



June Covenants Corner

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors inspect the homes in the community for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in view to parking issues and unapproved modifications to leftover holiday decor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular violations that occur with high frequency.

During the month of June, the Inspectors will be focusing on lawns in need of weeding and pruning. Lot owners and residents are required to keep their properties free of excessive weeds, overgrown or unsightly shrubbery or other plant growth, with detailed guidelines outlined in the Procedures and Standards Relating to Yard and Lawn Maintenance (see For Homeowners>Rules and Regulations on the website). This resolution was adopted by the Board of Directors for the benefit and protection of all owners in order to ensure that all lot owners maintain their yards and lawns in a neat and orderly condition. Lawn maintenance violations include:

Excessive weeds, overgrown or unsightly shrubbery or other plant growth in turf areas and

mulch beds

Dead plants and shrubs

Trees that overhang the sidewalk; these should be trimmed to provide a minimum height of eight (8) feet, measured above the sidewalk level, free of obstruction

Grass height shall not exceed (6) inches

If these conditions are noted, a Warning and Hearing Opportunity letter will be issued to the property owner, providing ten days to correct the issue. If the violation is not corrected within ten days and a Hearing is not requested. the HOA or its contractor will enter the lot and correct the violation, and the resulting repair costs as well as an administrative fee will be charged back to the owners' account.

If you have questions regarding this process, or if you receive one of these letters and are unable to correct in the time allotted, you may contact the covenants inspectors at covenants@broadlandshoa.com to request a reasonable extension to rectify the issue.

- Approved an in home consulting business.
- Overturned an approval for a trampoline previously approved by the Modification Subcommittee.
- Approved tot lots repairs recommended by Sport Systems at a cost not to exceed \$16,500.
- Provide 10 days for an owner to remove a trampoline in disrepair from their rear yard. If owner fails to do so, remove the trampoline and charge the cost back to the owners account for failure to do so.





A Waystation for Monarchs in Your Garden By: Jill Johnson, Loudoun County Virginia Cooperative Extension Master Gardener

If you've ever seen a Monarch butterfly, you know why conservation groups like Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy are working with communities across the United States to encourage the

planting of "Monarch Waystations" to help save the everdwindling Monarch population from extinction. Planting a Monarch Waystation provides the required host and nectar resources necessary for Monarchs produce new generations during their breeding cycles which take place here in North



Milkweed is the essential component of the Monarch lifecycle and of the Monarch Waystation. The butterflies will only lay their eggs on milkweed, and the emerging caterpillars will only eat milkweed. We are fortunate in this area to have three native milkweed species: swamp milkweed, butterfly weed, and common milkweed.

Last summer the Loudoun County Master Gardeners' Demonstration Garden at Ida Lee Park in Leesburg achieved certification as both a Monarch Waystation and a Certified Audubon Wildlife Sanctuary. In addition to its extensive vegetable and ornamentalplants, the all- organic Demonstration Garden includes a wide variety of plants that provide food and shelter to a number of birds, mammals and beneficial insects. Visitors are welcome at any time and will find many garden ideas.

If you would like to start a Monarch Waystation, it's best to have at least 10 milkweed plants, ideally made up of two or more species, and then at least four annual, biennial or perennial nectar plants. If you don't have space for the larger milkweeds, it is okay to use 10 of only one specie. Below are some ideas for plant combinations.

Butterfly-weed, Asclepiustuberosa, is

probably best for a small garden. It grows no more than two ft. tall, has fine leaves and clusters of red-orange flowers inJune and July. It prefers slightly dry, well-drained soil and grows readily

from seed.Add other natives like Bee Balm, Monarda spp., Black-eyed Susan, Rudebeckia hirta, New England Aster, Lymphyotrichum lateriflorum and Orange Coneflower, Echinachea fulgida, for a lovely and colorful habitat.

Swamp milkweed, Asclepius incarnata, grows 2-3 ft. with pale pink flowers in late summer and fall. It prefers moist soil but

will grow in ordinary garden soil. You might add Cleome, *Cleome spp., Z*innia,

Zinnia spp. and Lantana, Lantana spp. with this.

