

A Note From Your General Manager, Sarah Gerstein

At long last, we have suffered through enough of winter and made it to the other side to reach spring. With the arrival of spring come the spring cleaning and yard sales, the rain showers and gardening projects. For the association staff, spring brings the hectic season of pool opening preparation and pool pass processing, reminder letters for lawn maintenance and trash cans in view and other violations, and a significant increase in modification applications.



With the melting of the snow and the arrival of warmer temperatures, the association will be stepping up inspections of exterior maintenance violations. These inspections ensure that the appearance of our beautiful neighborhoods is maintained. Covenant Inspectors can be identified by their bright orange safety vests with a Broadlands label on the back. Please be aware the Association has the right of access over and through any portion of the Property (excluding any occupied dwelling) for inspections, maintenance and to correct any violations. This right is granted to the Association, its managing agent, and any other person authorized by the Board of Directors in the exercise and discharge of their respective powers and responsibilities. If you are interested in the exact language and wording, it is located in Section 5.3(a) of the Declaration for Broadlands.

During the month of April, the Covenants Inspectors will be focusing on units in need of exterior painting and wood trim maintenance and issuing appropriate letters. If your unit is in need of repair or repainting, you will be notified via letter and given time to correct. If you are unable to correct in the time allotted, please be sure to contact the inspectors to establish a reasonable extension to correct. If you do not correct the violation in the allotted time and do not contact the inspectors to request an extension, you will be sent follow up correspondence in accordance with state statute and our Policies and Procedures Regarding Violations of Governing Documents, which could include a Hearing before the Board of Directors and the potential for violation charges being assessed against your account. Though it is not the preferred method, the association also has the ability to file a suit in General District Court to request a favorable ruling from a judge.

As a reminder, lot owners must obtain written approval from the Modifications Subcommittee prior to the commencement of all changes or improvements on or visible from the exterior of your unit. The Modifications Subcommittee meets the first and third Wednesday of the month from March through November. They meet the third Wednesday of the month during their slow season. Please note the new deadline for submissions is Noon on the Thursday before the meeting in order to ensure time for processing applications. Moreover, all applications must be complete before they will be forwarded to the committee. The Design Guidelines and application are available online at www.broadlandshoa.org. If you have any questions regarding this process, please contact Robin Crews, Secretary to the Modifications Subcommittee at rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or 703-729-9704.

If you are planning to put your home on the market, you must provide the contract purchaser with a resale disclosure package within 14 days of contract execution. Resale packages can be ordered online through Armstrong at http://www.armstrong-mgt.com/. Click on "Order Resale Documents" on the top of the page and follow directions. If you are purchasing or refinancing your unit and your lender requires a PUD questionnaire, you do not need to purchase these through Armstrong. Forms are completed by Broadlands staff for a \$50 fee. Please contact 703-729-9704 or joannehang@broadlandshoa.com to submit your form and arrange for payment. Please ensure that you have obtained written approval from the Modifications Subcommittee for all exterior modifications prior to requesting resale disclosure packages.

Please Tie Down Your Trash on Windy Days

Please be sure to bind newspapers with twine or set out in paper bags. Weigh down your bottles, plastics and cans by placing heavier recyclables on top. Ensure that the lid of your trash can is tightly secured. Put smaller lightweight bags of trash together in a larger heavyweight bag. Don't put trash out early and PLEASE no loose "peanuts" or other packing materials.

Lastly, if the trash does blow over, please pick it up even if it isn't yours. Your HOA assessment provides for curbside trash removal. There is no budgeted amount for litter removal. The Association relies on homeowners to keep their neighborhoods free of litter and their assessments reasonable.

Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy Launches County-Wide Monarch Butterfly Campaign

Graceful, brilliant, they are the Monarch Butterflies. We see them in our gardens from July through October. We learn about their remarkable 2000+ miles great annual migration from the United States and Canada to central Mexico. We discover that in Mexico, they congregate by the millions in a tiny mountain area and rest for the winter. We await the return north in the spring to lay eggs for us to marvel at their metamorphosis and savor their beauty. But with all their majesty, their future is imperiled.

Monarch numbers have been on a steady decline for the past 15 years. This year, the number of Monarchs reaching Mexico is the lowest ever recorded! Habitat loss is among the contributing factors. Though the situation may seem grave, people of Loudoun are taking action! In January, Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy launched a Monarch Campaign focused on "Bringing Back the Monarch, Keeping the Magic Alive." Over 100 local residents met to kick off a county-wide campaign and more join every day to take up the charge. People from all walks of life are joining in - from MOMS groups to Girl Scouts to churches to teachers in our public schools to businesses, parks and more.

