





Neighborhood Watch Home Security By Staci Kapinos

Complacency is the biggest issue facing Broadlands residents in protecting themselves and their homes. Fortunately, most residents feel very safe living here, and consequently, do not take the time to do the simple things that will make this an even safer community to live in. When a criminal is deciding whether or not to break into your property, they have to look at the risk vs. the reward. Your goal should be to increase the risk thus decreasing their reward.



These are the 3 basic elements that are needed to commit a crime. Unfortunately, it's hard to alter a criminal's desire or ability, but there is a lot we can do to block their opportunity. First and most important, if something breaks, fix it immediately. Several years ago, a professor took a high end BMW to a well-known crime area of New Jersey and left the car there with the hood up for a week. He returned to find the car still sitting where he left it in perfect condition. He then decided to break the driver side window. Within 20 minutes of breaking the window, the entire car was taken apart. The same is true of your home. If you leave windows or doors broken or in disrepair, you increase it's appeal to lurking criminals.

Secondly, do not advertise your personal belongings. Take purses, laptops and GPS systems out of the car. Make sure all big boxes are cut up and folded so that someone passing by does not know what you just purchased. Make sure as much of your trash as possible is shredded and contained inside a trash can. The less the criminal knows about you and your home, the less likely he will target you.

Thirdly, make your home visible. Bushes should be no more the 24 inches tall and lower branches of trees should be trimmed to be above 6 feet tall. This makes it harder for someone to hide on your property. It also allows your windows and doors to be seen by your neighbors who are able to call the police if they see someone roaming around. Make sure your address is prominently displayed. The easier it is to find your home, the quicker the police can respond and the greater the risk of the criminal being caught. Make sure your home and potential break-in areas are well lighted, preferably by lighting that is not easily reached from the ground. Several years ago, when people were being attacked in Ashburn off the WO&D trail, the perpetrator was unscrewing light bulbs during the day to better hide himself at night. Motion lights work best in this situation.

Lastly, lock all of your doors and windows. This includes car doors and the door between your home and your garage. Currently in Loudoun County, a prevalent crime is stealing from unlocked vehicles or using a garage door opener retrieved from an unlocked car to enter into the house.

With the downturn in the economy, crime is on the rise and we need to do what we can to stop the complacency and help protect our neighbors and ourselves. If every resident follows these four easy steps, we can help increase the risk of a criminal being caught in our community. And please remember, it is very important for residents to report suspicious activity to the police. The recent murder that occurred in Lansdowne may have been prevented had someone called the first time they saw the suspicious looking van. The call later may just have been what brought the police early enough to save the wife's life. If you have to think twice about it, please call! In an emergency: 911; otherwise: 703 777-1021.

Pool Season is Here! Do You Know Where Your Pool Passes Are?

Look in the bottom of your pool bag or maybe in the drawer with the swimsuits for your Broadlands Photo ID pool passes. Everyone 5 and up who wishes to gain admission to the pools needs one.

If you are a new resident, you must fill out an application, return it to the Nature Center and have your photos taken. Applications are available at the Nature Center or online at www.broadlandshoa.org.

If you received a pass last year and have lost it, you can receive a replacement pass for \$5.00 each. If you want a new pass with a new photo, the charge is \$7.00. **CREDIT CARDS ARE NOT ACCEPTED!** Cash or check only. All passes are picked up at the Nature Center Monday through Friday from 9:00a.m. to 5:00p.m.

If any of your children have turned five since last summer or will be five by June 1, 2009, they must have a picture taken and a pass made. Please use the resident application available at the Nature Center or online at www.broadlandshoa.org and return it to the Nature Center to add them to your family data base.

Pictures will be taken at the Nature Center from 9:00a.m. to 5:00p.m. Monday through Friday on a first come first served basis.

Pool passes will be issued to each individual aged 5 and up living in the household. A household consists of all persons permanently living in the dwelling including live-in caretakers and any unmarried children who are students and/or from a previous marriage and who will be residing with the owner for the summer.

