Due to a low participation rate, Patriot Disposal will no longer be collecting recyclable newspapers on Mondays. As of August 3rd, newspaper for recycling should only be placed at the curb for collection on Thursdays, along with other recyclables.

Also, if you have a large item that you need to have picked up, please call our Patriot Disposal office in advance to let us know what the item is and when it will be out at the curb for collection. We can accept notification up until the day before you want the item picked up. Generally, there is no additional charge (unless it is a very large item, many items or large amounts of brush or yard debris), but the advance notice will help us to incorporate the request into our schedule efficiently. Large items include mattresses, appliances, small furniture, etc.

Broadlands Association Board of Directors Meeting July 14, 2009 Board Actions

The meeting was called to order at 5:32p.m. with the following Board members in attendance:

Eric Bazerghi moved to approve the minutes from the June 9, 2009 Board Meeting as amended and was seconded by Staci Kapinos. The motion was approved 6/0/2 with Denise Harrover and Roy Barnett abstaining.

Eric Bazerghi reported great attendance at Flicks in the Sticks even though they had to postpone a week because of the weather. Their new signage is helping. Staci Kapinos reported she had consulted with the attorney regarding videotaping meetings. He believes it would be fine but wishes to check further, especially with surrounding communities. Tom Marable reported that Mooreview Parkway was now open from Wynridge Drive to Croson Road. The developer has starting paving at Broadlands Boulevard and Route 659 (Belmont Ridge Road). Traffic patterns will be changing. Cliff Keirce read a letter of thanks from a homeowner regarding activities within the community. Cliff reported that the Association will have plenty of help to establish a committee to work on the Stone House property if turned over to the Association. He also reported he met with a student who was working on her thesis regarding associations. Denise Harrover reported an easement request from B. F. Saul to install a traffic signal at Broadlands Boulevard and Demott Drive would be forwarded in the near future. B. F. Saul will be required to install another left hand turn in lane on Broadlands Boulevard and is hoping to get approval to install a right hand turn in lane from Claiborne Parkway.

Lori Seidmeyer reported for the Habitat Committee that approximately 40 decals had been installed on storm drains on VDOT streets within the community to help with a Loudoun County project to preserve the Chesapeake Bay. The Board of Directors viewed a sample decal and the permit approval from VDOT issued to the County. The project will continue. Brian Beahm moved to allow the decals be installed on storm drains on the private streets within the community. Eric Bazerghi seconded the motion. The motion was approved 8/ 0/0.

Two changes to the Design Guidelines were proposed by the Modifications Subcommittee. Eric Bazerghi moved to approve the insertion of new section under open style fencing regarding mesh on the exterior of fence to comply with a new interpretation of Loudoun County Code when enclosing a swimming pool with open style fencing. This section would apply only to open style fences approved prior to July 14, 2009. Staci Kapinos seconded the motion. The motion passed 8/0/0.

Staci Kapinos moved to do crack filling only on streets after marking for measurement at the lowest cost per foot. Eric Bazerghi seconded the motion. The motion passed 8/0/0.

A drainage proposal was tabled by the Board for further evaluation of the issue under adverse weather conditions.

The Board agreed to severely trim back bushes screening a bench from view along the trail behind Windover Drive.

The Board reviewed and made changes to upcoming mailings and insertions into the newsletter regarding the upcoming Transition Meeting on September 30, 2009 at Mill Run Elementary School.

Seven covenant hearings were scheduled. Two were for inoperable light fixtures; one was resolved prior to the meeting and the other owner is in process of repairing. Another hearing for storing a trailer and recreational vehicles was resolved prior to the meeting. The owner attended the meeting. There was one hearing for a fence mesh violation, one for no application for a patio, one for a dead tree and bush and one for trash in view. The Board authorized assessing of charges after following normal procedures. The Board inquired about the extension granted at the last meeting and was informed that the violation had been resolved.

The Board discussed and decided to continue its current policy of not allowing political advertising in the newsletter.

The Board reviewed the submission requirements for daycare homes proposed by Staci Kapinos. Eric Bazerghi moved to approve the submission requirements for daycare homes. The motion was seconded by Brian Beahm. The motion passed 8/0/0.

Staci Kapinos moved to approve the request for a daycare home on Humbolt Square based on information submitted. Eric Bazerghi seconded the motion. The motion passed 8/0/0.

The Board reviewed the license agreement prepared by the Association's attorney. Roy Barnett requested an electronic version for further review. The Board tabled the agreement until the next meeting.

Staci Kapinos moved to enter Executive Session at 7:10p.m. to discuss collections. The motion was seconded by Eric Bazerghi. The motion passed 8/0/0.

