

Manager's Report

First of all, let me say congratulations to Brian Beahm and Eric Bazerghi on their reelection to the Board of Directors. Both were reelected to a three year term expiring May 2016. Thank you to all those who submitted their proxies and those who attended the sixteenth Annual Meeting of Broadlands Association, Inc. Officer positions will be determined at the June 11th Board of Directors meeting.



As I will be celebrating my

first anniversary on June 6, I thought this would be a good opportunity to reflect on some of the changes that have been implemented in the past year and discuss what we foresee for this association in the future. In the past year, we have executed improvements like repainting of the fire lanes for the first time, altering the layout inside the nature center to improve flow, and establishing a paint cycle on the townhome mailboxes. HLS did some extensive soil amendments to enhance turf areas as well as extensive stump removal. We have also begun to upgrade landscaping at the pools and performed some much needed repairs and touchups at the pools and bath houses. Many of these items are phased in over months or years and will continue to see improvements. We have also upgraded some of the office equipment, improving efficiency and reducing expenses.

Going forward, we are looking to expand the nature center programs as well as implement holiday lights decorations and yard maintenance contests. We are eagerly anticipating the new clubhouse that will be located off of Waxpool Road in the developing section known as Broadlands Station. This will provide the community with a fitness center, some much needed storage and office space for the HOA, plus a large meeting room that will be available for HOA Board and Committee meetings and for event rentals. We will also phase in street and pathlight repainting and be performing some road maintenance on the private roads. An upcoming major project will be the Stone House restoration, which will be phased in and overseen by our Stone House Committee and include a new roof, wall repairs, and storm shutters.

As you may have seen, we have been offering Broadlands logo magnets for sale in the Nature Center for the past few months. We are also looking to offer Broadlands logo gear such as t-shirts and hats to promote our wonderful community. 

The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling **Ashburn Village Animal** Hospital

"Sugar-free, but not Risk-free" Sugar substitutes are big business. Less sugar can mean weight loss, improved health, diabetic control, and even reduced tooth decay. The quest for products that can sweeten and cook like sugar is ongoing. Xylitol is a common substitute, especially when it comes to gum. Not only does xvlitol offer sweetness, but it has also been shown to reduce periodontal disease from its antibacterial properties. These are great, provided you are human. For dogs, xylitol is potentially lethal.

In the canine body, the pancreas confuses xylitol with real sugar and releases insulin to store the "sugar". The problem is that xylitol does not offer the extra calories of sugar and the rush of insulin only serve to remove the actual sugar/ glucose in the bloodstream. Blood sugar levels plummet resulting in weakness, disorientation, tremors, and potentially seizures. It doesn't take many sticks of gum to poison a dog, especially a small dog (see below). Symptoms typically begin within 30 minutes and can last for more than 12 hours. Vomiting and diarrhea can also occur.

The other reaction that can occur with xylitol in dogs is the actual destruction of liver tissue. How this happens remains unknown but the doses required to produce this effect are much higher than the hypoglycemic doses mentioned above. Signs take longer to appear (usually around 8-12 hours later) and surprisingly not all dogs that experience this hepatic necrosis will show hypoglycemia first. Internal bleeding is commonly involved.

The hypoglycemic dose of xylitol for dogs is considered approximately 0.1 grams per kilogram. A typical stick of gum contains 0.3-0.4 grams of xylitol, which means that a 10 pound dog could be poisoned by as little as a stick and a half of gum. The dose for liver failure is roughly 10 times this, so a 10 pound dog would have to eat an entire package of unopened gum, and this amount of gum would probably cause only hypoglycemia in an 80-90 lb. dog. (Note – the current gums that use Xylitol are Dentyne Ice, Orbit, and Trident)

Treatment: Ideally, a patient can be seen quickly to induce vomiting. But if the ingestion has occurred at an unknown time and the dog is symptomatic, then a sugar IV drip is the proper course of action for 24 hours. Liver enzyme and blood clotting tests are monitored for 2-3 days as well.

So watch where you put that gum, even the ABC gum ("already been chewed") that your dog can get to in the trash. It just might save his life. Till next time.