Renters must have the owner of the property sign the application transferring their pool privileges to the tenant. Please pick up a Tenant membership application from the Nature Center.

Prior to having the photo taken, all adults 18 and up must show a photo ID and proof of address.

Photos will not be taken if acceptable proof of identity and address are not available.

Acceptable photo IDs include:

- Driver's License
- School, Military or Work Photo ID
- State Issued Non-Driver Photo ID
- Current Passport
- Current Resident Alien Photo ID

Acceptable Proof of Address include:

- Payroll Stub issued within the last 60 days
- Most Recent W-2 or 1099
- Original Bank Statement issued within the last 60 days
- Utility bill issued within the last 60 days
- Current Virginia Voter Registration Card
- Settlement Papers or Deed
- Current Homeowners Insurance Policy



Non-resident caregivers are able to obtain a pass for \$40 for the season. They should be noted as non-resident caregivers on the resident's application. The fee must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the care giver to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Up to 5 long term house guests may obtain pool passes for \$40 per person for the season or \$15 per person for a month (30 consecutive days) or \$5 per person for seven consecutive days. They must be noted as non-resident house guests on the resident's application. The fees must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass issued. The resident must accompany the guests to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Ten guest passes are allocated to each <u>residence</u>. Additional guest passes, good for 10 visits may be purchased for \$20. Guest passes are added to the electronic account. No physical pass will be issued. Guests must be accompanied by a pool pass holder to gain admittance to the pool facility.

Broadlands Pool Rules

MEMBERS MUST COMPLY WITH ALL LIFEGUARD INSTRUCTIONS

GENERAL RULES:

- · NO glass containers or breakable objects
- NO food or drink except in designated areas
- NO profane language
- NO play equipment or wheeled vehicles, except wheel chairs and strollers
- NO pets
- NO alcohol or drugs
- NO chewing gum
- NO running, pushing, dunking, wrestling or rough play
- NO general swimming in diving area
- NO diving in shallow area
- NO tape players, CD players or radios unless waterproof and used with personal headphones
- NO flotation devices except water wings, U.S.C.G approved life vests and U.S.C.G. approved swimwear flotation devices
- NO DISPOSABLE DIAPERS, children not yet toilet trained must wear plastic pants or "Swimmies" (swim diaper) under their bathing suit
- Children 10 years or younger MUST BE accompanied and supervised by an adult or care provider at least 14 years old
- Parents are responsible for the safety and conduct of all children in their care
- Pool membership may be temporarily suspended or revoked for failing to comply with the pool rules

The meeting was called to order at 5:33p.m. with the following Board members in attendance:

Eric Bazerghi moved to approve the minutes from the March 10, 2009 Board Meeting as amended and was seconded by Brian Beahm. The motion was approved 7/0/1 with Staci Kapinos abstaining.

Staci Kapinos thanked the Board and others and reported her daughter was recovering nicely. Cliff Keirce spoke to the School Board twice (additional high schools proposed and elementary school boundaries). Mr. Keirce also proposed a business meeting of the Board on May 5, 2009. Roy Barnett reported that the proposed extension of Demott Drive to Moorefield Station is dead. Mr. Barnett also reported that the Hotel Special Exception for Section 204 should be held in May. Denise Harrover reported that over 60 vendors have committed to attend the Loudoun Earth Day Celebration here in Broadlands. Tom Marable reported that the traffic switch for Route 659 has been completed and should last for about six weeks.

The Board heard a presentation by the Technology Committee members who were evaluating the computer maintenance proposals. After listening to the presentation, Staci Kapinos moved to follow the recommendation of the Committee and select NT Connections to be the Association's computer maintenance provider after finalizing all terms and review by the Association's attorney. Brian Beahm seconded the motion. The motion passed 7/0/1 with Eric Bazerghi abstaining.