Common milkweed, Asclepius syriaca, grows 3 – 6 ft. tall with large coarse leaves and showy purple and very fragrant flowers in June through August. Common milkweed can spread rapidly by rhizomes and often forms extensive colonies in the wild. Common milkweed may not be suited for a small garden, but would be perfect in a sunny common area of a community, planted with other large native plants like Joe Pye Weed, Eupatorium fistulosus, and Goldenrod, Solidago spp.

There are many other suitable plants for a Monarch Waystation: Click on http://monarchwatch.org/waystations/for more information and plant suggestions.

Save Yourself Time, Money and Aggravation

Before you make any modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the homeowner's responsibility to file an application with the Modifications Subcommittee for all exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this



requirement. The process is easy if you apply before work commences.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a Covenants violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee by the Homeowners Association of up to \$900, which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made in a timely manner. You may be taken to General District Court in order for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which the Commonwealth of Virginia requires you to provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines at http://www.broadlandshoa.org/for-homeowners/design-guidelines/ for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in a timely manner to the Modifications Subcommittee in order to obtain approval prior to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions. 

Non-Toxic Home-Made Weed Killer

- 1 Gallon Vinegar
- 2 Cups Epson Salt
- 1/4 Cup Dish Soap Original Formula Dawn
- Apply after morning dew has dried

Non-Toxic Homemade Pest Control

Use it on soft bodied pests like aphids.

Formula:

- Fill your blender with water
- 1 large onion chopped
- 3 cloves garlic
- 1 tsp. hot sauce
- Dash chili powder
- Dash cayenne pepper
- Blend, strain twice and store in refrigerator up to 1 year.

How to Use:

In a spray bottle, put 1 cup of formula, a quarter cup of eco-friendly soap and fill it up with water. Spray directly on pest infestation.

Lawn and Garden Chemicals - Why be Concerned?

- Pesticides, such as insecticides, weed killers, and slug bait, contain toxic ingredients. Often these products are toxic by ingestion, inhalation, and skin contact.
- Mixing pesticide concentrates can expose you to very strong solutions of active ingredients.
- Many pesticides are toxic to pets. Slug bait is especially hazardous to dogs.
- Many pesticides are also highly toxic to birds, bees, and fish. Most insecticides are toxic to all insects, including those that are harmless or beneficial.
- Some pesticides are highly mobile and can contaminate ground water or surface water.
- Despite their name, inert ingredients can be toxic, flammable, or corrosive. Sometimes they are more hazardous than active ingredients.
- Scientific studies show that pesticides applied to the lawn are tracked into the home and can be found in carpet dust and on tables, window sills and other surfaces. Children pick up these residues on their hands and can transfer them to their mouths.

Trees – Who Needs Them Anyway? By: Jeremey Baker, The Care of Trees



You do! In fact, we all do. Here in the Broadlands, we love our trees! We love the forest that our homes have been built in, we love the wildlife, and we love the shade that our trees provide. There are a multitude of tree benefits including:

- A feeling of home and a sense of community.
- Providing privacy, screens, and focal points.
- Improving air quality, conserving water, and harboring wildlife.
- Creating windbreaks, reducing temperature, and reducing storm water runoff.
- Improving home values by 5-20%.

Along with these wonderful benefits comes a substantial responsibility. We need to care for our trees through pruning, fertilization, proper mulching, watering, and pest control. Consider your trees; when was the last time that you performed these items? In order to continually reap the benefits of our trees, we need to reciprocate!

For tree needs located on your lot, engage a company that employs Certified Arborists and carries adequate liability and workers compensation insurance. The HOA utilizes the services of The Care of Trees, located in Dulles, VA (703-661-1700). My name is Jeremy Baker, and I am the local manager. I am a former 7 year resident of Broadlands, and I am also the Certified Arborist who keeps an eye out on our forest. We perform

residential tree care and can handle tree needs in your yard should they arise. Do not call The Care of Trees directly for HOA owned trees as we are not allowed to respond to such requests. You MUST contact the HOA office directly to report hazardous trees owned by the HOA, 703-729-9704.

