Local Mom Creates a Task Force to Raise Money For Assault Victim

It was Peter Walsh's show "Enough Already!" and her commitment to assisting Ryan Diviney's progress that inspired Broadlands resident, Jane Hofmann, to raise money for the Diviney family.

Ryan's shocking story began on November 7, 2009, when the Ashburn, college student was beaten over a minor argument and left in a coma. Although his condition is extremely critical, Ryan's family and friends are committed to maximizing his chances of recovery. Their blog "Rally for Ryan," has found new friends offering emotional support and prayers for this young man. One of those supporters, Jane Hofmann, read that Ryan was accepted into the International Brain Research Foundation program, which although extremely expensive, could make a marked difference in Ryan's care and improvement. It was clear that the Divineys faced a large financial obstacle.

Inspired by the idea of helping the Divineys, Jane sent an email to acclaimed organizational expert Peter Walsh, telling him that it was because of "Enough Already!" featured on the Oprah Winfrey Network that she came up with an idea to help the Diviney family. Jane decided that she would encourage people to declutter their homes, find items in good condition and encourage them to donate those items to a mega yard sale effort called "Declutter for the Divineys".

What Jane didn't realize was that Peter Walsh would call her. Moved by Ryan's story, Peter agreed to come to the event to encourage people to help Ryan.

Jane rallied her good friend Christine LeTourneau and together they kicked off "Declutter for the Divineys". Teams of local women were assembled throughout Ashburn and a fundraising event was born.



YARD WASTE PICKUP SPECIFICATIONS

Yard debris is defined as grass clippings, leaves and brush/hedge trimmings that result from the regular maintenance of your yard.

Yard debris does not include stumps, whole trees, or clean-up from storm damage. Collection of these items may be provided for an additional charge.

The specifics regarding yard waste collection are as follows:

- 1. Brush/hedge trimmings must be cut into four-foot lengths, with limbs no larger than four inches in diameter, tied in small bundles or bagged.
- 2. Bundles of brush/hedge trimmings can be no larger than two feet in diameter.
- Leaves and grass clippings must be placed in a separate container clearly marked "yard waste" or in <u>biodegradable paper bags</u>, in accordance with County regulations.
- 4. Yard waste that is put out at the curb in plastic bags will not be picked up.
- Patriot Disposal plans to compost the yard waste that it collects. Therefore, food waste can be mixed in with the yard waste that is placed out for collection.
- 6. The weight limit for yard waste is 35 pounds per bag or container.
- 7. Yard debris may be mixed with trash only during the months of January, February and March.

Important: Public Input Needed on OpenBand Franchise

To all Southern Walk homeowners:

The Southern Walk HOA is urging members to attend the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors meeting on April 4 to share your thoughts on OpenBand.

The Loudoun County Cable TV / OVS Commission has sent its recommendation to the County Board of Supervisors that OpenBand's expired franchise be renewed for a 12-year term. It is extremely important that the Board of Supervisors hear from as many OpenBand homeowners as possible.

This is your best opportunity to voice your opinion about OpenBand service. Even if you do not wish to speak, there is strength in numbers and your presence at the meeting will demonstrate how important this issue is.

Although OpenBand's county franchise has already expired, the Commission's recommendation backdates the new application to the expiration date of the previous franchise. There are many changes to the terms of the franchise that were negotiated directly between OpenBand and the County, in closed meetings with nobody present to represent OpenBand customers. The SWHOA Board of Directors feels this process does not fairly take into account the concerns of residents and homeowners who are locked in to paying for OpenBand service.

The Board of Supervisors meeting is **Monday April 4th at 6:30PM** in the Board Room of the Loudoun County Government Center at **1 Harrison Street**, **S.E. in Leesburg**. Please come to the meeting and share your opinion!

Wise Up about Wi-Fi: Tips for Using Public Wireless Networks

Public wireless networks – those Wi-Fi hotspots in coffee shops, libraries, airports, hotels, universities, and other public places – allow people to access the internet through a shared network. While convenient, they're often not secure. You're sharing the network with strangers, and some of them may be interested in your personal information.

Technology experts at the Federal Trade Commission say encryption is the key to keeping your personal information secure online. Encryption scrambles the information you send over the internet into a code so that it's not accessed by others. When using wireless networks, it's best to send personal information only if it's encrypted – either by an encrypted website or a secure network. An encrypted website protects **only** the information you send to and from that site. A secure wireless network encrypts **all** of the information you send while online.

