Looking Forward

Since the early planning stages of Broadlands, efforts were made to preserve the natural wetlands, working around them to create areas for homes, schools, recreation, offices, and shopping. The result was a land plan with green spaces throughout the community. A commitment to preserving and enhancing the natural environment is at the heart of Broadlands philosophy.



Unfortunately, it seems that our wetlands are sometimes misunderstood.

What is a wetland?

A wetland is an area that is covered by shallow water or has waterlogged soils for long periods during the growing season in most years. Prolonged saturation with water leads to chemical changes in wetland soils, which in turn affect the kinds of plants that can grow. Therefore, wetland vegetation often looks quite different from that of surrounding non-wetland areas. Although wetlands are often wet, a wetland might not be wet year-round. Some of the most important wetlands are only seasonally wet. Wetlands are the link between the land and the water. They are transition zones where the flow of water, the cycling of nutrients, and the energy of the sun meet to produce a unique ecosystem characterized by hydrology, soils, and vegetation, making these areas very important features of a watershed. Using a watershed-based approach to wetland protection ensures that the whole system, including land, air, and water resources, is protected. The United States loses about 60,000 acres of wetlands each year. The very runoff that wetlands help to clean can overload and contaminate these fragile ecosystems. In addition, nonnative species of plants and animals and global climate change contribute to wetland loss and degradation.

How do wetlands benefit nature?

Often called "nurseries of life", wetlands provide habitat for thousands of species of aquatic and terrestrial plants and animals. Although wetlands are best known for being home to water lilies, turtles, frogs, muskrats, salamanders, and snakes, they also provide important habitats for waterfowl, fish, and mammals. Migrating birds use wetlands to rest and feed during their cross-continental journeys and as nesting sites when they are at home. As a result, wetland loss has a serious impact on these species. Habitat degradation since the 1970s has been a leading cause of species extinction. Wetlands do more than provide habitat for plants and animals in the watershed. When rivers overflow, wetlands help to absorb and slow floodwaters. This ability to control floods can alleviate property damage and loss and can even save lives. Wetlands also absorb excess nutrients, sediment, and other pollutants before they reach rivers, lakes, and other waterbodies.

Playing in the Street

The Association does not endorse playing in the streets, nor can it approve the location of play equipment that encourages play on the streets. This is for the safety of the players as well as drivers. Streets are designed for vehicular traffic.

As a reminder, per the Design Guidelines, basketball goals on public streets cannot be located in the street or in the VDOT right-of-way which extends approximately ten feet from the street towards your home. On private streets basketball goals must be located above the driveway apron.

Light the Way

As Autumn approaches and the days get shorter it is more important than ever to keep your exterior pole light functioning both for security and safety purposes. Additionally, maintaining pole lights are part of the Broadlands Covenants.

Keeping these lights functional is the responsibility of the homeowner whether you own a single family, semi-attached or a town home. Should replacing the light bulb not resolve the problem, you may have a tripped circuit breaker in your home or you may need to replace the photoelectric cell. You may want to contact an electrician to repair the light pole issue.

Please keep your pole lights operational to help keep your home and neighborhood safe.

How do wetlands benefit people?

Wetlands benefit people in many ways that may not be obvious. They improve the quality of our water by filtering sediments and removing contaminants. They serve as spawning sites and nursery areas for fish and other aquatic life. They also support downstream aquatic systems, including commercial and sport fisheries, by producing food and organic material that is flushed out of the wetlands and into streams during high flows. They reduce flood damage to crops and human settlements downstream by storing flood water and releasing it slowly, like a giant sponge. They protect shorelines from erosion due to waves and currents. Additionally, they provide recreational opportunities, such as hunting, fishing, boating, and wildlife watching.

How can you recognize a wetland?

The term "wetland" encompasses a variety of conditions and degrees of wetness. Some wetlands are very easy to recognize because the water sits on the land's surface for much of the year. Other wetlands exist due to saturation of the soil by groundwater and can be difficult to identify. One clue that a tract of land may contain wetlands is its topography or position in the landscape. Wetlands occur in areas where water naturally flows or accumulates, such as in the floodplains of streams and rivers, along smaller creeks and washes, in low spots or depressions in flat or rolling landscapes, around seeps and springs, along the fringes of ponds and lakes, and in coastal areas affected by tides. Even in fairly obvious wetland situations, it may be difficult to determine where the wetland ends and the upland begins. Wetlands are delineated by carefully examining a site for the presence of wetland indicators. Three categories of wetland indicators exist: vegetation, soil, and hydrology.

