

Monthly meetings are held in the conference room of the Clubhouse on the second Tuesday of the month at 6:00pm.




BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following actions were taken by the Board of Directors at their meeting held on June 14th, 2016:

• Approved minutes of May 12, 2016 meeting

Pets, Pets, and More Pets

Broadlands is proud to be a pet friendly community, and we're happy that fourlegged family members are part of our community. Many residents get endless joy from their four legged counterparts. Hard as it may be to believe, your furry friend may become your neighbors' enemy if you don't take steps to ensure that their habits don't have a negative impact on others.



It's important that these pets don't create an unpleasant environment for everyone else. To avoid unnecessary disputes and potential rule violations, here are some recommendations to ensure your furry friends continue to be a welcome addition to the neighborhood.

Stop That Barking!

The HOA receives numerous complaints throughout the year that residents allow their canines to bark incessantly. Pets will be noisy from time to time. However, when loud barking becomes an annoyance, it's time to help your pet become less talkative. First, try to find out what causes your pets to get vocal: Do they get noisy when they've been alone and bored all day and need some playtime? Have they gone through a stressful change in environment recently? Are they suffering from health issues? Do they simply like saying "hello" to every squirrel, person or car that passes by? When you've identified the cause, take remedial actions such as confining them to an area where they feel calm while you're away, removing or blocking as many stimuli as possible, exercising them more and spending more time with them. You can also take them to a professional or search online for tips on how to train your pets not to get too noisy. Here are some additional ways to help abate the barking nuisance:

• Training. Always the first recommendation for any behavioral problem! Help is as close as the internet. Training not only helps your dog, you'll be surprised how much it helps you, too. You may get some insight into why yourdog barks so much, or what it is trying to communicate. See Pets on page 7

- Citronella collars. A humane alternative to the electric-shock. anti-barking collar and costs about the same. Available on the web and in pet stores.
- Confinement. Sometimes simply bringing an outspoken dog indoors or confining it to a crate can cut down on the disturbance to neighbors.
- Reduce stimulus. Close drapes to help muffle street noise, or leave a radio on to mask it. Disconnect telephones and doorbells before leaving your home if they upset your dog or make it bark.
- Companionship. Dogs are pack animals; they need companionship—a cat, bird, or another dog. Consider a mid-day visit from a pet-sitting service, or drop your pooch off at a friend's place or a day-care facility once or twice a week.

Scoop The Poop!

American pet owners collectively spend tens of millions of dollars every year on veterinary care and over-the-counter medicines for their furry loved ones. But what many don't realize is that many pet illnesses can be avoided by simply keeping the back yard clear of pet waste.

Dog waste is more than just a smelly and unsightly mess. It's also a breeding ground for infection—especially in dog parks and other areas where dogs frequently gather. Bacteria, worms and other parasites thrive in the waste until it's cleaned up or washed into the water supply. Giardia, ringworm, roundworm and E. coli are examples of such inhabitants, all of which are commonly found in dog feces and are easily transferable upon contact.

When pets become sick, contagions are often times passed through their deposits into their own yard. The longer infected dog waste stays on the ground,

the greater a contamination becomes. And when this waste is not picked up, pets have a high risk of catching the infection over and over again. Roundworm, for example, is one of the most common parasites found in dog waste and it can remain infectious in contaminated soil and water for years.

The best thing pet owners can do to help keep their four-legged friends healthy and safe is to pick up after them and to do so in a timely manner. Those who don't have enough time to deal with the mess themselves—or simply don't want to—should consider hiring a local pet waste removal service.

Some neighbors don't want your dogs on their property even if you are a diligent pooper scooper. Be mindful of your neighbor's property and try to keep your dog off it when possible. Urine can be difficult to clean up and can cause yellow spots on turf.

Love 'Em and Leash 'Em!

According to the U.S. Humane Society, an unleashed dog has an average life span of less than four years. Allowing your dog to run free is not only against the law, but it also threatens your dog's health and welfare and the happiness it brings to you. Your neighbors likely don't like to call animal control, but they won't have any choice if your dog is running free. Dogs can unexpectedly dart into oncoming traffic and I've witnessed the very unfortunate premature demise of a dog being hit by a car here in Broadlands.

