Happy December, Broadlands! We made it through another year and are staring down 2014, eager to get things started. Before we can get there, I'd like to recap some of the accomplishments of 2013. In addition to the routine maintenance that we always provide, we worked to make improvements to the community to add to your home value, increase your sense of community, and improve the efficiency and productivity of the HOA office and staff. Here are just a few of the things your HOA did for you!

- Adopted a 2014 operating budget with no increase in the assessments for towns, singles and court yard homes.
- Enhanced the Nature Center, including new habitats for several of the animals who call this place home, redesigned the library and added valuable built in bookshelves and storage, revamped the programs to include exciting exhibitors at our Second Saturday programs, improved the Nature Center pond to provide a more natural perimeter to enhance the health of the pond and the animals that make it their home as well as promote the natural beauty of the area, and repainted the NC trellis
- Installed pool lifts in order to comply with federal regulations for ADA accessibility and replaced broken diving board
- Introduced the Halloween and Holiday decorating contests
 Repainted the fire lanes, crackfilled and sealcoated private roads and parking lots
- Refurbished cluster mailboxes in the townhomes
- Obtained a structural engineering survey on the Stone House
 Provided vehicle magnets and wine openers for sale and
- free temporary tattoos to promote BroadlandsReplaced aged tot lot behind the Southern Walk pool
- Purchased violations software to increase the efficiency of the Covenants Inspectors
- Rolled out the "green" option for the newsletter for owners who want an electronic rather than print version
- Adopted a new Lawn and Yard Maintenance Resolution to streamline the process for correcting violations for lawn mowing, weeding, etc.

We also celebrated anniversaries of employment for association staff. I made it past the one year mark, part time receptionist Joanne Hang and weekend warrior Eric Kuklick have each been with us for four years, our Advertising Manager and part time receptionist Stassa Collins has spent 6 years with Broadlands, both our newsletter editor Natalie Ihanainen and Secretary to the Modifications Subcommittee Robin Crews celebrated 7 years with Broadlands, and we are honored to have had Covenants Inspector Susan Kuklick with the community for 13 years. Save Yourself Time, Money and Aggravation

Before you make **any** modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the homeowner's responsibility to file an application with the Modifications Subcommittee for **all** exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this requirement.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a Covenants violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee by the Homeowners Association of up to \$900,- which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made in a timely manner. You may be taken to General District Court in order for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which the Commonwealth of Virginia requires you to provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines at http://www.broadlandshoa.org/forhomeowners/design-guidelines/ for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in a timely manner to the Modifications Subcommittee in order to obtain approval *prior* to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions. Dear Homeowners,

In the following pages, please find the approved FY2014 Operating Budget for Broadlands Association, Inc. as approved during the November 12, 2013 Board of Directors Meeting. All budgetary accounts have been adjusted for inflation and are based upon historical precedent. The Board of Directors and Management have made every effort to control expenses and generate income in order to keep the assessments as low as possible while continuing to provide quality services to the community. These efforts allowed the Board of Directors to approve a budget with no increase in the monthly assessment.

The Assessment Fees for 2014 are as follows:

Single Family Homes	\$73.00 per month
Single Family Homes on Private Street	\$87.00 per month
Town Homes	\$86.00 per month
Courtyard Homes	\$125.00 per month
Villa Homes	\$101.00 per month

Assessment coupons will be delivered to all owners at the address on file with FirstService Residential. Please contact FirstService Residential at 703-679-1541 or broadlands.dcmetro@fsresidential.com if you have not received your coupons by December 15, 2013. If you already participate in the Direct Debit Program through FirstService Residential, you will not receive a coupon booklet and the 2014 assessments will be automatically deducted from your account.

Owners are encouraged to sign up for the Direct Debit Program through FirstService Residential. Your monthly assessment will be automatically deducted from your bank account during the first week of every month. This eliminates the possibility of a payment being missed or lost in the mail and the Association charging a late fee to your account as a result.

FirstService Residential also accepts major credit cards and e-checks for assessment payments. Through PayLease, you can make a one-time e-payment or schedule recurring e-payments by visiting https://fsresidential.com/virginia/home.

Deer Season is Here! By: Alexandra VIk, Broadlands ANS Naturalist

Each year there are 1 million car accidents, 200 American deaths, 10,000 personal injuries, and \$1 billion dollars in vehicle damage due to deer collisions, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Unfortunately, deer habitats are being broken up by roads, forcing these animals to cross the roads on a regular basis, inevitably causing accidents.

Deer are large mobile animals, weighing up to 300 pounds; they need large areas of land to survive. While deer are not specifically attracted to cars, they are attracted to urban areas. Many landscapes have plant materials that deer find highly attractive to eat. This is also the case on roadsides and shoulders. In the colder months, deer are drawn to the roadways by the salt that is put down to de-ice the roads. When a car comes along, the animal gets frightened and confused and will dash into the oncoming traffic.

