item Pick-ups

Each Thursday, Patriot Disposal will collect furniture, mattresses, appliances, and other large, non-metal household goods that have been placed at the curb for collection, for no additional charge.

Please note the following requirements concerning the collection of special items:

- 1. Items for collection must be placed at the curbside and/or designated area by 7 a.m.
- 2. Appliances containing Freon must be certified as "Freon-Free" prior to removal.

Schedule

Patriot Disposal will provide services on all holidays that fall on regularly-scheduled pickup days with the exception of Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. If a regularly-scheduled pickup day falls on one of these holidays, service will resume on the next regularly scheduled pickup day, however no earlier than 6:00 p.m.

On regularly scheduled pickup days, Patriot Disposal will provide services beginning at 7 a.m. Therefore, items for collection must be placed at the curb prior to 7 a.m. If possible, homeowners are encouraged to place items at the curb the night before each scheduled collection day.

Patriot Disposal will not provide service to any residence when circumstances exist that are beyond its reasonable ability to control, such as roadways deemed to be impassable due to parked vehicles or construction, riots, fires, floods, inclement weather, strikes, or acts of God.

Unacceptable Waste

The following items will not be collected, and should not be placed in the trash or set out for pick up: highly-flammable substances, hazardous waste, construction debris, liquid waste, toxic materials, radioactive materials, asbestos, infectious or medical waste, petroleum contaminated soil, dead animals, paint, manure, or other dangerous materials as determined by state, federal or local law, or in the reasonable judgment of Patriot Disposal.

Vehicles

Please be aware that Patriot Disposal owns and operates some vehicles that are "split-body" trucks. This means that there are two separate sections in the body of the truck, and the truck can therefore be used for the simultaneous collection of trash and recycling without co-mingling the items. To see the split body, you must view the truck from the rear. From the side, it will appear as though there is only one compartment and that all of the materials are being placed into it. Patriot Disposal anticipates possibly using some of these types of vehicles to perform waste collection services for the Broadlands Association. Please keep in mind that on some occasions, split-body trucks will be used to collect trash in one side and recycling in the other; or they might be used for the collection of trash and yard waste.

2008-2009 Snow Removal Guidelines

Within this section, you will find a list of streets indicating which entity is responsible for snow removal. *Please reference this list to determine who to call with snow removal concerns.* Broadlands Association provides snow removal for the private streets that have been completed by the builder and are owned by the Association. As the public streets in the single family home sections are accepted into the state road system, they will be maintained by the Virginia Dept. of Transportation (VDOT). Owners in new construction areas in Broadlands should contact their builder, Van Metre, unless their section/street is included in the HOA or VDOT areas to plow. Major roadways such as Claiborne Parkway, Demott Drive, Vestals Gap Drive, Ellzey Drive, Chickacoan Trail Drive, Glebe View Drive, Truro Parish Drive and Route 625 (Waxpool Road) are considered priority snow removal routes. After these roadways are cleared, work will begin on the secondary residential streets.

Snow plowing is to begin after there has been an accumulation of 2 inches of snow. Sand and/or chemicals will be used at critical intersections and as needed on streets.

In addition, there is a Loudoun County ordinance (Chapter 1022) that requires the owner/occupant of a property which has a public sidewalk adjoining or touching the property in front, rear or either side, to clear or treat that sidewalk for snow and ice within 6 hours of a snowfall (by 12:00 noon for overnight snowfall). Property owners abutting common areas (i.e. along Ellzey Drive) are also responsible for clearing those sidewalks. This will provide a safe walkway for children going to school. The County Department of Building and Development is responsible for enforcement of this ordinance.

Broadlands Association Board of Directors Meeting January 13, 2009 Board Actions

The meeting was called to order at 5:30p.m. with the following Board members in attendance:

Kathleen McFarlane and Brian Crow of Infinitive Foundation Triathlon Eight Homeowners

Staci Kapinos moved to approve the minutes as amended in Board Comments from the December 9, 2008 Board Meeting and was seconded by Eric Bazerghi. The motion was approved 6/0/2 with Brian Beahm and Denise Harrover abstaining.

Cliff Keirce mentioned the owner of the Association's security company (Top Notch K-9, LLC) passed away on January 1, 2009. His wife intends to keep the company functioning.

Eric Bazerghi asked whether the transition to the new trash company was proceeding on schedule and Management informed the Board that the Feruary newsletter would have information on the transition and things were proceeding smoothly.

Roy Barnett discussed the Hotel Special Exception for Section 204 that Van Metre is requesting. It is proposed as a 160 room hotel with no restaurant included. It is proposed to be approximately 80 feet high (six stories). The section (located across from the Broadlands fountain where the Van Metre trailers were) is slated for future development. Van Metre is proposing not to develop for at least 4 years if approved.

The Board reviewed a request by HGTV and declined to participate.

Brian Beahm moved to approve the appointment of Thomas Horne to the Modifications Subcommittee and was seconded by Eric Bazerghi. The motion passed 8/0/0.

The homeowner Board members informed Van Metre's representatives that the Association was not willing to accept the Stone House and the surrounding property, as is.

The Board instructed Management to send a certified letter plus regular mail to all parties involved in the drainage dispute. The parties were to be informed that if the homeowner working to implement the Board directed solution was unable to perform the work because of inability to access the affected areas the Board would take no further action and consider the matter closed. The Board requested an opportunity to review the letter before it was sent to the affected owners.

The Board requested Management discuss proposals with Denise Harrover and obtain a bid from a company suggested by Van Metre. A review of the Comprehensive Sign Plan needs to be done to determine compliance with County Guidelines.

Eric Bazerghi moved to approve the proposed Rain Barrel Design guideline. The motion was seconded by Roy Barnett. The motion passed 7/0/1 with Brian Beahm abstaining.

