Neighborhood Watch: Safety News from the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office

National Night Out is an annual crime prevention event that takes place on August 3, 2010. The goal of this event is to encourage community members to get to know one another better, discuss community concerns, and learn about crime prevention. These events promote a community's commitment to being crime free and aid in deepening the overall community relationship. This year Broadlands Neighborhood Watch like to invites residents to a meetand-greet, on August 3rd at 7:00p.m. on the back patio of the Nature Center. Come meet some of your neighbors, discuss safety concerns with Staci Kapinos (the Neighborhood Watch chairperson), pick up some crime prevention information and enjoy refreshments with your fellow residents.

What you can do to prevent car break-ins:

Loudoun County residents continue to have items stolen from their vehicles. The most common items taken include GPS units, small electronics and money. Here are some prevention tips:

- 1. Remove all items from your vehicle when not in use. When you cannot do this, put the items inside a locked glove box.
- 2. A visible GPS unit is an obvious target, but car prowlers also look for any signs of hidden units inside the vehicle, such as a mount on the window or dashboard. Even the circle left on the windshield from a suction cup mount is enough for some crooks to break in. So get rid of all tell-tale signs.
- 3. Park inside a locked garage, if available. Or try to park near an illuminated area.
- 4. KEEP YOUR VEHICLE LOCKED. Most stolen items are taken from vehicles that are not locked. If your vehicle is broken into, report it to the Sheriff's Office. It is also helpful to have the serial numbers of the stolen items available when the deputies arrive. County wide, this is the most frequent criminal event. To combat this ongoing issue, please report suspicious persons you see around your neighborhood.

Time to get involved

Citizens really want to be involved, but fear that their identities will become compromised. To help citizens remain anonymous but still involved, call the following telephone numbers to report information anonymously.

• If you suspect narcotics (drug) use or sales, you can call the Narcotics Tip Line at 703-779-0552.

Plant a Wish Tree Finds a Home in Broadlands

On June 13th the Broadlands Certified Community Wildlife Habitats Committee hosted the Plant a Wish project, a nationwide tree planting and public awareness project that is being filmed for a feature documentary. Community members joined Plant a Wish founders Joseph Imhoff and Sara Tekula for the planting of a native Serviceberry tree. The team from Hawaii was in town as part of their mission to plant native trees in all 50 states and document the project on film. This tree represents the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The Serviceberry tree was donated by GreenWorks Landscaping and hand-picked by Landscape Designer John Magee because of the integral part the tree has played in the history of the US and the indigenous people who occupied these lands before us. To the Native Americans, the blooming of this plant, named Shadblow, signaled when the shad would run up the rivers to spawn and the start of a successful fish harvest. As early European settlers crossed the Appalachian Mountains in search of new homes, some of their family members or friends would die in the cold, harsh winters. With the ground frozen, they could not bury the dead until springtime, when the Serviceberry would be blooming. The flowers of the tree were used in their memorial services, hence the name 'Serviceberry'. The tree produces a wonderful, edible fruit in June, giving the tree one more common name, Juneberry.

During the planting ceremony at the Broadlands Nature Center, wishes were written down on pieces of scrap paper and planted under the tree; hence the origin of the name, Plant A Wish. This event will be featured in an article on the Plant a Wish blog, at www.plantawish.org.





Plant a Wish was launched on Earth Day 2010. The team planned to visit 22 states in the month of June. The duo will return in Fall 2010 and Spring 2011 until they have planted trees in all 50 US states.

"I felt like the project needed a specific mission, some goal that we as filmmakers must attain to make this historic, so I suggested we do all of the U.S. States and the District of Columbia.", says Imhoff. "I believe we'll be the first people in history to have accomplished this when we're finished. As you might imagine, this is a challenging adventure that we're on. We're excited to work with the Certified Community Wildlife Habitat Committee, because we believe that humans have the power and the responsibility to preserve native wildlife in their neighborhoods."

"It's been our goal to find ways to restore the natural habitats in our community. This can be as simple and practical as planting native trees and plants. We are really excited about being part of the Plant a Wish project and to represent Virginia." said Oya Simpson, Co-Chair of the Broadlands Wildlife Habitat Committee.

