

The approved budget for the 2012 fiscal year is on the following pages of the newsletter. Overall, reductions in some operating costs resulted in forecasted expenses which increased slightly over the 2011 budget. Projected income also increased slightly. These factors allowed the Board to approve a budget with no increases to assessments for 2012.

The Assessment Fees for 2012 remain the same:

Single Family Homes \$68.00 per month

Single Family Homes

on Private Street \$82.25 per month

Town Homes \$83.00 per month

Courtyard Homes \$119.25 per month

You will have an opportunity to ask the Board of Directors questions about the budget at the December Board Meeting on December 13, 2011 at 6:30pm.

Please contact the Broadlands Assessment Office at Armstrong Management at 703-679-1541 or Broadlands@armstrong.net if you have not received your coupons by December 23, 2011. If you have signed up for the Direct Debit Program with Armstrong Management you will not receive any coupons.

All Owners are encouraged to sign up for the Direct Debit Program through Armstrong Management. Your monthly assessment will be automatically deducted from your bank account during the first week of every month eliminating the possibility of late fees due to missed or misdirected payments.

2011-2012 Snow Removal Guidelines

Within this section, you will find a list of streets indicating which entity is responsible for snow removal. *Please reference this list to determine who to call with snow removal concerns.* Broadlands Association provides snow removal for the private streets that have been completed by the builder and are owned by the Association. As the public streets in the single family home sections are accepted into the state road system, they will be maintained by the Virginia Dept. of Transportation (VDOT). Any new construction areas in Broadlands would contact their builder, Van Metre, unless their section/street is included in the HOA or VDOT areas to plow. Major roadways such as Claiborne Parkway, Demott Drive, Vestals Gap Drive, Ellzey Drive, Chickacoan Trail Drive, Glebe View Drive, Truro Parish Drive and Route 625 (Waxpool Road) are considered priority snow removal routes. After these roadways are cleared, work will begin on the secondary residential streets.

Snow plowing is to begin after there has been an accumulation of 2 inches of snow. Sand and/or chemicals will be used at critical intersections and as needed on streets.

In addition, there is a Loudoun County ordinance (Chapter 1022) that requires the owner/occupant of a property which has a public sidewalk adjoining or touching the property in front, rear or either side, to clear or treat that sidewalk for snow and ice within 6 hours of a snowfall (by 12:00 noon for overnight snowfall). Property owners abutting common areas (i.e. along Ellzey Drive) are also responsible for clearing those sidewalks. This will provide a safe walkway for children going to school. The County Department of Building and Development is responsible for enforcement of this ordinance.



Winter Feeding

Now that the migrating birds have reached their destinations, it is a good time to help keep our winter feathered friends fed!

Foods that help them through the winter are seeds and suet.

The most nutritious are:

- Suet with seeds or fruit
- Peanut Butter
- White millet seed
- Hulled peanuts
- Niger seed
- Black oil sunflower seed

Putting food outside in feeders isn't really enough, it all depends on where it's located. Make sure that you place the feeders where the birds are protected from the wind, closer to the house, but not any closer than five feet (to avoid them flying into your windows) and, near sheltering hedges or brush piles to give them protection from predators. The feeders need cover from snowfall too. After a snowfall, it is helpful if you go out to your feeder area and flatten or shovel the snow around it so that the birds can find the dropped seeds too.


It is very important to keep the feeders clean. The birds can contract serious illnesses from moldy food that has mildew on it. Dump out soggy or icy feed and wash and sterilize the feeder. Let it dry completely and then refill it. I use two feeders so that one can be kept filled at all times. A variety of feeders can be used such as a peanut feeder for the woodpeckers, a suet feeder, Niger feeder for the finches and a feeder for the wild bird seed for other types.


Don't throw your Christmas tree out once Christmas is over. Instead, put it outside filled with edibles for the birds to enjoy. By doing this, the tree will provide cover for the birds and you can have fun with your kids decorating it with string popcorn, oranges, cranberries and chunks of apples. You can even bake some birdy

biscuits and cut them into festive shapes!





The Critter Corner By Dr. Steve Velling "Don't Cut to the Quick!"

When you hear the telltale "click-click" as your dog walks across the tile floor, you know it's that time again – time to trim the toenails. Trimming your dog's nails is not just a part of grooming; it's important for your pet's health as well. You should remember that untrimmed nails can cause a variety of problems including broken nails, which are painful and can bleed profusely.