Beth Levine, former account manager with Smith Barney came to discuss her reasons for moving to Lara, Shull & May and to explain why the Association should move its money management to her new firm. Issues raised were the safety of working with RBC (Royal Canadian Bank) plus the larger inventory of CD's that would be available.

The Board and three members of the CSL Swim Team Board discussed issues with joining the team on the website. The CSL Board stated there were still a few spots available on the team and that there were currently 8 outside members. The meet schedule was also discussed. 



I TOOK A TRIP

Everyone sits in a circle. One player, the leader, goes around saying to each player, "I took a trip. What did I take along?" The players name any object they please. The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling Ashburn Village Animal Hospital "My pet has a drinking problem, Doc!"

Dogs often drink out of a toilet, and cats often like to drink from a dripping faucet, but when they are showing these behaviors all the time, and when it leads to urinating in the house, that's when we usually get a call. Some of the statements we get are, "My cat's peeing in the house. It must be because she's mad at me" or "Bowzer is so thirsty all the time. What do you think it is?".

Excessive thirst, termed polydypsia in medical terms, is usually combined with excessive urination, or polyuria. What goes in must come out, right? Dogs and cats normally take in about 20-40 milliliters per pound of body weight per day, or 3 cups per day for a 20 pound dog, and 1.5-2 cups for a 10 pound cat. This includes any water they take in with their food, such as canned food. Anything more than that, under normal environmental conditions is considered polydypsia. These are early signs of several diseases including kidney failure or infection, diabetes, pyometra (a uterine infection), liver disease, and high blood calcium levels, among others.

Determining the cause of the increased thirst and urination requires further testing such as bloodwork, urinalysis, x-rays, specialized blood tests or even an MRI in really difficult cases. Treatment depends on the underlying cause, your individual pet, and your veterinarian. Treatment may include intravenous fluid therapy, insulin, or even surgery. Discuss treatment details with your veterinarian if your pet is diagnosed with any of these conditions.

In the meantime, watch for these symptoms:

- 1. Drinking large amounts of water
- 2. Frequent urination (and/or really large clumps in the litter box!)
- 3. Changes in appetite
- 4. Changes in behavior
- 5. Lethargy/weakness
- 6. Vomiting or diarrhea

So if you notice that Rex can't pull himself away from his water bowl, or that Shadow's litter box seems flooded with urine, give us a call right away!

Members of the Lepidoptera Order Have Arrived!

Lepidoptera is an order of insects that involve moths and butterflies. In mid May, we received one Eastern Tiger Swallowtail chrysalis, three Luna moth cocoons and several Painted Lady butterfly larva.

What do these insects have in common? They all go through a 4 stage life cycle; egg, larva/caterpillar, pupa/chrysalis and imago/adult. The adults have two sets of wings covered with tiny scales and a straw like mouth part called a proboscis.

There are other commonalities but let's look at some differences. Moths have wings that are attached while butterflies have wings that are hooked together in flight. Moths unlike butterflies as we know are active at night. Another major difference are the antennae appearance. The moth's antennae are feathery and the butterfly's are straight with a ball on the end. Butterflies have a thin abdomen while the moth's mid part is heftier.

Even though both members of this order are important pollinators and can appear very similar there are quite a number of differences. Next time you see one, take a closer look.

ROASTED POTATO KABOBS

- 1 ½ pound small potatoes such as purple, Dutch yellow, fingerlings, or new reds
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 tablespoons snipped fresh thyme
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

Soak four 8-inch wooden skewers in water for 30 minutes. Scrub potatoes. Cut any large potatoes in half. In a large saucepan cook potatoes, uncovered, in boiling salted water to cover for 5 to 10 minutes or until almost tender. Drain. Or place potatoes in a microwave-safe bowl with 2 tablespoons water. Cook, covered, on 100 percent power (high) for 5 to 7 minutes or until almost tender. Preheat oven to 475 degree F. Thread potatoes on the 4 soaked wooden skewers. Place kabobs on a baking sheet. In a small bowl combine melted butter and olive oil. Brush potatoes with butter mixture. Sprinkle with thyme, salt, and pepper. Roast, uncovered, for 20 to 25 minutes or until golden brown. Makes 4 servings. bhg.com

