Looking Forward This May will mark the 23rd anniversary of American Wetlands Month, a time when EPA and its partners in federal, state, tribal, local, non-profit, and private sector organizations celebrate the vital importance of wetlands to the Nation's ecological, economic, and social health. It is also a great opportunity to discover and teach others about the important role that wetlands play in our environment and the significant benefits they provide - improved water quality,



increased water storage and supply, reduced flood and storm surge risk, and critical habitat for plants, fish, and wildlife.

Beginning in the early planning stages of Broadlands, efforts were made to preserve the natural wetlands by working around them to create areas for homes, schools, recreation, offices, and shopping. The result was a land plan with green spaces throughout the community. A commitment to preserving and enhancing the natural environment is at the heart of Broadlands philosophy. Unfortunately, it seems that our wetlands are sometimes misunderstood.

What is a wetland?

A wetland is an area that is covered by shallow water or has waterlogged soils for long periods during the growing season in most years. Prolonged saturation with water leads to chemical changes in wetland soils, which in turn affect the kinds of plants that can grow. Therefore, wetland vegetation often looks quite different from that of surrounding non-wetland areas. Although wetlands are often wet, a wetland might not be wet year-round. Some of the most important wetlands are only seasonally wet. Wetlands are the link between the land and the water. They are transition zones where the flow of water, the cycling of nutrients, and the energy of the sun meet to produce a unique ecosystem characterized by hydrology, soils, and vegetation, making these areas very important features of a watershed. Using a watershed-based approach to wetland protection ensures that the whole system, including land, air, and water resources, is protected. The United States loses about 60,000 acres of wetlands each year. The very runoff that wetlands help to clean can overload and contaminate these fragile ecosystems. In addition, nonnative species of plants and animals and global climate change contribute to wetland loss and degradation.

How do wetlands benefit nature?

Often called "nurseries of life," wetlands provide habitat for thousands of species of aquatic and terrestrial plants and animals. Although wetlands are best known for being home to water lilies, turtles, frogs, muskrats, salamanders, and snakes, they also provide important habitat for waterfowl, fish, and mammals. Migrating birds use wetlands to rest and feed during their cross-continental journeys and as nesting sites when they are at home. As a result, wetland loss has a serious impact on these species. Habitat degradation since the 1970s has been a leading cause of species extinction. Wetlands do more than provide habitat for plants and animals in the watershed. When rivers overflow, wetlands help to absorb and slow floodwaters. This ability to control floods can alleviate property damage and loss and can even save lives. Wetlands also absorb excess nutrients, sediment, and other pollutants before they reach rivers, lakes, and other waterbodies.

How do wetlands benefit people?

Wetlands benefit people in many ways that may not be obvious. Continued on page 12

Broadlands Annual Meeting - May 6th, 2014

This meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 6, 2014 at the **new Broadlands Clubhouse**, located at 43360 Rickenbacker Square. The doors open at 6:30pm for the purpose of registering a quorum. The agenda begins at 7:00pm. As part of the meeting, an election will be held to select two (2) members to three-year terms ending in May 2017 and one (1) member to serve a one-year term ending in May 2015.

This will allow us to establish a quorum and to run the meeting on time.

Movies begin around sundown – time listed is approximate. In the event of rain, check the website to see if the event is cancelled or rescheduled.

