People or live animals are not allowed as part of the display. Participants are requested to keep their houses decorated through January 1st so that the community may view and enjoy them. Judging will take place the week of December 8th from dusk until 9:00pm. Please have your decorations turned on by 5:00pm. Judges' decisions are final.

Save Yourself Time, Money and Aggravation

Before you make any modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the owner's responsibility to file an application for all exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this requirement. The process is easy if you apply before work commences.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee of up to \$900. which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made. You may be taken to General District Court for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which you provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines on the website for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in order to obtain approval prior to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions. November Covenants Corner

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors inspect the homes in the community for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in view to parking issues and unapproved modifications to leftover holiday decor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular violations that occur with high frequency.

During the month of November, the Inspectors will be focusing on homes with trash and recycling bins left out in public view on non-collection days. Article 8, Section 8.2 (i) of the Declaration states that trash containers shall not be permitted to remain in public view from the Common Area or another Lot Except on days of trash collection.

Containers are not permitted to be stored on the driveway, in front of the garage, or on the side of the house, unless approved screening has been applied for and installed per the Design Guidelines. Containers may be put out the day before pickup and should be put out of view by the end of the day of pickup.

If a violation is noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing ten days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional seven day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, Hearing Notice is sent and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$50 per occurrence. Repeat offenders may be assessed \$50 per date that the containers are left in view.

If you have questions regarding this process, or if you receive one of these letters and are unable to correct in the time allotted, you may contact the covenants inspectors at covenants@broadlandshoa.com to request a reasonable extension to rectify the issue.

Light the Way

As autumn approaches and the days get shorter it is more important than ever to keep your exterior pole light functioning both for security and safety purposes. Additionally, maintaining pole lights are part of the Broadlands Covenants.

Keeping these lights functional is the responsibility of the homeowner whether you own a single family, semi-attached or a town home. Should replacing the light bulb not resolve the problem, you may have a tripped circuit breaker in your home or you may need to replace the photoelectric cell. You may want to contact an electrician to repair the light pole issue.

Please keep your pole lights operational to help keep your home and neighborhood safe.

Road Improvements Update

I was very excited to break ground on the extension of Gloucester Parkway earlier this fall. This connection between Loudoun County Parkway and Nokes Boulevard will provide an alternative to Waxpool Road to connect from the Ashburn area to Route 28. Traffic studies anticipate that approximately one-third of the current traffic utilizing Waxpool Road will instead use Gloucester Parkway when it opens in 2016. This project has been a top priority for the Board of Supervisors and I want to thank my colleagues for agreeing to fund this critical \$40 million project.

As Loudoun has grown over the past twenty years, residential development has far outpaced the needed supporting infrastructure. To address this issue, the Board has worked to slow new residential development so we can 'catch up.' Additionally, the Board has engaged in an aggressive Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to address our community's critical infrastructure needs, including transportation. The Board has identified key bottlenecks and roadway missing linksand has





prioritized and funded a plan to address these issues.

The Board has invested over \$700 million for transportation in the CIP over the next six years. This includes large projects like the Metrorail Silver Line and Gloucester Parkway, but also smaller projects like purchasing additional transit buses. In the greater Ashburn area, there are a number of transportation projects that are either planned in the near future or already underway.

Notable projects include:

- Belmont Ridge Road widening to four lanes
- Route 28 widening to eight lanes south of Waxpool Road
- Waxpool Road intersection and traffic flow improvements
- Prentice Drive/Sterling Boulevard Extension – another connection to Route

28 between the Greenway and Waxpool Road

- Loudoun County Parkway connection to Route 606
- Farmwell Road widening to six lanes between Ashburn Road and Smith Switch Road
- Claiborne Parkway connection between Croson Lane and Ryan Road

The new interactive map at loudoun. gov/underconstruction is designed to keep Loudoun County citizens updated on the status of the county's capital infrastructure projects. The map allows users of the county website to check on the progress of a wide range of capital projects, including active projects in the county's CIP as well as planned projects. 


Partlow Property Development Developer proposes small townhome development on the Partlow property located on Shellhorn Road.