How to Identify an Encrypted Website

If you send email, share digital photos and videos, use online tools to manage calendars and contact lists, use social networks, or bank online, you're sending personal information over the internet. The information you share is stored on a server – a powerful computer that collects and delivers content. Many websites, such as banking sites, use encryption to protect your information as it travels from your computer to their server.

To determine if a website is encrypted, look for **https** at the beginning of the web address (the "s" is for secure), and a **lock icon** at the top or bottom of your browser window. The exact position of the lock depends on which browser you use. Some websites use encryption only on the sign-in page, but if any part of your session isn't encrypted, the entire account could be vulnerable. Look for **https** and the **lock icon** the entire time you're on the site, not just when you sign in. You can also click on the lock icon to display information about the site and help you verify that it's not a fraudulent website.

Public Wireless Networks

Most Wi-Fi hotspots **don't** encrypt the information you send over the internet and are **not** secure. If you use an unsecured network to log in to an unencrypted site – or a site that uses encryption only on the sign-in page – other users on the network can see what you see and what you send. They could hijack your session and log in as you. New hacking tools – available for free online – make this easy, even for users with limited technical know-how. Your personal information, private documents, contacts, family photos, and even your login credentials could be up for grabs.

An imposter could use your account to impersonate you and scam people you care about. In addition, an attacker could test your username and password to try to gain access to other websites – including sites that store your financial information.

Protect Your Information

So what can you do to protect your information? Here are a few tips:

- When using a Wi-Fi hotspot, only log in or send personal information to websites that you know are fully encrypted. And keep in
 mind that your entire visit to each site should be encrypted from the time you log in to the site until you log out. If you think you're
 logged in to an encrypted site but find yourself on an unencrypted page, log out right away.
- Don't stay permanently signed in to accounts. When you've finished using an account, log out and close the browser software.
- Do not use the same password on different websites. It could give someone who gains access to one of your accounts access to many of your accounts.
- Many web browsers alert users who try to visit fraudulent websites or download malicious programs. Pay attention to these
 warnings, and take the extra minute or so to keep your browser and security software up-to-date.
- If you regularly access online accounts through Wi-Fi hotspots, use a virtual private network (VPN). VPNs encrypt traffic between your computer and the internet, even on unsecured networks. You can obtain a personal VPN account from a VPN service provider. In addition, some organizations create VPNs to provide secure, remote access for their employees.
- Some Wi-Fi networks use encryption: WEP and WPA are the most common. WPA encryption protects your information against
 common hacking programs. WEP may not. If you aren't certain that you are on a WPA network, use the same precautions as on an
 unsecured network.
- Installing browser add-ons or plug-ins can help, too. For example, Force-TLS and HTTPS-Everywhere are free Firefox add-ons
 that force the browser to use encryption on popular websites that usually aren't encrypted. They don't protect you on all websites –
 look for https in the URL and the lock icon to know a site is secure.

The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling "And Baby Makes Four"

So you're a young couple, and your first "child" was a pet (dog, cat, bird – take your pick), and now you find you are expecting a real child. Maybe you've heard horror stories ("The cat'll smother the baby – you gotta get rid of her!"), or maybe you don't have any concerns at all (you should). Well, having seen hundreds of couples just like this, I can tell you that there are some things to be aware of.

Life will change. Maybe not much for some, but usually quite a bit for most. And Fido or Fluffy will be part of that change. You should try to spend as much time with your pet as you did before your little bundle arrived, but that can be difficult when you're changing diapers and making formula, all while battling sleep deprivation! For most people, you simply won't be able to devote as much time to your pet as you did before becoming a parent. And your pet may become jealous.

Now don't get me wrong. Many cats and dogs become amazingly bonded to babies, following them around and protecting them, even alerting parents when a child may be in danger, but I've seen other cases where pets **do** become upset with the sudden lack of attention.

Try to prevent that from the beginning by putting a baby blanket in your bed (to get your scent on it), then use that blanket to bring home your baby. Once you've settled in, then let the animal have a good sniff of the blanket. This helps to tell him the baby is "one of the family".