While some dogs don't seem to mind when you're trimming their nails, others just plain don't like it. Make trimming time fun and not a struggle. If your pet is not used to having his nails trimmed, start slowly and work up to it gradually. Following these suggestions for a proper nail trim might help you give your dog a more pleasant pedicure.

- Start young. The earlier you start clipping your dog's claws, the better used to it he will be. Frequent trims when your dog is young will help diminish any fear. Have your veterinarian show you how to do it the first time.
- Learn the anatomy. Within the center of each toenail is the blood and nerve supply for the nail called the quick. In
 clear white nails you can see the quick, a pinkish area in the middle of the nail. Unfortunately, the common black nails
 do not allow an easy view. Cutting into the quick will result in pain and bleeding. Cut dark colored nails in several
 small cuts to reduce the chance of cutting into the quick.
- Use the proper instruments be sure to use only nail trimmers that are designed for dogs. There are a variety of nail trimmers available at pet stores or your veterinarian's office.
- Before you start clipping, determine how much needs to be trimmed. The basic rule of thumb is that the nail, which curls downward, should be even with the paw pad. Whatever hangs over must be clipped.
- Some dogs will happily sit in your lap or on a table while you trim their nails but many require some form of restraint.
 You may want to sit on the floor with your pet, hold your pet in your lap, or have someone hold your pet on a table. If your dog has light colored nails, eyeball the quick and aim a few millimeters away from it.
- Using a nail trimmer for pets, cut the nail below the quick on a 45-degree angle, with the cutting end of the nail clipper toward the end of the nail. In dogs with dark nails, make several small nips with the clippers instead of one larger one. Trim very thin slices off the end of the nail until you see a black dot appear towards the center when you look at it head on. This is the start of the quick that you want to avoid. The good news is that the more diligent you are about trimming, the more the quick will regress into the nail, allowing you to cut shorter each time. Trim nails so that when the animal steps down, nails do not touch the floor.

 AND BOAS, WE SEE ALL PETS

Although you will take great care not to hurt your pet, sometimes accidents happen and you will cut into the quick. Have silver nitrate products on hand – you can get them at your veterinarian's office or pet store. You can also use flour or cornstarch to stop the bleeding. If that doesn't work, apply a light bandage for about 15 minutes. If the bleeding continues, call your veterinarian.

I hope that helps you with your doggy pedi's!

Best Winter Birdfeeders

To attract the greatest number of species in the winter, it is important to have a number of different birdfeeders available. While easy birdfeeders such as hopper and platform designs are always popular, the feeders you use during the winter should have several characteristics in common.

Capacity: For birders' convenience, large capacity feeders are preferred for winter feeding because they do not need to be refilled as frequently. This is only viable, however, if the seed is protected from moisture, otherwise it may grow mold before it is consumed. Covered feeders with large capacities are suitable, but platform feeders should be emptied and refilled daily to prevent mildew and spoilage.

Foods for Birds in Winter

Most birds that visit backyards in snowy weather thrive on seeds, since insects and fruit are harder to find naturally during the winter. The best foods to offer birds in colder weather have a high fat or oil content that will provide abundant energy for winter survival. When choosing birdseed and other foods for winter feeding, take into consideration which bird species are present in the winter and what foods they prefer to avoid excess wasted seed. Many birders also prefer to use no-mess seed mixes such as hulled sunflower seeds in the winter to avoid several months' of hull accumulation beneath feeders in the spring.

Storing Birdseed

It is best to stock up on birdseed in the fall when many lawn and garden centers are discounting seed to make way for winter merchandise. Stored properly, seed can easily last for months, particularly seed mixes and sunflower seeds. To properly store seed, it should be kept in a cool, dry place that is protected from bugs and rodents. Choose a storage bin that will be easy to access all winter, and one that can be easily manipulated while wearing gloves and bulky coats.

Pests and Predators

Just as food is scarce for birds in the winter, it is also scarce for squirrels, raccoons, stray cats and other backyard predators. Steps can be taken, however, to safeguard feeding stations and provide birds the security to return to the feeders throughout the winter.

- Choose specialized feeders with pest repellants such as caged perches or squirrel baffles.
- Position feeders several feet from natural cover where birds can hide if necessary, but not so close as to allow predators a place for an ambush.
- Consider placing temporary fencing around feeding stations to keep predators and pest wildlife away.
- Offer other food for pest animals, such as cobs of corn for squirrels, in a different location so they will not be tempted to raid feeders.