Here in the Broadlands, the Board of Directors, HOA management, and my staff invest a significant amount of time and money each year reviewing our trees. The HOA budgets approximately \$90,000 per year for tree care, encompassing everything from routine maintenance to keep branches off light fixtures, deadwood thinning, storm cleanup from ice buildup as well as high winds and lightning strikes during thunder storms, and other unforeseen events. We all want to ensure that our community continues to be beautiful and safe.

Every spring, my staff and I perform a review of the common area trees within our community. While it is not feasible to examine every single tree in all of Broadlands each year, priority is given to those trees which are in proximity to roadways, walkways, homes, and other targets. Our goal is to proactively mitigate any potential issues through pruning or selective removal. The wood material is left in the forest so that it can break down, returning valuable nutrients to the soil as well as provide wildlife habitat.

Here are some of the criteria that are utilized when reviewing our trees:

- Are there large, dead or detached branches hanging in the tree?
- Does the tree have cavities or rotten wood along the trunk or in major branches?
- Are mushrooms present at the base of the tree?
- Are there cracks or splits in the trunk or where branches are attached?
- Have any branches fallen from the tree?
- Have adjacent trees fallen over or died?
- Has the trunk developed a strong lean?
- Do many of the major branches arise from one point on the trunk?
- Have the roots been broken off, injured, or damaged by lowering the soil level, installing pavement, repairing sidewalks, or digging trenches?
- Has the site recently been changed by construction, raising the soil level, or installing lawns?
- Have the leaves prematurely developed an unusual color or size?
- Have trees in adjacent wooded areas been removed?
- Has the tree been topped or otherwise heavily pruned?

Despite our proactive approach, from time to time branches or entire trees may fail due to unseen defects or Acts of God. We will continue to do our part to keep our community beautiful and safe. If you see a tree within proximity to a road, sidewalk, trail, or home that appears to be hazardous, please call the HOA office, 703-729-9704, to inform them. However, please use good judgment so as not to waste time and resources on a tree that is not a hazard. The typical response time for an arborist to review your reported tree is less than 72 hours, and work will be scheduled based upon the severity of the hazard.

Remember – according to Virginia law, you have the right to prune branches back to your property line so long as you do not cause damage to the trees pruned. As a general practice, the HOA will not prune trees overhanging your property unless they appear to create a significant threat. Spring is here! Enjoy the flowers...



Jet Set Pets

As a business in a D.C. Metro area suburb, we're accustomed to the highly varied vacation and business travels of our clients and their families, including their pets. At Stream Valley, we've prepared and approved pets for travel to places like the UK, Greece, France, Japan, Venezuela, and many more. "Preparation and approval?" you might ask. Believe it or not, there can be quite a bit involved when you travel with your pet, so if you've been considering a trip with him or her, make sure you've done your homework first!

Whether you'll travel by car or by air, whether you'll cross a state line or an ocean, there are pet import/export regulations to consider. These regulations have been set in place to protect both your pet and the inhabitants of your destination. For example, rabies does not exist in some parts of the world, so it is important to ensure that your pet could not transport the virus. The reverse may be true; you may travel to an area where your pet could contract an illness for which it is uncommon to vaccinate in our own Northern Virginia.

Therefore, when you first decide that you'd like to travel with your pet, a great place to start is the United States Department of Agriculture - Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, the government agency responsible for animal import and export regulations. More information can be found at http://usda.gov.

USDA-APHIS can help you identify the requirements for your destination; you can also verify with your destination's Department of Agriculture office, or even contact a foreign country's U.S. embassy for more information. Next, check with your airline or railway to see what their requisites are. Common considerations include exams on specific timelines, vaccinations, preventive testings, illness screenings, and microchips. Ultimately, you'll likely need an official travel health certificate: a document provided through a health exam by a USDA-accredited veterinarian, sent to the state Board of Health for approval, and then returned to the veterinarian with copies for the pet's medical record and for your travel use. Also keep in mind, that even for car travel within the Continental United States, a health certificate might be required. Planning ahead is key - some countries have requirements that may take up to four months or longer to fulfill!