If you've tried this, and you've also tried to give as much attention to your pet as you can, and yet Rover or Simba are still acting aggressive with your little one, then follow these tips:

- -Neuter your male cat or dog unneutered dogs are the most frequent causes of bites, and unneutered cats that are jealous tend to "mark" their territory (walls, rugs, clothes!)
- -Supervise any interaction between an animal and an infant.
- -Heed warnings! If your cat or dog has ever growled or snarled at a person, seek help from a veterinarian or a professional trainer. This could be a sign of things to come.
- -Don't allow your child to harass, chase, yell at, or grab/crawl onto your pet. This could be trouble waiting to happen like a bite wound or a claw to the face.

Well, I hope I didn't scare any of you expectant parents out there! This is just some important advice to prevent any future accidents. I hope you have a wonderful pregnancy, and a safe and joyous trip down the path of parenthood.

Our Savior's Way Invites Loudoun County Communities to "Learn About Lyme Disease!" on May 5th

Our Savior's Way Lutheran Church welcomes the Loudoun community to a Lyme Disease Awareness program on Thursday, May 5, 2011 from 7:00 - 9:30pm. The program features local expert Samuel Shor, MD, FACP, plus a special screening of the award-winning documentary *Under Our Skin*. Dr. Shor is a member of Virginia Governor Bob McDonnell's Lyme Disease Task Force.

"We live in tick country and everyone should know about this disease and the symptoms which can be disguised as other illnesses," says Marie Pfancuff, RN, BSN, of the sponsoring Parish Nurse Program at Our Savior's Way. Rev. Ralph Wiechmann, a pastor at the church who has undergone treatment for Lyme, noted: "I was fortunate since I had the rash and found a specialist who understood Lyme disease and the treatment."

Kathy Meyer, another Virginia Lyme Task Force member said, "It's critical to learn what Lyme Disease can look like in later stages. Many people, too often children, never see the tick or notice a rash. Later on, when they become ill, doctors may not think of Lyme, or tests may be misleading. The CDC intends the tests be used for tracking of the disease, not for diagnosis. Further, many doctors don't realize that the tests alone can't be relied on to determine Lyme Disease." Meyer will join Dr. Shor, the Parish Nurse Ministry, and representatives of the National Capital Lyme Disease Association to answer questions and provide reference information.

Loudoun County has the highest rate of Lyme disease in Virginia and third highest in the United States. According to the Centers for Disease Control, more than 200,000 people may be infected with Lyme disease annually. Given the descriptive nature of the movie we ask that only adults attend. May is Lyme Awareness Month and Loudoun County residents are encouraged to attend this and other Lyme awareness events including the 5k/1M/Family Day Lyme event at the National Conference Center in Leesburg on Sunday, May15th from 8:00a.m. – Noon.

Kritters for Kids By: Lisa Matthews, Broadlands Naturalist Frogs, Toads and Salamanders

It's Spring and the Amphibians (Frogs, Toads, and Newts) all know it! They are busy climbing out of the deep mud or deep leaves that they were hiding in



to hibernate over the winter. It is time for them to meet and lay their eggs. They like to lay their eggs in ponds, streams and if they are a newt (a type of salamander), in vernal pools. Vernal pools, which mean "spring", are pools that form when it rains but dries out because no water comes to it like a stream unless there is rain. Vernal pools are especially important to amphibians because they don't contain fish that would prey on amphibian eggs.

Newts like to get to the pools first. Their eggs hatch pretty quickly and when the pool dries out, the babies



burrow into the soft moist ground underneath. While it is wet, they eat bug larvae and worms. They also eat other amphibians'

eggs. So if you are born first, then you have a better chance to grow up to an adult.

If you go out at night (around 7:30p.m.) to one of the ponds, streams or vernal pools with a flashlight early this month, you might see dozens or even hundreds of salamanders, frogs and toads at the edges of the water. Be careful where you step, they might just be under your foot! It is a good idea to keep the flashlight shinning down so that you don't step on them or frighten them away.

Hopefully, your garden store and DIY staff have been brought up to date on the new or maybe not so new products. But if you are the type of person who likes to research on your own, then might I suggest a couple of websites? WTOP Garden Plot Editor, Mike McGrath (http://www.wtop.com/?nid=35), is ready and willing to answer your questions. His blog/website is filled with product choices and suggestions. One way to help the Bay is to add more native plants to your garden. As if veterinary and other healthcare professionals don't throw enough medical jargon out there, we're asking you to be aware of yet another term: *bartonellosis*. This bacterial infection, which you may know as "Cat Scratch Disease," can be transmitted to people via cat bites or scratches that are contaminated with flea feces. It's true that it takes very specific circumstances for someone to contract bartonellosis, but it is important, particularly for cat owners, to know your risk.