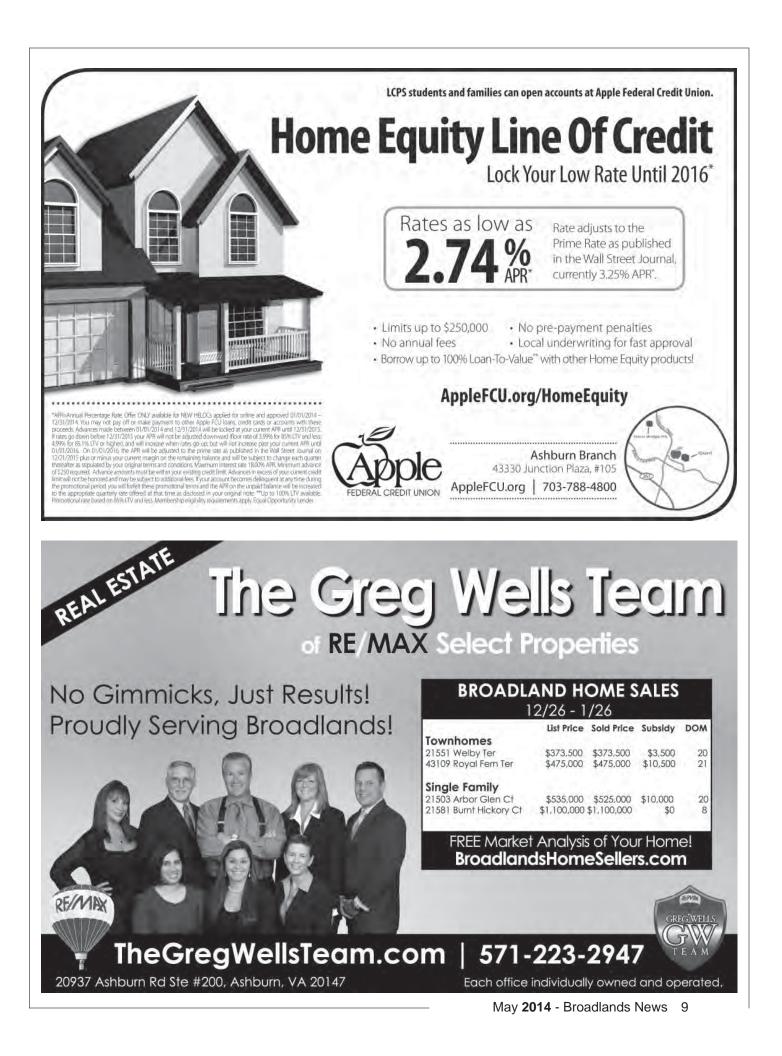

They improve the quality of our water by filtering sediments and removing contaminants. They serve as spawning sites and nursery areas for fish and other aquatic life. They also support downstream aquatic systems, including commercial and sport fisheries, by producing food and organic material that is flushed out of the wetlands and into streams during high flows. They reduce flood damage to crops and human settlements downstream by storing flood water and releasing it slowly, like a giant sponge. They protect shorelines from erosion due to waves and currents. Additionally, they provide recreational opportunities, such as hunting, fishing, boating, and wildlife watching.

How can you recognize a wetland?

The term "wetland" encompasses a variety of conditions and degrees of wetness. Some wetlands are very easy to recognize because the water sits on the land's surface for much of the year. Other wetlands exist due to saturation of the soil by groundwater and can be difficult to identify. One clue that a tract of land may contain wetlands is its topography or position in the landscape. Wetlands occur in areas where water naturally flows or accumulates, such as in the floodplains of streams and rivers, along smaller creeks and washes, in low spots or depressions in flat or rolling landscapes, around seeps and springs, along the fringes of ponds and lakes, and in coastal areas affected by tides. Even in fairly obvious wetland begins. Wetlands are delineated by carefully examining a site for the presence of wetland indicators. Three categories of wetland indicators exist: vegetation, soil, and hydrology.

What does this all mean to me?

Broadlands Association and our contractors work very hard to protect our existing wetlands. What may appear to be a nuisance or unattractive to you may in fact be a wetlands preserve or wetlands impact area. You may want (or want the HOA) to alter the wetlands on some ways, but these areas are heavily regulated by the Army Corps of Engineers and limits are placed on what can and cannot be done to alter these areas. The following outlines what can and cannot be done in a preserved wetlands area at Broadlands.

Permitted Activities:

- Trimming (by hand only) of dead or diseased vegetation
- Planting of native species typically adapted to living in wetland areas

Typical trees include: Red Maple

Red Maple	Pin Oak
Willow Óak	Green Ash
Sycamore	Sweet Gum

Typical shrubs include: Black Willow A Silky Dogwood B Winterberry H

Arrowwood Brookside Alder Highbush Blueberry

Prohibited Activities:

- Removing vegetation by the roots
- Ditching, filling, grading or other land disturbing activities
- Installation of permanent structures such as dog runs, dog kennels, picnic tables, swing sets, mulch piles, or asphalt or concrete paths

Wetlands in Broadlands occur along streams and ponds, as well as in low lying wooded areas. Many of our trails, homes, and tot lots are adjacent to wetlands or wetlands impact areas. Many of these areas either hold water year round or fill with water after heavy rains, doing what they a supposed to do by preventing flooding, hosting wildlife, and filtering sediment. Hopefully you now have a greater appreciation of wetlands and how we have incorporated Broadlands into the natural environment and the next time you see stagnant water or a swampy area you think may need better drainage, you may be looking at a wetlands area.