Deer are prey animals who usually live deep in the woods, making them rely a lot on sound to assess threat. Thanks to the Doppler Effect, a car coming towards them does not make a lot of noise, it instead compresses the sound waves in front of it. A vehicle does make noise out the back and off the side, which is then reflected off the trees as it passes. Deer, whose ears are much more sensitive than ours, interpret these sounds as coming from the woods and as a result will run to the road and away from the sound.

Some tips to avoid deer:

- Always look for more than one deer.
- Be alert during dawn and dusk, car accidents peak between 6:00p.m. and 9:00p.m. and 3:00a.m. to 6:00a.m.
- From the months October-December, deer are at their peak season since mating and eating more to build up fat supply for winter months.
- Slow down if you see a deer. If you can't stop, make sure not to swerve. Swerving will cause you to lose control of your vehicle.

If you see that the collision is unavoidable, accelerate instead of slowing down. This will cause the vehicle to pull the cars nose up, lessening the chance of the deer



going through your windshield.

If you do hit a deer make sure to report the accident. Call the nearest police department and insurance company.







Baba's Lasagna For The Holidays

Ingredients

3 Large Red Bell Pepper 1 Medium Sweet Onion 4 Medium Garlic Cloves 16 oz. Can Diced Tomatoes 16 oz. Can Tomato Sauce 6 oz. Can Tomato Paste 1 lb. Ground Beef 1 pkg. Italian 6 Cheese 1 pkg. Parmesan Shredded Cheese 1 cup Parmesan/Romano Shredded Cheese 1/4 pkg. Light Cream Cheese 4 oz. Light Sour Cream 8-10 oz. Ricotta Cheese 1 pkg. Lasagna Noodles 1 Egg 1 tsp. Garlic Powder 1 tsp. Garlic Powder 1 tsp. Black pepper ½ tsp. Cumin 1 tsp. Worchester Sauce 1 Tbs. Parsley 1 Tbs. Oregano 1 Tbs. Basil ¼ tsp. Red Pepper ¼ tsp. Paprika Olive Oil



PREPARATION:

Chop & sauté – Onion & bell peppers, mince garlic cloves and sauté all in a large skillet. When onions turn soft, add can of diced tomatoes then continue to cook until mix boils for a couple of minutes. Remove from skillet to a nearby pan.

- Brown meat Pour half a cup of water into skillet and add ground beef. With a spatula and fork pull meat apart while water boils. Add garlic powder, onion powder, black pepper and cumin. Continue with a slow boil and add Worchester sauce, some more water if earlier water becomes evaporated. Cook until meat is pulled apart and browned (not crisp). Add can of tomato paste to watery meat mixture and stir into mix while continuing to cook.
- Create sauce Add the previous cooked sauté mix to the skillet, stir in and add the can of tomato sauce. Stir and bring to a boil, add additional garlic and onion powders as desired plus oregano, basil, parsley, red pepper, paprika and sprinkle of olive oil, then cover and turn heat to low/simmer and let cook for about 30 minutes. Take lid off and continue cooking on low to boil off excess liquid creating a thicker sauce.
- Boil noodles Bring a very large pot with 2/3 water in it to boil, sprinkle olive oil in water and then add noodles, one at a time. Crisscross each noodle until entire package is in pot and boiling at medium heat. Allow to boil with lid slightly open to keep from boiling over for 8-10 minutes. Drain noodles, rinse with cold water, and return to pot filled with cold water to set until later.

Mix cheeses – In a medium mixing bowl add ricotta, cream cheese, sour cream and egg. Stir until creamy. Sprinkle with parsley, mix and set aside. Take packages of 6 blend cheese and parmesan cheese and mix in a medium bowl. Set aside.

ASSEMBLY:

- On a large surface set up your mixes to be assembled in a large rectangular pan (i.e. 11"X15" glass dish): skillet of sauce, pan of noodles (drained), bowl of cheese blends, and bowl of creamy ricotta blend.
- Begin by spooning and spreading a very thin layer of sauce in the pan. Add a layer of noodles side by side.
- After the layer of noodles spoon in sauce to make a thin spread across the noodles.
- After the sauce add the creamy ricotta mix in dribbles all around the sauce. Dribble it back and forth until it is spotted across the surface.
- Then take a handful of blended shredded cheeses and spread evenly across the surface.
- Repeat 2 more layers with noodles, sauce, creamy ricotta, and shredded cheese mixes as discussed previously.
- After layer 3 of noodles, sauce, creamy ricotta, and shredded cheese mixes, add a small amount of the Parmesan/Romano cheese sprinkled across the entire surface.
- With the last layer, you should have run out of creamy ricotta cheese and left with very little shredded cheese. Place last layer of noodles across pan, spread evenly what is left of sauce and blended shredded cheeses. Take the Parmesan/Romano cheese and spread evenly and cover the entire surface of the lasagna. Use more if necessary to completely cover the surface.

