Pool Season is Coming Up... Do You Know Where Your Pool Passes Are?

It's time to start looking in the bottom of your pool bag or maybe in the drawer with the swimsuits for your Broadlands Photo ID pool passes. Everyone 5 and up who wishes to gain admission to the pools will need one.

If you are a new resident, you must fill out an application, return it to the Nature Center and have your photos taken. Applications are available at the Nature Center, in this newsletter, see page 7 or online at <u>www.broadlandshoa.org</u>.

If you received a pass last year and have lost it, you can receive a replacement pass free of charge until Pool Opening Day which is May 23, 2009. Call the Nature Center at 703-729-9704 and request a replacement pass. After May 23rd there will be a \$5.00 fee for each replacement pass. If you want a new pass with a new photo the charge is \$7.00. **CREDIT CARDS ARE NOT ACCEPTED!** Cash or check only. All passes are picked up at the Nature Center Monday through Friday from 9:00a.m. to 5:00p.m.

If any of your children have turned five since last summer or will be five by June 1, 2009, they must have a picture taken and a pass made. Please use the resident application form on page 7 and return it to the Nature Center to add them to your family data base.

Pictures will be taken at the Nature Center from 9:00a.m. to 5:00p.m. Monday through Friday on a first come first served basis. Additionally, the Nature Center will be open for photographs on Sunday, May 17th from 12:00p.m. to 5:00p.m.

Pool passes will be issued to each individual aged 5 and up living in the household. A household consists of all persons <u>permanently</u> living in the dwelling including live-in caretakers and any unmarried children who are students and/or from a previous marriage and who will be residing with the owner for the summer.

Renters must have the owner of the property sign the application transferring their pool privileges to the tenant. Please use the Tenant membership application on page 8.

Prior to having the photo taken, all adults 18 and up must show a photo ID and proof of address.

Photos will not be taken if acceptable proof of identity and address are not available.

Acceptable photo IDs include:

- Driver's License
- School, Military or Work Photo ID
- State Issued Non-Driver Photo ID
- Current Passport
- Current Resident Alien Photo ID

Acceptable Proof of Address include:

- Payroll Stub issued within the last 60 days
- Most Recent W-2 or 1099
- Original Bank Statement issued within the last 60 days
- Utility bill issued within the last 60 days
- Current Virginia Voter Registration Card
- Settlement Papers or Deed
- Current Homeowners Insurance Policy

Non-resident caregivers are able to obtain a pass for \$40 for the season. They snould be noted as non-resident caregivers on the resident's application. The fee must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the care giver to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Up to 5 long term house guests may obtain pool passes for \$40 per person for the season or \$15 per person for a month (30 consecutive days) or \$5 per person for seven consecutive days. They must be noted as non-resident house guests on the resident's application. The fees must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the guests to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Ten guest passes are allocated to each **residence**. Additional guest passes, good for 10 visits may be purchased for \$20. Guest passes are added to the electronic account. No physical pass will be issued. Guests must be accompanied by a pool pass holder to gain admittance to the pool facility.

MEMBERS MUST COMPLY WITH ALL LIFEGUARD INSTRUCTIONS

GENERAL RULES

- NO glass containers or breakable objects
- NO food of drink except in designated areas
- NO profane language
- NO play equipment or wheeled vehicles, except wheel chairs and strollers
- NO pets
- NO alcohol or drugs
- NO smoking
- NO chewing gum
- NO running, pushing, dunking, wrestling or rough play
- · NO general swimming in diving area
- · NO water toys or other equipment unless authorized by pool manager
- NO diving in shallow area
- NO tape players, CD players or radios unless waterproof and used with personal headphones
- NO flotation devices except water wings, U.S.C.G. approved life vests and U.S.C.G. approved swimwear flotation devices
- NO DISPOSABLE DIAPERS. Children not yet toilet trained must wear plastic pants or "Swimmies" (swim diaper) under their bathing suit.

Notes from Your Neighbors...... Ashburn Volunteer Fire Rescue Department, <u>www.ashburnfirerescue.org</u>

My name is **Terry the Traumasaurus**, and, I am a paramedic dinosaur whose job it is to help promote the well being and safety of children in the Ashburn community.

Kids love to be active & <u>riding toys</u> fit the bill. Mom & Dad here are some safety tips to follow:

- Choose a toy that suits your child.
- Consider size, age, and abilities. Many injuries are caused by riding toys that are too large or too advanced for the child.
- Make sure the path is clear, and no hazards are in the pathway. Watch out for traffic, stairs, rough sidewalks, cords, and furniture that could cause an injury.
- Look for high-quality, durable pieces; free of sharp edges, unstable joints, or other potential hazards. Check weight requirements and make sure the piece will support your child and that all the screws are tight. Toys should be sturdy enough not to tip over, even when turning corners.