Staci Kapinos moved to exit Executive Session at 7:20p.m. and assert that no action was taken in Executive Session. Eric Bazerghi seconded the motion. The motion passed 8/0/0.

Denise Harrover moved to approve writing off the proposed accounts with an updated total of legal fees expended. Brian Beahm seconded the motion. The motion passed 8/0/0.

Staci Kapinos moved to adjourn the meeting and was seconded by Eric Bazerghi. The motion was approved 8/0/0. The meeting adjourned at 7:21p.m. The next Board meeting is scheduled for August 11, 2009 at 5:30p.m.


Fight the Flu Protect Yourself and Those Around You!



Broadlands Naturalist, Nan McCarry, Thinks We Have a Wonderful Nature Center!

Broadlands residents must be very proud of their Nature Center and their status as an National Wildlife Federation Certified Community Wildlife Habitat. I am enjoying my new job as Audubon naturalist here. It's nice to see families and individuals coming in to visit the Nature Center often. Several teens are helping with animal care, but we always welcome more. Let me know if you'd like to help.

I was told there is a wetland with a boardwalk here and was blown away when I first saw it. What a wonderful resource! I understand that many of you go out to see the turtles in the evenings. Jeanne Leslie sent in some wonderful photos of the enormous snapping turtle. The small turtle on the back of the larger snapping turtle is an eastern painted turtle.

Please remember, bread is NOT in any of the turtles' natural diets. Leftover bread is not healthy for the wetland either and can lead to more goose poop, which I'm sure we don't want. In the wild, turtles eat things like beetles, algae, fish, and invertebrates. If you would like to feed the turtles, try giving them lettuce or earthworms. Swimmy, the red-eared slider here at the Nature Center, loves her weekly slice of banana (although let's not pollute the wetland with mountains of fruit either—and NO citrus fruits, please!)



Now that fall is coming, it's a wonderful time to be outdoors. One destination is Rust Nature Sanctuary's Conservation Celebration in Leesburg on Sept. 27th. There will be activities for all ages and guided hikes and pond exploration. Let's fight "nature deficit disorder" and get out to enjoy a nice day in the country. As you probably know, Broadlands Nature Center is a partner with Rust Sanctuary.

If you're too busy to visit us at the Nature Center during the week, come and see us on a Saturday. We'll be open 3 Saturdays per month from 10:00a.m. to 2:00p.m. and will offer a family program on at least one of these Saturdays. Tara's House Animal Rescue, Inc. <u>www.tara.petfinder.org</u> and <u>www.tarashouse.net</u>

Tara's House is a private, not-for-profit, 501(c)(3) organization based in Columbia, Maryland. Our mission is to rescue and then provide care and compassion for our pets while working to place them, through an adoption process, in permanent, loving homes throughout the Washington, DC and Baltimore Metro area. We rescue our pets primarily from shelters throughout West Virginia, Ohio, Kentucky and Georgia. These shelters have no adoption program and oftentimes, Tara's House is the only hope to save these adoptable pets from euthanasia and give them a second chance at a forever home. Tara's House practices humane training of our rescued pets using positive reinforcement techniques. All of our dogs are spayed or neutered and current on vaccinations prior to adoption. We receive no government funding of any kind, and therefore operate solely on private donations, adoption fees and volunteer efforts.

Tara's House is a 'virtual' animal rescue, meaning we do not have a brick and mortar shelter that houses our dogs in a kennel environment. Instead, we are a network of volunteers who allow our rescued dogs to live with us in foster care until they are adopted. We harness the full power of the Internet to adopt dogs by using email for correspondences and accept online adoption applications via our websites. We do, however, hold monthly adoption shows, the location of which is advertised on our websites. Operating as a virtual shelter allows us to run lean operations and to use 100% of our donations toward the care of the pets that enter our adoption program.

Ginger! She is a tiny girl, a min pin mix, weighing only 10 pounds. Our vet estimates that she is 2 years old. Ginger is great with kids, other dogs, and even cats!



Leftovers...Use last night's chicken and make chicken strips. Pack dippers such as salsa, ranch dressing, barbecue sauce, ketchup, honey mustard, or pizza sauce.

Peanut Butter Twist...On a flour tortilla with jelly or fruit, spread and roll up "wrap" or "jellyroll" style. Slice crosswise into pieces. Select the size tortilla depending on your child's appetite.

Bagels Rock: Cut open a bagel and spread each side with cream cheese. Lay several slices of lunch meat on top of cream cheese and make into a sandwich.

