

SAVE YOURSELF TIME, MONEY AND AGGRAVATION

Before you make any modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the owner's responsibility to file an application for all exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this requirement. The process is easy if you apply before work commences.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee of up to \$900, which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made. You may be taken to General District Court for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which you provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines on the website for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in order to obtain approval prior to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions. COVENANTS CORNER

Light the Night

During the month of November, the covenants inspectors will to focus on homes whose pole lights in their front yards are burned out. As winter rapidly approaches and the days get shorter, it is more important than ever to keep your exterior pole light functioning both for security and safety purposes.

In accordance with the Association Documents, should you fail to bring your lot into compliance, the Board of Directors may take action to enforce compliance. If a violation is noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing thirty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fourteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, Hearing Notice is sent and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$10 per day for a maximum of 90 days.

Keeping these lights functional is the responsibility of the homeowner whether you own a single family, semi-attached or a town home. Should replacing the light bulb not resolve the problem, you may have a tripped circuit breaker in your home or you may need to replace the photoelectric cell. An electrician can help you. The HOA does not provide this service.

Keep your pole lights operational and keep your home and neighborhood safe.

If you have questions regarding this process, or if you receive one of these letters and are unable to correct in the time allotted, you may contact the covenants inspectors at covenants@broadlandshoa.com to request a reasonable extension to rectify the issue.

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors inspect the homes in the community for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in view to parking issues and unapproved modifications to leftover holiday decor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular violations that occur with high frequency.

NEED A MORE SECURE RECYCLING BIN?

Residents who currently have the smaller, open recycling bin through Patriot may swap out for the larger, lidded recycling toter at no additional cost. Please contact Patriot Disposal at 703-257-7100 to make this request. You are encouraged to keep a record of the serial number of your toter(s) should you need to identify it in the future.

Return of 'Jury Duty' Scam Leads to Warning from LCSO & Clerk of the Circuit Court

Loudoun County, VA- Recent reports of a scam often referred to as the 'jury duty' scam has the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office and the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Loudoun County issuing a warning to the community.

Several residents reported receiving a call from a person claiming to be a deputy with the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office. The caller states that a warrant has been issued for the residents arrest because they failed to report for jury duty. The caller goes on to say that they can avoid arrest by paying a fine by obtaining a money card or cards from a local store.

"The suspect's plan is to use the appearance of authority and the threats of arrest in hopes that the victim will be more willing to provide the money," said Loudoun County Sheriff Mike Chapman. "These types of scams prey on a person's fears," added Sheriff Chapman.

According to the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office and the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court, under no circumstance would a law enforcement official in Virginia be permitted to collect fines of this nature. Only the judges of the circuit court can order the payment of fines for failure to report for jury duty, but individuals would be required to attend a court hearing and explain why they neglected to report for jury duty before any fines are assessed.

"Jury service is an important civic duty and we do not want potential jurors to be intimidated or discouraged to serve as jurors by virtue of individuals who use these deceitful tactics to extort money from unsuspecting citizens," said Gary M. Clemens, Loudoun Clerk of the Circuit Court.

If you are a resident of Loudoun County and believe you were a victim of this scam or of a similar scam, please contact the Loudoun County Sheriff's office at 703-777-1021 or file a report online at http://sheriff.loudoun.gov/reportonline. Scams are occurring with great frequency and take various forms. Please visit the website http://www.lookstoogoodtobetrue.com/ for further information on the variety of consumer scams that are taking place.

Excited to Build Off the Board of Supervisors' Success

On September 21st, I was appointed to represent the Broad Run District on the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors through the end of 2015. I am humbled by the trust placed in me by my fellow members of the Board and I look forward to doing my best to represent you during my time as the Broad Run District Supervisor. Prior to this appointment, I had the pleasure of serving the community as Chairman of the Loudoun County Parks, Recreation and Open Space Board and as a member of the Advisory Commission on Youth, among other volunteer opportunities in our community.

As many of you are already aware, former Broad Run District Supervisor Shawn Williams chose to resign earlier this month for personal reasons. I hope you will join me in keeping Shawn and his family in your thoughts and prayers during this difficult time and I also hope you will join me in thanking Shawn for his service and dedication to Loudoun County and the Broad Run District.

My goal during my time as Broad Run District Supervisor will be to continue to build on the great work that has been done by Shawn and this current Board of Supervisors on vital issues for our community like transportation and economic development. The County recently released a report about the work accomplished by the Board of Supervisors during the current term and it's impressive to see the progress over the past few years.