The campaign has 5 main elements:

- Share the story of the Monarch through educational and community programs as well as business partnerships.
- Plant gardens County-wide that support Monarchs and other pollinators.
- Raise and release 2,013 Monarchs this summer and fall.
 Connect with counterparts in Mexico to support Monarch forest habitat restoration.
- Keep the campaign going into future years, because solving this problem is a marathon, not a sprint.

Loudoun County residents can take part in this campaign in many ways: plant Monarch Waystation gardens at homes, schools, churches, and businesses; create projects to help raise awareness; adopt waystations planted at public places; help raise and release Monarchs this summer and fall. Currently in Loudoun, there are 15 certified Monarch Waystation gardens. Through this campaign, the Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy will promote a significant growth in the number of gardens in Loudoun, with the goal to increase the number of Monarchs making the magnificent migration.

The Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy Monarch Campaign will provide garden designs ranging from small container gardens, to typical home owner gardens, to larger habitat restoration efforts. Moreover, the following four local nurseries have stepped forward to stock recommended native (non-cultivar), pesticide free plants: Catoctin Gardens, Wildwood/ Overbrook, Abernathy & Spenser, and Petals and Hedges. And for larger habitat restoration efforts, Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy identified two suppliers.

The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling "A Bark with Bite"

Joe couldn't sleep. For the fourth straight night, the neighbor's dog Bailey was outside barking incessantly. At first he tried to ignore it, then he tried plugging his ears with ear plugs, but that bark still seemed to work its way into his brain. It was 2:00am and he had a big presentation tomorrow. If he didn't get some sleep, he wasn't going to be his best, not ideal for impressing the boss.

This scene may be playing out in a neighborhood near you. I was asked to write an article about barking, which is becoming a common complaint in Ashburn. A dog barks primarily for communication, but the causes are numerous, depending on both the circumstances and the individual dog's state of mind.

- Warning Dogs will bark if they see someone approaching their house or yard, or if they sense danger. Their bark is saying "Stay away" or "Hey, somebody come quick!". This protective bark can often be trained and controlled.
- Anxiety This bark is a cry for help. Something is creating fear in the dog and they are expressing their need for attention, often accompanied by whining. This may be heard during thunderstorms or when the owner is gone from the house.
- **Playfulness** This is a dog's way of saying "Hey, there's fun stuff going on! I want in!" They will bark like this when they are playing with people or other dogs, or in anticipation of a car ride or play time.
- **Boredom** When a dog has nothing to do, or is being neglected, they will bark to let out energy or to express their loneliness. These dogs need something to do and lots of exercise.

Once you determine the causes of barking, you can take steps to control the unwanted behavior. The best way to prevent the barking is to remove any source of the behavior. Be careful not to inadvertently encourage the barking, and look for other outlets that will help curtail the barking by redirecting his/her energy and focus.

- Make sure your dog gets plenty of exercise. A dog needs to get out that excess energy, especially if they are a
 puppy or young dog.
- Avoid leaving your dog for long periods if at all possible.
- Never comfort or reward your dog for barking for attention this will only encourage your dog to bark more next time.
- Try a loud clap or whistle to stop the barking. When they are quiet, take that moment to reward their behavior.
- If you haven't already, train your dog or go to classes to learn. You have to get your dog to focus on listening to commands to stop barking.
- Do NOT let your dog bark outside constantly, regardless of the reason. This is a quick way to turn neighbors into enemies and to get either the HOA or the police to pay you a visit.
- Consult your veterinarian or a trainer if you are still having trouble.

Poor Joe had to do something. At 3:00am he called over to his neighbor, Matilda, and asked if she realized that Bailey was barking outside. She apologized, saying that her hearing aids hadn't been working well recently so she didn't know about Bailey's barking. She brought him inside and Joe had at least a few hours of solid slumber before going to work and nailing his presentation.

In this case, if a friendly call doesn't help, then a reasonable letter may be the next step, suggesting a trainer. If that doesn't help, then perhaps a call to the HOA may be needed. This may add to an already strained relationship, but at that point you may be too sleep-deprived to care.

April in the Garden By: Jill Johnson, Loudoun County Master Gardener

It's the fluctuating weather month with much to do in the garden! Take advantage of intermittent warm days to finish garden clean-up and get ahead of pesky weeds. Flower beds will welcome an addition of compost and reward you with bountiful blooms in May. Prune forsythia, weigela, spirea and spring-flowering shrubs after they bloom. If your forsythia is out of control, you can do renewal pruning by cutting down 1/3 of the oldest (thickest) branches. And, if you haven't already done so, cut back butterfly bushes to about 12 inches.