So get out there and enjoy the surrounding nature!

Save Yourself Time, Money and Aggravation

Before you make any modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the homeowner's responsibility to file an application with the Modifications Subcommittee for all exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this requirement.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a Covenants violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee by the Homeowners Association of up to \$900, which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made in a timely manner. You may be taken to General District Court in order for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which the Commonwealth of Virginia requires you to provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines at http://www.broadlandshoa.org/ for-homeowners/design-guidelines/ for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in a timely manner to the Modifications Subcommittee in order to obtain approval prior to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions. Good vs. Bad Soil: How to Grow Soil For Your Garden

We always struggled with poor results in our efforts to have healthy and lush results with our garden at home. I was amazed with the information given at one of the workshops called *"Urban Soil Husbandry and Sustainable Hydrologic Landscapes"* at The Chesapeake Conservation Landscaping Council Conference.

The keys to good soil are nutrients, aeration, and volume.

Nutrients come in many forms. Fertilizers for example, are a synthetic nutrient additive. You can also

add nutrients by composting. The more organic material you have in your soil the more nutrients you'll have. Nutrients give good soil its rich dark color, so if your soil is very sandy, very red or black from



clay you will want to add organic compounds to your soil. For many this is as easy as dumping your grass clippings into your garden plot and tilling them in. These organic compounds will break down and add nutrients. You can also add fireplace ash and all the leftover veggies from the kitchen, like onion peels, and apple cores. Even your egg shells work great.

Aeration can only be described as the looseness or texture of the soil. How easily does it break apart or how easily can you dig in it? Plants have to work their roots into the ground in order to access the nutrients you've placed there for them. The easier you can make it for your plants to put down roots, the quicker and easier they'll grow. You can help your soil out by adding peat moss, pecan shells, peanut husks, or even a little sand. For those really clay based soils which will often be red or black in color and have a very dense consistency, break up the soil, then add one of the above mentioned items, till it in, and then repeat every couple of months until you start seeing a nice texture in your soils.

Volume is how much soil you need. So many times we are just treating the top 6-8 inches of our gardens. This isn't enough because our plants need room to grow. If we don't allow enough space they won't really reach down into the soil and make the most of what's there. My recommendation is to provide 2 cubic feet per plant.

