



SPRING INSPECTIONS

At long last, we have suffered through enough of the cold, dark days of winter and made it to the other side to reach (we hope) sunny, bright, and beautiful spring. With the arrival of spring comes the spring house cleaning and yard sales (be sure to get all the details on page 18), April showers, lawn mowing, and gardening projects. For the association staff, spring brings the hectic



season of pool opening preparation, reminder letters for lawn maintenance and other violations, and an increase in modification applications. Also at the forefront of everyone's mind is the upcoming Annual Meeting of the Membership. This meeting will be held on Wednesday, May 10th at the clubhouse. We will again be using The Inspectors of Election online voting system for efficient and precise voting options. Be on the lookout for the official notice in the mail later this month.

With the thawing of the ground and the arrival of warmer temperatures, the association steps up inspections of exterior maintenance violations. These inspections ensure that the appearance of our beautiful neighborhood is maintained. In 2016 we generated 2,648 first notices. Please be aware the Association has the right of access over and through any portion of the Property (excluding the interior of the dwelling) for inspections, maintenance, and to correct violation. This right is granted to the Association, its managing agent, and any other person authorized by the Board of Directors in the exercise and discharge of their respective powers and responsibilities in Section 5.3(a) of the Declaration for Broadlands. Our Covenant Inspectors can be identified by the blue Nissan Versa inspection vehicle and carry ID on their person.

If your unit is in need of maintenance, you have been or will be notified via letter and given time to correct. If you are unable to correct in the time allotted, please be sure to contact the inspectors to request a reasonable extension to correct. If you do not correct the violation in the allotted time and, you will be sent follow up correspondence in accordance with state statute and our Policies and Procedures Regarding Violations of Governing Spring Inspections continued on page 17

Submissions may be emailed to *rcrews@broadlandshoa.com* or delivered to the Association office in the Nature Center, 21907 Claiborne Parkway. For your convenience, there is a drop box available for afterhours submissions.

Please review these guidelines and the updated changes on our website. Visit *broadlandshoa.org/for-residents/designguidelines/* for complete guidelines and information required to be submitted with your application, as failure to include all information will delay review of your application. A response to your application is generally sent within one week of the meeting.

HOW AM I NOTIFIED OF MY RESULTS?

The Modifications Subcommittee is using new software to process applications in order to increase efficiency and provide quicker response time to residents regarding the status of their modification applications. Once the Subcommittee has reached a decision, the results letter will be delivered via email. If an email is not provided, then the results letter will be mailed. There have been reports that some emails are being delivered to residents' junk/spam folder. Therefore, please check your inbox and junk/spam folders for your results letter or contact the HOA office at 703-729-9704.

MIND YOUR MODIFICATIONS - TREE REMOVAL REQUIRES APPROVAL

Broadlands was created with nature in mind. And we, as a community, take pride in preserving the environment. Trees are an integral part of the overall image and character of Broadlands and need to be protected. Trees that are located on lots, within woods, buffer easements, other natural areas such as tree save areas *may not be disturbed without approval*.

Submission for approval from the Modifications Subcommittee is required before removing any trees that are either deciduous or evergreen and whose trunk measures 4" or more in diameter when measured at a height of 4' from the ground. For removal of any ornamental tree such as a dogwood, holly or cherry larger than 2" in diameter, *approval must be obtained*. Before removing any trees please refer to the property plat to determine if the tree is located on your property. *If there are any landscape buffer easements on the property, approval to remove any tree must be obtained from the Association and Loudoun County*.

In general, the removal of trees will be approved by the subcommittee if the tree is dead **or** if there is a danger to people, the property or if a detrimental condition exists. A detrimental condition is determined when there are intrusions of roots or branches that may cause damage, the tree provides excessive shade or coverage, there is overgrowth, or the tree blocks views or sight lines. Once the tree has been removed, the stump(s) must be ground down below ground level and the area sodded or mulched.

- Forgot your waste bag? No worries! The Broadlands HOA has more mutt mitt stations to offer residents than any other surrounding community.
- Don't want to carry it with you? No problem, most of our mutt mitt stations have trash cans attached.