The Broadlands Wildlife Habitat Committee was established in 2003. Their first accomplishment was to receive national certification for the Broadlands which is only the 25th community in the nation certified as a Community Wildlife Habitat by the National Wildlife Federation. The group works on maintaining their certification by educational programs about nature and promoting environmentally sustainable living practices.

The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling "Hyper Kitty!"

We have a saying in the veterinary business that when a pet just isn't feeling well, and the owner can't put their finger on what's wrong, we say the patient is ADR – ain't doin' right. That could mean all sorts of things, but this article is specifically about older cats. Sometimes senior kitties may start to act strange, like meowing all night or not using the litter box well, or they may be eating fine but still losing weight. These symptoms may indicate that Fluffy has feline hyperthyroidism.

Hyperthyroidism is a condition where a typically benign tumor in the thyroid gland produces too much thyroid hormone. This increases your feline's metabolism, causing her to be hungry all the time, yet still lose weight. We also often see cats with behavioral changes as mentioned above. If left untreated, Tiger will progressively lose weight, develop heart disease, and ultimately die from the disease.

There are tests for this most common endocrine disease in cats, and easy treatments as well. A drug called Tapazole can be effectively used to control the condition, but there are some potential side effects. Surgery is an option, but with no guarantees. The most effective treatment is radioactive iodine. Done at a special facility (we have one in Springfield), a cat stays at the center for about 4 days until his or her radiation levels are low enough, getting lots of TLC the whole time. This therapy is 99% effective, and needs very little follow-up. The downside is the cost – about \$1500.

I hope this sheds some light on a common ailment in older cats. In the meantime, have a great summer, and I hope your critter isn't ADR!

Healthy Homebodies By Shannon M. Pecora, M.A. Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

Rabies can be passed from infected bats. Heartworms come from carrier mosquitoes. Ticks can give us Lyme disease. So we know to protect our dogs from exposure during hikes or camping trips, by scheduling semi-annual veterinary exams, maintaining their vaccinations, and using preventative products. But



even "couch potato" dogs and indoor-only cats are at risk, so they need regular veterinary care as well.

Your pet's daily schedule might be mainly comprised of meals and naps, and he might seem wholly content with that lifestyle. However, we really should not encourage inactivity. Physical and mental fitness are just as important for them as for us, and routine vet exams can help determine if an underlying medical condition is the cause of the inactivity. The veterinarian can recommend appropriate treatments, medications, diet changes, supplements, or exercise regimens as needed. Follow-up visits can then help you monitor your pet's progress and make adjustments accordingly.

Also, even if your pet rarely ventures beyond your own backyard, those bats, mosquitoes, and ticks can unfortunately still pose a threat. We've all heard stories of bats trapped in residential attics. We've swatted at mosquitoes in our kitchens. We've hopped in the shower after working in the yard and discovered that we've brought in a few stow-away ticks. Or, have you ever stepped in doggie doo just before entering your house? Have you ever seen your pet eat a cricket (potential roundworm carriers) in your basement? Ever notice that your cat likes to hop up in your bed just after walking through, using, and digging around in the litter box? Creepy, but truethere are countless ways for even the most sheltered pets to contract and spread diseases, infections, and parasites. And when you consider that just one heartworm can be fatal to your cat, or that your entire family can suffer from hookworm infestation, the value of regular and preventive veterinary care becomes clear.

While lifestyle can dictate certain aspects of veterinary care, it is not the deciding factor in the actual need for care. We should see our own physicians routinely, whether we are avid outdoorsmen or easy-going homebodies, and such is the case for our pets. Personalized healthcare is an asset that we can offer our pets so they can live the best lives possible—no matter what activities fill up those lives.

Are Our Native Birds in Decline?

Unfortunately, urban sprawl has caused so much habitat loss that commonly seen meadow birds that require undisturbed meadow and field habitats have almost disappeared, and most shoreline migrating birds are under threat due to loss of staging areas. Some edge and suburban species who can adapt to the change, such as the American Robins, Carolina Wrens and Northern Cardinals, have been increasing their populations. Unfortunately, these success stories are few.