Supervise - Keep a constant eye on your little one and make sure they stay in safe areas.

Ride on toys are a fun way for kids to expend their energy and get the physical activity they need. With a few precautions on your part, they can be a safe and enjoyable experience.

Everywhere I go, I get lots and lots of questions from boys and girls about all my friends at the fire house and what they do there.

BJ (5 years old) asks "Terry, Why is no one ever sure when the helicopter will come at your Open House?"

Great question, BJ... The emergency helicopter service that helps us at AVFRD is always working and "on call" all the time. If they have a real emergency they must always go there first. We ask them to come to our Open House, fully aware that they may get called away if they are needed at an emergency scene, elsewhere. The weather may also be a problem– we always hope for a pleasant day, but a very cloudy or windy day may delay or even prevent their ability to fly. This year we have asked them to try to come about 3:30.... But we never know...

Keep Mom and Dad Safe – Ecards Provide Internet and Privacy Tips

Along with the flowers, cards, ties, and gadgets, consider sending these e-cards for Mother's Day and Father's Day. Available from the FTC in English and Spanish at www.ftc.gov/ dad, www.ftc.gov/padre, and www.ftc.gov/mom, www.ftc.gov/ madre, the cards offer advice on keeping personal information secure.

Help your folks figure out how to spot fraud on the Internet. When Internet scam artists go "phishing," they send spam emails or pop-up messages asking for personal information, Social Security numbers, and/or passwords. To gain the trust of those they wish to con, these hustlers often pose as representatives of a bank, an Internet Service Provider, or a government agency. Send them these ecards and keep them from getting hooked by Internet con artists.



The FTC works for the consumer to prevent fraudulent, deceptive, and unfair business practices in the marketplace and to provide information to help consumers spot, stop, and avoid them. Broadlands Association Board of Directors Meeting March 10, 2009 Board Actions

The meeting was called to order at 5:39p.m. with the following Board members in attendance:

Also arriving during the meeting were 4 representatives for Kincora to give a presentation to the Board of Directors. They were Christopher T. Flynn (Bendure Communications, Inc.), John C. McGranahan, Jr. (Hunton & Williams, LLP), John G. Lavoie, (Cooley, Godward, Kronish, LLP) and Daniel P. Coughlan (TRITEC Real Estate Company, Inc.).

Brian Beahm moved to approve the minutes from the February 10, 2009 Board Meeting and was seconded by Eric Bazerghi. The motion was approved 6/0/1 with Mark McIntosh abstaining.

Cliff Keirce discussed school redistricting and is approaching the issue as he has in the past. His rationale is to keep Broadlands children here in the community and not have them split up. He is also advocating no money be spent for new schools unless needed. Cliff also discussed the upcoming Van Metre 5 Mile Race and noted that some private streets appeared to be on the race route prior to clearance by the Association. He addressed better clean-up, indemnification for the Association and notice to residents on the private streets. Sandwich boards were to be placed at the entrance to the streets a week prior to the event.

Roy Barnett discussed the Hotel Special Exception Hearing. There would be a two month deferral. Mr. Barnett also mentioned that Demott Drive may be slated to go through to Moorefield Transit Station. Van Metre would be opposing this change and recommended that the Board should oppose this because Demott would become more of a cut through street if this occurred. Mr. Barnett also mentioned Van Metre would be looking to move the Church site from Wynridge (Section 208) to the age restricted housing site (Section 108). Mr. Barnett also confirmed with Mr. Marable that Broadlands Boulevard would be open to Route 659 (Belmont Ridge Road) in approximately May.

Eric Bazerghi commented on the quick clean up of the Hillside Tunnel after the major graffiti issue, the possibility of adding a sign under each marquee board advertising the web site and commented on the family emergency that prevented Staci Kapinos from attending the meeting.

Lori Seidmeyer (Habitat Committee) spoke about upcoming events to benefit the Loudoun Earth Day celebration to be held in Broadlands on April 26th. On March 26th Anothai will donate a portion of the proceeds to the Habitat Committee and the Loudoun Earth Day celebration. There will be an Earth Day celebration at American Flatbread on April 22nd. Lori also inquired about using the frame sign at the fountain entrance prior to the event for advertising. This would have to be authorized by Van Metre.