We don't want to create fear or panic as this is not necessarily a rampant illness. However, its effects can be serious, much like the effects of Lyme disease, including chronic fatigue, aches and pains, reduced appetite, and fever. These complications can be serious and long-lasting enough to negatively impact everyday life. Unfortunately, the symptoms of bartonellosis closely mirror the symptoms of so many other illnesses, such as the aforementioned Lyme disease or food poisoning, depression, thyroid disorders, and so much more.

Therefore, be sure to take precautions in your contact with cats. You should try to avoid scratches and bites, whether this is during playtime, nail trims, or other handling. Don't "roughhouse" too much with your cat, and become familiar with any warning signs she may give before she swats or nips. Should you receive a bite or scratch, wash the area immediately. If the site becomes infected, see your doctor as soon as possible. Let your physician know how you received your injury, and bring up your concerns about bartonellosis. Additionally, as flea excrement is a major component in disease transmission, this is yet another reason to keep your cat on year-round flea and tick prevention.

Should you develop any of the above symptoms after being bitten or scratched by a cat, contact your doctor right away. Any number of illnesses may be suspect, but you want to maintain control of your own health by giving your physician all pertinent information. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention can offer you more information about the bacteria bartonella and about bartonellosis at http://www.cdc.gov/healthypets/diseases/catscratch.htm.



Help Your Friends with Lyme's Disease at the Loudoun Lyme 5K

It's hard to find a block in Broadlands where residents haven't been touched by Lyme disease. Home to the third largest number of Lyme's cases in the nation, Loudoun County is facing a Lyme disease epidemic, with 22 percent of the Virginia's reported cases occurring in the county. Now a new race promises to take on this disease in hopes of finding a cure.

After watching his wife and many friends battle the disease, Steve Gotschi, the owner of Sterling-based DryHome Roofing and Siding and Loudoun County resident, decided to do something. He started the **Loudoun Lyme 5K**, which will take place Sunday, May 15th from 8:00a.m. - Noon at the National Conference Center in Leesburg.

The first annual event expects to draw more than 500 runners and walkers of all ages and will raise awareness and money to help find a cure for Lyme disease, the number one tick-borne illness in the U.S. The Loudoun Lyme 5K will also feature a 1K family walk and informational fair to educate the public about the disease, its causes, and treatments. On hand for the fair will be community leaders, health department officials, Lyme's disease experts, medical and veterinary doctors and specialists, vendors, and sponsors. The fair will also have children's activities.

According to the CDC, the US has 24,000 new cases of Lyme disease. However, the disease is difficult to diagnose and that figure may be 10 times as great. Unfortunately, fewer than half of patients with Lyme disease recall a tick bite or a rash, making it harder to diagnose. Lyme disease is a spirochetal infection of multiple organ systems, causing a wide range of symptoms that mimic other diseases. An uncomplicated case of chronic Lyme disease requires an average of 6-12 months of high-dose antibiotic therapy, while other patients may require treatment for 1-4 years.

The race costs \$30 for an individual and \$70 for a family to enter. The fair is free. Proceeds benefit **National Capitol Lyme Disease Association**, a nonprofit offering education and support. The top three male and female finishers and the top finisher under age 15 will be recognized. To learn more about the race or to register, visit www.LoudounLyme.org.

April Tips for the Garden

The best time to plant shrubs and trees is on a windless, cloudy day.

Once new growth begins on trees and shrubs, cut back to green wood any twigs affected by winter kill.

Don't coat pruning cuts with tree paint or wound dressing. These materials won't prevent decay or promote wound closure.

Prune roses to buds that point outward to encourage good air and sunlight penetration. Dark-colored canes indicate dead wood. Cut back an inch below these darkened areas. If no live buds are left, remove the entire cane or branch.


Prune spring-blooming shrubs, such as forsythia, weigela and early spirea, after they have completed flowering.

Hydrangea is one gift plant that transplants well into the garden after its flowers fade. When the weather warms, plant in well-drained soil in full sun to partial shade. Don't be surprised if the next year's flowers are a different color than the first year. Blue or pink hydrangea color is dependent on the pH of the soil. Alkaline soil produces pink flowers; acidic soil produces blue flowers. White hydrangeas are not affected by soil pH.