It's still a bit early to plant most tender annuals as the last chance of frost is mid-May. Master Gardener Help Desk volunteers recommend waiting until Mother's Day (May 12) before setting out tomato plants, basil, peppers and many annual flowers. Gladiola and lily of the valley bulbs can be put in the ground now, and you can plant "cool season" vegetables such as arugula, broccoli, peas, radishes and spinach. April is also the time to plant or transplant strawberries.

The Master Gardener Demonstration Garden at Ida Lee Recreation Center in Leesburg is starting to be worked by our Master Gardeners. The 1/3 acre garden includes raised bed vegetables, a butterfly garden, a garden for children featuring child-friendly plants and activities, and a shade garden created under beautiful pine trees. When visiting one March morning I was struck by the sight of hundreds of robins dining on a feast of worms. I then read that because robins forage largely on lawns, they are vulnerable to pesticide poisoning and can therefore be an indicator for chemical pollution. Clearly the word is out to the robin world about chemical free worms at the all organic, synthetic pesticide-free Master Gardener Demonstration Garden. You are invited to visit too! The garden is open every day and officially opens to the public with the Loudoun County Spring Farm Tour May 18/19th. Volunteers are there from 9am to noon on Tuesdays and Thursdays mid-March through mid-October to answer your questions or grab a map and take a self-guided walking tour.

The More that You Learn, the More Places You'll Go By: Shannon M. Pecora, MA Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

As the title of this article (a quote from Dr. Seuss) suggests, education can certainly take you places! Each year, many medical professionals are required to participate in what is known as "Continuing Education," or "CE." These are generally short classes or lessons used to maintain proficiency in a given field. Along with our own physicians, dental hygienists, nurses, and such, Doctors of Veterinary Medicine (DVMs) and Licensed Veterinary Technicians (LVTs) must log a certain number of continuing education credit hours with each new calendar year. To stay current with new scientific discoveries, medical treatments, and diagnoses, our medical personnel attend conferences, view webinars, enroll in online courses, and participate in symposiums, both at the local level and at national conventions. For instance, in February, Dr. Kirk attended a conference in Las Vegas, where the highlight was a series of advanced surgical lectures. At press time, Dr. Signorino was scheduled to travel to Texas for an ultrasound conference. And perhaps you caught the snapshot on our Facebook page of Dr. Corey at the North American Veterinary Conference in Florida this past January!

In addition, our other staffers, such as receptionists and kennel attendants, participate in less "official" continuing education throughout the year. Training videos, industry publications, and visits from vendors and specialists are all great resources for keeping our skill sets and knowledge bases up-to-date. These programs are certainly useful, and as a bonus, consistently learning new things can also make our jobs fun and interesting.

So why is all this happening, and what are the implications for you and your pets? Because both the science and the business of veterinary medicine and related fields (including grooming, boarding, and doggie daycare) are constantly evolving, you should feel comfortable that the people you have entrusted with your pets' care are evolving too! For example, many years ago an indoor lifestyle and wishful thinking were the only things available to help guard against tick bites and subsequent illnesses. Today, we have flea and tick preventatives and the Lyme disease vaccine to protect your pets. Plus, should your pet contract a tick-borne illness, we know more about effective treatments. In essence, pet care professionals spend each day attending to *your* pets, so it's in the best interests of your family that we're continually learning how to do our jobs better.

You might call to schedule an appointment with your pet's regular doctor, only to be told that this doctor will be away for a week. You may head to the vet hoping to see your pet's favorite technician for a nail trim, just to find out that this tech will be out of the office for a few days. You could discover that you've got to wait until next week to book an appointment with your pet's groomer. All of these folks could be traveling to obtain their yearly CE credits. And we definitely understand the immediate inconvenience that these situations present. However, we hope that the lessons we're learning while we're away will only improve your pet's health and happiness in the long run!