Once you've got a handle on the medical services and paperwork involved, don't forget to plan for the travel itself. For instance, if you'll be on a long flight or car ride, you may want to fast your pet for a certain time period prior to the trip. Whether your pet is small enough to ride in the cabin with you or large enough that he or she must ride cargo, air travel does not permit stops for pet potty breaks. And even if you'll drive so that you can make as many pit stops as you need, your pet may experience motion sickness. During the health certificate exam, speak to your veterinarian about these scenarios. Medication to reduce motion sickness may be in order. You can also discuss sedatives or anti-anxiety medications, if warranted and if appropriate (you should NOT give any sedative products to your pet without speaking to your vet first!). Additionally, you may want to explore a special diet to help prevent gastrointestinal upset caused by travel stress. After all, a vacation (or even a long-term move) won't be any fun if your pet starts out with vomiting or diarrhea.

You may be part of the Washington, D.C. jet set, but spontaneity will work against you if you'd like to bring your pet along. If you are expecting to travel with your pet, either permanently or for just a short jaunt, call us to start the process early to help you achieve smooth sailing.





Sautéed Shrimp with Feta Cheese

20 large shrimp, peeled and deveined 8 plum tomatoes

1 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

½ cup thinly sliced garlic (about 5 cloves)

1 cup Chardonnay wine or other dry white wine


1/4 cup lemon juice

1 cup diced feta cheese

½ stick butter cut into pieces and softened

2 tablespoons fresh chopped cilantro

Coarse salt and ground black pepper to taste



Cut shrimp in half lengthwise. Remove stem end from tomatoes and dice into large bite size pieces. Heat oil in sauté pan over medium-high heat, add sliced garlic and cook until golden brown, about 1 minute. Add tomatoes and cook for 2-3 minutes or until softened. Add wine and lemon juice, simmer 3-4 minutes or until slightly reduced. Reduce to medium heat. Add shrimp and feta cheese. Simmer 3 minutes or until sauce is thickened slightly and shrimp is cooked through. Slowly add butter and stir gently until it's melted into the sauce. Add cilantro, then salt and pepper to taste. Toss, serve and enjoy. Serves 4-6

Onion Tart

2 tablespoons olive oil

1 large onion, halved and thinly sliced

1 bay leaf

2 eggs

2 tablespoons heavy cream

2 tablespoons milk

1 clove garlic, minced

Coarse salt, white pepper, to taste

1 package refrigerated pie dough

1/2 cup crumbled blue cheese

4 - 3 ½ inch tart pans (for individual tarts)

WALNUT DRESSING

1/2 cup sherry vinegar 1/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard 1 tablespoon chopped walnuts 1 small shallot, minced Coarse salt, freshly cracked black pepper, to taste 1 cup olive oil

Mix sherry, mustard, walnuts, shallot, salt, and pepper in a blender, slowly drizzling in the oil until the dressing has a creamy consistency.

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Heat olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Add the onion and bay leaf and sauté until soft and lightly browned, about 12 minutes. Remove to a plate to cool. In a mixing bowl, beat together eggs, cream, milk and garlic. Season with salt and pepper and set aside. On a work surface with a rolling pin, roll out the dough to 1/8 inch thick. Cut into circles about 4 inches in diameter. Place in tart pans so that they fit in the bottom and up the sides. Trim off the portion over the top if necessary. Prick the dough with the tines of a fork and bake for 5 minutes. Remove from oven and place a teaspoon of sautéed onions in each tart, spreading evenly. Spoon 1 1/2 tablespoons of egg mixture on top of onions in each tart, and then top each with 2 tablespoons blue cheese. Bake at 400 degrees F for 8 to 10 minutes. Remove from tart pans and serve with a drizzle of walnut dressing. Serves 4

- Children under 16 years must pass the Swim test to use the diving board and slide
- Guests must be accompanied by members with pool ID. Each adult member (18 years or older) is limited to bringing 3 guests per visit. A member 5-17 years of age is limited to 1 guest under 18 or 3 adult guests (18 years or older) per visit. Members must use guest visits for each guest aged 5 and older.

FITNESS CENTER RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. The Broadlands Fitness Center will be available for resident use from 5:00am-11:00pm / 7 days a week. These hours are subject to change by the association and may be amended.
- 2. All persons who utilize the fitness center exercise equipment do so at their own risk. Members assume the full risk of loss and responsibility for damage to health from the use of the cardio fitness center. Members should consult a physician before using the cardio center.






