Patriot Disposal Information

Patriot Disposal provides trash and recycling services for the Broadlands community. An environmentally-conscious company, Patriot Disposal offers a curbside recycling program that extends well beyond those offered by other haulers.

Schedule

Trash removal: Monday and Thursday Recycling collection: Thursday Yard waste pick up: Monday Large item pick-up: Thursday (small furniture, mattresses, bed frames)

Patriot Disposal Collection Schedule

Mondays: Trash and Yard Waste Thursdays: Trash and Recycling



Please have trash and recycling at the curb no later than 7:00a.m.

Containers

Patriot Disposal provides one wheeled, covered Toter for each residence for the collection of trash. Each town home will be provided with a 64-gallon, and each single-family home will be provided with a 96-gallon. Each town home and single-family home will also be provided with one recycling bin.

Additional recycling bins are available for no additional charge and may be picked up at the Nature Center. Additional Toters are available for purchase at the following rates:

Trash Toters (Green with Black Lid): 96-gallon Toter -- \$100.00 64-gallon Toter -- \$ 50.00

Recycling Toters (Green with Blue Lid) 64-gallon Toter -- \$ 25.00

You are encouraged to keep a record of the serial number of your Toter(s) should you need to identify it in the future. Requests for toters are accepted by phone at 1-703-257-7100.

Trash Removal

Please note the following requirements concerning trash removal services:

- 1. Trash must be properly secured in plastic bags, standard trash cans, or wheeled carts.
- 2. Trash bags and containers shall not exceed 50 pounds in weight per bag or container.
- 3. Trash must be placed at the curbside and/or designated area by 7 a.m. for collection.

Recycling

Patriot Disposal's weekly curbside recycling program includes the collection of **scrap metal** (foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.), **newspapers, mixed paper, cardboard, paperboard, glass bottles and jars, metal and aluminum cans and plastic bottles.** Each Thursday, Patriot Disposal will remove recyclable materials that have been placed at the curb for collection.

Please note the following requirements concerning recycling collection services:

- 1. Newspapers and magazines should be bundled and placed in paper grocery bags or tied with heavy twine.
- 2. Glass, plastic, aluminum and metal, food/beverage containers should be rinsed and placed in bags, cardboard boxes, or recycling bins.
- 3. Recyclables must be placed at the curbside and/or designated area by 7 a.m. for collection.
- 4. Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- 5. Patriot Disposal will remove and recycle packing boxes and cartons placed at the curb by residents.

Yard Waste

Each Monday, Patriot Disposal will remove yard waste that has been placed at the curb for collection. Please note the following requirements concerning the collection of yard waste:

- 1. Yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash only during the months of January, February and March.
- 2. Brush must be cut into four-foot lengths, with limbs no larger than six inches in diameter.
- 3. Brush must be tied in bundles no larger than two feet in diameter.
- Yard debris must be placed in separate containers, marked "yard waste" or in biodegradable bags. Yard waste that is put out at the curb in plastic bags will not be picked up.
- 5. Yard waste must be placed at the curbside and/or designated area by 7 a.m. for collection.
- 6. Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.
- 7. The weight limit for yard waste is 35 pounds per bag or container.

Special Item Pick-ups

Electronics, used motor oil, auto batteries and appliances, will be picked up on Wednesday by a separate truck. Please call the office at 1-703-257-7100 to arrange for pickup. Very large items may incur a charge. Please ask the customer service representative when you call. Please note the following requirements concerning the collection of special items:

- 1. Items for collection must be placed at the curbside and/or designated area by 7 a.m.
- 2. Appliances containing Freon must be certified as "Freon-Free" prior to removal.

Schedule

Patriot Disposal will provide services on all holidays that fall on regularly-scheduled pickup days with the exception of Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. If a regularly-scheduled pickup day falls on one of these holidays, service will resume on the next regularly scheduled pickup day.

This international competition featuring 82 of world's best teams was held in St. Louis, MO between April 27- May 1. The World Festival is like the "Olympics" of Lego Robotics. This year more than 170,000 children participated in FLL worldwide. The teams have 8 weeks to build and program an autonomous robot to perform specific challenges on a standardized playing field. while also developing a research project and producing a "creative" presentation of their research results. Teams are judged on robot performance, technical design, research, and teamwork. This year over 500 teams participated in Virginia and D.C.'s regional tournaments alone. Worldwide there were 540 regional tournaments, which qualified teams to go on to one of the 111 Championship tournaments.

