



The Value and Care of Trees By Oya Simpson

Master Naturalist, Wildlife Habitats Committee

I have been fascinated with mature trees and the shade they provide when sitting under one. To me sitting under a tree is calming and wondrous and creates a feeling of respect for this provider of shelter and protection. Recently I started looking into the value, impact and care of trees in our area to find out more about them. It was interesting to find out different values that trees provide for our environment, human health as well as our economy.

How can a tree be worth \$193,250? According to Professor T.M. Das of the University of Calcutta, a tree living for 50 years will generate \$31,250 worth of oxygen, provide \$62,000 worth of air pollution control, control soil erosion and increase soil fertility by \$31,250, recycle \$37,500 worth of water and provide a home for animals worth \$31,250. This figure doesn't even include the value of fruits, lumber or beauty derived from them! A very sensible reason to take care of our forests.

According to the study "Impact of Improved Landscape Quality and Tree Cover on the Price of Single-Family Homes" published by Horticulture Research Institute Journal of Environmental Horticulture, property value increased with improvements to landscaping and added tree cover. This is consistent with previous studies evaluating the impact of landscape quality and tree cover on residential property value. The studies proved that improvement in landscaping from average to excellent quality increases a house's sale price by 10.8%, with approximately **30% of the increase in sale value due to added tree cover**.

When a house is viewed as an investment, this study showed that each \$1.00 invested in upgrading an average landscape to excellent quality returns \$1.35 in added property value. It is important to note that, in addition to added value, an improved landscape provides a relaxing and enriching quality for the homeowner and the neighborhood. Moreover, tree cover is important to the homeowner because trees provide shade in summer and shelter in winter, possibly reducing heating and cooling costs.

Information for planting and caring for trees:

Plant in fall

Trees planted in the fall are better equipped to deal with heat and drought in the following season. Another great reason to plant your shrubs in the fall is because you can pick your trees and shrubs by the fall color they produce.

Pick drought tolerant trees

Prolonged periods of drought do have an impact on native plants, but they tend to be better adapted to this climate and can tolerate its extremes. Planted in appropriate habitats, many natives will thrive in our gardens without much supplemental watering. However, even the most drought tolerant plants need to get their roots established before they can stand on their own. Your plants will be well established before hot and dry conditions return if planted in fall.

Virginia trees tolerating dry condition:



What's That Tree? Winter Tree Identification

Advances in Veterinary Medicine - Breed Driven Diagnostics By: Shannon M. Pecora, MA Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

Picture a Chinese Pug. Super cute, right? That squishy little face and wrinkly skin. The tongue hanging out as he's panting. Wow, he sure is panting a lot. Gee, why does he pant so much?

Well, think about that cute, squishy face. This facial structure is what's known as brachycephalic. A short, flattened face means that the airway structure beneath is compressed and easily restricted. Therefore, heat and exercise can present a special problem for those pets who have a harder time breathing in general. And that wrinkled skin—wrinkly facial skin was bred into certain dogs to help them trap scents close to their noses better as they track and hunt prey or pests. Unfortunately, this can also trap heat and make breathing and cooling down even more difficult. By the way, those skin folds can keep dirt, bacteria, fungus, food, and other things trapped, leading to odor and infection.

This is a very small taste of one of the newer advances in veterinary care: breeddriven diagnostics. Like a family medical history helps our doctors care for us, breed genetic dispositions can help veterinarians care for our pets. Pugs are a good example of genetic dispositions that you can see. Another example is dachshunds. Visualize that long back and those short, stubby legs. You may be able to guess that it could be relatively easy for a dachshund to injure his back, so you'd want to take special care not to rough-house or attempt complex agility maneuvers with this type of dog. But did you know that such small-breed dogs carry the genetic potential for certain cardiac issues? Just by looking at your pet, you would never know, but these and other traits are what veterinary professionals are learning about and tailoring medicine to every day.

Breed-driven diagnostics are the result of a long history of veterinary research and trend-tracking. Armed with this knowledge, we're developing better preventive care standards across the industry and more specifically driving diagnostics (as the term suggests) when illnesses present themselves. For instance, an unexplained cough might not be a mysterious respiratory illness. Coughing can actually be a sign of cardiac disease, and for a breed with this genetic risk, we may adjust our diagnostic plan to help identify the problem.

Particularly if you've adopted or rescued your pet, you don't really have access to a full medical "family" history. You may be aware that your own Great Aunt Agnes, your cousin Bob, and your sister Jenny are Type 1 diabetics, and your doctor appreciates keeping this valuable information in your records. But you probably know next to nothing about your cat's Great Aunt Fluffy, cousin Muffin, or sister Socks. That's where breed-driven diagnostics come in. We know what the "family" of Rottweilers, Persians, or German Shepherds can carry as genetic risks, so we can watch out for certain developments throughout their lives. So, even though our pets can't talk to us or respond to all of our questions themselves, at least we can look to their genetic histories for potential answers!

Late Fall in the Garden By: Jill Johnson, Loudoun County Master Gardener



Late fall brings opportunities for planting as well as time to get your garden ready for winter. October is still a good month for planting fall bloomers like asters, ornamental cabbage, kale and a great time to plant trees and shrubs. Consider planting a native bird-attracting shrub or tree such as serviceberry, inkberry holly or a viburnum. If you have a sunny windowsill, pot up herbs like chives, oregano and rosemary to spice up autumn soups and stews.

It's hard to believe but the average first frost date in Loudoun County is October 15! That means it's time to move any houseplants that spent the summer in the sun indoors. Repot them (outside) if they have outgrown their homes, check for insects, and give them a good shower (again outdoors) before moving them back inside. It is also time to dig up tender bulbs that you want to save such as dahlias, cannas, and caladiums. Wait until their leaves have yellowed, then cut them back to about 6 inches and dig carefully. Rinse with water to remove dirt, allow them to air dry and then store in a cool, dry spot.

The first hard frost turns many annuals to mush, and with that the garden clean-up begins in earnest. If your peonies or other plants like roses and bee balm suffered from powdery mildew this summer, be meticulous about cleaning up the debris after you have cut back the foliage. Don't leave any plant matter on the ground and do not compost.

Leave the dried flowers of sedum, coneflower, ornamental grasses, rudbeckia and other perennials in place for the birds and finish cleanup of those next spring. The dried seed heads also provide nice winter interest in the garden.

The holidays will be here before you know it, so mark your calendar for the November 7th free gardening lecture at 7:00pm at the Rust Library in Leesburg. Kim Wright, a teacher at Northern Virginia Community College, a floral designer and a Master Gardener will demonstrate how to create holiday flower arrangements.