More Winter Birdfeeding Tips

- Clean off feeders, platforms and perches after each storm so seed is easily accessible.
- Leave fruit and berries on trees, hedges and bushes to provide a natural source of food throughout the winter.
- Add a heated birdbath to your backyard or place a safe heating element in a regular birdbath to provide birds with liquid water.
- Stamp or shovel snow around feeders to provide easier access to spilled seed for ground feeding birds.
- Leave nesting boxes and birdhouses up all year round to provide winter roosting sites.

With care and consideration, backyard birding can be an exhilarating hobby throughout the winter, with birdsong and backyard visits to brighten the coldest, darkest days of the season.

Who's Been Clattering on the Roof, Reindeer?

Did you know that reindeer and caribou are closely related? In fact, they share the same scientific names down to species, but there are five subspecies (and might even be more). A man named Linnaeus used ancient Greek and Latin words to name animals and plants all over the world because both of these languages were not used anymore so they were less likely to change. It made it easier for scientists from different countries to communicate so that they were certain that they were talking about the same plants and animals when they discussed them. We mostly use the common names for plants and animals and not the scientific names.

The scientific name for caribou and reindeer is Rangifer *tarandus*. Depending on where you or they live determines if they are called reindeer or caribou and what subspecies they are named. Both Caribou and Reindeer live in North America and Reindeer live in Eurasia. But mostly, the name reindeer refers to the ones that are semi-domesticated.

Reindeer and Caribou are large deer with brown/ grey hair. Both boys and girls have antlers, though the reindeer females have larger antlers than the caribou. Girls keep their antlers until spring, but the boys lose theirs in the fall.

These animals have special adaptations that allow them to live where it is very cold. Their feet are called hooves and change with the seasons. In the summer, their footpads are large and spongy so that they can walk on the mushy tundra. In the winter, their footpads shrink and expose more of the hoof so that they don't slip on the ice. They have amazing noses! They have wide faces that have special bones that increase the space inside their nostrils which allows cold air to warm up before it goes to their lungs. The hair on their body has hollow tips which act like an extra blanket to keep them warm.

They live mostly in large herds up to 10,000 animals, though smaller groups can be found too. They migrate twice a year up to 750 miles each way! They are good swimmers and can run up to 50 miles per hour!

There are quite a few differences between them even if they look alike. It is thought that the differences came when the reindeer were domesticated. Reindeer are shorter, reindeer bulls are smaller than caribou bulls, but the cows are the same size. Reindeer have thicker fur and they have their babies a month earlier.

Reindeer mainly feed on grasses, herbs, sedges, mosses, fungi, twigs and lichens so keep that in mind if you are putting out a "treat" for some special reindeer visitors!



- 1 stick unsalted butter
- 1 cup raw sugar
- 3 large eggs

- 2 teaspoons ground ginger
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg
- 1 cup molasses
- 1 cup Guinness, or other dark beer Spiced Creme Anglaise, recipe follows

Confectioners' sugar, for dusting



Spiced Creme Anglaise:

- 2 cups heavy cream
- 1/2 teaspoon orange zest
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/8 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- 1/8 teaspoon ground ginger
- 3 large egg yolks
- 1/4 cup sugar

Combine cream, zest, cinnamon, nutmeg, and ginger in a medium saucepan and bring to simmer over medium heat. Remove from heat. In medium bowl, beat egg yolks and sugar until pale and frothy, about 2 minutes. Slowly drizzle in 1/2 cup of hot cream, whisking constantly. Return mixture to warm milk and stirring constantly, cook over medium heat until thick, about 4 minutes. Remove from heat and serve warm. (Or, to serve chilled, place in an ice bath to cool, then cover with plastic wrap, pressing down against the surface to prevent a skin from forming. Refrigerate about 2 hours.) Yield: 2 cups Prep. Emeril Lagasse



Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Combine flour, brown sugar, pecans, and butter in bowl. Press dough into ungreased 13 by 9 by 2-inch pan. Bake for 12 to 15 minutes or until lightly browned. For filling, beat cream cheese and granulated sugar together in bowl until smooth, using handheld electric mixer; add eggs and extract; beat well. Pour over crust. Bake for 20 minutes. Cool completely. Cut into squares before serving. Decorate tops with berries and mint leaves. Paula Deen

ORANGE-CHOCOLATE BREAD PUDDING

4 cups whole milk

- 1 1/2 cups sugar, plus more for sprinkling
- 1 12-ounce can (11/2 cups) frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed
- 3/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons bourbon
- 2 large eggs plus 6 egg yolks
- 12 cups day-old challah bread cubes
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter, plus more for greasing
- 3/4 cup bittersweet chocolate chunks

