Thirty-two Cities and Counting By: Shannon M. Pecora, MA Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

Earlier this year, San Diego became the thirty-second U.S. city to ban retail sale of pets from "puppy mills" or irresponsible breeders, http://www.allpetnews.com/sandiego-bans-sale-of-puppy-mill-pets. San Diego pet stores have just about two more months to comply as the law goes into effect. While this is an event to be celebrated, it should also provoke thought. For example, many of the new pets we see in our office come to their families from pet stores or breeders. We and their families truly love and care for them, just as they deserve. Why, then, are we such advocates for pet rescue and adoption?

Rescued pet stories tend to tug on those old heartstrings. We pull for the underdog (note: the term is "under**dog**"). An animal who has been homeless, abused, neglected, or unloved finds a caring and devoted new owner. It's a story that easily puts a smile on your face. Or, consider the family who is hit with an unexpected move or financial hardship. They may not want to give up a beloved pet, but they just don't have a choice. We may not even know these people, but we can invoke their anxiety, and we can feel an equal sense of relief if that pet happily finds a new home. It is only natural to be pleased when the unfortunate are met with good fortune. Often this is exactly the case when a pet is rescued or adopted.

From a more objective point of view, adoption quite simply saves lives. Too frequently, pure-bred pets are purchased on a whim, in emulation of a celebrity, or as a method to gain status by folks who are unprepared for the responsibilities, training, veterinary care, and other expenses. When the charm has worn off and reality sets in, these pets are surrendered to shelters if they are lucky. To "no-kill" shelters, but only if they're luckier. "No-kill" shelters are not as prevalent as you may think. Therefore, rescue can save a pet's life figuratively by offering a true home in place of the shelter setting and literally by preventing euthanasia when the shelter becomes overcrowded or the pet's "time is up". Shelter staffers and rescue group volunteers deeply care for the pets in their charge, but there is no substitute for a permanent family and home.

Depending on the size of the shelter or rescue group, there could be dozens of dogs, cats, and exotic or pocket pets available for adoption in just one location. If several adolescent or adult pets need homes, why add infants and juveniles to that population unnecessarily? The goal of "puppy mill" type breeders is to add as many pets as possible to the retail market to increase their profits. Of course, not all breeders are like this. Many are responsible and reputable, and they genuinely care for the pets that they breed. So you've got to research and check references. Visit the breeder's facility to get a first-hand look. Then, if your family is really ready to add a pet to your lives, be sure to weigh all of your options...is pet rescue or adoption the right choice for you?

Going Native! By: Alexandra VIk, Broadlands ANS Naturalist

For many of us, gardening brings a sense of satisfaction, it allows us to beautify our homes and communities, it's a great outlet for creativity, and you get to be outdoors. But in this day and age, gardening is much more than that, it is a chance for us to make a difference in the world, the nation's wildlife is literally in our hands.

Every day we threaten our wildlife with uncontrollable expansion. We have come to a mentality where if we need something we will get it without any questions or compromises. If we need more roads, we make them, if we need space for a new mini-mansion, we take it, if we need room for some more suburbs, we have no problem plowing land without any doubt. Unfortunately for the wildlife, it comes down along with constant growing. We always assume that the wildlife or nature has somewhere else to go, and until recently it did. We have constantly been thinking that there is undisturbed habitat out there, we may not be able to see it. but it is out there. No matter how many roads we build and subdivisions we make, there is always plenty of undisturbed space left. The nation is so big, how can there not be enough land for all the wildlife? Approximately 83% of people live in cities or suburbs (U.S. Census Bureau 2005), 69 million acres to urban and suburban landscapes (Grey &Deneke 1986). This being said, the landscape and gardens we create are some of the only spaces in our country left for wildlife to live.

If we continue to take away the food and space from the wildlife, the plants and creatures we enjoy most in life will sadly not be here in the future. On top of all the expansion our nation goes through, our gardens, the one place we can restore natural habitats for wildlife are being replaced with alien plant species, which our native species cannot eat. Unless we restore the native plants to our suburban ecosystems, the future of biodiversity



in the U.S. is dim.