Additionally, loose dogs can be a danger to other dogs. Perhaps your dog is always friendly and approaches another (leashed dog) to say hello. If the other dog is not comfortable having their space invaded, they may become aggressive as your loose dog gets too close to them, causing a dangerous

situation for the dogs and their handlers. Or maybe your dog is out enjoying a stroll on the path with you without a leash (or with one that is unattached to a human) and a person approaches from the other direction. You and your dog have no idea, but this person is terrified of canines. Your dog goes up for a friendly greeting and the person is crippled with fear.

We hope you and Fido have a safe and enjoyable summer, and that your neighbors are able to enjoy the community as well without interference or irritation from your fur baby. Cheers,

SAVE YOURSELF TIME, MONEY AND AGGRAVATION

Before you make any modification, change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Don't be misled by well meaning friends, neighbors or contractors. It is the owner's responsibility to file an application for all exterior work. A county permit does not circumvent this requirement. The process is easy if you apply before work commences.

What can happen if you don't submit an application? You may be ordered to cease and desist, which might cause your contractor to charge additional money for delays in completion. You may have to appear before the Board of Directors at a violation hearing. You may be assessed a fee of up to \$900, which will be added to your account and to which late fees, attorney fees, and court costs can be charged if payment is not made. You may be taken to General District Court for a judge to hear the case and determine the penalty. You may lose your recreational and voting privileges. You might have difficulty selling your home if violations are noted in the resale package which you provide to your buyer.

Please consult the Design Guidelines on the website for detailed information. Submit a complete application package in order to obtain approval prior to beginning any work. The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality throughout the community, to promote sensitivity for the natural environment and to encourage consistency of design while allowing flexibility for achieving design solutions. JULY COVENANTS CORNER

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors inspect the homes in the community for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in view to parking issues and unapproved modifications to leftover holiday decor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular violations that occur with high frequency.

During the month of June, the Inspectors will be focusing on lawns in need of weeding. Lot owners and residents are required to keep their properties free of excessive weeds, overgrown or unsightly shrubbery or other plant growth, with detailed guidelines outlined in the Procedures and Standards Relating to Yard and Lawn Maintenance (see For Homeowners>Rules and Regulations on the website). This resolution was adopted by the Board of Directors for the benefit and protection of all owners in order to ensure that all lot owners maintain their yards and lawns in a neat and orderly condition.

Lawn maintenance violations include: excessive weeds, overgrown or unsightly shrubbery or other plant growth in turf areas and mulch beds. Dead plants and shrubs.

If these conditions are noted, a Warning and Hearing Opportunityletter will be issued to the property owner, providing ten days to correct the issue. If the violation is not corrected within ten days and a Hearing is not requested, the HOA or its contractor will enter the lot and correct the violation, and the resulting repair costs as well as an administrative fee will be charged back to the owners' account.

If you have questions regarding this process, or if you receive one of these letters and are unable to correct in the time allotted, you may contact the covenants inspectors at covenants@broadlandshoa.com to request a reasonable extension to rectify the issue.



Happy July Broadlands!

As your summer begins, our County government is working hard for you. We are kicking off the new comprehensive plan and new road projects such as Sterling Blvd Extended which will be the first leg of a Greenway Alternative to eventually connect to Shellhorn Road, opening new roads including the Gloucester Parkway and Russell Branch Parkway extensions (both are scheduled to open at the end of July!), and helping new businesses open throughout the Broad Run District.

Metro has been in the news a lot recently regarding the hiring of their new general manager and CEO, Paul J. Wiedefeld, and the implementation of his Safe Track program, which will bolster Metro's safety system-wide. This month I would like to give you an update on a presentation he recently delivered to the Loudoun Board of Supervisors.

Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Update from Paul Wiedefeld

On Tuesday, June 7th, Paul Wiedefeld from the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) presented an update on the future of Metro to the Loudoun Board of Supervisors. Paul's update provided useful insight into the new culture behind Metro and the changes that are underway. As the Phase 2 metro stops continue to be built. Mr. Wiedefeld is committed to making Metro safer and much more reliable. In fact, during his presentation to the Board, he informed us that he has taken 3 years' worth of work and has compressed it into one year - this is being done through the Safe Track program.