NX-Treme was honored to represent our region at the World Festival. The theatrical lighting and rock music made for an exciting and colorful experience. One team that competed was wearing pig hats and the team from Israel, the Pink Eagles, sported black capes with pink-feathered wings. NX-Treme's white lab coats and crazy hats fit right in. Our robot did fairly well on the two practice runs, only missing one challenge, but it proved less reliable on the competition day, scoring 370 out of a possible 400 points.

The most exciting thing was being able to meet other robotic enthusiasts from around the world and finding out about their teams and their hometowns. We met teams from Jordan, Utah, Malaysia, Peru and Holland. When not on the competition floor, we spent time at our booth sharing information about Virginia and Washington D.C. with visitors from around the world and across the USA. Each team brought small items to trade or swap with other teams. There were buttons, pens, pins, bracelets, stickers and cards being traded and collected. The Swiss team was passing out Swiss chocolate (yum!) and the team from Peru was passing out handmade pins in the shape of llamas.

One of this year's highlights was an exclusive concert by will.i.am and the Black-eyed Peas. will.i.am also participated in the opening ceremonies by driving an FTC robot in competition against Dean Kamen, the founder of FIRST and an inventor in his own right. This year the X prize foundation was represented. They are sponsoring an innovative solution prize that will financially help the winning FLL team to patent their innovative solution.





The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling Ashburn Village Animal Hospital "The Tick-ing Lyme Bomb"

One of our patients came in several weeks ago, a beautiful Golden Retriever who was normally full of life, but that day he was extremely limp and weak. His vital signs were all good, but he was very stiff and sore in his knees, hips and elbows. I asked the owner about any previous episodes like this, and he said he didn't know of any, and with further examination, we found a few small ticks on the dog. The owner did mention that they hadn't been putting any tick preventives on "Buddy" as it was still cold outside, so I ordered a test, which confirmed Lyme disease.

There is, in my opinion, an epidemic of Lyme going on in this area. Loudoun County has the highest incidence of Lyme in all of Virginia, and in fact, we estimated that about one in 4 dogs that we test are positive for Lyme. If you are unfamiliar with Lyme, as I was when I first moved to this area 14 years ago, then I'll go over the basics. Lyme disease is a microscopic organism passed by deer ticks. Deer ticks are much smaller than common dog ticks. They are the size of a pinhead, which can make them difficult to detect. They are found, of course, where there are large populations of deer. So when you see those deer on the side of Route 7, you can understand why Lyme is such a problem in this area.

The symptoms are variable, which can make it a challenging disease to diagnose, but the most common signs to look for are fatigue, fever, lameness and loss of appetite. Some dogs don't show any of these signs, which catch people off guard when they test positive. Sometimes even indoor lapdogs test positive, apparently picking up a tick on their rare outings outside. Interestingly, cats seem immune to Lyme.

The best defense against Lyme is to prevent the bite in the first place. Topical agents such as Vectra, Frontline

Plus and Advantix are great and only need to be applied monthly, and there is a terrific "Preventick" collar available as well that lasts up to 3 months (and a soon-to-bereleased Scalibor collar which last 6 months!). There is also an effective vaccine against Lyme as well. If by chance you see a tick on your dog, use fine-point tweezers to get as close to the skin as possible in order remove as much of the tick as you can. DON'T crush or squeeze the tick, or cover it with Vaseline, or burn it off with a match or cigarette.

If caught early enough, Lyme may be cleared from a dog. But since it can lay dormant for a while, a dog may have had Lyme for months prior to diagnosis, making it difficult to eradicate. Fortunately, most dogs respond well enough to antibiotics (typically doxycycline) to at least control the symptoms. So be on tick alert, and have a safe, fun summer!

From the Naturalist.... By Lisa Matthews

Several times a year, I am asked if we are interested in turtles that people have raised from wee little things into animals that are too big for them to care for any longer. Unfortunately, I have to refuse them as we have two turtles at the Nature Center and numerous native ones in the ponds. Alarmingly, many people ask if they can just release their turtles into one of our ponds. There are few options open to the many persons who now have the toolarge-to-keep turtle.

This has become such a large issue that many of the reptile rescues and societies have become activists in curbing the red-eared slider trade....it is currently illegal for a business to sell red-eared slider hatchlings because they are the most commonly surrendered/unwanted turtle. Starting out as tiny, green and cute little creatures, they grow 6" to 11" in a short period of time requiring up to a 75 gallon tank, and they can live for decades.

Can I suggest *not* getting a turtle in the first place? Or, if you really want one, adopt from the animal rescues? You would not acquire a cute little one, but take it from me, the big ones are cute too. And you know what you are in for with a bigger turtle. Their growth slows down and you won't see as much change in them. You can make a habitat for them in your garden using a decorative pond. This can add value to your home. This is also a good option for those who now have turtles too large.