Many non-environmentalist ask why preserving biodiversity, plants and animals is necessary? Look at New York City, people live there successfully and it is completely devoid of wildlife. The truth is, the only reason New York has not crumbled yet is the fact that every natural resource required to keep it afloat comes from ecosystems that have not yet collapsed (outside of the city). To simplify biodiversity, we can compare it to the game Jenga. We can never be certain whether a particular block is holding up the tower or if it can be removed safely without harm. Eventually, if you remove enough of these blocks, everything collapses. Whether you like it or not, plants and animals are not optional on this planet. We cannot live without them. Plants are what produce our oxygen for breathing, the only thing constant in our lives which can be taken away from us if we keep going on the fast track of expanding and introducing alien species.

Luckily, it is easy to create and restore a biodiverse habitat right in your own backyard! Way back in the day, Europeans started bringing over exotic

plants from other continents, it was a sign of wealth and high status. Unfortunately, our native insects cannot survive on these alien species. A garden without insects may sound amazing, but so many animals depend directly or indirectly on the protein that comes from insects. A land without insects is a land without most forms of higher life. As the ecologist E.O Wilson in 1987 said "they are the little things that run the world". Many insects cannot use alien plants for growth and reproduction for three reasons: 1. Most alien plants are unpalatable to insects and 2. Evolution works very slowly, it takes a long time for an insect to adapt to a certain chemical mix of a plant and 3.90% of insects evolved with only a few plant lineages.

If helping wildlife isn't reason enough to go native in your garden, then go for the fact that it is just easier! Everyone loves easy. Alien species demand high care, after all they are on unfamiliar ground. Native species are a synch to care for, before we ever came along they were growing perfectly fine without us. Do your research and go native in your garden!

The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling "Your Kitty's Got Bad Kidneys"

Shadow, the 16 year old grey cat, wasn't doing well. She seemed weak all the time, rarely hungry, yet was constantly at her water bowl. By the time I saw her, she was so dehydrated that it took 3 days of hospitalization and IV fluids to restore her to a state of normal hydration. I diagnosed her with chronic renal failure (CRF), and though she wasn't cured, she was doing better, and had a good quality of life.

CRF is a common problem in all cat breeds. The digestion of food produces waste products, which are carried by the blood to the kidneys to be filtered and excreted in the form of urine. When the kidneys fail, they are no longer able to remove these waste products, and toxins build up in the blood producing clinical signs of kidney disease (excessive drinking and urinating, sometimes noted by more frequent trips to the litter box, lethargy, vomiting, halitosis, poor appetite, and weight loss).

CRF can be caused by several different conditions, such as:

- **Toxins**
- Poor blood flow and/or lack of oxygen (ischemia)
- Inflammatory disease
- Infections
- Cancer
- Immune system abnormalities

Diagnostic tests are needed to recognize CRF and exclude other diseases. These tests may include blood tests such as a biochemistry analysis and a complete blood count (CBC), a urinalysis, and abdominal x-rays. Although there is no cure, early detection and treatment can slow the progression of the disease.

Treatments may include:

- Fluid therapy for dehydrated pets
- Management of blood abnormalities such as elevated or decreased potassium levels.
- Dietary therapy with protein and phosphorous restriction
- Free access to filtered water
- Control of vomiting with diet and drug therapy
- Management of anemia (as CRF can cause there to be a shortage of red blood cells)

Shadow may not have been "fixed", but with the care that she received, she felt better, and will hopefully continue to have a good life for months or even years to come. If you suspect that your feline friend may have CRF, call your veterinarian right away.

The Mulch at the Top of the Heap By Jill Johnson, Loudoun County Master Gardener

I'm not fond of raking and I hate the sound of leaf blowers, but I welcome falling leaves in my yard as autumn's gift to the garden, specifically to the garden's soil in the form of leaf mulch/leaf mold. I live in the woods, and the leaves fall where they may. Some are shredded for the compost pile; others are piled up and in time, will turn into leaf mold. In neighborhoods throughout Loudoun County, instead of filling up the landfill, recycled leaves are turned into garden gold at Loudoun Composting, one of Virginia's largest yard-debris composting facilities in Virginia. Leaves from Loudoun and Fairfax Counties are composted there and become Karbon ® leaf mulch which can be purchased and delivered through a number of local vendors including Abernethy and Spencer, Hamilton Milling, Merrifield Garden Center, and Virginia Ground Cover.