It's the law! Not only is it a violation of the Association Declaration, Article 8, Section 8.2(q) to not pick up your pet's waste, it is also a county ordinance violation. Please reference Loudoun County Ordinance, Chapter 612.19, Section a (9) Dog waste.

COVENANTS CORNER

Please Dispose of Debris, Yard Waste, etc. Properly

The covenants team has been finding personal items, structures, debris and yard waste placed in the common areas by residents. As a reminder, these common areas are Association property and nothing should be placed, removed or disposed of in these sections to change or interfere with the grounds in any way. This includes the regrading of common area land.

Article 8, Section 8.2: (e) of the Declaration "No person shall place or cause or permit anything to be placed on or in any of the Common Area. Nothing shall be altered or constructed in or removed from the Common Area..."

Please leave the common areas in a natural state. Thank you.

Covenant Inspectors regularly canvass our neighborhood to help preserve the property values for home ownership, to promote community harmony and to ensure the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained.

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors routinely inspect homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications, and leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections where violations may occur with high frequency.

DON'T PLAY IN THE STREETS - STREET PLAY IS NOT LEGAL OR SAFE



SPRING EGGSTRAVAGANZA



Hello Broadlands,

By the time this newsletter reaches you, we will be close to completing the budget process and setting tax rate. The budget has been presented to us, three public hearings have been held, and the Board has made its way through many work sessions. I am very conscious of the many needs of our citizens while also trying to be a good steward of your tax dollars. The Board of Supervisors will set the tax rate in a final vote on April 4th.

I'd also like to thank the nearly 650 individuals who have taken the Broad Run Survey. Your input is incredibly valuable to me and we have been digging into the results. Slurry Treatment on Broad Run **Roads**

VDOT has announced that they will be performing a Slurry Seal on many Broad Run roads especially roads in neighborhoods.

A slurry seal is the application of a mixture of water, asphalt emulsion, aggregate (very small crushed rock), and additives to an existing asphalt pavement surface. A slurry seal is similar to a fog seal except the slurry seal has aggregates as part of the mixture.

Innovation Avenue is Open

I had the pleasure of cutting the ribbon at the opening of Innovation Ave. This will pave the way for "The Hub" which will be a fantastic mixed-use community.

The model that we have here, for investing in infrastructure first before development, is something that we always talk about, it's something that we always say we wish would happen. It's happening here. \$23 million have already been invested in this project -- not in residential housing, not in townhouses, but in roads for Loudoun County, for the Town for Herndon, and for Fairfax County.

Scholarships for Loudoun Youth **Leadership Program**

Loudoun Youth Leadership Program is now accepting applications and requests for scholarships:

Due to the generosity of the Community

Impact Fund, and the Jack Kent Cook Foundation, Loudoun Youth Inc has scholarship funds for their Loudoun Youth Leadership program for high achieving, low income students. Loudoun Youth Leadership Program is a week-long leadership program designed to introduce youth to leadership concepts and to provide exposure and interaction with local business, government and community leaders. Youth spend productive and valuable time learning leadership skills in a classroom-type setting, but spend the majority of the week observing leadership in action with local business, government and community leaders. The program is open to high school students in Loudoun County. Classes are limited to 25 youth per week to encourage team building and provide a genuine experience in a small group setting. This year's sessions are July 10-14 and July 31-Aug 4.

IN THE GARDEN

Garden Centers Still Selling Invasive Plants

It's a rite of spring: that weekend trip to the garden center. Who doesn't enjoy perusing the aisles and imagining all those beautiful displays of plants growing in our own yards? And if it's being sold at the garden center it must be okay, right? Well, not necessarily. Some popular landscape plants have been identified as invasive by the National Forest Service and other organizations, yet they're still being sold to consumers. An invasive plant is one that escapes the area where it was planted and begins to grow aggressively in natural areas, often outcompeting native plants that wildlife and insects need for their survival. Here are just a few examples.

Japanese Barberry (Berberis thunbergii)

The seeds of this popular shrub are spread by birds, and quickly grow into dense thickets in forests, crowding out native plants. Scientists

have also recently learned that Japanese barberry is the perfect host plant for ticks, and areas where barberry is present have significantly higher numbers of the pest.