Free Gardening Lecture -**Counting on Pollinators**

Master Gardeners know that bees are the most important pollinator of food plants in the northeast and they decline. "Counting on Pollinators: The Banshee Reeks Bee Inventory" is the topic for the free June 6th lecture at 7 pm at the Rust Library, 380 Waterford Road NW, Leesburg. In the context of pollinators and their importance to plant and biodiversity conservation, and to the overall health and function of the global ecosystem, Ms. Elizabeth Sellers will provide an introduction to bees as pollinators and to the Banshee Reeks Bee Inventory. Ms. Sellers will discuss living with, gardening for, and conserving pollinators, as well as opportunities and resources available for learning more about and working with pollinators.

With the help and support of volunteers from the community and the U.S. Geological Survey, the Banshee Reeks Bee Inventory began in 2010 to collect the baseline data needed to assess the numbers and status of the Banshee Reek bees. This collection of bee population data and information is critical to the successful monitoring, management and conservation of bees, other pollinators, and their Banshee Reeks habitat. Ms. Sellers is currently working on publishing the results of the survey so that others may have access to this unique data.

Ms. Sellers has a passion for field research and has worked on the World Bee Checklist and the North American Pollinators Protection Campaign. Described by her colleagues in the science community as an "incurable naturalist," she has a Bachelor of Science in Tropical Biology and Geomorphology from James Cook University in Australia.

KEEP KIDS LEARING OUTDOORS THIS SPRING!

Parents are always looking for the most unusual, interesting activities to give their kids that the children will feel excited and learn at the same time. Raising butterflies is truly an educational experience that every child will want to do over and over again.

You can take the kids on a hike to search for butterfly eggs and collect them, then make a home for them.

Did you know that the monarch butterflies that live in North America migrate?

Monarch butterflies are the only insect to migrate up to 2,500 miles to get out of the cold weather and hibernate. But not all monarch butterflies migrate; only the fourth generation of monarchs can migrate each year because the first three generations die after about six weeks from escaping their chrysalids.

Did you know that monarch butterflies go through four generations each year? The first three generations hatch from their chrysalis state and live for up to six weeks, but the fourth generation continues to live on for up to nine months so that they can migrate to a warmer climate, hibernate, and then start a new first generation in the spring time.

A Beautiful and Healthy Garden By: Jill Johnson, Loudoun **County Master Gardener**

June is the month when the gardener begins to reap what he has sown: birds and butterflies attracted to worm-rich soil and nectar-filled flowers, lush vegetables beginning to bear fruit and a leafy green tree canopy providing shade for a hammock or pair of chairs. What can you add to make your green space a haven for you and your family to enjoy?

June's longer days means everything is growing rapidly, including weeds. Control them by weeding diligently and covering bare soil with a layer of mulch. Japanese beetles arrive now and can be easily handpicked in the morning before they wake up and tossed into a jar of soapy water. The soapy water treatment also works well with stinkbugs.

It pays to be vigilant in the vegetable garden too. Keep plants weeded and mulched and be on the lookout for mites, tomato horn worms, vine borers and other pests. Drop insects in soapy water in the early



morning and remember to remove eggs from the undersides of leaves by rubbing them off. Handpicking is a tedious task but it is necessary in an organic garden. Pick up a copy of "Good Bug, Bad Bug" at the Extension Office in Leesburg so vou can differentiate between pests and beneficial insects. Continue to fertilize vegetables with fish emulsion or other organic fertilizer. Plant some pumpkin seeds now and they'll be ready by Halloween.

Finally, extend the beauty of your annual and perennial flowers by deadheading them to encourage new blooms.

> Loudoun County Master Gardeners have partnered with Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy and the Audubon Society's "Audubon at Home" program to promote good stewardship of nature in our gardens. Through the program's "Healthy Yard Pledge", participants

Purr-fect Kitty Care By: Shannon M. Pecora, MA

Can you guess what type of pet we see most in our office each day? If you said, "Dog!" then you are absolutely correct! On average, canines can make up 85% of our business, or a very large percentage of our tailwagging, face-licking working days. But can you guess how much of our total patient base is feline? Over the past few years, that number has remained steady at about 25%, yet they are certainly not one-quarter of our appointment totals. (By the way, we also treat exotics and pocket pets, and they do play a small role in those total figures, too). So, why aren't those kitties making up more of our chinscratching, petting-and-purring business days?