Releasing them into the wild is equal to euthanizing them. They have no skills to survive in the wild and are particularly susceptible to diseases there. If they do survive, they can upset the natural balance of the pond that they are released into and can damage the eco-system of that pond (for example, some well-meaning person put a box turtle into the pond where the turtle drowned. It is better to place them on the bank of the pond and let the turtle choose where they wish to go). Some herpetologists believe that you do euthanize them if you release them into the wild. It is the far more humane treatment than releasing them to slow starvation.

Options (other than building a pond)? Well, the Virginia Reptile Rescue has a few. For more information, visit http://www.vareptilerescue.org/res.html. They go more into depth on the issues of red-eared slider and have some very good ideas on how to re-home your pet.;

Please use careful consideration and research any potential pet and try not to bring home unfamiliar animals by impulse. Reptiles can be a joyful addition to your family when you know what you are getting into.

How Fit is your Pet? By Shannon M. Pecora, MA Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

Are you ready to show off that flat stomach and those toned arms at the pool or beach this summer? If so, you've probably been working hard over the past few months—watching what you eat and getting appropriate exercise. You are in control of your diet and exercise, and you're seeing your efforts pay off!



Now, imagine that you have no access to your food supply. You have to wait for someone else to offer you meals, in a single dish or via a free-flowing food dispenser. It's not as though anyone has missed filling that dish or dispenser before, but you can't be quite sure what the future holds. Hadn't you better try to eat everything right now, just in case your body needs to prepare for leaner times? If you stockpile fat reserves now—even if that happens to be every single day—you'll be ready if those meals ever do stop coming for a while.

And about that exercise—what if you were given a bed and told that you could just lay around all day? No one else will be around for much of the day anyway, and why bother playing with that tennis ball or stuffed animal all by yourself? Eventually, someone should open a door or offer you a clean box for when you have to potty, so there's no real reason to strain yourself by moving around too much. Plus, in the evening you'll get to sit on the couch—maybe even in someone's lap—in front of the TV for a while, and at least that's some fun attention.

If you haven't guessed by now, the above describes the point of view of a typical couch potato **PET**. Hopefully, this helps illustrate why pet owners need to be diligent when it comes to their pets' physical fitness. A quick test for dog and cat owners can be done the next time you go to scratch their ears or rub their tummies. From the side, you should see a definite upward tuck behind the rib cage as the stomach leads into the groin area. From above, you should see the shoulders, waist, and hips line up in an hourglass shape. You should also not have much trouble feeling the ribs and spine under the fur and skin; these bones should not protrude, but they should also not be hidden under a thick layer of fat.

Your vet can offer specific advice for your pet's nutrition and activity routines. Sometimes prescription food or specialized physical therapy is in order, but sometimes small adjustments in meal sizes or walks and play times can

be beneficial. You don't need to put your dog in a Speedo or your cat in a bikini, but overall physical fitness is vital for every member of your family!



- **NO DISPOSABLE DIAPERS,** children not yet toilet trained must wear plastic pants or "Swimmies" (swim diaper) under their bathing suit
- Children 10 years or younger MUST BE accompanied and supervised by an adult or care provider at least 14 years old
- Parents are responsible for the safety and conduct of all children in their care
- Pool membership may be temporarily suspended or revoked for failing to comply with the pool rules

General Information

The cost of a regular group session (composed of 8 classes) is **\$70 per child**. The cost of a regular private session (composed of 8 classes, one child) is **\$280 per child**. Semi-private sessions (2 children per session are required) are also available, for a cost of \$140 per child. The group must be pre-arranged by the parent(s). HSP unfortunately cannot arrange these groups. Each session is composed of eight lessons over **2 weeks**, taught **Monday through Thursday**, with Friday as a make-up day (make-up day is reserved only for classes that were canceled due to bad weather, instructor absence or mechanical failure of equipment). ***Exception:** During week Fourth of July week, classes will run Tuesday through Friday.

Please register your child **at least one week** prior to the start of each session. Payment is due upon registration. **Minimum age for children is 3.** We offer four swimming levels: Nemos, Sea Turtles, Dolphins, and Sharks (see Swim Level Descriptions below). Each level has **completion requirements.** At the end of each session, skills are **demonstrated and if successfully completed, children can progress to the next level.** Participants usually need to stay in one level for 2 to 3 sessions. Upon request, our swimming instructors will be available to evaluate your child and recommend appropriate level before the session starts. Swim instructors will also reevaluate participants and divide them into corresponding levels during the first class (only if needed).