If dogwood leaves have been small, sparse and pale, the trees may need fertilizer. Request a soil sample kit from your Extension office and collect a soil sample from the area beneath the trees using instructions provided by your Extension agent. Mail your sample, form, and payment to Virginia Tech and correct fertilizer recommendations will be returned with the test results.

Sugar Snap Pea Salad with Quinoa and Citrus Vinaigrette

Sugar snap peas are packed with calcium, iron and vitamin C. Paired with quinoa, a whole-grain powerhouse, and fresh citrus, this salad is both healthy and delicious.

1 cup cooked quinoa (about 1/2 cup before cooking)

3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil

3 tablespoons white wine vinegar

3 tablespoons organic or raw honey

Juice from 1/2 medium-size lemon

Juice from 1/2 medium-size orange

1/4 teaspoon salt

Pinch of fresh ground pepper

1/4 teaspoon sesame seeds

8 ounces sugar snap peas, rinsed and de-stringed

Segments from 1 medium-size orange, skin and pith removed

Prepare quinoa according to package directions. Fluff with a fork and let cool completely. While quinoa cooks, make citrus vinaigrette: Whisk together olive oil, vinegar, honey, lemon juice, orange juice, salt, pepper and sesame seeds in a small bowl; set aside. Toss snap peas with quinoa and orange segments. Drizzle citrus vinaigrette over salad and serve. Servings: 6

Mushroom Kabobs

The earthy flavors of mushrooms combine with grilled peppers, lemon juice, thyme and rosemary for a taste of summer in every bite. Serve these kabobs hot off the grill with wedges of lemon or lime and fresh herbs.

3/4 cup sliced fresh mushrooms

2 red bell peppers, chopped

1 green bell pepper, cut into 1 inch pieces

1/4 cup olive oil

2 tablespoons lemon juice

1 clove garlic, minced

2 teaspoons chopped fresh thyme

1 teaspoon chopped fresh rosemary

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

Preheat grill for medium heat. Thread mushrooms and peppers alternately on skewers. In a small bowl, mix together olive oil, lemon juice, garlic, thyme, rosemary, and salt and pepper. Brush mushrooms and peppers with this flavored oil. Brush grate with oil, and place kabobs on the grill. Baste frequently with oil mixture. Cook for about 4 to 6 minutes, or until mushrooms are tender and thoroughly cooked. Servings: 4



Vegan Banana Blueberry Muffins

Quick and easy to make. Full of fiber, these morning muffins are a great way to start a nutritious day.

2 very ripe bananas, mashed

3/4 cup all-purpose flour

1/2 cup whole wheat pastry flour

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 tablespoons water

1-1/2 teaspoons egg replacer (dry)

1/2 cup blueberries



Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease muffin cups or line with paper muffin liners. In a large bowl combine mashed bananas, all-purpose flour, whole wheat pastry flour, sugar, baking powder and salt; mix until smooth. In a small bowl or cup combine water and egg replacer; stir into banana mixture. Fold in blueberries. Spoon batter evenly, about 1/4 cup each, into muffin cups. Bake in preheated oven for 20 to 25 minutes, or until golden brown. Servings: 6

Mike Aldrich, PGA of River Bend G&CC has been named the 2011 MAPGA Assistant Professional of the Year and was honored on March 19, 2011 at Lansdowne Resort at the MAPGA Hall of Fame & Awards Banquet. This award bestows special recognition on an assistant PGA Professional who, through a commitment to improving opportunities for assistants, has distinguished himself/ herself in service to the Section, his/her peers, and facility.

Since turning professional in 1994 and being elected to PGA membership in 1997, Mike has been an Assistant Professional at various facilities in the New England Section including Glen Ellen Country Club, Millis, Mass.; Breakfast Hill Golf Course, Greenland, NH and Cochecho Country Club, Dover, NH. He spent three years at Forest Hills Country Club in Chesterfield, MO and made



his way to the Middle Atlantic Section in 2002 with an Assistant position at Bull Run Golf Club in Haymarket, VA Mike served as an Assistant at Westwood Country Club in Vienna, VA before becoming an Assistant at River Bend Golf & Country Club in Great Falls, VA where he has worked since 2008. He has also served as The PGA General Manager and Head Professional at Poolesville Golf Course in Poolesville, MD.

