CALL FOR CANDIDATES

The most important meeting of the year will be held on Wednesday, May 10th at 7pm at the Broadlands Clubhouse – The Annual Meeting of the Membership. This meeting, held every year in order to elect the Board of Directors, is required by the Bylaws for Broadlands Association, Inc. and the quorum requirement is at least ten percent of the total number of votes of the



association must be present in person or by proxy. You will receive official notification of this meeting via USPS mail around April 1.

Included in this publication is the Call for Candidates, inviting you to get involved by volunteering to serve on the Board of Directors. Please take time to review this information and consider submitting your candidate application to serve your community. If the monthly Board commitment seems too great, consider helping out with one of our fantastic committees instead!

Some of the powers and duties of the Board include: providing goods and services in accordance with the documents and providing for the upkeep of the common area; designating, hiring, and dismissing personnel necessary to provide for the upkeep of the common area and goods and services; collecting and depositing assessments; adopting and amending rules and regulations; opening bank accounts; enforcing provisions of the documents; obtaining and carrying insurance; paying for authorized goods and services; charging reasonable fees for the use of the common area; suspending the right of an owner or occupant to vote or to use common areas; preparing and adopting an annual budget and establishing assessments; borrowing money on behalf of the association; and employing a managing agent. The full list of powers and duties can be found in the Bylaws for Broadlands.

The Articles of Incorporation provide that the Board be comprised of nine people elected to serve in staggered terms of three years. Eligible Board Members include owners, *See Candidates on page 7*

A response to your application is generally sent within one week of the meeting.

MIND YOUR MODIFICATIONS - TREE REMOVAL REQUIRES APPROVAL

Broadlands was created with nature in mind. And we, as a community, take pride in preserving the environment. Trees are an integral part of the overall image and character of Broadlands and need to be protected. Trees that are located on lots, within woods, buffer easements, other natural areas such as tree save areas *may not be disturbed without approval*.

Submission for approval from the Modifications Subcommittee is required before removing any trees that are either deciduous or evergreen and whose trunk measures 4" or more in diameter when measured at a height of 4' from the ground. For removal of any ornamental tree such as a dogwood, holly or cherry larger than 2" in diameter, *approval must be obtained*. Before removing any trees please refer to the property plat to determine if the tree is located on your property. *If there are any landscape buffer easements on the property, approval to remove any tree must be obtained from the Association and Loudoun County*.

In general, the removal of trees will be approved by the subcommittee if the tree is dead **or** if there is a danger to people, the property or if a detrimental condition exists. A detrimental condition is determined when there are intrusions of roots or branches that may cause damage, the tree provides excessive shade or coverage, there is overgrowth, or the tree blocks views or sight lines. Once the tree has been removed, the stump(s) must be ground down below ground level and the area sodded or mulched.

COVENANTS CORNER Trash and Recycling in Public View and Fencing Issues

During the month of March, the Inspectors will be focusing on two issues: homes with trash and recycling bins left out in public view on non-collection days and homes with fencing issues. Article 8, Section 8.2 (i) of the Declaration states that trash containers shall not be permitted to remain in public view from the Common Area or another Lot Except on days of trash collection. Containers are not permitted to be stored on the driveway, in front of the garage, on the side or back of the house, unless approved screening has been applied for and installed per the Design Guidelines. Containers may be put out at sundown the evening before pickup and should be put out of view by the end of the day of pickup. If a violation is noted for trash cans, the owner will be mailed a letter providing ten days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional seven day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a Hearing Notice is sent and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$50 per occurrence. Repeat offenders may be assessed \$50 per occurrence if the containers are left in view.

Article 7, section 7.2 of the Declarations for Broadlands states "Each Owner shall keep such Owner's Lot and all improvements located on the lot in good order, condition and repair." Fencing must be maintained in such a way that it is safe and visually appealing. Fencing that is leaning, has broken, bent, or missing boards, discoloration or mildew, or other damage should be repaired in order to maintain the integrity and visual appearance of the community. If a violation of this nature is noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing sixty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent. If you have questions regarding this process, or if you receive one of these letters and are unable to correct in the time allotted, you may contact the covenants inspectors at covenants@broadlandshoa.com to request a reasonable extension to rectify the issue.