Pet owners can tend to think of cats as independent, self-reliant creatures who are happier when allowed to stay comfortable and sheltered in their own homes. We're quick to associate car rides and vet visits with fear and trauma. Therefore, why not just let our cats remain in their daily routines? If they don't "seem" ill or injured, why bother them?

If you're still in the mood for guessing games, then you probably figured out that the purpose of this article is to relay the benefits of bringing your cat to the vet for regular visits. And you may have also guessed that we would compare feline health care to human health care. Our human doctors like to see us for regular physicals to track our baseline health and to try to catch any issues early; the same is true for cats—and for all pets, really. Plus, prevention is key. You might think, "My cat never leaves my house. What could pose a risk in her life?" True, this scenario does present a great deal of "maybes". Maybe I'll step in an outdoor cat's urine and bring feline distemper in on my shoe. Maybe a rabid animal will get into my garage if the door is accidentally left open. Maybe my dog will run through rabbit feces in the yard and bring an intestinal parasite in to my cat. Maybe a heartworm-carrying mosquito will enter through a tear in a window screen and bite my cat. Maybe none of these will happen, but any of them *could* happen—easily. And if something does happen, cats can be very good at hiding their symptoms until an injury or illness has progressed quite far (have you ever known a cat who wanted to show a sign of weakness?). Testing for and protecting against such problems, via exam, vaccination, at-home products, and other doctor recommendations, are generally

easier, safer, more cost effective, and more comfortable than diagnosing and treating a major illness. Yes, it is a bit of a "doom and gloom" outlook, but why not do all that you can to keep your cat healthy, happy, and with your family for as many years as possible?

If you start the vet visit routine early in life, your cat should get used to the idea, even if begrudgingly so. Try adding a favorite blanket, toy, or treat to the carrier to make the car ride more inviting, and try leaving the carrier out for your cat to access all the time so it's less daunting. You can even check to see if your vet has set aside times when they see cats only to help minimize some of the veterinary office stress. But no matter what, get your kitties out of the house and to the vet about every six months (or more often as issues arise), both for their health and for your peace of mind.




Briar Woods Falcon Regiment to offer 2nd Annual Mini Band Camp

THAI SALAD

- 4 oz extra-firm tofu, drained and cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 4 oz buckwheat soba noodles
- 1/2 cup shredded carrot
- 1/2 red bell pepper, sliced into 1-inch strips 1/2 cup frozen shelled edamame, microwaved for 1 minute and cooled
- 2 Tbsp chopped cilantro
- 2 tsp black sesame seeds

- NO diving in shallow area
- NO tape players, CD players or radios unless waterproof and used with personal headphones
- NO flotation devices except water wings, U.S.C.G. approved life vests and U.S.C.G. approved swimwear flotation devices
- NO DISPOSABLE DIAPERS. Children not yet toilet trained must wear plastic pants or "Swimmies" (swim diaper) under their bathing suit
- Children 5 and under must be accompanied and supervised by an adult 18 years old or over
- Children 6 to 11 years of age must be accompanied and supervised by an adult or care provider at least 15 years old
- Pool members are responsible for the conduct of their guests
- Children under 16 years must pass the Swim test to use the diving board and slide
- Parents are responsible for the safety and conduct of all children in their care
- Pool membership may be temporarily suspended or revoked for failing to comply with the pool rules
- Members using the pools do so at their own risk
- No Lifeguards are on duty at the wading pools

Now that he lives in Broadlands with the wide paths, he's decided to 'branch' out. Jenny, Jack and I never really thought it was that strange but within a week on the paths, we knew differently. People would honk or roll down their windows and comment (my favorite was a woman who said "You just made my morning!") and then people started stopping to take pictures and regulars we passed would come up with jokes (one jogger calls him the "Branch Manager"). I apologize to some for him being a road hog or tell others he's working on his Jogger Battering Ram, patent pending, but nobody seems to mind him taking up more than his fair share of space. 