EATING GREEN IN HONOR OF EARTH DAY

Spinach and Nectarine Salad

2 tablespoons orange marmalade

1 large shallot, thinly sliced

2 tablespoons white balsamic vinegar

2 teaspoons olive oil

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

1/4 cup slivered almonds

1 package (7-ounce) baby spinach

2 ripe nectarines, pitted and cut into wedges





In microwave-safe small bowl, combine marmalade and shallot. Cover with vented plastic wrap and cook in microwave on High 1 minute. Stir in vinegar, oil, 1/4 teaspoon salt, and 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper. In small skillet, cook almonds on medium 5 minutes, stirring until toasted. Set aside to cool, about 2 minutes. To serve, toss spinach, nectarines, and marmalade mixture until combined. Place on 2 dinner plates; scatter almonds on top. Delish.com

Citrus Scallops

- 1 lemon
- 1 lime
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 1/4 pound sea scallops, rinsed
- 3 teaspoon olive oil
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped shallot
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1 bag (5- to 6-ounce) baby greens
- 1/4 cup fresh parsley leaves, chopped





From lemon, grate 1/4 teaspoon peel and squeeze 2 tablespoons juice. From lime, grate 1/4 teaspoon peel and squeeze 1 tablespoon juice. Set juices aside. In small bowl, combine peels, salt, and pepper. Place scallops on paper-towel-lined plate; pat dry. Sprinkle with citrus-peel mixture. In 12-inch nonstick skillet, heat 2 teaspoons oil on medium 1 minute. Add scallops; cook 6 to 8 minutes or until opaque throughout, turning once. Remove from pan; cover. To skillet, add 1 teaspoon oil and shallot; cook 3 minutes or until tender. Stir in Dijon mustard and citrus juices, scraping up browned bits; cook 1 minute. Toss sauce with greens; place on plates. Top with scallops and chopped parsley, and serve with whole wheat couscous. Delish.com

Pool Season Begins May 25th... Do You Know Where Your Pool Passes Are?

It's time to start digging around in the bottom of your pool bag or in the drawer with the swimsuits for your Broadlands Photo ID pool passes. Everyone age 5 and older will need one to gain admission to the pools. If you are 18 or older, you must provide proof of residency in order to obtain a pool pass.

If you are an owner and have the pool passes you used last year, you DO NOT need to submit an application. Passes will be electronically reactivated. If you cannot locate your passes, reprints can be issued free of charge prior to the opening of the pool on May 25, 2013. After May 25, replacement cards cost \$5.00 each. If you want a new picture for your replacement pass, the cost is \$7.00, regardless of when the pass is issued.

New Residents: You must fill out an application, return it to the Nature Center and have your photos taken. Applications are available at the Nature Center, in this newsletter on page 25, or online at www.broadlandshoa.org. Click on Pool Information in the Directory on the left hand side of the home page. Pool passes are issued to each individual age 5 and older living in the household. A household consists of all persons <u>permanently</u> living in the dwelling, including live-in caretakers and any unmarried children who are students and/or from a previous marriage and who will be residing with the owner for the summer.

Tenants: If the owner wishes to transfer their pool rights over to the tenant, then the owner AND tenant must complete a Tenant Membership application for the 2013 season. In this instance, passes will only be issued to the Tenants, not the owners. Tenants may use previously issued passes, but these will not be activated until a completed application is received at the HOA office. Applications are available at the Nature Center, in this newsletter on page 24, and online at www.broadlandshoa.org.

Becoming of age: Children who have turned 5 since last summer or will be 5 by June 1, 2013 must have a picture taken and pass issued. Please use the resident application form on page 25 and return it to the Nature Center to add them to your family data base. Any individual who has turned 18 since last pool season will need a new adult card.

Non-resident caregivers: Passes are offered for \$40 per caregiver for the season. They should be noted as non-resident caregivers on the resident's application. The fee must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the caregiver to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Guest passes: 10 resident guest passes are allocated to each *residence*. Additional guest passes, good for 10 visits may be purchased for \$20. Guest passes are added to the electronic account. No physical pass will be issued. Guests must be accompanied by a pool pass holder to gain admittance to the pool facility. Up to **5 long-term house guests** may obtain pool passes for \$40 per person for the season, \$15 per person for a month (30 consecutive days) or \$5 per person for a week (7 consecutive days). They must be noted as non-resident house guests on the resident's application. The fees must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the guests to the photo session and show proof of identity and address. However, the long-term guest may enter the pools without the resident present.

BEGINNING APRIL 1, 2013, PICTURES WILL BE TAKEN AT THE NATURE CENTER FROM 9:00 A.M. TO 5:00 P.M. MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY ON A FIRST-COME,-FIRST SERVED BASIS.

Prior to having the photo taken, all adults 18 and older must show a photo ID with proof of Broadlands Association residency. **Photos will not be taken if acceptable proof of identity and address are not available.**

Acceptable photo IDs include:

- Driver's License
- School, Military ID
- Current Passport