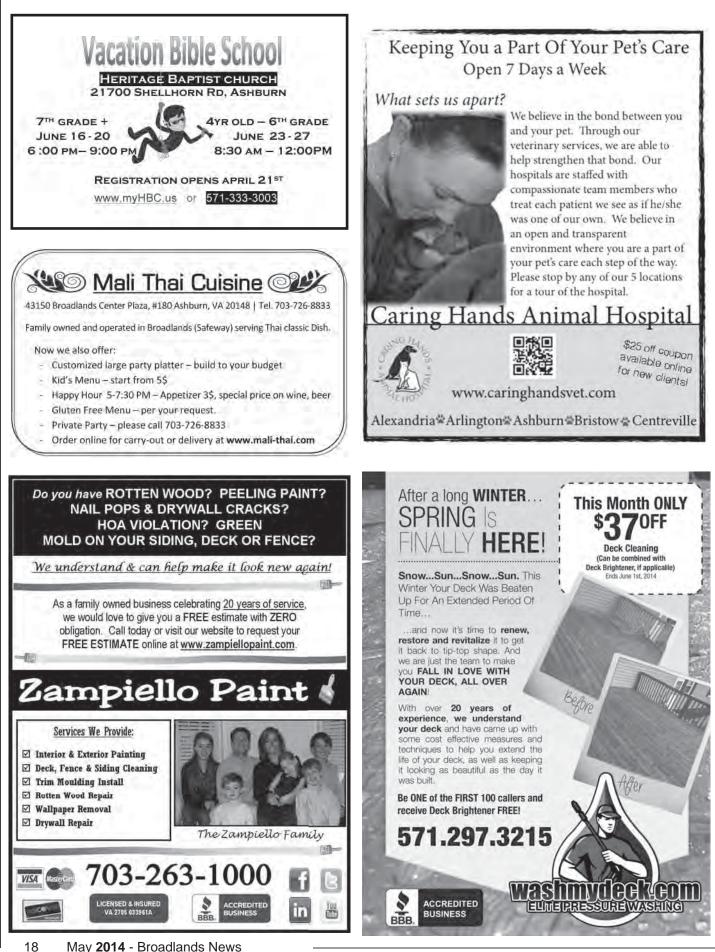


Some plants can be grown closer together than a foot, but that just means that their root structure grows down not out. So provide a good 12–18 inches of soil depth for your plants.

Give it a try and share your experience with us.

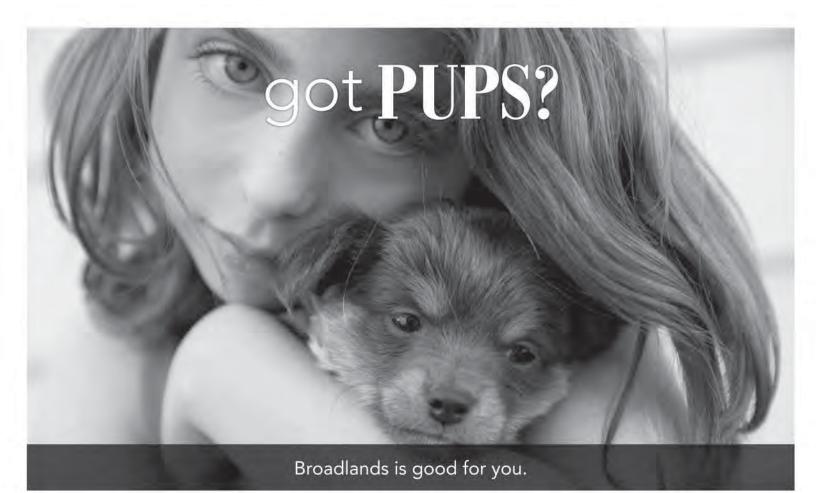

Fight the Bite - Loudoun Lyme 5K/1K

Fighting the bite of those all too prevalent ticks is the goal of the 4th annual Loudoun Lyme 5K/1K Fun Run/Walk - presented by **DryHome Roofing**. This year the popular event will take place at the Brambleton Town Center on Sunday, May 18th starting at 7:00am.

More than 1,000 runners/walkers of all ages are expected to attend the event in an

effort to generate awareness and money to help find a cure for Lyme disease, the number one tick-borne illness in the U.S. The Loudoun Lyme 5K will also feature a 1K Fun Run/Walk and informational fair to educate the public about the disease, its causes, and treatments. On hand will be community leaders, health department officials, Lyme experts, medical and veterinary doctors and specialists, vendors, and sponsors. The fair will also have children's activities and refreshments.

"We are creating a movement to bring more attention and resources to this devastating disease. That's why we are continuing to host the Loudoun Lyme 5K and connecting more people with information about diagnosing, treating and preventing this disease," explained Loudoun resident Steve Gotschi, event founder and owner of Sterling-based DryHome Roofing and Siding.

Steve's interest in organizing the event started after watching his wife battle the disease. For her, it started with unexplained aches, pains, and fevers. She went from doctor to doctor trying to find the reason for her health decline. After a long, frustrating year, the Gotschi family finally got a diagnosis: Lyme disease.

This story is all too familiar to county residents, including many living here in Broadlands. Home to the third largest number of Lyme's cases in the nation, Loudoun County is facing a Lyme disease epidemic.

According to the CDC, in 2012 the U.S. reported more than 30,000 new cases of Lyme disease. However, the disease is difficult to diagnose and that figure may be significantly greater. Unfortunately, fewer than half of patients with Lyme disease recall a tick bite or a rash, making it harder to diagnose.