The Safe Track program is a year-long



extensive maintenance program that will provide sorely needed improvements, fixes, and complete overhauls to many parts of the current Metro system. This plan will mean single tracking and delays on Metro for the next year, but it is completely necessary to make sure that Metro is safe and reliable, especially as it makes its way into Loudoun. The single tracking or "surges" began on June 4th and most of the safety improvement timelines are anywhere between one to three weeks per improvement area. The surges on the Silver Line will allow for a train to operate in 18 minute intervals, instead of the normal 6 minute intervals. In addition to the Safe Track program, Mr. Wiedefeld addressed the Loudoun Board on other issues including Metro's finances, employment changes, and possible future problems such as choke points in the system. Currently, the

federal government only contributes monetary funds to Metro's capital budget, not operating expenses, even though more than half of the federal employees who work in Washington D.C. commute by way of Metro. This is while every other jurisdiction who is served by metro pays for both capital and operating expenses.

As someone who commutes to D.C. almost daily for my job, I used to use metro as my transportation into the district, now I take the long haul commuter bus. One of the main reasons that I opted for the bus was because of the choke point at Rosslyn Tunnel. With the extension of the Silver Line to Loudoun, six stations are being introduced to a system that already has backups in the Rosslyn Tunnel. This is also a concern to Mr. Wiedefeld and one which he said should be addressed in Metro's capital needs assessment.

Right now, Metro needs system-wide reforms. It has many flaws and will take time to fix the system, but I am remaining optimistic about the future of Metro as it builds its way out to Ashburn - especially with Mr. Wiedefeld at the helm. It will bring in some very unique economic opportunities to continue to help make Loudoun a dynamic and exciting place to live and do business.





IN THE GARDEN

July Garden Chores...Will the List Never End? By Nancy Caldwell

Virginia Cooperative Extension Loudoun County Master Gardener



July marks the first full month of summer, and that lawn and garden todo list just keeps growing. While you may be ready to throw in the trowel, grab a cold beverage and head for the hammock, a little diligence now will pay big dividends come fall.

Make a habit of walking your property each week and tackling weeds before they get out of hand. Top off mulch where needed to suppress weeds and retain moisture. Lawns and gardens need an inch of water each week to thrive, so use a rain gauge to determine whether it's time to supplement Mother Nature. Remember, containers dry out much quicker and need watering more frequently, as much as twice daily in especially hot weather, so be vigilant.

Be on the lookout for those dreaded Japanese beetles. While not for the squeamish, beetles can be picked off of plants in the morning when they're less active, and drowned in soapy water. Tomato hornworms, squash bugs, Colorado potato beetles and cabbage worms can be managed the same way: handpick early each morning, and destroy.

Prune any dead, damaged or diseased wood as soon as they occur in trees and shrubs. Suckers - those little shoots that sprout up from the base of plants - should also be promptly removed. Evergreen shrubs like euonymus can still be pruned to maintain their shape, but by July 4th spring flowering shrubs like lilacs and

viburnums have reached the end of their pruning window. Prune now and you risk losing next year's flower buds. While most roses should only be pruned in later winter or early spring, the popular Knockout roses that bloom all season can be pruned until late summer. In fact, you'll encourage flowering and keep the plant dense and compact.

If you're still motivated after all that, why not plan now for a fall veggie garden? Carrots, kale, broccoli, greens and lettuces, to name a few, can all be planted in late summer for a fall harvest. Herbs like cilantro and basil can also be planted now and enjoyed until first frost.



MAKING PIES IN JULY!

Marilyn Batali's Blackberry Pie

Prep time: 30 minutes Cook time: 1 hour 15 minutes

Filling

2 pints blackberries (1 1/2 pounds)

1/2 cup sugar

3 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice

1 tablespoon cold unsalted butter, cut into cubes

Crust

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 cup solid vegetable shortening, chilled

5 tablespoons ice water

For the crust, whisk the flour, sugar and salt in a large bowl. Add the shortening and, using a pastry blender or 2 knives, cut it into the flour until the mixture resembles coarse meal. Add the ice water and stir with a fork until the dough is moistened. Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured work surface and gather it into a ball. Knead the dough 2 or 3 times, just until it comes together. Divide in half; flatten each piece into a disk. Wrap each disk in plastic and refrigerate until chilled, at least 1 hour. Preheat the oven to 375°. Let the dough stand at room temperature for 10 minutes. Working on a lightly floured surface, roll out one disk of dough to a 12-inch round. Transfer to a 9-inch glass pie plate. Roll out the remaining dough to an 11-inch round. For the filling, stir the blackberries with the sugar, flour and lemon juice, lightly mashing a few berries in a bowl; scrape into the prepared pie crust and sprinkle the butter cubes on top. Brush the overhanging pastry with water and carefully set the top crust over the berry filling. Press the edges of the dough together and trim the overhang to 1 inch. Fold the edge under itself and crimp decoratively. Cut 4 slits in the top crust. Bake the pie in the center of the oven for 1 hour and 15 minutes, until the bottom crust is golden and the fruit is bubbling. If necessary, cover the edge with foil for the last few minutes of baking. Let the pie cool for at least 4 hours before serving. www.foodandwine.com