In 2012 the Board clearly defined its key priorities and goals for its term: economic development, transportation,



fiscal responsibility, high quality education, government operations and reform, and athletic field improvements. Since that time, great improvement has been made in each area, significantly increasing our quality of life here in Loudoun County. Highlights from the report include:

- Economic Development Initiation of and approval of the 'businessfriendly' zoning ordinance amendment, creating of the Business Assistance Team, approval of the fast track process for economic development projects, adoption of economic development incentive policies, and funding and the zoning ordinance amendments to expand the rural economy.
- Transportation In the current capital improvement program over \$790 million is programmed for transportation projects that will relieve congestion, including the Metrorail Silver Line which was approved in 2012. Key projects are underway in the Broad Run District including the extension of Gloucester Parkway to

Route 28, widening Route 28, the Route 7 and Ashburn Village Boulevard Interchange, Russell Branch Parkway, Claiborne Parkway and many more.

- Fiscal Responsibility Since 2012, the average homeowner's annual property tax bill has been reduced by \$235. Important fiscal reforms have been made to County benefit programs to ensure solvency for the future and to maintain Loudoun's AAA credit rating.
- High Quality Education Since 2012, funding for the Loudoun County Public Schools has increased by \$239 million, nearly 32% with 'per-pupil' expenditures rising by \$1,170, a 15.5% increase. Additionally, the Board has met all the capital funding requests from the School Board, which is already easing school overcrowding.
- Government Operations and Reform In 2012 the Board created the Government Reform Commission, which led to recommendations for modernization of elements of the County government, most notably the combined fire-rescue system. The Board implemented many recommendations; reducing costs, increasing efficiencies, identifying cost-effective and innovative ways to improve and deliver services, and saving taxpayer's money.
- Athletic Field Improvements The Board approved funding to upgrade, irrigate, and maintain County and School ballfields, which will result in greater access to these fields by children and adult leagues. This effort does not replace the need for See Supervisor Bonfils on page 17



ABOUT YOUR PET...

November No-Nos By: Shannon M. Pecora, MA of Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

There is no shortage of flyers, infographics, and listicles regarding common holiday items that could actually be very dangerous for your pets. But you know what? Spreading such information could save a pet's life, so we're happily providing yet another version of the list!

- Antifreeze has a sweet, appealing taste for pets, but ingestion can be deadly. Keep your pets out of your garage where these chemicals are stored, and clean up any driveway spills immediately.
- Ribbon, tinsel, glass ornaments, string lights, and other decor might choke, cut, or shock a curious pet. Keep such items unplugged and/or well out of your pet's reach.
- Lilies, American holly, carnations, mistletoe, and poinsettia are

among plants that can have effects ranging from mild skin/mouth irritation all the way to death from toxicity if your pet ingests them. Visit the ASPCA Pet Poison Control website for a more comprehensive list:

aspca.org/pet-care/animal-poisoncontrol/toxic-and-non-toxic-plants.

• You've likely heard that chocolate can be incredibly dangerous for

pets. The stimulants caffeine and theobromine can affect the heart and nervous system, and even the gastrointestinal upset from eating an out-of-the-ordinary food can be severe. Keep those sweet treats and their wrappers away from your pets!

• You might loose and a drink, should I ike to let unwind with but our pets n e v e r celebrate your human family, consider offering your pets appropriate pet treats so that they can safely join in the feast.

- Grapes and raisins seem like healthy snack options in the face of holiday party fare, but for reasons that are not quite clear, they can lead to kidney failure in dogs, even when very small amounts are ingested.
- Even if you're trying to be good and go sugar-free, you'll need to t a k e care around your pets.

"Diet" sweeteners, particularly xylitol, can lead to seizures, liver failure, and even death in our pets.

> This is, by no means, an all-inclusive list, but it is a great starting point as you think about creating petsafe holiday celebrations.

IN THE GARDEN...

A Sustainable Landscape: It's Easier Than you Think By Nancy Caldwell, VCE Loudoun County Master Gardener

Sustainability. It's a term we hear a lot these days, but what exactly does that mean, especially as it relates to our own lawns and gardens? And why should we care? While there's no single definition, a sustainable landscape incorporates native plants and thoughtful design and maintenance practices that support

and protect the environment. But it doesn't stop there, says Doug Tallamy, esteemed entomologist and author of "Bringing Nature Home." Sustainable landscapes also support us: by filtering our water, trapping carbon from the atmosphere, supporting food webs and pollinators, and producing oxygen.

That doesn't mean we should all be ripping out our lawns and planting prairies! Our suburban landscapes offer a great opportunity to support wildlife

and pollinators and protect the environment.

For starters, instead of eliminating the lawn entirely, think about reducing its size. Is there space for a native pollinator garden that supports bees and butterflies? How about planting native trees and shrubs that provide food and habitat for birds? A good example, says Tallamy is the humble oak, a native that supports 534 species of caterpillars, an important food source for birds. Compare that to the Asian gingko that supports just one.