The race costs \$30 for adults/\$15 for children 12 and under through May 12. Starting May 13, adults cost \$35 and children \$20. The fair is free. Proceeds benefit the National Capital Lyme Disease Association, a nonprofit offering education and support.

Pool Season Begins May 24th... Do You Know Where Your Pool Passes Are?

It's time to start digging around in the bottom of your pool bag or in the drawer with the swimsuits for your Broadlands photo ID pool passes. Everyone aged 5 and older will need one to gain admission to the pools. All residents 18 and older must provide proof of residency in order to obtain a pool pass.

IF YOU ARE AN OWNER AND HAVE THE POOL PASSES YOU USED LAST YEAR, YOU <u>DO NOT</u> NEED TO SUBMIT AN <i>APPLICATION. Passes will be electronically reactivated. If you cannot locate your passes, reprints can be issued free of charge prior to the opening of the pool on May 24, 2014. After May 24, replacement cards cost \$5.00 each. If you want a new picture for your replacement pass, the cost is \$7.00, regardless of when the pass is issued.

New Residents: You must fill out an application and return it to the HOA office at the Nature Center and each pass holder must have their photo taken. Applications are available at the Nature Center, in this newsletter on page 28, or online at www.broadlandshoa.org. Go to the "For Homeowners" tab at the top of the page and click on the "Pool Information" link to access. Pool passes are issued to each individual aged 5 and older living in the household. A household consists of all persons living in the dwelling, including live-in caretakers and any unmarried children who are students and/or from a previous marriage and who will be residing with the owner for the summer.

Tenants: If the owner wishes to transfer their pool rights over to the tenant, the owner AND tenant must complete a Tenant Membership Application for the 2014 season. In this instance, passes will only be issued to the Tenants, not the owners. Tenants may use previously issued passes, but these will not be activated until a completed application is received at the HOA office. Applications are available at the HOA office in the Nature Center, in this newsletter on page 29, and online at www.broadlandshoa.org. Go to the "For Homeowners" tab at the top of the page and click on the "Pool Information" link to access.

Becoming of age: Children who have turned 5 since last summer or will be 5 by June 1, 2014 must have a picture taken and pass issued. Please use the resident application form on page 28 and return it to the HOA office at the Nature Center to add them to your family data base. Any individual who has turned 18 since last pool season will need a new adult card.

Non-resident caregivers: Passes are offered for \$100 per caregiver for the season. They should be noted as non-resident caregivers on the residents' application. The fee must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the caregiver to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Guest passes: 10 resident guest passes are allocated to each *residence*. Additional guest passes, good for 10 visits may be purchased for \$20. Guest passes are added to the electronic account. No physical pass will be issued. Guests must be accompanied by a pool pass holder to gain admittance to the pool facility.

Long term visitor: Passes are offered for \$100 per person for long term visitors for the season. The fee must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the visitor to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

BEGINNING APRIL 1, 2014, PICTURES WILL BE TAKEN AT THE NATURE CENTER FROM 9:00 A.M. TO 5:00 P.M. MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY ON A FIRST COME FIRST SERVED BASIS.

Prior to having the photo taken, all adults 18 and older must show a photo ID with proof of Broadlands Association residency. <u>Passes will not be issued if acceptable proof of identity and address are not available.</u>

Acceptable photo IDs include:

- Driver's License
- School, Military ID
- Current Passport

If your ID does not show a Broadlands Association address, the following additional documents will be accepted as proof of residency:

- Utility bill issued within the last 60 days
- Settlement Papers or Deed
- Current Virginia Voter Registration Card

How Much Do I Need? By, Katie Herbert CPT, Tabata Bootcamp Master Trainer locotabatabootcamp@gmail.com

This month's article wraps up our 4-month series on the Tabata Bootcamp **Take 3 Method** of eating. Over the last few months it has been really exciting to me that people are reading this and trying to put these principles into practice. I have bumped into so many neighbors recently that have told me about their own experiences with this method. If you missed the other articles I will give a quick refresher and then we will cap it all off with what may be the most important question of the three: How much do I need?