Level Description

Nemos: This beginning level for children teaches them to be comfortable and safe in the water. Instructors will focus on introducing children to the water and improving their safety and comfort in the swimming pool. The class will feature activities such as: face in the water, wet the hair, submerging, opening eyes, front glide, back glide, breath control, moving around comfortably, blowing bubbles and having fun in the class with aquatic recreation, gaining confidence and interest in swimming. We highly recommend this level for children who have never taken lessons, preferably children between 3 and 5 years old.

Sea Turtles: This level marks the beginning of independent aquatic locomotion skills. Children continue to explore using simultaneous and alternating arm and leg actions on the front and back to gain more proficiency for strokes. This class will introduce exercises in the water such as: arm movement, body position, leg movement, floating and blowing bubbles; all connected with free style and backstroke. This level is recommended for children that are confident in the water but never had lessons, or children that have taken and passed Nemos level.

Dolphins: Students who successfully complete this level will be comfortable swimming in deep water, be proficient in front crawl, back crawl, breast stroke. They will be able to swim 50 yards with each of the strokes. This group is for children that are confident in the water and know the basic swimming skills of free style and backstroke. At this level, the arm position, leg exercises, breathing, turns, treading water and diving will be practiced. Butterfly will be introduced in this class. The focus of this group is for children that already know basic skills of freestyle and backstroke or for children that passed the Sea Turtles level.

Sharks: The goal for sharks is to make the students comfortable swimming and practicing in deep water, make major improvements to rotary breathing with front crawl, demonstrate some proficiency in the other strokes being introduced and begin to develop endurance by increasing distances they can swim. At this class the swimmers will improve the quality of their movement in the backstroke, freestyle, breaststroke and butterfly. The correct diving position will also be an important skill learned in the class. This class is recommended for children that successfully finished Dolphins level or children with previous swimming experience.

Swim Lesson Schedule

Each session runs Monday – Thursday, offering 8 lessons over 2 weeks. ***Exception:** Session 2 will run Tuesday – Friday the week of Fourth of July.




Coco Gonzales Vigilar

Why Do Some of Us Gain Weight Around the Middle and Others Not? By: Josh Champney, Owner of Fitness Together in Ashburn

Where you tend to store body fat is related primarily to your genetic disposition. If you have an excessive amount of body fat, and heredity dictates storage around the middle, then unfortunately you will gain fat in the abdominal area. That said, many women notice abdominal weight gain when they go through menopause. This is because hormonal shifts can change the way the body breaks down and stores fat—hence a redistribution of body fat and the tendency for it to accumulate in the belly as women grow older. This tendency is particularly unhealthy, as excessive abdominal fat, especially the deep abdominal fat—called visceral fat—increases the risk for cardiovascular disease, diabetes, and certain cancers.

What really works to get rid of stubborn belly fat?

The good news in the battle of belly bulge is that there are three scientifically proven lifestyle changes you CAN make that when combined together are the best way to attack that fat around the middle and flatten your belly.



Three Tips for a Flat Stomach:

- 1. Eat a nutritious, calorie-controlled diet. Excess body fat, whether it's in the stomach or the thighs, is the result of routinely consuming more calories than you expend. Now is the time to change those unhealthy eating habits. Eat lots of fruits and vegetables, whole grains, lean protein, and good fats. Eat breakfast, don't skip meals, drink lots of calorie-free liquid, and eat small, frequent, lighter meals at home. Watch your portion sizes and calculate your daily calorie intake to ensure you're eating the right amount to lose body fat at a safe rate.
- **2. Daily cardio exercise.** Calorie-burning cardio exercise is one of the best ways to target stubborn belly fat. This is because stomach fat is more metabolically active and when you exercise, you target that area for fuel. What's more, when you burn those calories up, you reduce your percentage of body fat, thereby shrinking those belly fat cells. This will allow you to see those abdominal muscles you've worked so hard in the gym to define.
- 3. Strength training. While you can't "spot reduce" belly fat, you CAN strengthen and tone the abdominal muscles. That way, once you lose that extra fat around the tummy, you'll be able to clearly see that toned flat stomach. Keep in mind that a single abdominal exercise won't make a flabby stomach into washboard abs! Plus, there are certain abdominal exercises that are much more effective in strengthening and tightening the middle than others. This is a postural muscle; it's also a paired muscle that runs vertically and has distinct segments on each side. The rectus is responsible for the "six-pack" visible in toned athletes. Another important "core" muscle is the transverse abdominus, buried deep beneath the rectus. This muscle, though often neglected, also helps flatten the stomach. It runs horizontally and acts like a girdle, strengthening the core and decreasing risk of back injury.