The Board heard a presentation from the CSL Swim Team. They wish to add a shed at the Community Center Pool to be located on the grassy area behind the current trash dumpster near the outdoor shower. The Board requested the Swim Team obtain a building permit for the work and that the shed be vinyl, not metal. Cliff Keirce moved that since the increase in capacity to 195 members resulted in all Broadlands residents currently registered being eligible for the team and that the 4 slots left had to be advertised in the April newsletter with a deadline of April 10th. Kincora made their presentation and discussed the proposed location which encompasses 400 acres on the Southwest quadrant of Route 7 and Route 28. The proposed development includes residential (apartments and condominiums) in a village style with some retail, a fire station, cultural arts center and a minor league baseball park. If the project continues on track with zoning the ball park would be open in Spring of 2011. The project calls for a number of road improvements in the area being competed prior to construction.

Denise Harrover moved to approve the Dog Swim proposed by Ashburn Village Animal with no outside members because of the turnout at the prior year's event in the aftermath of Katrina. The motion was seconded by Brian Beahm. The motion passed 7/0/0.

 $Brian \ Beahm \ moved \ to \ approve \ Bob \ Clyburn \ as \ a \ new \ Modifications \ Subcommittee \ member. \ Eric \ Bazerghi \ seconded \ the \ motion. \ The \ motion \ was \ approved \ 7/0/0.$

Brian Beahm moved to approve the draft audit as submitted by Ahlberg & Company, P.C. and authorize the signing of the representation letters. The motion was seconded by Eric Bazerghi. The motion was approved 7/0/0.

Eric Bazerghi stated the Technology Committee had narrowed the candidates to two companies. The committee would bring their recommendation to the next Board meeting.

The Annual Meeting has been confirmed and is set for Tuesday, May 12th at the Mill Run Elementary School from 7:00p.m. to 9:30p.m. Management is to review signatories for all accounts after the Annual Meeting.

Eric Bazerghi moved to deny request to keep fence and playground past deadline. Fees will be assessed on two violations at \$10/ day/violation starting March 28, 2009 until the maximum assessment of \$900 per each violation is reached. Brian Beahm seconded the motion. The motion was approved 6/0/0. Denise Harrover was out of the room during the vote.

Eric Bazerghi moved to approve the day care application as submitted by the Little Sprouts Preschool. Brian Beahm seconded the motion. The motion was approved 7/0/0. *Board Actions continued on page 38*

"SPRINGTIME BLUES"

With all the trees and flowers blooming right now, we also see the peak of hay fever! Just like people, dogs and cats can develop allergies, with itchy, red eyes and runny noses. However, they often only show signs of allergies by chewing or licking themselves, signs that owners may mistake as "normal". Many dog owners are aware of "hot spots". These intensely itchy sores can pop up very quickly and need treatment.

Treatment of allergies often starts by trying to rule out other causes of allergies (fleas or ticks, food, contact with something like detergent or fertilizer). Antihistamines are often a good first choice of therapy, but antibiotics, shampoos, allergy injections, or even steroids may also be necessary in more complicated cases. So remember, if you hear somebody sneeze, it might just be your four-legged friend with hayfever!

The Ashburn Farmer's Market Begins Soon!

Ahhh, spring has arrived and along with it comes the opening of the Ashburn Farmer's Market, May 2nd! Located just off the Greenway at Ryan Park Shopping Center, our local, Loudoun Valley farmers and producers bring wonderful produce, plants, baked goods, cheeses, meats, wine, and more to market each Saturday from 8am to noon.

The following schedule provides approximate availability:

Spring: The early season brings bedding plants, salad greens, asparagus, herbs, beets, cut flowers, radishes, and rhubarb.

Summer: Strawberries, raspberries, cucumbers, zucchini, squash, peas, snap beans, peppers, and tomatoes come in June. Corn, melons and blueberries arrive about the end of June/beginning of July.

Fall/Early Winter: Late season harvest brings pumpkins, squash, herbs, greens, fresh pears, apples and apple cider, cabbage, potatoes, parsnips, swiss chard, sweet potatoes and walnuts.

Year-round: Meats, cheeses, baked goods, salsa, eggs, plants, and wine are available.

If you have never visited the market plan to stop by, get to know your local food growers and be impressed with the quality of offerings they bring to market. See a plant, vegetable, or fruit you are not familiar with? Don't hesitate to ask questions! Farmers enjoy sharing information about what they produce and the best possible way to use it or serve it. Note that some producers may not be there every week. So, if you find something you really like, ask their schedule.