Native Alternatives: Ninebark (Physocarpus opulifolius), Winterberry holly (*Ilex verticillata*), Bush honeysuckle (Diervilla lonicera). Blueberries (Vaccinium spp.)

Nandina/Sacred Bamboo (Nandina domestica)

It's no surprise that Nandina is a popular landscape plant with its beautiful fall foliage and bunches of bright red winter berries. Unfortunately, Nandina has naturalized and invaded local habitats, displacing native species and disrupting plant communities. The berries are also highly toxic to birds, cats and some grazing animals. Native Alternatives: Virginia sweetspire (Itea virginica), Wax myrtle (Morella cerifera), Coralberry (Symphoricarpos orbiculatus)

Japanese Honeysuckle (Lonicera iaponica)

Japanese honeysuckle is a dense evergreen to semi evergreen vine with attractive creamy white flowers.

Birds eat the fruit of this plant, which has allowed it to spread throughout the Northeast. In the wild, shrubs and young trees can be killed by girdling when its vines twist tightly around stems and trunks. Dense growths of this plant also gradually kill other vegetation by blocking sunlight from reaching their leaves.

Native Alternatives: Trumpet creeper (Campsis radicans), Coral honeysuckle (*Lonicera sempervirens*)

There are many groups working hard to educate the public about the threat posed by invasive plants.

Documents, which could include additional violation letters, a Hearing before the Board of Directors, and the potential for violation charges as high as \$900 assessed against your account. The intent is not to assess charges, but to compel compliance in order to maintain property values. The charges are a deterrent and help to offset of expenses incurred by staff time, printing, and postage for generating violation letters. Though it is not the preferred method, the association also has the ability to file a suit in General District Court to request a favorable ruling from a judge.

As a reminder, lot owners must obtain written approval from the Modifications Subcommittee *prior* to the commencement of all changes or improvements on or visible from the exterior of your unit. The Modifications Subcommittee meets the first and third Wednesday of the month from March through November and meets only the third Wednesday of the month during their slower season. In 2016, the subcommittee reviewed 780 applications for improvements. Please note the deadline for application submissions is noon on the Thursday before the meeting in order to ensure time for processing applications. All applications must be complete before they will be forwarded to the committee. The Design Guidelines and application are available online at www. broadlandshoa.org. If you have any questions regarding this process, please contact Robin Crews, Secretary to the Modifications Subcommittee at rcrews@broadlandshoa. com or 703-729-9704.

If you are planning sell your home this year, you will need to provide the contract purchaser with a resale disclosure package within 14 days of contract execution. Resale packages can be ordered online through FirstService Residential at https://fsresidential.com/washington-dc/ home. Click on "Order Documents and Certificates" on the top left of the page and follow directions. If you are purchasing or refinancing your unit and your lender requires a PUD questionnaire, you do not need to order these through FSR. Forms are completed by Broadlands staff for a \$50 fee. Please contact 703-729-9704 or joannehang@broadlandshoa.com to submit your form and arrange for payment. Please ensure that you have obtained written approval from the Modifications Subcommittee for all exterior modifications prior to requesting resale disclosure packages.

Now that we are approaching April, suddenly spring is in the air. We slowly start to crave that warmer weather and sunshine. With the warmer weather comes a new variety of fresh fruits and vegetables that become easily accessible to us at our grocery stores and the local farmers markets. I really believe that everything in the universe has its place and things are what they are for a reason. So we should follow the same thinking when it comes to the food on our plate! There are so many benefits to eating in season that hopefully will inspire you to visit our local farmers markets or experiment with growing some of your own food.

First off food that is grown in season iust has so much more taste and flavor than it does when you find it out of season. When produce is ripened in the sun it not only tastes amazing it has so much color! Plants get their nourishment from the sun and soil, so it makes sense that we enjoy the produce when it is naturally ready for us to pick. Seasonally fresh produce also has more antioxidants because it has grown to its fullest from the sun.

Another benefit from eating seasonally is the cost, especially when feeding a large family. When we are buying our watermelon and tomatoes in the summer they are much cheaper than buying them out of season. This allows us to choose how much salt and the type of oils and seasonings we want to use. When we are cooking our own food, we

will create a healthier lifestyle for ourselves and our family. It is a great way to get kids involved as well. They can come with you and pick out the seasonal vegetables and fruits they want to eat for the week. You can even go a step further and have the kids help cook a couple of the family's meals. 