Covenant Inspectors regularly canvass our neighborhood to help preserve the property values for home ownership, to promote community harmony and to ensure the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained.

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors routinely inspect homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications, and leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections where violations may occur with high frequency.



Dear Broadlands Homeowner:

The 2017 Annual Meeting of the members of Broadlands Association will be held on Wednesday, May 10, 2017. Please mark your calendars for this important meeting and plan to attend. The purpose of the meeting is to elect members to the Board of Directors, including three (3) members to serve three year terms expiring May 2020. The Board oversees the business of Broadlands in the collection and expenditure of association funds, selection of contractors, management of facilities, and adoption of policies for the day-to-day operations. These volunteer Board Members are a vital asset to the association.

To become a Director, you must be a Unit Owner in good standing. The Board currently meets monthly on the second Tuesday of the month at 6:00pm in the Broadlands Clubhouse.

If you are interested in serving, please complete a Nominating Form and Petition for Candidacy and return both documents to the Broadlands Association, Inc. office by 5:00pm on **Friday**, **March 24th**, **2017**. Only the attached Elections Committee approved nomination forms may be used. If you would like an electronic copy, check broadlandshoa.org or request one at sarah@broadlandshoa.com.

The Broadlands Association, Inc. Bylaws require that at least three other owners sign the Candidate Petition, which must be received by the Association no less than twenty five (25) days before the Annual Meeting to be eligible to be included on the Ballot. All members will be mailed a proxy form containing the names of all eligible candidates with the official notice of the Annual Meeting.

As in prior years, the Board has contracted with The Inspectors of Election, LLC to act as an independent third party election service. This provides the Association's members the option to vote via paper Proxy Ballots or vote your Proxy online via their **TIE***i***VOTE**[™] voting website. The online system offers you an easy way to vote in a secure, quick and cost-effective manner.

The Inspectors of Election will mail the official annual meeting notice and election package on or about April 1st, 2017, which will contain unique login information for each unit to access the **TIE***i***VOTE**[™] voting website. Proxies should either be submitted online via the voting website or will need to be mailed, faxed, or scanned to the Inspectors of Election, LLC. Proxy forms will <u>not</u> be accepted at the HOA Office.

For those of you that submit for candidacy in the election, we thank you for your willingness to assist in the success of your community. Remember to mark your calendars for Wednesday, May 10th, 2017 for the Annual Meeting of Broadlands Association, Inc.

This survey will be available for the next couple of months, so please share it with your friends and neighbors. Once we have had a chance to take a look at the results, we will report back to you. The information we will get from this survey will help me represent the Broad Run District as accurately as possible.

Budget season is rapidly approaching. I will be sending out a budget-specific update once we receive the official budget proposal. Until then, please feel free to reach out to my office with any issues or questions you may have about the budget process.

Transportation Updates: CTB Proposes \$81M for Loudoun Transportation Projects

The Commonwealth Transportation Board has released its Smart Scale ratings for transportation projects around the state in fiscal year 2018, including a recommendation to send \$81 million to seven Loudoun projects.

The Loudoun projects include intersection improvements at Waxpool



Road and Loudoun County Parkway; a park and ride lot; construction of Arcola Boulevard between Rt. 50 and Rt. 606; acquisition of transit buses; funding for the Rt. 7/Rt. 690 interchange and improvements to the Rt. 7/Rt. 287 interchange; and construction of Westwind Drive between Loudoun County Parkway and Rt. 606.

Route 772 Connector Bridge

Design and construction of a bridge over the Greenway to connect the north and south side of the Route 772/Ashburn Rail stations. Stage 1 bridge plans have been submitted to VDOT; preliminary engineering underway. Baseline schedule established; construction completion planned for Winter 2018.