Next, let's rethink the way we care for

requires less water. Instead of bagging grass clippings, use a mulching mower to recycle them back into the lawn. The clippings will break down and enrich the soil. Leaves, too, are a great soil amendment that can be mowed over and left on the lawn to decompose.



lawns. Grass blends that are adapted to this region such as tall fescues require less fertilizer, pesticides and water to maintain. Instead of resorting to chemicals to beautify the lawn, add a layer of compost each fall. It not only improves the soil, it results in a thicker lawn with fewer weeds, and Finally, take a look at water usage. Over-watered plants may grow too fast, and runoff contributes to groundwater pollution. Lawns only require 1 inch of water per week. Use a rain gauge to determine how much Mother Nature is providing, then supplement when needed. If you can live without a lush green lawn all summer, stop watering entirely and let the lawn go dormant in August. It will bounce back when cooler fall temperatures return

For ideas on how to invite nature back into your own suburban landscape check out "The Living Landscape" co-authored by Doug Tallamy and Rick Darke. If you'd like to find native plants, trees and shrubs in our area, check out the Virginia Native Plant Society website at vnps.org.

What the Kale! Try it for Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner



Kale & Cheddar Breakfast Strata

1 tablespoon butter 2 cloves garlic, thinly sliced 1 small or 1/2 large bunch kale, stems removed, leaves thinly sliced 1/2 teaspoon salt, divided 4–5 cups 1"-cubed French or Italian bread (Use slightly stale with crust) 4 ounces sharp cheddar, grated 1 ounce Parmesan or Romano cheese, grated or shaved 6 eggs 1 1/2 cups milk (low-fat or whole) 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard freshly ground black pepper

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and grease an 8" square baking dish with a little bit of butter. Heat a large skillet over medium heat. Add butter and stir in garlic once the butter melts. When garlic is sizzling and begins to turn golden, stir in kale and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Cook for a couple of minutes, stirring frequently, until kale is wilted. Turn off the heat. Spread out half the bread in the bottom of the baking dish, cover with half the kale and sprinkle half the cheeses over, then repeat with remaining bread, kale, and cheese. Beat eggs with mustard, milk, 1/4 teaspoon salt and several grinds of black pepper. Pour egg mixture over the bread in the dish. Now you can bake the strata right away or cover it with tin foil, keep in the fridge overnight and bake in the morning. Bake, uncovered, for 45-55 minutes, until the strata is cooked through and the edges pull away slightly from the pan. It should be puffy, golden-brown, and no longer wiggly in the middle. Serves: 4. ww.buzzfeed.com

Kale Salad with Sautéed Apples

1 large bunch kale, any kind, cut into thin ribbons zest of 1 lemon
2 tablespoons lemon juice
1 clove garlic, smashed and minced sea salt to taste
3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil, plus more for cooking
1 shallot, peeled and sliced
4 crisp apples, cored and cut into 1/2 inch slices
1/2 cup raw, hulled pumpkin seeds

Prep the kale, set in a large bowl, and toss with lemon zest. To make the vinaigrette, use a fork to whisk the garlic into the lemon juice. Add a generous pinch of sea salt. Drizzle in 3 tablespoons olive oil, whisking until emulsified. Drizzle half the dressing over the kale leaves and massage with fingers. Set aside while you prep the toppings. Set a large cast iron skillet over medium-high heat. Add a drizzle of olive oil and the shallots. Sauté, stirring occasionally, until shallots have browned for about 10 minutes. Meanwhile, slice apples, toss in the skillet, and cook just until apples are warm and have lost their bite, 5 - 7minutes. Remove shallots and apples from heat, add another drizzle of oil, and toast the pumpkin seeds, cooking just until they pop, about 1 – 2 minutes. Toss warm pumpkin seeds with sea salt. Fold the warm apples, shallots, and pumpkin seeds into the prepared kale leaves. Serve immediately, or cover and refrigerate for up to a day. Serves: 4. www.brooklynsupper.net

Tuscan Kale and Veggie Stew

1 onion 2 carrots 1 tomato 1 zucchini 4 garlic cloves 1 bunch kale 1 handful parsley 2 tablespoons olive oil A pinch dried chili flakes 10 sage leaves 15 ounce can cannellini beans 1 quart vegetable stock salt and fresh ground pepper Multi or Wholegrain sourdough bread Parmesan cheese

Dice the onion, carrot, tomato, and zucchini. Mince 4 garlic cloves. Remove the stems from the kale, and then roughly chop the leaves. Remove the leaves from the parsley. In a large saucepan or pot, heat 2 tablespoons olive oil. Add the onion garlic, carrots, chili flakes, and sage and cook over low heat for 20 minutes until softened but not browned. Add the parsley, tomato, and zucchini and cook for a few minutes. Add the kale and beans and cover with vegetable stock. Bring to a boil, reduce the heat and simmer for 30 minutes. Season with kosher salt and fresh ground black pepper to taste. Chop the bread into cubes. To serve, arrange the bread cubes in the soup and add Parmesan cheese shavings and olive oil. 