The subject property is an older home on 4.9 acres located at 21558 Shellhorn Road. The current zoning is R1 and the applicant proposes rezoning the property to R8 to permit the development of eleven (11) single-family attached homes. The development of the property will be an extension of the Ashburn Knolls community which was already approved for attached homes. Please see the map below and on page 11.

- The density of 2.24 dwelling units per acre is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan
- Only 1.8 acres or 37% of the 4.90 acre site area will be developed
- Over 3 acres of the site will be located in permanent open space
- Similar to Ashburn Knolls, the Applicant seeks a modified setback of 50 feet from Shellhorn Road but will add additional canopy and evergreen trees, a 10' wide asphalt trail and an 6' earthen berm
- Proposed lot and infrastructure configuration has been designed as a continuation of Ashburn Knolls
- Consolidates access points along Shellhorn Road
- Applicant proposes installation of a natural surface trail within the floodplain and dedicates most of the area to Loudoun County for use by the public as a linear greenway park.

Yummy or Yikes? Emergency Contact Resources for Dietary Indiscretion By: Shannon M. Pecora, MA, Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

Quick quiz: if your pet enjoys some leftover Halloween candy, a slice of

Thanksgiving pumpkin pie, a scoop of holiday party garlic mashed potatoes, or a puddle of spilled New Year's champagne, should you be concerned? If you answered, "Yes!" then you get a gold star! Now, for the short answer portion of the quiz: if your pet does help him or herself to some potentially harmful holiday goodies, what should you do about it?

First, even though a dietary indiscretion, or a pet eating something that he or she shouldn't, may be a dangerous situation for your beloved pet, try to stay calm. You'll want to try to find out

what your pet ingested, how much of it your pet ingested, as well as the item's ingredients, whether store bought or homemade. You'll also want to know if your pet ate any wrapping or packaging (want a list of foods that are pet no-no's? Visit http://www.aspca. org/pet-care/animal-poison-control/ people-foods-avoid-feeding-yourpets.)

Next, call your veterinary office. They'll likely ask you to bring your pet in right away so that they can see him or her as an emergency visit. However, what do you do if this happens late at night and the vet's office isn't open? Keep in mind that the fall and winter holiday season means that the office may have adjusted or reduced hours, too. Most general practice veterinary offices are not staffed 24 hours a day, so we highly recommend keeping handy the contact information for one or more local emergency animal hospitals. For example, the closest emergency veterinary facility to our practice is Animal Emergency & Critical Care at The Life Centre in Leesburg (703-7775755, http://www.tlcvets.com/specialtypractices/emergency-care.php). If



you're traveling to a nearby relative or friend's home, you may end up near VCA South Paws Veterinary Specialists & Emergency Center in Fairfax (703-752-9100, http://www.vcaspecialtyvets. com/southpaws/more/emergencies). Pender Emergency Centre in Fairfax (703-591-3304, http://www.pendervet. com/pender-emergency-centre.html), or the Regional Veterinary Referral Center in Springfield (703-451-8900, http:// www.vetreferralcenter.com/emergencycritical-care.htm). If you're traveling elsewhere make sure you bring the proper health certificate paperwork with you and do a quick online search for the nearest animal emergency provider before you head out. Have an updated copy of your pet's vaccine and preventive history with you, just in case. If your regular veterinarian offers a free service such as Pet Portals (https:// www.vetsecure.com/streamvalleyvet/ login), you can conveniently access this information from your tablet or smartphone!

Whether you head to your regular vet's office or an emergency center, you may be asked to contact a pet poison control

hotline. Sometimes, the veterinary staff will ask that you contact poison

control while you are en route to the office; in this case, it helps if you have one person drive and have another person make the phone call and keep an eve on the pet during the car ride. Other times, the staff will ask that you contact poison control while in the office, or they may offer to call for you. In any case, in addition to details about the ingested item, poison control will want to know your pet's age, breed, and weight. They should be able to give you a case number for reference and, of course, instructions for treatment. If you make the call on your own, have a credit card

ready for the consult fee; if your veterinary staff calls, you'll probably see that consult fee on your invoice.