Homemade "Lunchables"...Cut meat slices and cheese into pieces that will fit on crackers. Pack the meat, cheese, and crackers together. Have extra mustard or mayo packets from your take-out? Pack those along for condiments.

It Doesn't Have to be Jelly Everyday! Some other ideas for sandwiches using with traditional peanut butter are: sliced bananas, honey, butter/margarine, raisins, and thinly sliced apples.

Create "Wraps" Using Bread...Simply take a slice of your favorite bread (softer breads work better), and lay a slice or two of your favorite lunchmeat and cheese on it. Roll up the bread tightly, making sure to press the edges of the bread together to seal.

Vegetable Caterpillar... This crunchy caterpillar is a great idea to encourage kids to eat vegetables. Slice a cucumber into rounds about 1/2-inch-thick. Place the slices, slightly apart, onto a long bamboo skewer. You can even attach a cherry tomato on one end for the "head."

Apple Container...Turn an apple into a clever container: Cut an apple in half crosswise, cutting about onethird of the way into the apple. Remove the flesh of the apple with a spoon or a melon baller. To prevent the cut areas from turning brown, rub them with lemon juice. You can then use the apple container to hold items like raisins or homemade tuna salad. Place the apple container in a resealable plastic container and refrigerate until ready to add to the lunch boxes.

Picky Eater Tip...Before you plan the weekly lunch menu, ask your child to identify five favorite food items that he or she would like to see in the lunchbox. Then encourage your kid to participate in the planning, preparing, and packing of the rest of the meals, creating a balanced menu of protein and complex carbs. Including them in the decision—and preparation—improves the chances that the lunch will actually get eaten. Note: Introduce new or controversial foods at dinnertime, when your kid is presumably hungry and under your watchful eye.

Autumn Lawn Care Means Green Rewards Next Year

Whether planting a new lawn or taking care of one already established, fall is the perfect time to do the job to enjoy a better lawn next year, according to Lin Diacont President of the Virginia Green Industry Council. The winter resting period allows lawns to absorb nutrients and to build up strength in their root systems.


Fertilizing established lawns is extremely important during the autumn months since this is the time when grass is storing up nutrients for next year's growth. It is also a good time to dethatch the lawn to get out dead particles and allow it to grow healthy and thick. Check the lawn area thoroughly. Note weed areas or bare spots that need sprucing up, or pest areas that need control. Early autumn is also the best time for seeding or sodding a lawn. While there are a host of different grasses which will suit various climatic and soil conditions, the basic ingredients in planning and caring for a lawn are generally alike.

If putting in a new lawn, or making improvements in one, be sure to plan the layout to fit the overall landscape plan of the property. Avoid planting in areas that will make mowing difficult in the future or which will require substantial hand clipping of grass. The lawn should blend comfortably with the general landscape and help to enhance other plantings in the area. Lawn seed should be selected carefully, preferably from a local garden center or nursery, where someone can give advice on the particular variety that will serve the homeowner's purposes. If sod is to be planted, it should be selected from a quality grower who produces lawn varieties suitable for local conditions. The lawn bed should be prepared thoroughly before planting. Soil should be loose enough to allow the new roots to penetrate and get good foothold. If the soil is particularly hard or compact, tilling or digging in a few inches deep and raking is generally sufficient. Mixing peat moss into the soil helps to improve its quality as well. The planting area should be checked for proper drainage. Puddles or wet areas will rot the grass. Holes and depressions should be filled with topsoil. A lawn spreader is the ideal tool for spreading the right amount of seed. Generally, the seed package has proper instructions, or you can get advice from an expert on proper sowing of the soil is especially loose, it may be advisable to roll the planted area. This helps to compact the soil somewhat and allow moisture to permeate evenly throughout the soil. Mulching the soil with a thin layer of straw or other material that allows light and air into the bed will also help retain moisture. Most organic mulches will eventually decompose and disappear into the new turf. Newly planted or sodded lawns have to be kept moist. They should be watered immediately after planting, and then whenever there is not sufficient rainfall.

How much care a lawn requires after it is established depends on the type of grass as well as the homeowner's personal interest. All lawn care pays off, but it is important to mow it at frequent intervals to keep it at the length the particular variety requires; to keep it fertilized and watered appropriately; to control weeds and pests; and to thin, dethatch and aerate when needed. Of course, it is always smart to buy a good quality of grass, fertilizer, weed and pest control products from a reputable dealer who knows local requirements.

A good lawn is a rewarding achievement and autumn lawn care can help keep it green and healthy. The consumer website www.VirginiaGardening.com has additional gardening information.