Route 28 Hot Spot Improvements Southbound

Addition of a 4th lane on the southbound lanes between Sterling Boulevard and the Dulles Toll Road; includes widening of bridges over the Toll Road. Construction on the expansion of the Northbound and Southbound bridge deck over the Dulles Toll Road is underway. Construction on the southbound widening to eight lanes from Sterling Boulevard to the Dulles Greenway began in September, 2016. Traffic barriers and maintenance of traffic signs have been installed. Environmental permits have been secured, the project is under construction. Surface asphalt was completed from south of Sterling Boulevard to the Dulles Toll Road. Completion is scheduled for Summer 2017.

George Washington Boulevard Overpass

Design and construction of a bridge over Route 7 between Research Place and Russell Branch Parkway. Back in 2015 a scoping meeting was held at the request of VDOT. The Preliminary Field Inspection (PFI) was done in mid-April 2016. The estimated construction advertisement date for the project is April 2019. The Environmental Assessment document is underway. Roadway design is underway.

Waxpool Road

Widening Waxpool Road from 2 lanes to 4 lanes between Faulkner Parkway and Unbridled Way. Construction continues. Verizon relocation is complete. Open Band relocation work is now planned for completion by Spring of 2017. The General Contractor will re-mobilize 2nd quarter 2017 with completion expected by Fall 2017 (weather dependent).

Banana-Bran Muffins With Chocolate Chips

2 large eggs ³/₃ cup packed light brown sugar 1 cup mashed ripe bananas (2 medium) 1 cup buttermilk 1 cup unprocessed wheat bran ³/₄ cup canola oil 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 cup whole-wheat flour ³/₄ cup all-purpose flour 1¹/₂ teaspoons baking powder ³/₂ teaspoon baking soda ³/₂ teaspoon ground cinnamon ³/₄ teaspoon salt ³/₂ cup chocolate chips (semi or dark) ³/₃ cup chopped walnuts (optional)

Preheat oven to 400°F. Coat 12 muffin cups/tins with cooking spray. Whisk eggs and brown sugar in a medium bowl until smooth. Whisk in bananas, buttermilk, wheat bran, oil and vanilla. Whisk whole-wheat flour, all-purpose flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon and salt in a large bowl. Make a well in the dry ingredients; add the wet ingredients and stir with a rubber spatula until just combined. Stir in chocolate chips. Scoop the batter into the prepared muffin cups until full. Sprinkle with walnuts, if using. Bake the muffins until the tops are golden brown and spring back when touched lightly, 15 to 25 minutes. Let cool in the pan for 5 minutes. Loosen edges and turn muffins out onto a wire rack to cool slightly before serving. *eatingwell.com*





Almond-Honey Power Bars

1 cup old-fashioned rolled oats ¼ cup slivered almonds ¼ cup sunflower seeds 1 tablespoon flaxseeds, preferably golden 1 tablespoon sesame seeds 1 cup unsweetened whole-grain puffed cereal (i.e. Kashi's) ⅓ cup currants ½ cup chopped dried apricots
½ cup chopped golden raisins
¼ cup creamy almond butter
¼ cup turbinado sugar
¼ cup honey
½ teaspoon vanilla extract
½ teaspoon salt

Preheat oven to 350°F. Coat an 8-inch-square pan with cooking spray. Spread oats, almonds, sunflower seeds, flaxseeds and sesame seeds on a large, rimmed baking sheet. Bake until the oats are lightly toasted and the nuts are fragrant, shaking the pan halfway through, about 10 minutes. Transfer to a large bowl. Add cereal, currants, apricots and raisins; toss to combine. Combine almond butter, sugar, honey, vanilla and salt in a small saucepan. Heat over medium-low, stirring frequently, until the mixture bubbles lightly, 2 to 5 minutes. Immediately pour the almond butter mixture over the dry ingredients and mix with a spoon or spatula until no dry spots remain. Transfer to the prepared pan. Lightly coat your hands with cooking spray and press the mixture down firmly to make an even layer (wait until the mixture cools slightly if necessary). Refrigerate until firm, about 30 minutes; cut into 8 bars. Make Ahead Tip: Store in an airtight container at room temperature or in the refrigerator for up to 1 week or freeze for up to 1 month; thaw at room temperature. Storage smarts: For long-term freezer storage, wrap your food in a layer of plastic wrap followed by a layer of foil. The plastic will help prevent freezer burn while the foil will help keep off-odors from seeping into the food. eatingwell.com

NATURALLY...