A few notes about shopping a farmer's market...

- Come early for the best selection.
- Don't be bashful try the samples.
- Plan to pay by cash small bills are always welcome.
- Bring the kids what a great opportunity to teach them about sourcing food.
- Don't forget your re-usable bags.

TIME TO GET OUT AND PLAY! BY SHANNON M. PECORA, M.A. STREAM VALLEY VETERINARY HOSPITAL

Pack up those heavy sweaters! Stow away the snow shovel and ice scrapers! Open up those windows! Get out of the house and enjoy some fresh springtime air! But

don't do it alone—our dogs have often suffered from winter cabin fever, and they want to get out, stretch their legs, and get some exercise, too.

Take a look out your front door; in our area, it's highly likely that you've got a walking path or nature trail within sight. These trails afford you the opportunity to enjoy the natural beauty of our own community while you



and your pet stay in shape. Of course, we share these areas with the local wildlife as well, so make sure that your dog has the appropriate vaccinations (such as rabies, lyme, and leptospirosis) and preventatives (heartworm, flea and tick) on board before you head out. And, if you and your veterinarian have decided that your dog may not be a candidate for some of these protective vaccines, you can always stick to the sidewalks just along your street.

A walk around the block can also have its benefits! If you check with your vet, and your dog is appropriately protected, fit, and adventurous, you may want to check out some of the hiking trails that our area has to offer. The Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority website (<u>www.nvrpa.org</u>) lists the hours, locations, and pet-related rules of many of the great hiking spots near our community. There are even trail maps so you can plan trips and distances ahead of time.

Note that leash and pet waste laws still apply, so you've got to keep track of and clean up after your dog, even if it seems like you're just in the middle of the woods!

Warmer weather truly helps conquer many of the excuses we may have for avoiding exercise. We know that outdoor activity is good for us and good for our dogs.

You don't have to take your Great Dane along on a marathon run or take your Yorkie puppy on a hike through the mountains, but certainly take whatever chance you can to go outside and play!

Have her hold the paper in place while you wrap colored tape once or twice -- not too tightly -- around the widest part of her head. Remove the hat and trim the brim so it's about five inches wide. Fold up about a half-inch of the brim and secure it with invisible tape to form a hem. If desired, fold up and tape a section of the brim at the front.

A FLOWER FOR YOUR CAP...Add some floral flair to your new hat with a tissue paper bloom. For each flower, cut out several circles of tissue paper in two different sizes and colors and stack them. Cut a 1-inch circle out of card stock and use a craft knife or wooden skewer to poke two small holes near the center. Poke a 3-inch length of pipe cleaner through the center of the tissue paper circles and through one hole in the card stock circle. Thread a pony bead onto the pipe cleaner, then bend and push the end through the second hole in the card stock and back through the paper stack. Twist the ends of the pipe cleaner together. Crinkle the tissue paper petals, then tape the flower to your hat by its stem.

Liquid food coloring, sprinkles, colored sugar and candy flowers Cut entire cake into 1-inch-thick slices. Use 1-inch-wide cookie cutters or knife to cut round, square, and diamond shapes from each slice. Place cake pieces on wire rack set on a waxed paper-lined cookie sheet. In large saucepan over medium heat, mix together powdered sugar, corn syrup, ½ cup water, vanilla and almond extracts until mixture is creamy, about 5 mins. Remove saucepan from heat and let cool about 5 mins. As icing cools, if stiffens, stir in a spoonful of water to keep the icing smooth and flowing. Divide icing equally between two or three small bowls. Stir food coloring, a drop at a time, into each bowl until icing is the desired shade. Working with one piece of cake at a time, spoon on icing to cover it completely, then add sprinkles, colored sugar, or a candy flower before icing sets. Let cakes stand, uncovered, until icing is dry, about 30 mins. Store in up to 3 days. Makes about 30 cakes.

The fitness industry is not unlike many other industries; it goes thru many phases and fads. You can now see just as many infomercials related to fitness products as you can for "helpful" household products and gadgets. With so many new devices, pills, and ideas, the general public can feel a little lost. While there certainly are some wonderful new products and ideas in fitness, some are just bunk. In the last five years or so fitness has found a new buzz word; core. You may read about 'core strength' or hear about an athlete focusing on 'core training' and 'core conditioning'. I am here to tell you that all of this "core" talk is no joke, it's here to stay, and there is much science to back up the hype.

What is the Core?

