Words From Your Broadlands Naturalist, Lisa Matthews

Now is your chance to not only observe the beauty of fall color but also to catch a glimpse of one of nature's most amazing events. It is time for many animals to make their journeys to often very far away places. The great south trekking migrations have begun!

The top five must see migrating animals in Virginia are the shore birds, the monarch butterflies, the humpback and fin whales found on the Eastern Shore and the song birds and raptors.

To successfully see the shore birds, try the Virginia Birding and Wildlife Trail's Eastern Shore Loop after a weather front arrives and visit at mid-to-low tide this month.

The whales will be coming along from late December to mid-March. You can combine a visit to the Virginia Aquarium and Marine Science Center and catch one of their whalewatching trips.

The butterflies are in mass right now at Chincoteague. I have seen quite a few over the Appalachians, however, they are in the thousands on the shore - an amazing sight to see if you haven't experienced it.

The song birds are also migrating through. Locations for best viewing can be found by visiting the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries website for the Virginia Birding and Wildlife Trails, www.dgif.virginia.gov/vbwt/.

And, finally, be a part of the Raptor Bird Count! The Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy is asking for volunteers to help count the raptors migrating through the Blue Ridge Mountains until December 1st with their annual Snickers Gap Hawkwatch. They report that up to 12,000 raptors are counted coming through Snickers Gap every season. What a wonderful outing for a family!

On the weekends, volunteers are on hand to teach you how to identify the Raptors so bring your binoculars or spotting scopes and look for them flying in a southwesterly direction over and around the ridge line. The location for the Hawkwatch is approximately 10 minutes west of Purcellville on Route 7 where it just crosses the Loudoun-Clarke County line and the Appalachian Trail near Bluemont. It is next to the highway. Take a left at the top of the ridge on Rte 601 and then an immediate right into the commuter and Appalachian Trail parking lot.

The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling "Not So Fuzzy Little Ferret"

Bella the 5 year old female ferret wasn't doing very well. She was listless, and the hair on the back half of her body had been getting thinner for the last few weeks. Mrs. Smith brought her to us obviously concerned that something was wrong, and after taking one look at her, I could see that she was right. Bella was rather emaciated, and she definitely lacked the Tigger-like bounce that a healthy ferret



should have. It was at this point that I suspected that this cute little ferret had an adrenal gland problem.

Anyone who has ferrets usually knows that ferrets in the United States, being mostly inbred and spayed at a very early age (usually 6 weeks), have a good chance of developing one of three diseases – lymphoma (a cancer of the lymphatic system), an insulinoma (an insulin-secreting tumor causing a ferret's blood sugar to plummet), or an adrenal tumor. Adrenal tumors in ferrets can be benign or malignant, cause weakness, hair loss and intense itching, a swollen vulva in females or possible urinary obstruction in males, and potentially death as the tumor grows in size and affects other organs.

It can be removed surgically if it isn't wrapped around the aorta, or it can also be controlled with a synthetic drug called Lupron (which inhibits the pituitary gland and thereby lowers estrogen levels) which is injected monthly (ouch!). However, I have recently been using a new implant called Deslorelin that can last for up to 6 months, and the ferrets (and owners) that we have used it on are very happy.

So, if your ferret isn't feeling so perky or looking so fuzzy, give us a call!

From Hiss to Purr, or, How to Turn Naughty into Nice by Shannon M. Pecora, M.A. Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital

Muffin keeps scratching the furniture. Rex won't stop barking at the neighbors. Rover constantly pulls at the leash during walks. Did you know that issues such as these are among the top reasons why pets are given up to shelters—or even euthanized? And certainly such annoyances are relatively common. Fortunately, before any drastic decisions are made, Rex (and his owners!) may be able to find "reform" through a few visits with the veterinarian and/or trainer.



The best defense really can be a good offense, so with a new puppy or kitten, start building good habits right away. During the first series of vaccine and booster visits, your vet can offer advice and suggest resources about proper socialization and behavioral development techniques. For example, we recommend that you regularly touch and inspect your new pet's mouth, ears, paws, and skin. Help them get used to this activity so that teeth-brushing, ear-cleaning, nail trims, and vet exams are familiar, not frightening. Also, be sure to provide appropriate toys, treats, and exercise so that your puppy or kitten knows what is okay to play with, chew on, and do in order to expend energy. Additionally, training classes for puppies can range from basic obedience all the way up to tricks and agility. Make sure that the whole family is engaged in the puppy curriculum; if everyone is on the same page, training will be easier and less confusing for both pets and people.