One of the foundations of Tabata Bootcamp is our approach to nutrition. We switch things up a bit and try to take the focus away from deprivation and "dieting" and turn our attention to mindful eating to fuel the body. Often times when we deprive ourselves we cannot sustain a program, there is a reason that most diets fail. Mindful eating teaches us to take just a few seconds to think about what we are about to consume and lead us to better choices. We make these better choices using the **Take 3 Method**.

The idea is that we stop and ask these 3 questions before anything passes through our lips:

- 1. Am I hungry?
- 2. Is it smart?
- 3. How much do I need?

In our modern day of over consumption and super sized everything, how much do I need is a huge game changer. Think about your last meal, how did you feel after you ate? Were you satisfied or did you hit that level of uncomfortable fullness? All too often we find ourselves rushed to eat or mindlessly eating and before we know it we have consumed an entire bag of chips or a whole restaurant sized entrée. Even healthful food loses its power if we choose to eat to the point of discomfort. Additionally, this question holds great power. Instead of depriving yourself food you are giving yourself permission to eat it. You remove feelings of guilt for eating something because you have gone through the process and have allowed yourself to enjoy the food.

Put it to practice:

- Never take an entire bag of anything to a couch or a table or anyplace that you plan to eat. Always, always take out the portion that you need, perhaps use the portion suggested on the label, put it into a bowl, close the bag, put it away and walk away. The calories that are saved here are major. This may seem like a small step, but this one can add up big time.
- Share an entrée when out to dinner.
- If you are dining alone or order separate entrees, ask that half of your meal be boxed up *before* it comes out. As I mentioned before, and as you all know, portion sizes now are crazy. Most of the time the portion is at least twice what it should be. This is a win-win because you save the calories and you have lunch for the next day. Bonus!
- If you are snacking think about when your next meal is, and how long do you need to last before then? If you are headed home from work and the tummy starts rumbling, reach for a small bag of almonds that you have cleverly stowed away in your console (hint, hint), about a handful is a serving size and that will get you



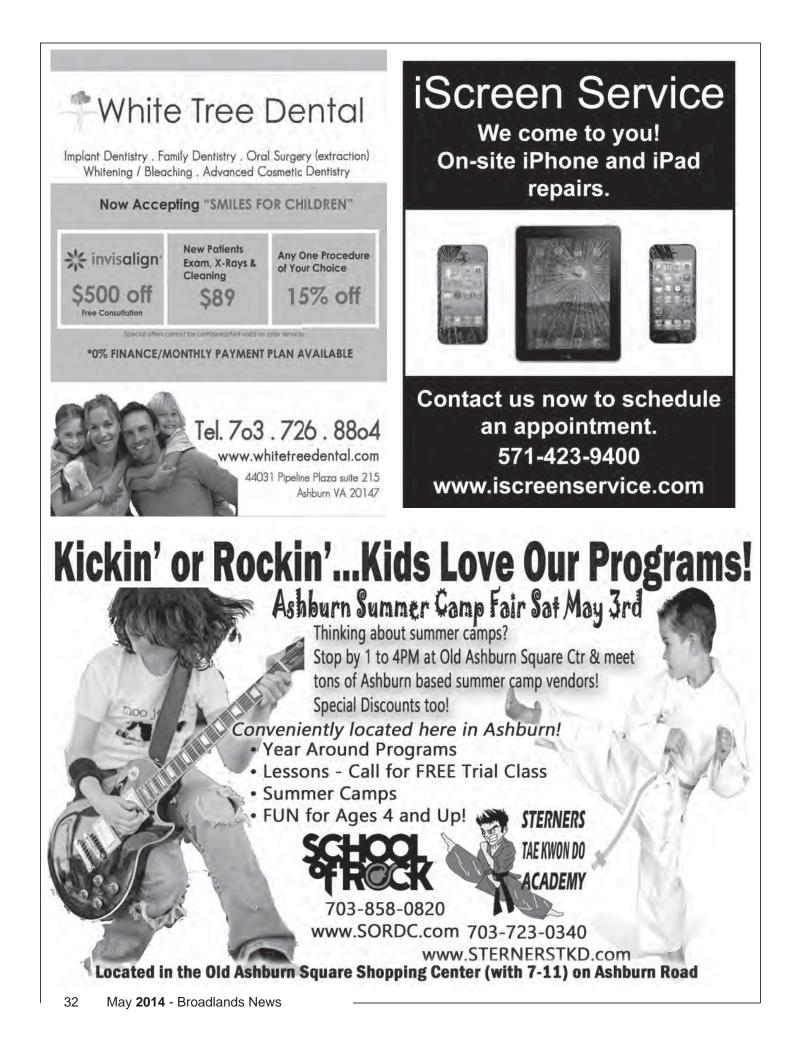
over the hump and get you home without blowing your day.