HOLE-IN-ONE CAKE

- 1 pkg. (2-layer size) yellow or white cake mix
- 1 cup boiling water
- 1 pkg. (4-serving size) JELL-O Lime Flavor Gelatin ½ cup cold water
- 2 squares BAKER'S Semi-Sweet Chocolate, melted
- 2 cups thawed COOL WHIP Whipped Topping
- 1 red and 1 green chewy fruit snack roll
- 4 pretzel sticks
- 1 JET-PUFFED Miniature Marshmallow, cut into quarters

SKILLET TOASTED CORN SALAD

1/3 cup olive oil

1/3 cup lemon juice

- 1 tablespoon white wine Worcestershire sauce
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- ½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

Few dashes bottled hot pepper sauce

- 6 fresh ears of corn
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 4 medium red, yellow, and/or green sweet peppers
- 2 ounces Parmesan cheese, finely shredded (1/2 cup)
- 1 head romaine lettuce, cut crosswise into 1-inch pieces or torn into bite-size pieces

In a screw-top jar combine the 1/3 cup oil, lemon juice, Worcestershire sauce, garlic, black pepper, salt, and hot pepper sauce. Cover and shake well; set aside. Remove husks and silk from corn. Cut kernels from corn cobs. In a large skillet cook corn kernels in 1 tablespoon oil over medium-high heat about 5 minutes or until corn is tender and golden brown, stirring often. Turn down heat as necessary to prevent corn from popping out of the skillet. Remove from heat; keep warm. Remove membrane and seeds from sweet peppers. Cut sweet peppers into large pieces or coarsely chop medium sweet peppers. In a large bowl combine sweet peppers, corn, and cheese. Pour dressing over mixture; toss lightly to coat. Serve over romaine lettuce. Makes 6 to 8 servings. bhg.com



PREPARE and bake cake mix in 13x9-inch baking pan as directed on package. Cool completely. Invert cake onto large platter; remove pan. Using small sharp knife, cut and scoop out a shallow free form "golf course" from center of cake. Reserve removed cake for another use.

STIR boiling water into dry gelatin in medium bowl until completely dissolved. Stir in cold water. Refrigerate about 1 hour until slightly thickened (the consistency of unbeaten egg whites). Pour thickened gelatin into center of cake. Refrigerate 3 hours or until set.

STIR slightly cooled melted chocolate into whipped topping until well blended. Frost borders and side of cake with whipped topping mixture. Cut out small triangle from the red fruit roll. Attach to pretzel stick. Place in center to resemble flag. Using sharp small knife, cut green fruit roll into strips and attach to remaining pretzel sticks to form trees. Use some of the darker reserved crumbs to make sand traps. Roll marshmallow quarter into ball and place near flag for the golf ball. Store any leftover cake in refrigerator. Kraftfoods.com.



Hurdles, Plateaus, and Bumps in the Road: How to Make Your Workout Fail Proof

Life is full of ups and downs. One minute you may feel on top of the world, you are working out harder than you ever have, you are losing the weight, you are feeling great and all of the sudden, BAM! Roadblock. Something halts your progress and all that hard work seems lost. There is a natural ebb and flow to life and fitness is no



different than any other aspect of life. In fitness goals, we can find great reward and success, but we can also find great failure. The key to success is to assess the damage and to move on.

Steps to Achieving Your Fitness Goals When You Encounter a Hurdle.

Step 1: Accept that fitness is a journey, not a destination. There may be small unexpected turns in the road (such as illness or an injury), but you have to find your way back to the course and keep going. After a small setback, be patient with yourself, work your way back to where you had been and then push to go farther.