Many gardeners prefer leaf mulch over the traditional wood variety not only aesthetically, but because of its many benefits. Leaf mulch is very dark in color and can be used year round to beautify and nourish the soil. It decomposes more quickly than wood mulch but is more useful as a soil amendment than the wood kind. Composted leaf mulch absorbs up to five times its weight in water, keeping plants moist in times of drought. Added to our clay soil, it makes the soil more friable and provides great habitat for worms and beneficial fungi. In a flower garden where you want to encourage reseeding, leaf mulch provides just the right environment for seeds to settle and germinate. Wood mulch does not.



Fallen leaves on the lawn can be mowed in place and left there. This is best done with a mulching mower, and according to Virginia Tech turf experts, chopping up deciduous leaves is an effective means of leaf management that does not harm turf.

Pumpkin Pancakes

2 cups all-purpose flour

2 tablespoons brown sugar

4 teaspoons baking powder

1 teaspoon cinnamon

1 teaspoon salt

2 cups low fat milk

1 cup pumpkin puree

1/4 cup melted butter

4 eggs (separated)

Mix dry ingredients together in a bowl. In a separate bowl, whisk together milk, pumpkin, melted butter, and eggs. Fold mixture into dry ingredients. Grease skillet and heat over medium heat: pour in 1/4 cup batter for each pancake. Cook pancakes about 3 minutes per side. Serve with butter and syrup. Yields: 10-12 pancakes Natalie Ihanainen

Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Muffins

4 eggs

2 cups sugar

1(16 oz.) can of pumpkin

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 1/4 cups vegetable oil

3 cups all-purpose flour

2 teaspoon baking soda

2 teaspoon baking powder

2 teaspoon cinnamon

1 teaspoon salt

12 oz. semi-sweet chocolate chips (the mini chips work best)

In a large mixing bowl beat the eggs, sugar, pumpkin, vanilla and oil until smooth. Mix the dry ingredients together in a separate bowl and add to pumpkin mixture. Fold in the Chocolate chips. Fill greased muffin cups 3/4 full. Bake at 400 F for 15-20 minutes. If you use convection oven cook at 375 F for 12-17 minutes. Yields: 30 muffins What's cooking?

Pumpkin Walnut Stuffing

6 cups cubed pumpkin bread

1 cup chopped celery

3/4 cup chopped walnuts

1 cup butter or 1 cup margarine

2 cups chopped red onions

2 tablespoons chopped fresh rosemary

2 tablespoons chopped fresh tarragon

2 tablespoons chopped fresh chives

2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley

1 1/2 teaspoons salt

1 teaspoon ground black pepper

6 tablespoons chicken broth

Spread bread cubes on a baking sheet, and let dry overnight. Alternatively, heat in a 250 degree oven until dry, about 1 hour. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Butter a 2 quart baking dish. Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Sauté celery and onions for about 10 minutes. Add walnuts, and continue cooking for about 8 minutes,

or until tender. Season with rosemary, tarragon, chives, parsley, salt and pepper. Fold in bread cubes, and add enough broth to moisten. Transfer to prepared dish and cover with foil. Bake in preheated oven for 40 minutes. Remove cover, and bake for 10 minutes, or until top is crisp. Serves: 8 Food.com

Pumpkin Soup

1 large onion, chopped fine

1 stick butter

6 slices of cooked chopped bacon

3 to 4 cups canned pumpkin puree (not pumpkin pie mix kind).

1 1/2 Tablespoons minced garlic

5 or 6 fresh carrots (chopped)

4 cups chicken broth or stock

1 cup chopped celery

1 pint half-and-half

1 teaspoon thyme

4 tablespoons chopped parsley

1 teaspoon onion salt

1 teaspoon cumin

1 tablespoon cracked black pepper

1/4 teaspoon cinnamon (optional)

salt to taste

1/3 cup sliced green onions

1/2 cup heavy cream

Sour cream and roasted pumpkin seeds as a garnish



In large soup pot, saute onions, garlic, celery in butter until tender. Add stock, pumpkin and carrots and bring to a boil. Lower heat and cook until carrots are tender, about 20 minutes. Puree soup in small batches in blender or food processor until smooth. Return to pot and add thyme, cumin, parsley, and cracked pepper and bring to another boil. Turn heat to low, stir in half and half, green onions, bacon and season with salt. Cook on low heat for another 10 to 15 minutes. Stir in heavy cream. Spoon into individual soup bowls. Dealing With Graffiti at Home and in the Community

We've had several incidents of graffiti in the neighborhood recently. The association monitors and immediately removes graffiti from common areas and encourages you to do the same with your property. The association recommends these steps for dealing with graffiti:

- If you happen to see someone defacing property, don't try to stop it yourself. Call the police immediately and report a vandalism in progress. Make a mental note of as many details as possible about the perpetrators how many, what age, male or female, distinctive clothing—that will help police.
- Encourage your neighbors to do the same-watch for and report graffiti vandals.
- · When graffiti appears on your property, photograph it before removing it. Record when and where

it appeared, when it was removed, the cost and other relevant information. Share your documentation with the police and insurance agent.

