A Note From Your General Manager, Sarah Gerstein

Happy December, Broadlands! The hot topic of the month is the budget.

Every fall, Management and the Board spends the months leading into the new year calculating the expected income from interest on investments, newsletter advertising, outside pool memberships, community center rentals. They also



calculate all of the expenses that the association must bear, ranging from repair and replacement reserves to maintain the common elements (buildings, roads, paths, pools), contracts for pool, grounds, trees, trash, pond, security, snow plowing, and cleaning, as well as insurance policies, utility bills, personnel and office expenses, and programs. Each item is scrutinized in detail to come up with realistic projections, and the assessments are established to cover the costs associated with these expenses.

The Board of Directors works hard to keep the assessments low while still affording the association the income to maintain and enhance the vast needs of the community. In 2013, this means the assessments will be increased slightly in order to cover the projected expenses. We continue to negotiate with our current vendors to keep pricing low and we obtain competitive bids for contracts as they expire to ensure pricing is industry consistent, but we must remain conscious that we do not reduce the quality of services in these efforts. Maintaining the quality of the services provided through the association is paramount to preserving property values and keeping Broadlands a highly sought after community in this competitive region.

"Local Conservation Heroes" Honored in Northern Virginia



At an annual gathering of not-for-profit conservation and community groups on October 19th at the Virginia Tech Advanced Research Center in Arlington, leaders of Virginia's largest environmental organizations recognized elected officials and volunteers for their work to promote "green communities" in Northern Virginia.

Jay Fisette, a member of the Arlington County Board of Supervisors was named a guest of honor for his work as president of Virginia Municipal League. In that role, Fisette spearheaded the creation of the GoGreen Initiative (http://www.gogreenva.org/), a friendly competition among local governments and school districts to improve recycling rates, energy efficiency and environmental performance. Fisette also

played a leadership role in the development of the Arlington County Energy Plan, a first-of-its-kind plan to provide cleaner, reliable power.

Former Alexandria councilman and newly elected member of the House of Delegates Rob Krupicka was recognized for helping to launch Eco-City Alexandria (http://alexandriava.gov/Eco-City). The Eco-City program was designed with help from Virginia Tech's School of Urban Affairs and Planning. It has helped Alexandria achieve a 48% recycling rate and extend Capital Bikeshare to Old Town. Eco-City Alexandria realized one of its major goals this month with the closure of an outdated and polluting power plant on the Potomac River.

Rounding out the list of honorees was a team of National Wildlife Federation volunteers who have established certified wildlife habitats throughout Fairfax and Arlington counties and in parts of Loudoun county. Northern Virginia now has one of the nation's largest concentrations of certified habitats, which require not only nesting and feeding areas but also public educational events (www.nwf.org/communityhabitats). The volunteers are: Scott Birdwell, Claudia Thompson-Deahl, Janine Finnell, Elenor Hodges, Kevin Holland, Robin Rentsch, and **Oya Simpson**. "These men and women embody the spirit of community service," said Nathan Lott, executive director of the Virginia Conservation Network. "They are living out the mantra 'think globally, act locally,' and by doing so they have shown that conservation improves property values, saves taxpayers money, creates healthier communities."

Dear Homeowners,

In the following pages, please find the approved FY2013 Operating Budget for Broadlands Association, Inc. as approved during the November 13, 2012 Board of Directors Meeting. All budgetary accounts have been adjusted for inflation and are based upon historical precedent. Increases in contracts, personnel, and maintenance expenses resulted in forecasted expenses being greater than the 2012 budget. The Board of Directors and Management have made every effort to control operating and administrative costs in order to keep the assessments as low as possible while continuing to provide quality services to the community. Based on this, the Board of Directors has approved an increase in the monthly assessment.