Mike has served on the MAPGA Board of Directors as the Vice President of the Central Chapter (2008-2009) and as the President of the Central Chapter (2010-2011). He participated in The PGA/Disabled Sports Military Golf Program and helped raise over \$1,000 for the Salute Military Golf Association by running in the Shamrock Marathon in 2008. He also won the Blockbusta Classic, a Pro-Invite at The Members Club at Four Streams in 2007, 2008 and 2009. Mike is an avid runner and has competed in two marathons, a 70.3 mile Ironman competition and numerous other endurance races where twice he finished 3rd place in his age group. Currently, Mike is training for the 2011 140.6 Ironman Coeur d'Alene.

Mike's golf philosophy is to focus on instruction, customer service, valuing employees, playing the game of golf and being a PGA Professional. He says that a PGA Professional's ability to play and teach the game of golf is what makes the title PGA Professional mean something to amateur golfers.

Mike was born on March 10, 1969 to Susan and Gerald Aldrich. He started hitting whiffle golf balls in his grandparent's yard when he was seven years old. Mike's first round of golf was when he was nine; playing with his father and grandfather, Saul Horowitz at Buena Vista Golf Course in West Hartford, CT. His most memorable experiences of that day is when he birdied the 60 yard sixth hole by chipping in.

Mike's father and grandfather both agreed that being able to play golf would be important for his success in the business world. It was not Mike's goal to become a PGA club professional, however, as he showed some ability at an early age, it was a common occurrence to hint at this potential. His father was very involved in the Sammy Davis Jr. - Greater Hartford Open and served on the Executive Committee for several years in the 70's in positions including Press Relations and Players Relations. During those years, Mike's father got him involved in tasks and he was fortunate to interact with many of the PGA Tour Professionals, including Phil Blackmar, Lee Trevino, Howard Twitty and Fuzzy Zoeller. Mike was a standard bearer for Lee Elder for several years and said that Lee's positive attitude and graceful demeanor on the golf course has stayed with him all this time.

Mike's first golf-related job was caddying in the Greater Hartford Open for the Chairman of Cannon. When he turned 17, he started working at Rockledge Country Club, and municipal golf course in his hometown of West Hartford, CT. The PGA Head Professional was (and still is) Richard Crow. Mike always looked up to Richard as the epitome of patience and grace under pressure. It was that same grace under pressure that allowed Mike to keep his job after crashing a golf car into a white pine on his second day of work, causing considerable damage to the car.

Mike attended Hall High School in West Hartford, CT where he went to the Connecticut State High School Championship twice, and won the Jack Stigberg Memorial Tournament as a senior in 1987. From Hall High School he went on to Bentley University where, during his freshman year, he played NCAA golf. Mike graduated from Bentley with a degree in marketing.

Mike and his wife, Laura Kathleen, were married in May of 1992 and have two children, Emily Margaret (16) a sophomore at Thomas Jefferson High School and Molly Kathleen (12) who is in the 6th grade.

Pool Season is Coming Up... Do You Know Where Your Pool Passes Are?

It's time to start looking in the bottom of your pool bag or maybe in the drawer with the swimsuits for your Broadlands Photo ID pool passes. Everyone aged 5 and up who wishes to gain admission to the pools will need one. If you are an owner and have the pool passes you used last year, you do not need to reapply. We will electronically reactivate them. If you cannot find your passes, new ones can be issued free of charge prior to the opening of the pool on May 28, 2011. After the pool opens, replacement cards are \$5.00 each. If you want a new picture for your replacement pass there is a charge of \$7.00 regardless of when the pass is issued.

<u>New Residents</u>, you must fill out an application, return it to the Nature Center and have your photos taken. Applications are available at the Nature Center, in this newsletter, on page 27 or online at <u>www.broadlandshoa.org</u>. Click on Pool Information in the Directory on the left hand side of the home page. Pool passes are issued to each individual age 5 and up living in the household. A household consists of all persons <u>permanently</u> living in the dwelling, including live-in caretakers and any unmarried children who are students and/or from a previous marriage and who will be residing with the owner for the summer.

<u>Tenants</u> must also apply for pool membership. <u>The owner and tenant must complete a Tenant Membership application for the 2011 season even if the tenants were members in 2010.</u> Tenants may use the passes they have, but they will not be activated until an application is received at the HOA office. Applications are available at the Nature Center, in this newsletter on page 28, and online at www.broadlandshoa.org.