When most people here the word core as related to fitness they think of the abdominal area, if you

are into pilates you may call it the 'powerhouse'. Both of those answers are correct but the core is so much more than just the abdominals, and what does powerhouse mean anyway? When a Fitness Professional talks about the core she is referring to the muscles deep in the abs and back that attach to the spine and pelvis. In other words, the core consists of the muscles that work to stabilize the back and pelvis including the muscle groups surrounding the hips, spine, and the abdominals. Listing all of the muscles involved would take up the rest of the article but suffice it to say that it is an extensive list of very important muscles.

What are the benefits of core training?

- Improved posture and balance
- Greater efficiency of movement
- Reduced risk of injury
- Greater body control and awareness
- Increased function of peripheral muscles (if the base is strong the limbs can work more efficiently)
- Reduces back pain and tension

How can I train my core?

The idea of core training has lent itself to a new way of thinking in the fitness industry. Many trainers are moving away from training one body part at a time and opting instead for a more functional approach. Core training is all about training the body as a whole not just part by part because we now understand that all of the parts are linked and affect each other. The new way of thinking has lead to the increased demand for exercise balls, bosu trainers, and other forms of stability training.

My favorite core exercise is the plank. It's simple to perform, anyone can do it anywhere. Start by holding the plank for just a few seconds making sure that your abs are pulled in and your body is in a nice straight line, no bum in the air. As you improve increase your time. If you can hold for over a minute try to lift one leg, then the other.



There are so many ways to effectively train the core muscles. You can even work the core by simply standing on one foot...if you think that is pretty easy, try closing your eyes. You'll feel all kinds of muscles twitching in the ankles that you never even knew existed! If you want to continue the experiment; try to squat down on that one leg, go as low as you can. If you are good at that and need a challenge grab a small towel, place it on the ground during one squat and pick it up the next squat. Do 10-15 reps per side a couple of times. I guarantee you'll wake up some new muscles. You have now gone from a simple core exercise to a full on functional exercise that is utilizing all of the major muscles in your body.

The greatest thing about core training and functional training is that you get more bang for the buck. The more muscles that you use at one time, the more calories you will burn=greater results in less time!

Good luck and I hope to see many more planks being done at the gyms very soon!

Loudoun County's Office of Public Information to Hold Series of Digital TV Transition Information Meetings

Loudoun County's Office of Public Information, in conjunction with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), is holding a series of meetings to help people prepare for the transition to digital television.

Loudoun residents who have questions about the digital conversion or who need assistance in understanding how to attach their digital converter box will have the opportunity to talk to representatives of the FCC.

The deadline for full-power broadcast TV stations to complete the switch to digital television (DTV) is June 12, 2009. Broadcast stations are required to notify their viewers before shutting off their analog channels. Local broadcast channels will make on-air announcements about the transition. Viewers may also contact stations directly for more information.

If you have one or more analog televisions that receive free over-theair TV programming with an outdoor antenna or "rabbit ears" on the TV, you will need to be prepared for the transition. You have three options: purchase and connect a "digital-to-analog converter box" to your analog TV, purchase a digital television (a TV with a built-in digital tuner), or subscribe to a paid service such as cable or satellite TV. Each U.S. household is eligible to receive two \$40 coupons from the federal government to be used toward the purchase of two digital converter boxes.

May Tips for the Garden

When planting a new shade tree, consider whether it is messy or neat in appearance, weak- or strong-wooded, and long- or short-lived. Resist the temptation to plant a fast-growing, weak tree for quick shade.

Some trees that are messy and weak-wooded include silver maple, hybrid poplar, mimosa, weeping willow, black cherry, and Eastern cottonwood. Better choices are Chinese elm, Japanese zelkova, pin oak, red maple, river birch, tulip poplar, and willow oak.

Rough or careless handling of balled-and-burlapped trees can break the soil ball, damaging or breaking off most of the roots, and result in the death of the tree. Never pick up a B&B tree by its trunk; instead, carry it by the root ball, being gentle when putting it down.

Regularly water newly planted trees and shrubs during the first three to four years after planting to help establish a good root system. They need at least 1 inch of water each week. It is better to water deeply once a week, than to water lightly every day; the former practice encourages deep, drought-resistant roots while the latter practice encourages surface roots that may suffer during dry spells. Apply an organic mulch to conserve moisture and control weeds.

Most evergreens have many roots near the soil surface. Avoid deep cultivation, which might wound roots.

Prune out winter-killed wood on trees and shrubs by cutting back to green wood after new growth begins.

Watering with soaker hoses or drip irrigation will reduce the spread of blackspot in roses.