Infinitive Foundation presented their proposal to hold two triathlons in Broadlands in 2009. The proposed events would be Sunday June 7th and Sunday August 9th. Over the last two months employees at the nature center have seen bluebirds on several occasions. What a treat for the eyes! These beautiful members of the **Thrush Family** appear



round bodied and round headed when perching. Their breasts are orange and wings are a bright blue. Males are more brightly colored than females.



Bluebirds like to have access to a lot of open space and are also cavity nesters. They like to raise their young in old trees. Since we have lost many old trees due to housing developments, roads etc...blue birds are losing their natural habitats.

Besides being a beautiful bird that is native to our area why else do we hear so much about this species? One word can sum up the discussion about these birds, **invasiveness.**

Two imported species - **the House Sparrow and the European Starling** are competing for the same habitats. These two types of birds are cavity nesters and can be very aggressive.

Another problem is related to the bluebird's food source. Bluebirds prefer eating insects. When insects aren't available in the winter they feast on wild berries. The predicament is some birds compete for these berries and strip off the berries before the bluebirds get a chance.

So what can we do to help these natural wonders? We can improve their chances by providing proper

nesting sites. Setting out a blue bird box is one way to help. These boxes need to be constructed a specific way and located in certain areas so they benefit the bluebird. People of all ages can enjoy bluebirds by watching the activity at these boxes.



If you want to set up a series of

boxes it is important to get some monitoring training. The following websites can provide further information on how to create a box , set up a bluebird trail, and how to get training: <u>www.virginiabluebirds.org</u> or <u>www.loudounwildlife.org</u>

Currently, the naturalist at the Nature Center, Susanne Ortmann, plans to place two boxes on the Nature Center grounds and is looking for trained volunteers to help with this project. If you like spending time outdoors and have a few hours a week or one week a month this might be a rewarding opportunity for you.

Irish Chicken-Leek Pie Recipe

10-12 inch pie pastry 1 whole chicken, about 4 lb 4 one-inch thick slices cooked ham steak 4 large leeks, cleaned/chopped 1 large onion, chopped salt and pepper 1/2 tsp ground nutmeg 2 cup chicken stock 1 cup heavy cream

Cook chicken with salt, garlic, sage, 1 stalk chopped celery, and 1 chopped onion. De-bone and chop. In a deep 1 - 1 ^{1/2} quart dish, place layers of the chicken, the ham, leeks and onion or shallot, adding the mace, nutmeg and seasoning, then repeating the layers until the dish is full. Add the stock, then dampen the edges of the dish before rolling out the pastry to the required size. Place the pastry over the pie and press the edges down well. Crimp with a fork. Make a small hole in the center. Roll out the scraps of pastry and form a leaf or rosette for the top. Place this very lightly over the small hole. Brush the pastry with milk, and bake at moderate heat, 350°F, for 25-30 minutes. Cover the pastry with damp greaseproof paper when partially cooked if the top seems to be getting too brown. Gently heat the cream. When pie is cooked, remove from oven. Carefully lift off the rosette and pour the cream in through the hole. Put back the rosette and serve. Serves: 6-8



Irish Potato Casserole

10 medium Potatoes -- peeled 8 oz Cream cheese (soft) 8 oz Sour cream ½ cup Butter or margarine -- melted ¼ cup Chives 1 Clove garlic -- minced 1 teaspoon Salt 1/8 tsp Garlic powder Paprika

Cook potatoes in boiling water for approximately 30 min or until tender. Drain and mash. Beat cream cheese with electric mixer until smooth. Add potatoes and remaining ingredients, except paprika; beat just until combined. Spoon mixture into a lightly buttered 2 qt casserole; sprinkle with paprika. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Remove 15 min before baking. Uncover and bake at 350 for 30 minutes. Serves: 8



Chocolate Mint Ice Cream Dessert

This minty dessert is the perfect way to top off your St. Patrick's Day dinner. Your little Leprechauns are sure to make it disappear.

12 ice cream sandwiches

- 1 carton frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 jar hot fudge ice cream topping
- 1 tsp. mint extract
- 1 c. Andes Candies Chocolate Mint Chips

Cut 4 ice cream sandwiches in half. Place 4 whole ice cream sandwiches side by side in an un-greased 9 x 9 in. pan. Lay 1- 1/2 piece of ice sandwich at the end of each of the 4 whole sandwiches. The bottom of the pan should be full. Spread with a thin layer of whipped topping. Pour the entire jar of hot fudge sauce into a microwave safe bowl. Heat for 15 seconds. Stir in 1 tsp of mint extract. Spoon 1/2 of the hot fudge sauce over the whipped topping. Repeat layer with remaining ice cream sandwiches, then remaining hot fudge sauce and top with whipped topping. Tent with Aluminum foil and freeze for at least 3 hrs. Remove from the freezer 15 minutes before serving and sprinkle with Andes Candies mint chips. Cut into small squares.

On the weekend of December 6th & 7th, 2008 Ashburn Robotics :: NX Treme competed at James Madison University in the VA/DC State First Lego League Tournament. This event featured some of the premier robotics teams in Virginia. This was the team's first year competing in the division II age bracket. The team was awarded first place in robot performance with a high table score of 330 points out of a possible 400 points. Ashburn Robotics :: NX Treme is an independent robotics team based in the Broadlands but drawing team members from many of the surrounding communities. The team qualified for the state tournament during the November 15th Regional Tournament held at River Bend Middle School. As part of this years challenge the team investigated the effects of freeze/thaw cycles on the formation of potholes and studied what solutions can be applied to this climate related issue. The team met with several scientists and road engineers to develop a new method to drain the sub-base using a perforated pipe and solar powered heating coils.