It's not necessarily a lost cause if behavior issues are not addressed early or if they crop up later in life. You actually can teach an old dog new tricks! Particularly if odd or inappropriate behaviors newly appear, your vet is your greatest ally. It is important to establish the cause of certain actions; for instance, an illness can lead to urinating on the floor or aggression during ear-cleaning. With any possible diagnosis, the doctor can help you formulate a plan. Does your pet need medications to manage a condition such as anxiety? Can supplements to relieve arthritis pain lead to a better overall disposition? Would adult training classes help you overcome obedience challenges? A health exam and behavioral consultation, or maybe a visit with a referred specialist, can give you the information you need to tackle the unusual or "naughty" actions of your adult, or even geriatric, pet.

You love your pet, but you don't love constantly cleaning soiled upholstery or cautioning visitors that your pet may bite or scratch. If you are experiencing any unwanted behavioral issues with your pet, know that veterinary and animal care professionals are available to get you and your pet back on track. If we can help you find a reasonable solution, then we are hopefully keeping your pet in your home and out of a shelter—or worse.

Blue Cheese and Caramelized-Onion Squares

Crust

2 cups all purpose flour

2 tsp baking powder

3/4 tsp salt

3/4 cup whole milk

1/4 cup olive oil

2 tablespoons (1/4 stick) unsalted butter, melted

Topping

2 tbsp (1/4 stick) unsalted butter

2 tbsp olive oil

3 large onions (2 pounds) thinly sliced

1 tbsp finely chopped fresh rosemary

1 tsp sugar

1/2 tsp salt

1 1/2 cups (6 ounces) crumbled blue cheese

For crust: Preheat oven 425°F. Mix flour, baking powder, and salt in bowl. Whisk milk, olive oil, and melted butter. Pour milk mixture in dry ingredients, stirring until just blended and smooth. Roll out dough on lightly floured surface to 10x13-inch rectangle. Transfer to rimmed baking sheet. Re-form dough into 10x13-inch rectangle. Pierce dough all over with fork. For topping: Melt butter with oil in large skillet over med-high heat. Add onions. Cook until onions are soft and beginning to brown, stirring frequently, about 10 mins. Add rosemary, sugar, salt and pepper. Reduce heat to medium. Cook until soft and dark brown, cool. Spread onion mixture over dough. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake until crust is golden and cheese is bubbling, about 20 minutes. Cut into squares and serve. Bonappetit.com



Broccolini with Smoked Paprika, Almonds, and Garlic

Broccolini may be labeled "aspiration" or "baby broccoli." If using ordinary broccoli, cut off florets, peel stalks, and cut into short, thin sticks.

3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, divided

1/2 cup whole almonds, coarsely chopped

3 large garlic cloves, chopped

1 1/2 teaspoons smoked paprika

Coarse kosher salt

2 pounds broccolini, rinsed, stalks cut into 2- to 3-inch lengths

1/3 cup water

1 to 2 teaspoons Sherry wine vinegar

Heat 1 tbs oil in heavy large skillet over medium-high heat. Add almonds. Stir until lightly browned, 2 to 3 minutes. Add garlic and paprika. Sprinkle with coarse salt; sauté 1 minute. Transfer to small bowl. Add remaining 2 tbs oil to skillet. Add broccolini; sprinkle with coarse salt. Add 1/3 cup water. Cover and boil until crisp-tender and still bright green, about 4 minutes. Pour off any water. Stir in almond mixture. Season with coarse salt and pepper. Mix in 1 to 2 tsp vinegar. Transfer broccolini to bowl and serve. Bonappetit.com

Mashed Potatoes with Sage and White Cheddar Cheese

4 pounds russet potatoes, peeled, cut into 1 1/2-inch cubes

1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter

2 tablespoons plus 1 teaspoon minced fresh sage

3/4 cup whipping cream

3/4 cup whole milk

2 1/4 cups (about 9 oz) grated sharp white cheddar cheese

Butter 8- to 10-cup baking dish. Cook potatoes in large pot of boiling salted water until tender, about 12 minutes. Meanwhile, melt butter in medium saucepan. Add 2 tbs sage; stir until butter begins to brown, about 3 minutes. Add cream and milk; bring to simmer. Drain potatoes; return to pot. Stir over medium heat until excess moisture evaporates. Add cream mixture; mash potatoes. Stir in 1 3/4 cups cheese. Season potatoes with salt and pepper. Transfer to prepared dish. Sprinkle with 1/2 cup cheese and 1 teaspoon sage. Preheat oven 375°F. Bake potatoes uncovered until heated through and golden brown, about 45 minutes. Bonappetit.com

Pecan Pie Bars

1 (18.25 ounce) package yellow cake mix

1/2 cup margarine, softened

1 egg

3 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 1/2 cups dark corn syrup

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1 cup chopped pecans

2/3 cup yellow cake mix

Preheat oven 350 degrees. Grease 9x13 inch pan. Reserve 2/3 cup cake mix. Mix together remaining cake mix, margarine, and 1 egg. Pat in prepared pan. Ideas to Get Started


Once you have found your partner, there are many different directions to go.