- · Remove graffiti immediately. "Taggers" gain more notoriety the longer the graffiti remains. Removing it quickly sends a message that you care about our community.
- · Install good lighting in areas vulnerable to graffiti.
- Plant shrubs or climbing vines in graffiti-prone areas. Or, replace walls with hedges.
- In problem areas where graffiti reappears regularly, try applying a layer of clear paint or silicone coating over painted surfaces. This will make cleaning future graffiti much easier.

Working together, we can reduce this problem in our community.





Tracking Down Air Leaks

Air leaks are one of the biggest saboteurs of your energy bill. They cause your heating and air conditioning units to work overtime. But, you can increase the efficient use of energy by tracking down and eliminating sources of air leaks in your home.

How to Check for Indoor Air Leaks

Close your unit as tightly as possible—shutting doors, windows, flues, anything that vents to the outside. (Leave inside doors open.) Turn on the exhaust fans in the kitchen and bathrooms. This pulls air out of the house or unit and draws outside air in through the leaks. A common way to identify air movements is to hold a lighted incense stick near a suspect area. The smallest movement of air will cause the smoke to move. Another method is to simply hold your damp hand near potential leak sites. Air movement will feel cool.

Where to Check for Air Leaks

Any place one surface joins another (even if it appears closed) is a potential place for air to move in or out of your home—for example, where floor and walls come together, such as around baseboards or carpet edges.

Small spaces don't allow much air leakage individually, but collectively they can eat up a significant amount of energy. Check all spaces where any type of opening exists such as electrical outlets and switch plates, fireplace dampers, around pipes, attic hatches, mounted air conditioners and mail slots.

Also, be sure to check caulked edges. Don't assume they're still air tight. Caulk dries over time and shrinks. Another application might be needed.

Doors and windows are in a category of their own. If they rattle or if you can see daylight around them, they leak. Fortunately, they're easy to fix with caulking or weather stripping.

Making the Fix

Weather stripping is the simplest and least expensive means to eliminate air leaks around doors. Foam insulation is a variation on caulking that is available as an aerosol spray. It's well suited for filling large gaps like the holes where pipes or wires enter your home. (Use with caution, however; it expands significantly and can be unsightly if overdone.) For just about everything else, standard caulking is all you need. Once the job is done, test again to make sure you stopped the leak completely.

Saving for the Holidays

In these tough economic times, many of us are trying to stretch our dollars and keep our debt as low as possible. The following tips from the National Foundation for Credit Counseling (NFCC), offer easy ways to save:

- Empty the change in your pocket into a jar each night. Pocket change can add up to between \$30 and \$50 a month.
- Cut \$5 a day out of your incidental spending. Mindless spending and impulse shopping take a bigger chunk out of your spending than you might care to admit.
- Resolve to carve \$10 a month from each of five discretionary spending categories.

For example:

Food: plan meals in advance and never grocery shop on the run.

Eating out: order water to drink when dining at a restaurant.

Utilities: lower the thermostat at home.


Shopping: stay out of malls, and shop only when an item is needed.

Medical: sign up for one of the discount plans on prescriptions currently being offered by many national drug chains.

- Kick your bad habits. Buying a boutique cup of coffee and/or a lottery ticket each day can add up quickly.
- Eliminate bank fees. Bank with an institution that has ATMs near where you live and work, eliminating any fees assessed by using a machine outside of your network. Don't pay for your checking account when many banks offer free checking with few strings attached. Never overdraw your account.
- Get an insurance check-up. You don't want to be overinsured or underinsured, but if you can handle raising your deductible, it will save you money each month.
- Don't have too much of a good thing. Examine your cell phone package. Are the minutes right for your calling patterns? Look at your cable plan. Are you paying for channels you never watch? Switching to a plan that is right for you yields big savings.
- Stop charging and pay with cash. Studies show that people who pay for their purchases with cash typically save about 20 percent. Therefore, if you put \$1,000 onto a charge card each month, you stand to save big bucks.