The Assessment Fees for 2013 are as follows:

Single Family Homes \$73.00 per month
Single Family Homes on Private Street \$87.00 per month
Town Homes \$86.00 per month
Courtyard Homes \$125.00 per month

Assessment coupons will be delivered to all owners at the address on file with Armstrong Management. Please contact the Broadlands Assessment Office at Armstrong Management at 703-679-1541 or Broadlands@armstrong.net if you have not received your coupons by December 21, 2012. If you already participate in the Direct Debit Program through Armstrong Management, you will not receive a coupon booklet, and the 2013 assessments will be automatically deducted from your account.

Owners are encouraged to sign up for the Direct Debit Program through Armstrong Management. Your monthly assessment will be automatically deducted from your bank account during the first week of every month. This eliminates the possibility of a payment being missed or lost in the mail and the Association charging a late fee to your account as a result.

A copy of the Automated Payment Service Authorization Form follows the budget in this newsletter. Copies are also available at the HOA office or online at http://www.broadlandshoa.org/fileshare/files/108/Armstrong_Auto_Pay_Application.pdf .

Armstrong Management also accepts major credit cards and e-checks for assessment payments. Through PayLease, you can make a one-time e-payment or schedule recurring e-payments by visiting www.armstrong-mgt.com. If you already participate in the PayLease program, please note that you need to update the assessment rate online beginning January 1st.

If you currently use a personal online bill-paying service to pay your assessments, you will need to update the assessment rate with your service provider effective January 1.

If you have questions regarding the budget or assessment levels, you may contact the General Manager, Sarah Gerstein or address the Board of Directors at their December Board Meeting on December 11, 2012 at 6:00pm.

Winter is Here - Please be Prepared!

Both Virginia and Loudoun County Codes require that the occupant - whether an owner or a tenant - remove all snow and ice from any walkway adjoining any part of their property within 6 hours after the snowfall has ceased.

If the snow or ice fell during the night, it must be removed by Noon the following day. Should the storm occur on Sunday, the accumulation must be removed by Noon on Monday.

Failure to comply with the Code can result in a fine of \$250.00 imposed by the county. Complaints should be reported to the County Department of Building and Development, (703) 777-0635.

Please be a good neighbor and a good citizen. Clear your walkways and keep Broadlands a safe environment for all our residents. If you know someone physically unable to keep their walkway clear, please consider giving them a helping hand.

STAY SAFE-

Don't Skate on the Community Ponds!

Please remember skating is prohibited on all community ponds. Even walking on any ice covered pond can be very dangerous.

The surface of the pond may appear to be frozen, but our winters are normally not cold enough to guarantee that the ice is thick enough to support anyone's weight, even a child's.

Parents, please tell your children that it is extremely dangerous, even deadly, to walk or skate on the ponds in the community.

When a snow storm has been predicted, especially overnight, the snow plows will be working during the early morning hours. PSI Property Services has been contracted by the Board of Directors to repaint the fire lanes on the private streets throughout the community. Painting will take place in late November/early December as weather permits.

Kritters for Kids By: Broadlands Naturalist, Lisa Matthews

In the winter, one of our favorite native birds is there to brighten up our gardens. The glorious red of the Northern Cardinal flashes and flits around our trees and shrubs to give the grays and browns a splash of color.

Though they have black masks on their faces, they are plucky but gentle friends to other birds. The girls are light brown with just a smudge of rosy red and the boys are bright red, as red as they can be so that they can attract the girls. The boys perk up their

pointed crests and flash their tails to show the girls how beautiful they are. Both the girls and boys like to sing to each other. This is unusual because for most birds, only the boy birds sing.

Cardinals pick a mate each year and the girls build cup-like nests in dense shrubs and bushes. Her camouflage coloring helps keep her and the nest safe from predators. Cardinals raise three "clutches" of eggs and babies from spring to fall. Daddy Cardinals are very good fathers. They feed the mommy while she sits on the eggs and then helps raise the babies. The parents will stay together all through the season. The Daddy is very protective and will not let other boy Cardinals stay nearby and will try to lure predators away.