In the end, the **Take 3 Method** is about listening to *your* body to make more thoughtful decisions about what goes into it. Give yourself that chance to take a few seconds to make those decisions and good things will come. No one is perfect. You may try it and then fall off the wagon, but hop back up and keep going!

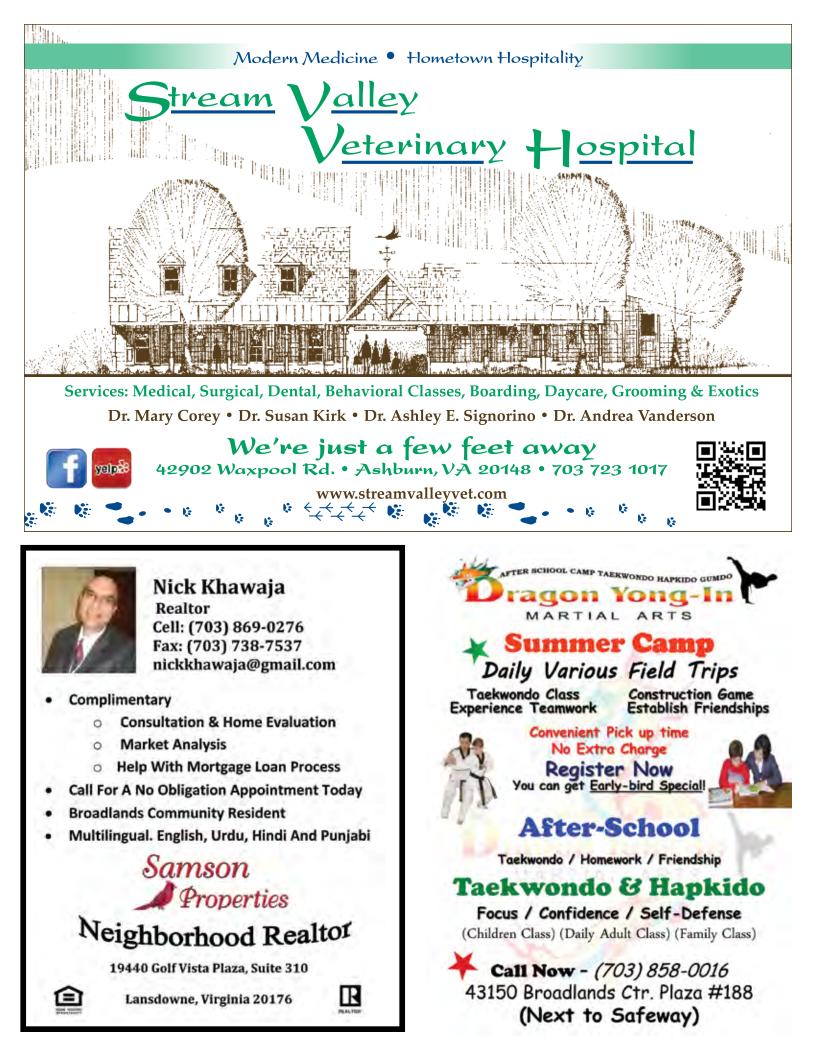

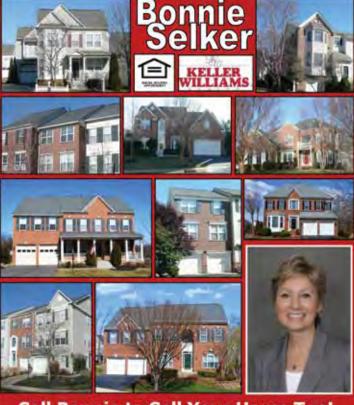
