Board of Directors Request Resident Input

The Board of Directors is considering a change to the Broadlands Parking Resolution and is soliciting comments from resident members of the Association.

Currently the Resolution states that no recreational vehicle may be parked or stored in open view of residential property, residential streets or open space or other Common Area. The Board is considering adding the following language to the Parking Resolution in Section 1. *Restrictions on the Parking and Storage of Vehicles;* Paragraph A. *General*:

As a convenience to Broadlands Homeowners, recreational vehicles may be parked at the Owner's residence or with Board or Management's permission at a specified Common Area parking lot for no more than two days to facilitate preparation or unloading of the recreational vehicle. Vehicles must be legally parked and conform to all other conditions of the Broadlands Parking Resolution. Permission to park the vehicle must be requested from Management in advance. The total number of days any Homeowner may utilize this waiver may not exceed 24 days in a calendar year or 4 days in a single calendar month.

All comments will be forwarded to the entire Board for review. From Your Naturalist, Lisa Matthews

Budding and Weekend Biologists! Did you know that the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries(DGIF) have started a volunteer program for wildlife-monitoring?

Its purpose is to allow amateur wildlife observers to contribute their observations to Virginia's biological database which helps in the long-term monitoring of the 2200 species of fish, reptiles, amphibians, mussels, crayfish, mammals, butterflies and dragonflies that are already documented; as well as, Virginia's bird population. Did you know that Virginia has one of the highest diversity of birds in the eastern United States, with nearly 400 resident and migratory bird species seen by bird watchers?

Many people make observations every day. Every day sightings at the bird feeder, the park or the pond is just as important as the rare sightings. Even though we see the same birds all of the time doesn't mean that they will be there forever. It is helpful to the wildlife biologist to track the everyday sightings and be alert when the sightings of individual species decrease or even increase.

As a Wildlife Monitor, you can bring your family to help you with observations. Children are very naturally good observers. They often see and find what many adults miss and can contribute greatly to the project. It's a great activity to enhance a family nature walk! The DGIF states that "The program connects citizens to the environment that sustains them and all life, and encourages them to think about the relationships between human and natural systems".

This program assists wildlife biologists with data collection and species distribution information while also meeting formal education plans set out by the Commonwealth in the Virginia Standards of Learning with the desired end result of managing our natural resources in a sustainable manner. Data collections made by thousands of people instead of the few wildlife biologists should help them meet that goal!

In Virginia, the DGIF Wildlife Action Plan has identified 925 "at risk" species including 93 "Tier I" species (which are the species that are in critical need of conservation action in order to sustain or restore their populations). The loss of habitat, demands on natural resources and improper land management have taken their toll on the struggling populations. The program will help wildlife biologists to identify and protect geographic areas (habitats) that are critical to individual species or groups of species before their existence is threatened by determining how big parks must be, as well as, how best to provide wildlife corridors to maintain populations.

The process is simple. Attend a short course on how to do wildlife mapping. After you take your course, you will have access to the Wildlife Mapping database on your computer. Enter your sightings and make a difference!

If you are interested in the course, please email me at naturalist@ BroadlandsHOA.com. The fee is \$25 for which you receive mapping materials and instructions. I have arranged a course on October 30th with DGIF Wildlife Biologist Louis Verner at the Nature Center. Teens, this course and the observation time spent qualify for community service hours! What a fun way to earn it! Doggie Swim Day!!!!

Three Meals from One Chicken

One of the best meat bargains today is chicken. Nutritious and versatile, it is an excellent thrifty meal maker. suite101.com

Meal One: Roast Chicken

Purchase a precooked rotisserie chicken or gather the following to prepare your own: one chicken, a roasting pan, salt, pepper, *onions*, carrots, and celery, and some oil. Rinse chicken and pat dry. Rub salt and pepper on outside and inside of chicken. Put veggies inside chicken for added flavor. Place chicken in roasting pan and brush with oil. Place chicken breast side down to keep juicy. Place in oven and cook according to table: 1.5-2 lbs 400 .75-1 hr. 2-2.5 lbs 400 1-1.25 hr. 2.5-3 lbs 375 1.25-1.75 hr. 3-4 lbs 375 1.75-2.25 hr. About every 30 minutes, brush chicken with oil for a nice, crispy skin.

Meal Two: Chicken Rice Casserole

Strip meat from remains of your Roast Chicken. Check wings and back area. Gather the following: 1/4 c. butter or margarine 1/3 c. flour 1.5 c. milk salt and pepper 1 c. broth or bouillon left over chicken 1.5 c. cooked rice .5-1 c. vegetables (green pepper, onion, carrots, peas, whatever you have sitting in the freezer or ice box), 2 quart sauce pan and 2 quart casserole baking dish. Melt butter in sauce pan. Add flour, salt and pepper, stir until bubbly. Remove from stove and add milk and broth. Put back on stove, heat to boiling for 1 minute. Put rest of ingredients in saucepan and stir together. Pour into ungreased casserole pan. Place uncovered in 350 deg. oven 40-45 minutes.



Quick Meals for Busy Families

When you're short on time and have not yet stocked your kitchen, prepared and take-out foods can serve as the centerpiece for quick healthy meals or as a side dish.

- Store-bought roasted chicken; fresh or frozen vegetables; and a quick-cooking grain, such as packaged couscous or quick-cooking brown rice
- Frozen spinach and cheese pie; rice; fruit
- Thin-crust cheese pizza topped with veggies; garden salad with reduced-fat dressing; milk or 100% juice
- Whole-grain frozen waffles topped with low-fat vanilla yogurt and fruit, such as sliced strawberries; milk
- Cheese and vegetable omelets or scrambled eggs; fruit or vegetables; whole-grain toast or rolls; milk
- 100% ground turkey breast burgers or prepared veggie burgers on whole-wheat buns; cooked broccoli; milk
- Pasta and prepared marinara sauce with leftover chopped roasted or grilled chicken or garbanzo beans added to it; garden salad
- Homemade pizza: whole-grain English muffin or pizza round topped with pasta or pizza sauce or sliced tomato and shredded cheese; garden salad. *Webmd.com*

Meal Three: Potato and Chicken Soup

Take bones left from first two meal to make a substantial, thick soup. Gather the following: chicken bones, carrots, onions, celery, 5-6 potatoes, salt, pepper, green chili (if desired), can of corn (if desired), large stock pot or biggest pot you own. Put bones in the stock pot along with a carrot, celery and onions. Cover with water. Bring to a boil then simmer for about two hours. Let broth cool. Strain out veggie pieces and bones, saving the good broth. Put broth back into the pot. Add a couple of fresh carrots, celery, onion, washed and chopped potatoes, the chili and corn. Cook for about 30-45 minutes. If you like thicker soup, run half the soup through blender. For creamy soup, run whole recipe through the blender.

With participation on the Colonial Swim League (CSL) and the Old Dominion Swim League (ODSL) at record levels, the Broadlands Piranhas had another outstanding season! The Broadlands Piranhas has blossomed from 65 swimmers in 1997, to a combined team total of 202 ODSL Swimmers and 171 CSL swimmers from over 234 families.