Old Fashioned Raspberry Pie

Prep time: 30 minutes Cook time: 35 minutes

Crust

3 cup flour

1 cup lard or shortening

1 teaspoon salt

1 egg

1 tablespoon vinegar

very cold water, about 1/4 cup

Filling

3-4 cups favorite brand of raspberries (3-6oz packages)

1 1/4 cup sugar

4 tablespoon flour

1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

2 tablespoons butter



For the crust, mix together the flour and salt in a large bowl. Chop the butter into 1/4" pieces and toss into the flour. Using two knives or a pastry cutter, cut the butter into the flour until pea sized pieces remain. Mix together the egg and vinegar in a glass measuring cup. It should be around 1/4 cup all mixed together. Now add the very cold water until it makes 1/2 cup. Slowly add a few tablespoons at a time to the flour mixture and using a fork, whisk into the flour. Mix until the dough comes together and pulls together when you squeeze it into a fist. Cut the dough ball into two pieces. Lay a little saran wrap out and place each piece of dough on the plastic wrap, and wrap tightly. Place in the freezer for 20-30 minutes to rest. Roll the dough out on a lightly floured surface. Gently place the rolling pin at one end of the dough and pull the edge up over the pin and roll over the remaining dough so it's wrapped around the rolling pin. Carefully unroll the dough over a pie dish, lifting the edges and allowing the dough to fall into the bottom of the plate rather than stretching and pushing it into place. For the filling, combine sugar, flour, cinnamon and berries in mixing bowl. Fold gently to combine. Pour into pastry and dot with 2 tbsp. Butter. Place top pastry over berries and seal and cut slits in top. (Brush top with a little milk for golden brown color and sprinkle with cinnamon sugar.) Bake at 450 for 10 minutes and then reduce temp to 375 for 20-25 minutes. Allow to cool before slicing. www.ohsweetbasil.com



TID BITS OF THIS AND THAT

Every day, over 300 children ages 0 to 19 are treated in emergency rooms for

burn-related injuries, according to the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. While most people understand that it's necessary to go to the emergency room if you have been burned by a fire, it may be less clear how to treat common household burns from touching something hot or from steam, hot liquids, or other cooking or heatrelated accidents. Children aren't the only ones who can be burned in these situations.

Burns can be categorized as first-degree, second-degree or third-degree. A firstdegree burn, like a sunburn, involves just the top layer of skin. These burns will appear red and will be painful to the touch. For these milder burns, the most important thing to do is to run the area of the burn under cold water right away. Cold water is unbelievably effective at sucking the heat out of the burned skin, and it can help wash away hot oils or other liquids so they can't do further damage. Cool compresses or wet cloths also may feel good against your burned skin. You can take over-the-counter ibuprofen for pain and inflammation relief but do not use any ointments,

butter or other home remedies as these could cause infection. These injuries

> generally get better on their own within a few days.

A second-degree burn involves the first two layers of skin; it may appear deep red, or blisters may develop, and the burn may cause some skin loss. A thirddegree burn can penetrate several layers of skin and permanently destroy tissue.

Never attempt to treat serious burns yourself; instead, make sure to call 911 or come to the emergency room. We can prescribe medications for pain, assess and treat some burns (including draining blisters), or refer patients to a burn specialist if necessary.

If you're unsure of the nature of your burn, or you have any of the following symptoms, come to the emergency room for evaluation. Be extra cautious with infants and toddlers and with older adults, whose skin is thinner and are at greater risk of injury:

- burns that cross over a joint, such as over the wrist or fingers
- burns that go all the way around an arm or leg
- burns to the face or genitals
- burns covering a large area

There are a number of steps you can take to reduce the risk of a burn:

Never leave cooking unattended. Cook on the back burners and turn the pot handles inward. Stand back when removing a lid from a hot pot or pan, and always use oven mitts when taking dishes out of the oven.