- Pet Poison Helpline (800) 213-6680, http://www. petpoisonhelpline.com/

Dietary indiscretion is a hazard and a hassle, so do what you can to prevent it! Keep pets away from food preparation and dining. Give them appropriate treats and toys to keep them busy if you'd like them to be included in the festivities.

But if your pets do happen to get into that "people food," at least having pet emergency contact information available can help you feel prepared!

Cleaning the Air with Indoor Plants By Jill Johnson, Virginia Cooperative Extension Master Gardener, Loudoun County

Air pollution doesn't just occur outdoors: the air inside our homes and offices is also unclean, especially now, when the heat is on, and windows and doors are shut tight against the cold.The good news is that research has shown that having an abundance of houseplants will help mitigate indoor pollution and add beauty and a touch of nature to your home.

There are three main household pollutants of concern: benzene, formaldehyde and trichloroethylene, carcinogenic chemicals that are used in the manufacture of synthetic materials. These are present in our homes and offices because they are outgassed from new furnishings, carpeting, office equipment and some building materials.

A 1989 study conducted by NASA and the Associated Landscape Contractors of America found that certain houseplants could be used to effectively filter these toxins from the closed air inside spacecraft. The study found that certain houseplants removed as much as 87 percent of indoor pollutants within 24 hours. Houseplants clean the air by absorbing pollutants into their leaves. The toxins then travel to the root zone where the plant converts them into nutrients.

Here are a few houseplants found by NASA to be superior in cleaning up indoor air:

Peace lily (Spathiphyllum sp.) This plant was the top performer in NASA's study and is also an outstanding easy-care foliage plant that produces beautiful white flowers (spathes). It does well in bright, indirect light. It removes all three chemicals mentioned, as well as acetone and alcohols, and is said to remove mold spores as well, making it a good choice for bathrooms, kitchens and laundry rooms.

Spider Plant (Chlorophytum comosum) – NASA places this plant among the top three houseplants that are great at removing formaldehyde and benzene. It also removes carbon monoxide and is easy care with lots of rich foliage and tiny white flowers.

Snake Plant (Sansevieria trifasciata) also called Mother In-law's tongue. This plant is one of the best for filtering formaldehyde, which is common in cleaning products, toilet paper, tissues and personal care products. It will thrive with low light and humidity and would be a good choice in a bathroom. It also tolerates irregular watering.

To use houseplants most effectively, place them within your personal breathing zone, which is the six to eight cubic foot area where you spend the most time in your bedroom, living room, kitchen, etc. The more houseplants you have, the cleaner your air will be.

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

Warm Up Your Thanksgiving Holiday With These Delicious Pies

Chocolate-Chunk Pecan Pie

- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour, plus more for parchment paper
- Salt
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter, cold and cut into small pieces
- 1 stick unsalted butter, melted
- 3 large eggs
- 1 large egg white, lightly beaten
- 1 1/3 cups (about 6 ounces) chopped pecans
- 4 ounces bittersweet chocolate, chopped into 1/4-inch chunks
- 1 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup dark corn syrup
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

In a medium bowl, combine flour and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Using your fingertips, quickly blend in shortening and cold butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs with butter lumps. Sprinkle 1/4 cup ice-cold water over mixture and mix gently until dough begins to come together. (If dough is too dry, add up to 3 more tablespoons water, a tablespoon at a time.) Pat dough into a disk, wrap tightly with plastic wrap, and refrigerate until chilled, 2 hours or up to 2 days. Roll out dough between 2 sheets of lightly floured parchment paper to an 11inch circle. Fit dough into a 9-inch pie plate and trim edge to create 1/2-inch overhang. Tuck overhang under to form a border around rim. Using your fingers, crimp around the edges. Brush dough with egg white and chill in freezer for 20 to 30 minutes. Preheat oven to 350 degrees with a rack positioned in middle. In a small bowl, toss together pecans and chocolate. In a medium bowl, whisk together sugar and eggs. Whisk in melted butter, corn syrup, vanilla, and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Place chilled piecrust on a baking pan. Spread half the chocolate-pecan mixture in piecrust, pour in half the filling, then repeat. Bake pie until filling sets and top has browned, about 1 hour. Transfer to a wire rack to cool. (The pie can be covered with plastic wrap and refrigerated up to 3 days.) Yields: 8 slices CountryLiving.com