What does this all mean to me?

Broadlands Association and our contractors work very hard to protect our existing wetlands. What may appear to be a nuisance or unattractive to you may in fact be a wetlands preserve or wetlands impact area. You may want (or want the HOA) to alter the wetlands in some ways, but these areas are heavily regulated by the Army Corps of Engineers and limits are placed on what can and cannot be done to alter these areas. The following outlines what can and cannot be done in a preserved wetlands area at Broadlands.

Permitted Activities:

- Trimming (by hand only) of dead or diseased vegetation
- Planting of native species typically adapted to living in wetland areas

Typical trees include

- Red Maple
- Pin Oak
- Willow Oak
- Green Ash

- Sycamore
- Sweet Gum

Typical shrubs include:

- Black Willow
- Arrowwood
- Silky Dogwood
- Brookside Alder
- Winterberry
- Highbush Blueberry

Prohibited Activities:

- Removing vegetation by the roots
- Ditching, filling, grading or other land disturbing activities
- Installation of permanent structures such as dog runs, dog kennels, picnic tables, swing sets, mulch piles, or asphalt or concrete paths

Wetlands in Broadlands occur along streams and ponds, as well as in low lying wooded areas. Many of our trails, homes, and tot lots are adjacent to wetlands or wetlands impact areas. Many of these areas either hold water year round or fill with water after heavy rains, doing what they a supposed to do by preventing flooding, hosting wildlife, and filtering sediment. Hopefully you now have a greater appreciation of wetlands and how we have incorporated Broadlands into the natural environment and the next time you see stagnant water or a swampy area you think may need better drainage, you may be looking at a wetlands area. The Broadlands Nature Center will be providing a sanctuary for the monarch butterflies. This will be an amazing opportunity to experience an incredible transformation of a caterpillar to a beautiful adult monarch butterfly.

Every fall, millions of monarch butterflies migrate from the United States and Canada to Mexico and California where they wait out the winter season. This migration is one of the most wonderful works of nature to experience, yet it is severely threatened by habitat loss.

This loss is due to the widespread use of herbicides. developments that consume wildlife habitats, and frequent mowing along roadsides. To offset all of the destruction of the butterfly's habitat we need to create. conserve, and



protect their resources (milkweeds and nectar plants). This effort will help the preservation of the monarch species and continuation of migration.

Are You Familiar With the **Parking Regulations That** Are in Effect in Broadlands? Here's a Quick Overview.

- There are no assigned parking spaces in Broadlands. Owners, residents, tenants and their quests may park in any legal space regardless of where there home is located.
- Commercial vehicles, school buses, church buses, recreational vehicles of any type – boats, campers, motor homes and/or any vehicle which could not normally be used for daily transportation - may not be parked or stored in open view of any residential property, residential streets or open space or other Common area.
- Junk or derelict vehicles may not be parked or stored in open view of any residential property, residential streets or open space or other Common area.
- Vehicles must conform to all State and County codes, ordinances and statutes with regard to stickers, registrations and certifications.
- Vehicles cannot be parked in a manner that obstructs vehicular or pedestrian traffic or on a sidewalk or any grassy or landscaped area.
- Vehicles may not be parked with any type of "For Sale" sign displayed on the vehicle on any roadways or common area.
- Vehicles may not park within ten feet on either side of a mailbox.

Vehicles parked in violation of any of these regulations may be towed at the owner's sole risk and expense. If you have any questions regarding parking in Broadlands, please call the HOA office at 703-729-9704 Monday through Friday from 9:00am to 5:00pm.



Best Friends, Worst Moments By: Shannon M. Pecora, MA Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

Earlier this year, I lost one of my best friends: my beloved 15 yearold Australian Shepherd-Chocolate Lab mix. College, grad school, marriage, first house, first child, second child - so many milestones came in life, and my dogs were always there (my 15-year-old Cattledog-Chow mix is thankfully still with me, even still running and playing like a puppy on occasion!). I could count on sharing each day with my first furry kids, and my optimism and "puppy love" let me feel like it would always be that way.