One species that is under threat in our area is the Chimney Swift. They are often seen in cities and towns and are well-known and loved for their aerial acrobatics. Before humans, they set their nests in colonies inside dead tree trunks. When we started invading their habitat, they made use of our chimneys in the spring and summer when we have little use for them. However, we became tired of cleaning the chimneys after our little friends used them and many people have had their chimneys "capped".


The Chimney Swifts population has dropped 53% since the 1960's due to the following reasons:

- Loss of habitat in their migration route. They winter in the Amazon River watershed. Rainforest reduction is affecting their population.
- Pesticides are killing their food source.
- Nesting requirements- Chimneys are capped or cleaned during their breeding season.

Why do we care? Like bats, Chimney Swifts feed voraciously on flying insects. They eat huge numbers of mosquitoes and other pests.

How can we help? Start now to prepare for next year's return! If you don't want to give your chimney to the birds perhaps, you could build a chimney swift tower in your yard (ask for HOA approval). Instructions can be found at www.chimneyswifts.org. Rust Sanctuary has one in their garden if you would like to go have a look.

14th Annual Butterfly Count— Saturday, August 7, 9:00 a.m. Join the Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy on its fourteenth Annual Butterfly Count, centered in the Waterford area. No experience is necessary; novices will be teamed with experienced leaders in each segment of the count. Come out and have fun while contributing to butterfly conservation. Counters will visit various locations that include butterfly gardens, sanctuaries, roadside wildflower and grassy areas and parks. We typically count over 2,000 butterflies in this single day and can get up to 50 different species. Our count circle stretches from White's Ferry in the east, to the Appalachian Trail and the Blue Ridge Center for Environmental Stewardship in the west, to Point of Rocks and south to Lincoln. Please bring a lunch and water. Binoculars are also helpful. There's a \$3 fee per adult that we pass through to the North American Butterfly Association to help with their data compilation. 



Re: Additional Assessment

Dear Homeowner,

As you are aware, snow fell in record amounts this past winter and the cost for snow removal services exceeded the budget at most communities, including Broadlands Association, Inc. Despite having established a snow removal budget in line with historic experience, the extraordinary amount of snow caused snow removal and related expenses far in excess of budget. In addition, bad debt expenses related to delinquent accounts have also exceeded budget expectations.

As such, during our scheduled Board of Directors meeting on June 8, 2010, the Board approved an Additional Assessment to be levied against all owners in the total amount of \$275,000, plus the cost to administer the Additional Assessment, in order to defray the excessive snow removal and bad debt expenses. Over 80% of the Additional Assessment is attributable to the excess snow expenses. Payment per homeowner will be as follows:

- Single family detached homes served by public roads and multi-family units \$38.00
- Townhouses and single family detached homes served by private roads \$148.50

The due date of this Additional Assessment will be October 1, 2010, approximately sixty (60) days from your receipt of this notice. Payments not received by October 10, 2010 will incur a late fee as is customary. We have enclosed a coupon for your use in paying the Additional Assessment. If you are paying by check or money order, you must use the enclosed coupon and make your check payable to Broadlands Association, Inc.

DIRECT DEBIT PAYERS - If you currently participate in the Direct Debit Program, the Additional Assessment <u>will be automatically deducted</u> from your designated account, along with your normal monthly assessment, on October 1, 2010 unless you make alternative arrangements by contacting Armstrong Management at (703) 385-1133.

½ cup blueberries
1 tablespoon minced ginger
1 tablespoon sugar
Juice of ½ lemon
2 cups blueberry juice
½ cup sparkling water or cider, divided
Mash blueberries with ginger, sugar and lemon juice.
Add blueberry juice and steep for 5 minutes. Strain; divide among 4 glasses. Top each with the ½ cup sparkling cider or water.

If using fresh raspberries, freeze for about 1 hour before proceeding. Combine cranberry-raspberry juice, seltzer, lime juice in pitcher. Divide among 4 ice-filled glasses. Garnish with frozen raspberries and lime wedges.

Cucumber-Lemonade Chiller

3 large cucumbers

- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh rosemary, plus 4 sprigs for garnish
- 1 ¼ cup water
- ¹/₂ cup lemon juice

3 tablespoons agave syrup

Cut 12 thin slices of cucumber for garnish.