- Keep your stovetop and oven clean; the buildup of grease or crumbs can cause fires.
- 3. Allow food to cool before removing it from a microwave. Remove container lids carefully to prevent steam burns, stir food thoroughly before eating it.
- Keep hot liquids out of the reach of children. Put coffee cups or soup bowls toward the middle of the table.
- To prevent scalding in the bathroom, set hot water heaters at 120 degrees. Keep bath water temperatures for children lower, no more than 101 degrees.
- Keep space heaters at least three feet away from anything that can burn. Keep children and pets away from the heaters, and don't leave them unattended.
- 7. Use outdoor grills a good distance from buildings, plants/trees or anything else that can catch on fire. Don't add lighter fluid once the fire has started, and watch children and pets carefully.

LCSO SAFETY TIPS

LCSO Reminds Residents to Lock Vehicles After Vehicle Tamperings in Sterling & Ashburn

The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office is reminding residents to secure their vehicles and remove valuable items after a rash of larcenies from vehicles and vehicle tamperings in the Sterling and Ashburn areas of the county.

Recently multiple vehicles were entered on Weatherburn Terrace, Wake Terrace, Warburton Bay Square, Woodboro Terrace, Woolcott Square, Sound Square and Willoughby Square in Sterling. In Ashburn, a juvenile and an adult male were apprehended on May 21 after they were discovered entering unlocked cars in the area of Mandalay Court. In all of the cases the vehicles were entered without any signs of force or physical damage, and were believed to be left unlocked.

In light of these thefts, the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention Unit is offering residents several tips for deterring thefts from vehicles:

- KEEP YOUR VEHICLE LOCKED. Most stolen items are taken from vehicles that are left unlocked.
- Remove all items from your vehicle, including garage door openers, when not in use. When you cannot do this, put the items out of sight (inside a lockable glove box or trunk). If your vehicle has an integrated garage door opener, please try to park your vehicle in the garage.
- Park inside your garage, if available, and keep the garage locked. Or, try to park in a well-lit area.

The Crime Prevention Unit also encourages residents to register your valuable items with the manufacturer and document and record your properties' make, model and serial numbers through Operation Inventory, a prevention based program intended to help curb thefts taking place in Loudoun County. Thieves often depend on citizens to not have key information about their belongings. Information such as serial numbers, model numbers, make and model information are key pieces of information that law enforcement uses to recover and identify stolen property. These key pieces of information help law enforcement quickly identify stolen property and aid in the prosecution of the offenders. The form can be downloaded at http:// sheriff.loudoun.gov/operation-inventory.

Residents are also reminded to report any suspicious activity immediately by calling the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office non-emergency number at 703-777-1021.

LCSO Reminds Residents of County Ordinances Regarding Peddlers and Solicitors

The warmer weather brings an increase in door-to-door solicitors to our area. While some door-to-door salespersons are honest, the chance does exist that you may be taken advantage of if you are not cautious and informed.

All solicitors that operate inside the county are required to register with the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office per County Ordinance 828.04, except any person that is affiliated with non-profit organization registered in Virginia, places of worship, and community services. As part of this registration, a background check is completed and information on their employer is obtained. Through this process, anyone approved to solicit is issued an identification card showing they are a registered solicitor. All solicitors are required, upon request, to provide their identification card to any person they are contacting as a solicitor. This identification card shall contain the following information:

- (1) The permit number;
- (2) The name and address of the applicant;
- (3) The date the permit was issued and the date of expiration;
- (4) The name and address of the employer or principal;
- (5) A physical description (height, weight, color of hair and eyes, complexion) and the date of birth of the applicant and the presence and location of marks and scars on the applicant;
- (6) The signature of the County Sheriff; and
- (7) A brief description of the nature of the business and the goods to be sold.

In addition to registering, all solicitors must uphold a code of conduct (County Ordinance 828.08). If a solicitor is found in violation of this code, their privileges will be revoked and they will not be authorized to solicit within Loudoun County for a period of one year.

Solicitation hours in the county are weekday 9:00am to 9pm. Soliciting is not permitted on Sunday's or state or national holidays. Solicitors must leave when asked by the property owner. Solicitors must conduct themselves in a lawful and orderly manner and must identify themselves and their purpose of being on the property.