Cover the dish with tinfoil and place in the fridge for cooking the next day as a prepared dish left over-night will give it a greater amount of flavor. Take out dish and let set for anywhere from 15 to 30 minutes prior to cooking. Preheat oven to 375. Cook dish covered with tinfoil for 30-45 minutes and turn to 350 degrees. Cook for another 15 minutes or so and take foil off. Continue to cook until surface is lightly browned. When browned as desired, take out and let cool for 15 minutes. This allows the lasagna to be served as individual servings rather than soup. Serving tip: Cut with a pizza cutter into serving sizes. Recipe provided by Steve Newton.





- Examine window caulking and reseal where needed.
- Examine and repair vents where needed.
- Clean chimneys and flues.
- Remove items near heat vents.
- Place nonskid runners or door mats outside to help keep water, sand and salt out of the house.

Outdoor Winterizing

- Cut back tree branches and shrubs that hide signs or block light.
- Examine outdoor handrails and tighten if needed.
- Turn off electrical breakers for outdoor equipment.
- Close hose bibs.
- Clean out gutters and downspouts.
- Clear yard drains.
- Spray outdoor locks and hinges with lubricant.
- Stake driveway and walkway edges that may be difficult to find under deep snow.

Assemble, stockpile or refresh winter supplies:

- Batteries
- Candles and matches
- Ice melt and de-icer
- Sand
- Snow shovels
- Generator fuel
- Antifreeze

naturalized in Virginia. Eleven years in the making, it is only the second flora of Virginia, following the first *Flora Virginica* which was published more than 250 years ago! The book contains innovative keys for identification, detailed habitat information, and an exhaustive description of each plant. Tips For Protecting Your Identity During the Holidays

Identity theft is a problem any time of the year. But, while consumers are focused on giving during the holidays, crooks are focused on taking. If there's one thing consumers don't need, it is dealing with identity theft during the holidays. The National Foundation for Credit Counseling (NFCC) offers the following tips to help consumers protect themselves during the busy holiday season:

• Be aware of your surroundings. Sidewalks and malls will be crowded and shoppers will be distracted the perfect combination for a pickpocket. If someone bumps into you, don't assume it was an accident. Women should clutch purses closely at their side or in front of them with the wallet hidden at the bottom. Men should stow wallets in an inside coat pocket.

• Don't carry large sums of cash. Charge your purchases or use a debit card. Just remember that credit cards offer some protections that debit cards don't. When you use a credit card, you can dispute a purchase before paying for it. With a debit card, the money is removed from your account at the time of the purchase. A thief can wipe out your checking or savings account before you ever realize the theft has taken place

• Guard your PIN number at the ATM. Be aware of anyone lurking around the ATM, and if someone is standing too close, simply ask him



your information at the ATM without you knowing it. If you notice anything unusual about the ATM, use a different one, and report what you've seen to the bank.

• Don't let your credit card out of your sight. Unscrupulous clerks or waiters can copy your card information or swipe your card into a second card reader and later make a new credit card for themselves. Worse yet, they can sell your information to an organized crime ring.

• Lighten your wallet. Remove anything from your wallet that you don't absolutely need to have with you. That way, if someone is successful in stealing it, they won't get as much. Never carry your Social Security card with you, but check other cards that might use your SS# as an identifier. If you're not going to be using your checkbook, leave it at home.

• Make copies of your credit cards. Copy both sides of all your cards. If you lose your wallet, you'll have easy access to all of your account numbers and phone numbers, allowing you to alert your bank immediately.

• Keep up with all receipts. Not only will you need them to make returns easily, but crooks are very interested in stealing the information they contain. Never stuff the receipts into your car visor or leave them exposed in any way.

• Open your credit card statements as soon as they arrive. Check the bill for any unauthorized purchases. Even better, keep a watchful eye on your accounts by going online and reviewing your accounts each week. If you notice anything out of the ordinary, report it immediately to your bank. Doing so will likely remove any payment responsibility you might have for fraudulent purchases.

• Secure all personal information, even while at home. Unfortunately, many

times an ID thief is someone we know. During the holidays, you may have guests in your home. Remove temptation by putting personal information out of sight.

- Consider signing up for a credit monitoring service. Such services alert you via email anytime there is an inquiry or other activity to your credit report. In other words, if someone tries to open an account in your name, you'll know about it. Such services are offered by all of the major credit reporting bureaus, and could be money well-spent.
- Order your credit report. Consumers are allowed one free credit report every 12 months from each of the three bureaus. Order a report now from one bureau, and order another one in January from a different bureau. This will give you a good snapshot of activity and will alert you to anything unusual.

In spite of all your efforts, if you are victimized by ID theft, contact an NFCC Member Agency for help. Their certified counselors can walk you through the steps to recovery. To find the agency closest to you, dial (800) 388-2227, or go online www. DebtAdvice.org. To locate a Spanish speaking counselor, call (800) 682-9832.