Peel and chop the rest of the cucumber; transfer to a food processor, add rosemary and puree. Pour the puree through a fine-mesh strainer set over a medium bowl or large measuring cup. Press on the solids to extract all the juice. Add water, lemon juice and agave syrup to the cucumber juice; stir until the agave is dissolved. Divide among 4 ice-filled glasses. Garnish with cucumber slices and rosemary sprigs.

Lemon Orange fizz

2 cups orange seltzer 2 tablespoons frozen lemonade 1 tablespoon lemon juice Lemon wedge Sugar Ice cubes



Combine seltzer, lemonade, lemon juice. Rub rim of 2 glasses with lemon wedge and dip in sugar. Fill glasses with ice and top with the seltzer mixture.

Watermelon Fizz

5 cups diced watermelon, divided

- 8 tablespoons lime juice, divided
- 1 1/3 cups ginger ale, divided
- Lime wedges, for garnish

Freeze 1 cup watermelon for garnish. Puree the remaining 4 cups watermelon. Strain; divide the juice among 4 ice-filled glasses. Top each with 2 tablespoons lime juice and 1/3 cup ginger ale. Garnish with the frozen watermelon and lime wedges.




Broadlands Kids' Triathlon Swim, Bike & Run for Charity


dental goodie bag from the Ashburn Pediatric Dental Center.

Finding the Gym that is Right for You By: Katie Herbert Certified Personal Trainer fitness.innovations@gmail.com

In our rapidly growing area it is no surprise that like grocery stores and pharmacies, new fitness centers and gyms are popping up everywhere and vying for our membership. With options that range from 24-hour bare bones facilities to amazing full service health clubs and everything in between, how do you choose the place that is right for you and your family? As a trainer, I have not only worked in multiple gyms but have also belonged to many others over the years which has given me some insight in what to look for.

Location

As with real estate, fitness is all about location, location, location. It doesn't matter how fabulous a club is, if it's a pain to get to, you will always have an excuse not to go. If you like to workout before work, a gym close to home may make sense. If you like to get a workout in at lunchtime, then check out clubs close to work to ensure exercise adherence.

Contracts

Some gyms require long commitments and others are on a month-to-month basis. If you are considering a club that requires an extended contract, make sure that there is some kind of trial period so you can be sure that it is the place for you. Many places that require extended contracts do offer 30 days without penalty. If you don't have that option, I would not sign a longterm deal. Month-to-month is great because it gives the member control, but it can sometimes be a more expensive option.

Cost

In our current economy, price is an issue for many people. Lucky for us, there is a lot of competition in the area, which can sometimes leave a little wiggle room for negotiating a price. Check out all of the clubs that are on your list and don't let pressure from a sales person force you into signing anything until you check out all of your options. Many clubs have "special promos that will be ending in a few days". The truth is that different clubs are always having different promos. If someone pressures you for the quick sale, I would walk away, there are too many options around here to deal with that.

Classes

Most gyms offer some kind of classes. If you are into group exercise classes, check not only what classes are offered but also when they are offered. If you are paying for classes, they have to make sense in your schedule. Even if you haven't typically been into classes, it is great to be at a club that offers them because you never know when you may want to mix up your workout.

Childcare

If this is a necessity for you, be thorough when you check out the childcare facilities on your tour. Don't do a quick pass thru, hang out for a few moments and see how the check-in/check-out process goes, what type of security measures they take when kids leave, how the staff interacts with the kids, do they change diapers etc. For most Moms, childcare is a deciding factor when choosing a gym, so don't be afraid to ask questions. I would also ask for a week pass so you can see how your kids like the facility.

Amenities

When you are thinking about amenities, think about what will get you to the gym on days that you would rather not go. Would a hot tub or sauna get you in the door? Do you want towel service or bath and body products in the showers? Do they offer any spa services? Yes, amenities are the extra bells and whistles that aren't necessary for gym membership, but if it's something you want, it can help break a tie between gyms.

Above all, choose a place that feels comfortable, where you can be you and have fun!