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

Pool Season Begins May 27th... Do You Know Where Your Pool Passes Are?

It's time to start digging around in the bottom of your pool bag or in the drawer with the swimsuits for your **Broadlands Photo ID Pool Passes.** Everyone aged 5 and older will need one to gain admission to the pools. If you are 18 or older, you must provide proof of residency in order to obtain a pool pass. IF YOU ARE AN OWNER AND HAVE THE POOL PASSES YOU USED LAST YEAR, YOU DO NOT NEED TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION. Passes will be electronically reactivated. If you cannot locate your passes, replacements can be issued free of charge during the month of April. Beginning May 1st, reprints will cost \$5.00 each. If you want a new picture for your replacement pass, the cost is \$7.00, regardless of when the pass is issued. Children whose passes have not been updated in the last five (5) years should be brought in for an updated photo at no charge. Any individual who has turned 18 since the last pool season will need a new adult pass, provided free of charge, and will be required to bring proof of residency.

All applications and forms referenced in this notice can be found in this newsletter, online at www.broadlandshoa.org under pool information, or at the HOA office located in the Nature Center.

New Owners: You must complete an "Owner - 2017 Pool Membership Application", return it to the HOA office at the Nature Center and have your photos taken to be issued pool passes. Pool passes are issued to each individual aged 5 and older living in the household. A household consists of all persons living in the dwelling, including college students, other non-resident children spending the swim season in Broadlands and live-in care providers or others showing proof of residency in the form of a valid driver's license or other government issued ID or utility bill.

Tenants (new and existing): If an owner wishes to transfer their pool rights over to their tenant, then the owner must complete the "Absentee Owner Statement (AOS) - Facilities Use Agreement for Tenants" form and submit it along with the lease to the HOA office. Tenants must then complete and sign the "Tenant - 2017 Pool Membership Application" form for membership. In this instance, passes will only be issued to the tenants; not the owners. Existing tenants with AOS forms on file may use previously issued passes, but will only be valid through the lease date. If a lease date has expired and will be renewed, it is the tenant/owner responsibility to complete a new AOS form and submit it along with a copy of the new lease to the HOA office.

Children: Children who have turned 5 years old since last summer, or will be 5 years old by June 1, 2017, must have a pool pass for the upcoming pool season. A pool application must be filled out and a picture taken so a pass can be issued. Please return completed pool applications to the HOA office at the Nature Center to add your child(ren) to your family data base. Children under 5 years old may obtain a pool pass in order to bring in guests to the pool. This will allow our 5 and under members the opportunities to have an older guest accompany them when other family members are not available.

Long-Term Guest Passes: Long-Term Guess Passes are offered to allow visiting guests to use the pools unaccompanied by residents. The cost for the entire 2017 season is \$100 per person. This price will reduce on July 1 to \$75 per person and again on August 1 to \$50 per person. They should be noted as a long-term guest on the pool application. The fee must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass is issued. The resident member must accompany the long-term guest to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Guest passes: 10 resident guest passes are allocated to each residence. Additional guest passes, good for 10 visits, may be purchased for \$20. Members are limited to bringing 3 guests per member per visit to the pool. Guest passes are added to the electronic account of each residence and no physical passes will be issued. Guests must be accompanied by a pool pass holder to gain admittance to the pool facility. Rules regarding the use of guest passes can be found online at www.broadlandshoa.org.

Pictures: Beginning April 3, 2017, pictures will be taken at the nature center from 9:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday on a first come first served basis. Walk-in applications will not be processed for same day delivery if received after 4:30pm. In order to expedite lines and shorten your wait time, you may submit your application in advance via email to info@broadlandshoa.com or mail/hand delivery to 21907 Claiborne Parkway or fax to 703-729-9733.

Proof of Residency: Prior to having a photo taken, all adults 18 and older must show a photo ID with proof residency at a Broadlands Association residential address. Photos will not be taken if acceptable proof of identity and address are not available.