Residents If any of your children have turned five since last summer or will be five by June 1, 2011, they must have a picture taken and a pass made. Please use the resident application form on page 27 and return it to the Nature Center to add them to your family data base. Any individual who has turned 18 will need a new adult card made as well.

Beginning April 4th, pictures will be taken at the Nature Center from 9 am to 5 pm Monday through Friday on a first come first served basis. Additionally, the Nature Center will be open for photographs on April 9th and 16th and on May 1st, 14th and 22nd from 10 am to 2 pm and on April 13th and May 19th from 6pm to 9 pm.

Prior to having the photo taken, all adults 18 and up must show a photo ID and proof of address.

Photos will not be taken if acceptable proof of identity and address are not available.

Acceptable photo IDs include:

- Driver's License
- School, Military or Work Photo ID
- State Issued Non-Driver Photo ID
- Current Passport
- Current Resident Alien Photo ID

Acceptable Proof of Address include:

- Payroll Stub issued within the last 60 days
- 2010 W-2 or 1099
- Original Bank Statement issued within the last 60 days
- Utility bill issued within the last 60 days
- Current Virginia Voter Registration Card
- Settlement Papers or Deed
- Current Homeowners Insurance Policy

Non-resident caregivers are able to obtain a pass for \$40 for the season. They should be noted as non-resident caregivers on the resident's application. The fee must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the caregiver to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Up to 5 long term house guests may obtain pool passes for \$40 per person for the season or \$15 per person for a month (30 consecutive days) or \$5 per person for seven consecutive days. They must be noted as non-resident house guests on the resident's application. The fees must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the guests to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Ten guest passes are allocated to each <u>residence</u>. Additional guest passes, good for 10 visits may be purchased for \$20. Guest passes are added to the electronic account. No physical pass will be issued. Guests must be accompanied by a pool pass holder to gain admittance to the pool facility.

- NO water toys or other equipment unless authorized by pool manager
- NO diving in shallow area
- NO tape players, CD players or radios unless waterproof and used with personal headphones
- NO flotation devices except water wings, U.S.C.G. approved life vests and U.S.C.G. approved swimwear flotation devices
- NO DISPOSABLE DIAPERS. Children not yet toilet trained must wear plastic pants or "Swimmies" (swim diaper) under their bathing suit.
- Children 10 years or younger MUST BE accompanied and supervised by an adult or care provider at least 14 years old
- Pool members are responsible for the conduct of their guests
- Children under 16 years must pass the Swim test to use the diving board and slide.
- Parents are responsible for the safety and conduct of all children in their care
- Pool membership may be temporarily suspended or revoked for failing to comply with the pool rules







If your biggest reason for seeking out a trainer is to get the results you haven't been able to achieve on your own, ask the trainer questions about how he or she will push you safely to improve your health and fitness condition.

Do you mainly need someone to hold you accountable? Ask the trainer about the most challenging experiences he or she has had with "slackers" or clients who lose their motivation, and listen for insight into how they handle difficult, emotionally charged situations.

Be brutally honest with yourself here. Picture how you'll feel and act when challenged or outside your comfort zone, and think about the communication styles you respond best to in that sort of situation.

Some people like the in-your-face yelling and screaming style and find it motivating, while others thrive more on positive reinforcement or a trainer who's just super energetic and excited that they're there.

There are many perspectives of what exercise is all about. A personal trainer needs to know when to be nurturing, when to be tough, when to listen — and mold his or her approach to the personality of each individual client.

3. Whether they have practical experience with your situation

Ask the trainer how they've helped other people with the same type of injury, health condition or other special situation you're in. While training and certifications are important, experience with your situation will help your trainer better tailor your workout to your unique needs. For example, they may need to modify certain types of exercises to protect and strengthen a traumatized or vulnerable area of your body, or take a heart condition into account when structuring your cardio regimen.

It's about the trainer's practical knowledge. If you have a knee issue, make sure the trainer has the knowledge to help you protect that knee.

4. What kind of nutrition training does the trainer have?

Look for a trainer who's received instruction from a credentialed nutritionist in strategies to help clients improve their eating habits.

Multiple studies show that including dietary change into a weight loss program can produce two to three times greater weight loss than programs focused on exercise alone. Bonus: the same studies also show that changes in one's (diet or exercise habits) can help promote changes in the other, especially among women.

Look for a package deal that includes both fitness coaching and nutritional guidelines tailored specifically for you, and you're far more likely to achieve your goals.