But I work in the veterinary field. I wasn't kidding anyone, least of all myself. Even now, it's too painful for me to rehash and relive my ole buddy's decline, but of course the signs of the inevitable increasingly became impossible to deny: advancing age, decreased mobility, loss of interest in the favorite toys...The day came when he let us know that he had reached the end of his journey here with us, and, simply put, it was time to say goodbye.

Yes, he did let us know, in his way, in a way that my husband and I fully understood, and looking back now, we know that we made the right decision. But was this so easy on that day? Of course not. It's natural to second-guess yourself, to ask yourself, "What if?" Unfortunately, that is a question that your veterinarian may not be able to fully answer for you. Veterinary staff can help guide you, help you assess if activity, personality, affection, and attitude changes in your pet are such that, as one of our Stream Valley doctors puts it, "Fluffy just isn't Fluffy anymore". Even a small amount of objectivity can offer clarity when you are charged with such a distressing choice.

No matter how sure you are, no matter how old, ill, frail, weak, or glum your pet is, there are still regrets and doubts that can creep into your heart and mind. Veterinary professionals can help with that, too. When you're faced with the loss or potential loss of your pet, ask for resources such as grief support websites, hotlines, books, and groups. Also, ask for basic information; if your pet is suffering from a serious illness or medical condition, the veterinarian can help you explore treatment options and side effects, symptoms, disease progression, pain prognosis, and more. This knowledge may not end up affecting your decision at all. You may still know that it's time to say goodbye. However, you can settle on the decision for humane euthanasia with a bit more confidence or certainty.

When I consider my decade and a half with my ole buddy, I truly ache. I miss the reliable, unconditional love and just the general fun that we had with one another. But, cliché alert - I have to consider myself lucky to have had him in my life. He was my husband's dog when we first met all those years ago, and I always joke that, more than with my husband, I was meant to be with this dog. We were simply supposed to be best friends! So, I have to take some comfort in the fact that I did the best I could for him, in all circumstances, including the end. Isn't that the greatest thing that any of us could ask for?

The Critter Corner - "On the Move" By: Dr. Steve Velling

Moving day is approaching and the stress is mounting. As a human, you have the advantage of knowing why you're moving and where you're going. Pets don't have that benefit. They are sensitive creatures and they know something is up, especially when their food bowl is surrounded by boxes. And even when you get to where you're going, the stress doesn't end there. You've got all of your moving in to do, and your pet is in a strange place with new people and new sights, sounds, and smells. There are some real concerns for you and your four-legged friend, but also some things you can do about it.

Cats that are indoor-only cats should do well adjusting, but just make sure Shadow knows where the food, water, and litter are. You may even want to get a second litter box just in case. As for outdoor cats, moving is the perfect opportunity to transform Tigger into an indoor kitty. Not only do indoor cats tend to live longer lives, but an outdoor cat in a new environment stands a good chance of being attacked or running away. They have a tendency to wander back to their old territory. Have Tigger spend at least a month confined to the house. Hopefully he'll decide it's nicer indoors than out.

For dogs, separation anxiety can be a very real issue. When you move to a new home, the only constant thing in Max or Sadie's life is you. When you leave to go to work, the dog may come unglued. The most common symptoms of separation anxiety are barking, "accidents" in the house, and tearing or chewing things up. To ease his/her pain, try to spend some quality time with your pet in your new home, but leave your home for short periods of time the first few days so he/she isn't left feeling abandoned. If your pet does have an accident or chews something up while you're gone, don't correct him after the fact. That just creates more stress. Instead, get a crate, or bring him or her to a doggy daycare facility. Make sure your pooch gets plenty of exercise, as tired dogs don't have enough energy or inclination to get into trouble. Also, ask your neighbors to listen for whether your hound spends all day barking while you're gone. If he or she is, then it may take a few weeks for them to feel secure in your absence.

With so many things to think of when you're moving in or moving out, try to prepare for what your pet may need ahead of time, and try to be patient with your fuzzy pal. She may be as worried as you, and doesn't even know why. But if you don't show your stress too much, chances are your pet won't be quite as worried either. Bone voyage (bad pun), and good luck!