In the fall and winter, Cardinals are social birds and will fly in flocks even with birds of other kinds (species). With their large strong beaks they can crack heavy seeds but they also like to eat insects, grains, fruit and sap.



They like to live in gardens, on the edge of forests and swamps (or marshes) where there is a lot of food to eat.

You can encourage them to visit your garden and give your home some color when the sky and plants are so gray by putting out water and seed for them to eat. Make your own birdfeeders with pine cones and stringing popcorn and fruit. Decorate the trees and shrubs with them and soon you will have new colorful friends!

December in the Garden By: Jill Johnson, Master Gardener

It's cold, the days are short, the skies are gray and the seed catalogs haven't arrived. What's a gardener to do? With the leaves off the trees and shrubs, it's a fine time to assess your landscaping and see where the addition of a few evergreens might add structure to the winter scene, or perhaps a trio of Winterberry shrubs (Ilex verticillata) to brighten a corner of the garden with their striking red berries on bare branches.

Indoors, you can start a pot of paperwhites in pebbles and water, laced with a touch of alcohol to keep them from growing leggy. Start a new pot ever two weeks for a continuous display. If you've purchased poinsettias for the holidays, they will look best if kept in bright light and away from drafts. Keep them well-watered but avoid overwatering.

Houseplants are semi-dormant now unless they are growing under plant lights. This is not the time for fertilizer, and again don't overwater. Overwatering is the number-one killer of houseplants. Check plants periodically for spider mites, mealy bugs and scale insects. Prevention is the best way to protect plants. If you catch them early, sometimes just washing the plant with warm water and a small amount of insecticidal soap will remove these pests.

Looking for some last minute holiday gifts? Stop by the Loudoun County Extension Office and pick up a gift combination that has the Loudoun County Master Gardener's seal of approval! Many of us agree that the soil knife is our most versatile tool. We use it to weed, plant, dig and trim and it is only \$20.00. Paired with the great gloves we sell for \$7.00 and you have a perfect gift for your gardening friends.

Mark your calendar for the Loudoun County Master Gardeners 2013 Lecture Series which kicks off on January 3, 2013 at 7:00pm in the Rust Library. Local environmentalist, Ms. Debra Maes will speak on "Composting 101" or how to turn your garbage into gold. Through a combination of "composting, upcycling, recycling and food donations", Ms. Maes was able to reduce one local school's waste from 300 pounds a day to an incredible 30 pounds a day! This should be another interesting LCMG lecture that we hope to see you at.

The season of gift giving is upon us. As you shop you may wonder what characteristics would make a gift eco-friendly or "green"? I happened upon a quote that I believe answers that question. "An eco-friendly or "green" toy is both environmentally and socially responsible. It's accountable to, and respectful of, the

places and people that provide and use it."

Eco-friendly toys may be natural toys made from **solid woods** (with no finish or a non-toxic finish), **cotton** and **wool**. Steer clear of plastic and PVC toys, which can contain harmful toxins. PVC, labeled #3 is often mixed with phthalates, a toxic additive that makes plastic more flexible. If you do buy plastic, look for safer plastics like those **labeled #1, 2, 4, or 5** in the chasing arrows symbol usually found on the bottom of the product.

Cheap jewelry and kids' cosmetics should also be avoided, as both of these types of dress-up products are high-risk. Cheap jewelry often has high lead or cadmium levels and kids' cosmetics can have any number of questionable chemicals. Better options are hand crafted jewelry and natural bath and skincare products. The 2012 EarthDay@Loudoun Family Festival's Market Place Exhibitors were local businesses providing these products. Gifts that require no packaging, such as certificates for spa services or special event tickets, make great eco-friendly gifts. 
the gift of seeds to start next year's garden.

Ground pepper

2 tsp fresh thyme leaves, plus more for serving 3/4 cup (2 oz) grated Gruyere cheese