Come Visit Broadlands' Pollinator Sanctuary, *our own native plant display garden By Oya Simpson,osimpson@broadlandsnaturally.org*



An array of colorful native perennials will soon begin poking through the dirt in our Native Plant Garden, ready to invite pollinators back for the season. One can only imagine that these various species of bees and butterflies are ready for spring to arrive.

The Broadlands Native Plant Demonstration Garden, located on the corner of Ridgeway Drive and Inglewood Court, has been maturing as the young plants establish their roots and thrive. Some challenges the plants face include a very dry and sunny project site along with poor drainage. To help alleviate this, compost has been added to improve the quality. In addition, grasses were planted whose long roots will help break up the soil creating deep pockets for storing air and water.

Some of the plants are thriving while others have shown signs of distress.

A few have surprised us by doing exceptionally well.

Thriving Plants:

- Agastache foeniculum -Lavender hyssop
- Amsonia hubrichtii Blue star
- Baptisia australis Blue false indigo
- Physostegia virginiana -Obedient plant
- Sambucus canadensis -Elderberry
- Solidago rugose "Fireworks" goldenrod
- Sporobolus heterolepis Prairie dropseed

Natural habitats for physostegia virginiana (pictured) are river banks, wet thickets, and prairies, however, it is also highly adaptable, tolerating both drought and poor drainage. You can see the massive bloom of this plant from early summer until the end of fall.

The garden showcases a range of colors and textures and is visited by many butterflies and other beneficial insects. It's becoming a beautiful habitat to explore and discover many native plant possibilities for your own gardens.

Some of the plants are taking longer to mature as they establish stronger roots. If they don't look too happy, it doesn't necessarily mean they are dying, but that they may be stressed due to the conditions (weather, drainage, and other environmental factors). On the other hand, some of the plants may not survive due to the heat and drought. Bare spaces will be planted with the species that are thriving to prevent the need for watering after the initial planting.

Many thanks to the Hughes Family for letting us use their water while we plant.

You can see the pictures of the garden online. Search for "*Broadlands Native Plant Demonstration Garden*" in Google Maps.

This ongoing project has been made possible with community volunteers, but more help is needed for the maintenance and development of this garden and other projects around Broadlands. You can choose your level of participation depending on your ability. As a thank you for helping, you can take home plants when it's time to split them in the fall.

Please keep an eye out for additional information on the HOA's website. We plan to make the plant list and other resources easily available.

LOUDOUN COUNTY LAUNCHES COMMUTER BUS SERVICE; REVISES SCHEDULES IN DULLES AREA

Beginning Monday, February 6, 2017, Loudoun County Transit added commuter bus service to Washington D.C. from the East Gate Park and Ride and is offering some new bus schedules from the Dulles South Park and Ride.

Since opening in the summer of 2015, the East Gate Park and Ride has provided Metro-Connection Bus Service, taking riders to the Wiehle-Reston Metro Station. In addition to Metro-Connection service, riders now will have the option to travel directly to Washington D.C. via Loudoun Transit's Commuter Bus service from the East Gate Park and Ride. The East Gate Park and Ride has 218 free parking spaces and is located at 43664 Tall Cedars Parkway in Chantilly.

Loudoun Transit also has made changes to some existing routes that run from the Dulles South Park and Ride. The Dulles South Park and Ride has 350 free parking spaces and is located at Stone Ridge Village Center, 42015 Village Center Plaza in Aldie. The service changes are designed to alleviate overcrowding, shorten existing trips and increase reliability. The changes were developed after an extensive public process that included recommendations and suggestions from commuters and the general public.