Cheddar Apple Pie

- 2 3/4 cups all-purpose flour, plus more for work surface
- 1/2 cup sugar, plus 2 tablespoons
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- ♦ 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 8 ounces (about 2 cups) sharp Cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1 1/2 sticks butter, cold and cut into small pieces
- 1 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 4 Granny Smith apples, peeled, cored, and thinly sliced
- 1 large egg, beaten with 1 tablespoon water

In a food processor, pulse 2 1/2 cups flour, 2 tablespoons sugar, and salt to combine. Add cheese and pulse to coat. Add butter and pulse until the mixture resembles coarse meal. Add 1/3 to 1/2 cup cold water, 1 tablespoon at a time, until dough begins to come together. Transfer dough to a floured surface and knead a couple times. Divide dough and pat into 2 disks. Wrap each disk tightly with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 1 hour. Roll out each dough disk between 2 sheets of parchment paper to 1/8-inch thickness. Transfer one rolled-out disk to a 9-inch pie plate; lightly press against plate, pierce with a fork all over, and refrigerate. Meanwhile, transfer the second rolled-out disk to a floured surface. Using a 1/2-inch square cookie cutter, cut out a lattice as shown, and leaving a 1/2-inch border. Transfer to a baking sheet and refrigerate for 1 hour. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Meanwhile, cover the pie plate of prepared dough with foil, leaving a bit of overhang, and add pie weights or dried beans for weights. Bake for 15 minutes, then remove the foil and weights, and bake about 5 more minutes. Transfer to a wire rack to cool. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, combine cinnamon and remaining flour and sugar; add apples and toss to coat. Transfer to prepared pie plate, and then top with reserved lattice. Crimp edges to seal, and brush the top with egg wash. Place the pie plate on a baking sheet and bake on the middle rack until golden, 50 to 60 minutes. Cover edge of crust with foil if it browns too guickly. Let pie cool for at least 2 hours before serving. Yields: 8 slices CountryLiving.com

Tracking Down Air Leaks

Air leaks are one of the biggest saboteurs of your energy bill. They cause your heating and air conditioning units to work overtime. But you can increase the efficient use of energy by tracking down and eliminating sources of air leaks in your home.

How to Check for Indoor Air Leaks Close your unit as tightly as possibleshutting doors, windows, flues, anything that vents to the outside. (Leave inside doors open.) Turn on, the exhaust fans in the kitchen and bathrooms. This pulls air out of the house or unit and draws outside air in through the leaks. A common way to identify air movements is to hold a lighted incense stick near a suspect area. The smallest movement of air will cause the smoke to move. Another method is to simply hold your damp hand near potential leak sites. Air movement will feel cool.

Where to Check for Air Leaks

Any place one surface joins another (even if it appears closed) is a potential place for air to move in or out of your home—for example, where floor and walls come together, such as around baseboards or carpet edges.


> Small spaces don't allow much air leakage in dividually, but collectively they can eat up a significant amount of energy. Check all spaces where any type of opening exists such as electrical

outlets and switch plates, fireplace dampers, around pipes, attic hatches, mounted air conditioners and mail slots.

Also, be sure to check caulked edges. Don't assume they're still airtight. Caulk dries over time and shrinks. Another application might be needed. Doors and windows are in a category of their own. If they rattle or if you can see daylight around them, they leak. Fortunately, they're easy to fix with caulking or weather stripping.

Making the Fix

Weather stripping is the simplest and least expensive means to eliminate air leaks around doors. Foam insulation is a variation on caulking that is available as an aerosol spray. It's well suited for filling large gaps like the holes where pipes or wires enter your home. (Use with caution, however; it expands significantly and can be unsightly if overdone.) For just about everything else, standard caulking is all you need. Once the job is done, test again to make sure you stopped the leak completely.