Barbecue Bacon Wrapped Shrimp with Basil Stuffing


- 1 teaspoon fresh minced garlic
- 15 thin bacon slices, cut in half
- 2 tablespoons freshly grated Parmesan cheese
- 30 basil leaves, coarsely chopped
- 30 large shrimp (21-25 count per pound), peeled with tail shells on
- Parmesan cheese SAUCE
- 1/4 cup applesauce
- 1/4 cup pure maple syrup
- 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar
- 1½ cups barbecue sauce, bottled or homemade

Mix together basil, cheese and garlic. Cut deep down the back of each shrimp and remove vein. Fill cut with ½ teaspoon of basil stuffing. Wrap each shrimp with ½ slice of bacon and tuck loose end or secure bacon with a toothpick, leaving only shrimp tail exposed. Build a fire for leaving one side for indirect cooking. When grill temperature reaches 400 F, place shrimp on grill away from coals and with tails pointing up. Close lid and cook shrimp for 14 minutes. Drain shrimp on a paper towel lined platter. Stir sauce ingredients together in a small bowl. Holding the shrimp by tail, dip each into the sauce, and return it to the grill away from the coals/fire. Close the cooker lid and allow the sauce to caramelize (about 3 minutes). Serve hot. 6-8 servings. Grilling.com

Flank Steak with Cilantro-Almond Pesto

- 3/4 cup fresh cilantro
- 2 tablespoons slivered almonds, toasted
- I tablespoon chopped seeded jalapeño pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 garlic clove, chopped
- 3 tablespoons plain fat-free yogurt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons fresh lime juice

- 3 tablespoons olive oil, plus extra for greasing grill pan
- 4 large Portobello mushrooms (about 5 in diameter), stemmed
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, plus extra for drizzling
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 small to medium sized vine ripened tomatoes, cut into I/2-inch pieces
- 8 ounces fresh water-packed mozzarella, drained, cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh basil leaves

Prepare barbecue (medium-high heat). Drizzle 3 tablespoons of olive oil over both sides of mushrooms. Sprinkle mushrooms with salt and pepper. Drizzle olive oil on grill pan to prevent mushrooms from sticking. Grill until mushrooms are heated through and tender, about 5 minutes per side. Meanwhile, whisk the extra-virgin olive oil and garlic in a medium bowl to blend. Add tomatoes, cheese, and basil and toss to coat. Season tomato salad, to taste, with salt and pepper. Place 1 hot grilled mushroom gill side up on each of 4 plates. Sprinkle with more salt and pepper. Day of the drive, donor registration:

The donation process starts at the registration table where donors are asked to show a picture ID. Donors will be asked to read a booklet to help the donor determine if they are eligible with regards to medication taken, travel, health and lifestyle.

Donor Screening:

After registration, the donor will meet with a member of the Red Cross collection team for a confidential health history interview. The donor will receive a "mini-physical", checking temperature, blood pressure, pulse, and blood iron level. This mini-physical

helps the Red Cross determine if a blood donor can safely donate blood. The donor will use a computer to answer questions privately about health history and places traveled. At this point in time some donors may be deferred. Common deferrals are: low iron, cold/flu/other illness symptoms, certain travel, and some medications. Many deferrals are short-term deferrals that are resolved in a matter of days, weeks, or months, after which time the person may attempt to donate again.

Blood Donation:

After the screening, the donor is moved to the donation area. The actual whole blood donation process usually takes less than ten minutes. The donor's arm will be cleansed, the phlebotomist inserts the needle, and blood flows into the collection bag. Most donors feel only a slight pinch when the needle is first inserted. During this process, separate test tubes are filled with the donor's blood. These test tubes will be sent to our testing lab in Philadelphia where approximately 13 different tests are performed to determine the safety of the blood. These test are performed within five days of the donation and when completed will allow the donor's blood to be sent to the needed hospitals and trauma centers.

Post Donation Instructions:

The next step toward safety is the distribution of post donation instructions to the donors, which provide them with contact information for notifying the Red Cross with any follow-up questions that they may have, or to inform the Red Cross of any donor concerns.

Refreshments/Canteen Area:

After giving blood, the donor is asked to relax for a few minutes and enjoy some refreshments in the canteen area. We want to be sure that all donors are feeling well and are hydrated before leaving the donation site.

Your whole blood donation has the potential of saving the lives of three

individuals! In our labs, your whole blood donation will be split three ways: Red Blood Cells, White Blood Cells & Platelets, and Plasma. These three separate blood products can then be sent to three separate patients in need!