Pinch of salt

3/4 cup heavy cream

Heat milk, 1 cup sugar and 1/2 cup orange juice concentrate in saucepan over medium-low heat until the sugar dissolves, stirring. Cool slightly. Whisk milk mixture, 2 tablespoons bourbon and whole eggs and yolks in large bowl; fold in bread. Cover and refrigerate until liquid is absorbed, about 1 hour 30 minutes. Reheat oven to 350 degrees F. Butter a 13 by 9-inch baking dish. Fold chocolate chunks into bread mixture. Spread evenly in baking dish and sprinkle with sugar. Bake until knife inserted into center comes out clean, about 1 hour 20 minutes. Meanwhile, make sauce: Melt 4 tablespoons butter in small saucepan over medium heat. Add remaining 1/2 cup sugar and cook, stirring, until lightly caramelized, 5 to 6 minutes. Whisk in remaining 1 cup orange juice concentrate, 3/4 cup bourbon and salt. Cook until thick, 10 to 15 minutes. Stir in cream and simmer until sauce coats a spoon, about 10 more minutes. Slice bread pudding and drizzle with sauce. Food Network Magazine

Living Christmas Trees - Making Your Holidays Even "Greener"!

This month I wanted to provide information on how to make the coming holidays "greener". Of course one idea is the phrase you have all heard before "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle" and I have a couple of links related to that topic at the end of this article. The main topic I want to discuss is how to care for a living Christmas tree that after the holidays you can plant in your landscape. A living tree will make a positive contribution to the environment for many years if planted and cared for properly in the first few years of its life.


Living trees require a bit more work and effort on your part. The rootballs are heavy and bulky, so they can be hard to move. It is best to move balled and burlapped trees by supporting the ball. You can roll it on the ground, or inexpensive snow sleds make for a good moving tool. Just roll the ball onto the sled and then you can easily pull it to where you want it. You may want to place an old blanket or towel underneath to protect the floor when sliding it around inside. You will need a large watertight container of some kind to hold the ball of the tree while inside your house to protect the floor from damage from soil and water. I used a galvanized tub then decorated my tree with silver garland and ornaments.

When selecting a living tree, consider where you will plant it in the landscape – you need to make sure you have enough space (both width and height) to accommodate the tree at its mature size. Go ahead and dig the planting hole before the ground freezes and cover the loose soil and the hole with a tarp or plastic. Remember an ideal planting hole is no deeper than the rootball you will plant and 3-5 times as wide.

When you bring the tree home, it should be conditioned before being brought into your heated house. Leave the tree upright in an unheated garage. After a couple of days, the tree can be brought indoors and placed in a cool location. Make sure you locate the tree so that it is not in direct sunlight and is away from heat sources such as wood stoves, fireplaces, heater vents, etc. Living Christmas trees will need water, so before you move the tree inside, moisten the root ball and keep it moist, but not standing in water while you have it inside.

Because you have a living tree, remember it is being exposed to warm temperatures inside which could cause it to break its dormancy and begin to grow. For this reason, try to limit its time in your home to no more than 10 days. Before you move the tree outside to plant, move it back to the unheated garage and allow it to become acclimated to the colder temperatures before you plant into the landscape.



If you cannot plant the tree within a few days, move it to a sheltered area and heavily mulch the rootball to protect it, and then plant as soon as you can. Make sure the rootball is not too deep in the hole and remove the twine and burlap. Using the original soil (no amendments recommended), backfill the planting hole about ½ of the way and then fill the hole with water allowing it to settle the soil. Add the remainder of the soil and water again to settle the soil. Mulch the tree using organic mulch, keeping the mulch at least 3 inches away from the trunk and no more than 3 inches deep and at least 3 feet wide. Only stake the tree if it is located in an area where it is exposed to wind or possible damage from wildlife or vandalism and remember to remove the stakes the following fall. The tree will remain dormant for the rest of the winter and will begin to grow as the weather warms in the spring. You will need to water the tree for a minimum of 3 years if rainfall is not sufficient to ensure the tree becomes established and able to survive on its own. Most landscape trees do not require regular fertilization. If you believe your tree may need fertilizer, take a soil test and send to a soil testing lab to determine what it may need. You can pick up soil testing kits for sending to Virginia Tech at any local library or at the Loudoun County Extension Office.




