Board of Directors Meeting Highlights

The following actions were taken by the Board of Directors at *their meeting held on March 12th, 2019*:

- Approved the amended minutes of February 12th, 2019 meeting
- Denied a request to do DNA testing on dog feces
- Approved the proposed Design Guidelines for Lighting, as amended
- Approved the proposal from PolyApps LLS to develop a free Voice-Frist app
- Approved a proposal from Potomac Tree and Shrub for scale treatment for the Maple trees on Croson Road
- Approved a proposal from Sport Systems to crackfill and color coat the Nature Center tennis courts
- Held one violation hearing and assessed violation charges

Spring Events and Inspections

At long last, we have suffered through enough of the cold, dark days of winter and made it to the other side to reach (we hope) sunny, bright, and beautiful spring. With the arrival of spring comes the spring house cleaning and yard sales, April showers, lawn mowing, and gardening projects. For the association staff, spring brings the hectic season of pool opening preparation, reminder letters for lawn maintenance and other violations, and an increase in modification applications.

We are jam packed with spring events here in the community, starting with our annual Eggstravaganza, set to hatch this year on April 6th. Every year we kick off the event with a parade from the Community Center to Hillside Park, led by Peter Cottontail. Eggs are hidden throughout Hillside Park for the littles to collect. That morning, get your pre eggstravaganza workout in by participating in the 27th Annual Van Metre 5

Mile Run and One Mile Fun Run/Walk to benefit Children's National. This event is even stroller and dog friendly.

We are very excited to unveil our Nature Center solar panel project, which

has been a few years in the making. The Technology Committee worked hand in hand with MTVSolar to bring a solar installation which will benefit the community as a whole and can even provide savings for individual residents wanting to participate in the solar coop program. Again this year, we are proud to present the annual Truck and Pony Show, which benefits Sprout Therapeutic Riding & Education Center. I started this event in 2016 at the suggestion of Patriot Disposal Services. The first event attracted over 700 people from all over the region and raised nearly \$1,300 in donations. We bring in trash trucks, fire and rescue (note: these vehicles are on call and may be required to leave in case of an emergency), snow plows, landscaping equipment, and more for this event. You can also meet Lucky, the amazing therapy pony. You don't want to miss out. Bring cash for donations as well as food as there will be food trucks and Chick-Fil-A sales on site. I am very proud to roll out our charitable organization program as part of my Community Outreach goals. We are currently organizing a sneaker drive, a pet food drive, and a plastic bag drive. These items help give back to less fortunate and save our planet.

The intent is not to assess charges, but to compel compliance in order to maintain property values.

With the thawing of the ground and the arrival of warmer temperatures, the association steps up inspections of exterior maintenance violations. These inspections ensure that the appearance of our beautiful neighborhood is maintained. In 2018, we generated 2,304 first notices. Please be aware the Association has the right of access over and through any portion of the Property (excluding the interior of the dwelling) for inspections, maintenance and to correct violation. This right is granted to the Association, its managing agent, and any other person authorized by the Board of Directors in the exercise and discharge of their respective powers and responsibilities in Section 5.3(a) of the Declaration for Broadlands. Our Covenant Inspectors can be identified by their ID cards worn on lanyards around their necks, typically driving the blue Nissan Versa inspection vehicle.

If your unit is in need of maintenance, you have been or will be notified via letter and given time to correct. If you are unable to correct in the time allotted, please be sure to contact the inspectors to request a reasonable extension

> to correct. If you do not correct the violation in the allotted time and, you will be sent follow up correspondence in accordance with state statute and our Policies and Procedures Regarding Violations of Governing Documents, which could include

additional violation letters, a Hearing before the Board of Directors, and the potential for violation charges as high as \$900 assessed against your account. The intent is not to assess charges, but to compel compliance in order to maintain property values. The charges are a deterrent and help to offset of expenses incurred by staff time, printing, and postage for generating violation letters. Though it is not the preferred method, the association also has the ability to file a suit in General District Court to request a favorable ruling from a judge.

As a reminder, lot owners must obtain written approval from the Modifications Subcommittee prior to the commencement of all changes or improvements on or visible from the exterior of your unit. The Modifications Subcommittee meets the first and third Wednesday of the month from March through November and meets only the third Wednesday of the month. In 2018, the subcommittee reviewed a record breaking 873 applications for improvements. Please note the deadline for application submissions is noon on the Wednesday before the meeting in order to ensure time for processing applications. All applications must be

A response to your application is generally sent within one week of the meeting.

Once the Subcommittee has reached a decision, the results letter will be delivered via email. If an email is not provided, then the results letter will be mailed. Please check your inbox and junk/spam folders for your results letter or contact the HOA office at 703-729-9704.

Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/ deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidently placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed it notifies theHOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, structures that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the owner's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement then, the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. complete before they will be forwarded to the committee. The Design Guidelines and application are available online at broadlandshoa.org. If you have any questions regarding this process, please contact Robin Crews, Secretary to the Modifications Subcommittee at rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or 703-729-9704.

If you are planning to sell your home this year, you will need to provide the contract purchaser with a resale disclosure package within 14 days of contract execution. Resale packages can be ordered online through FirstService Residential at https:// fsresidential.com/washington-dc/home. Click on "Order Documents and Certificates" on the top left of the page and follow directions. A Resale Package includes all of the governing documents of the association, a financial statement of your account, and includes a physical inspection performed by HOA staff to identify any violations or missing modification applications. The HOA performed 177 resale inspections in 2018. If you are purchasing or refinancing your unit and your lender requires a PUD questionnaire, you do not need to order these through FSR. Forms are completed by Broadlands staff for a \$50 fee. Please contact 703-729-9704 or joannehang@broadlandshoa.com to submit your form and arrange for payment. Please ensure that you have obtained written approval from the Modifications Subcommittee for all exterior modifications prior to requesting resale disclosure packages.

I hope to see you all out taking advantage of the extensive trail systems, utilizing one of the many play courts throughout the community, or attending one of our many events and programs as the weather continues to improve.

The Annual Meeting is Right Around the Corner

The 2019 Annual Meeting of the members of Broadlands Association will be held on Tuesday, May 7th, 7:00pm at the Broadlands Clubhouse, 43360 Rickenbacker Square. Please mark your calendars for this important meeting and plan to attend. The purpose of the meeting is to elect members to the Board of Directors, including three (3) members to serve three year terms expiring May 2022. The Board oversees the business of Broadlands in the collection and expenditure of association funds, selection of contractors, management of facilities, and adoption of policies for the day-to-day operations. These volunteer Board Members are a vital asset to the association.

Covenants Corner



Mildew, Wood Trim & Faded Shutters

Throughout the year, the Covenants Inspectors inspect the homes in the community for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in view to parking issues and unapproved modifications to leftover holiday decor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular violations that occur with high frequency.

Spring brings a very busy time for covenants. This month, the Inspector will be focusing on several issues: homes with mildew on the siding, stoops, etc., rotten wood trim, and faded shutters and doors. Mildew detracts from the aesthetics of the community and is often found on areas that receive little or no sunlight. Rotten wood can often be identified by paint that is cracked, peeling, or blistering, or wood that's darker than the surrounding area or green with algae. Shutters and doors that have faded from their original color should be freshened up.

The Inspectors will also continue performing house to house inspections, checking the front, back, and sides of each unit for improvements that have been made without prior approval from the Modification Subcommittee.

If any violation of these types are noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing sixty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent, and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$10/day for a maximum of ninety (90) days.

If you have questions regarding this processes, or have corrected the violation(s), or if you would like to request an extension on a maintenance violation, please contact the Covenants office at *covenants@broadlandshoa.com* or Suzan Rodano, Covenants Manager at 703-729-9704, option 2. of your Toter(s) should you need to identify it in the future.

Throughout the year, the Covenants Manager routinely inspects homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications to leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections where violations may occur with high frequency.

This helps preserve the property values for home ownership, promotes community harmony and ensures the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained.

Proper Mulching Techniques

Benefits of Proper Mulching

- Helps maintain soil moisture. Evaporation is reduced, and the need for watering can be minimized.
- Helps control weeds. A 2"-4" layer of mulch will reduce the germination and growth of weeds.
- Insulation. Mulch keeps soils warmer in the winter and cooler in the summer.
- Improved quality of soil. Many types of mulch can improve soil aeration and structure and can improve drainage.
- Some types of mulch can improve soil fertility.
- A layer of mulch can help inhibit some types of plant disease.
- Helps facilitate lawn maintenance and reduces the risk of mechanical damage from weed-whips or lawn mowers.

Trees growing in a natural forest environment have their roots anchored in a rich, well-aerated soil full of essential nutrients. The soil is blanketed by leaves organic materials that replenish nutrients and provide an optimal environment for root growth and mineral uptake. Urban landscapes, however are typically a much harsher environment with poor soils, little organic matter, and large fluctuations in temperature and moisture. Applying a 2"-4" layer of mulch can help mimic a more natural environment and improve plant health. The roots of most trees can extend to a width of 2-3 times the diameter of the canopy of the tree. Additionally, most of the fine, nutrient and moisture absorbing roots are located in the top few inches of the soil. These roots require oxygen and moisture to survive. A thin layer of mulch, applied as broadly as practical, can improve the soil structure, oxygen levels, temperature, and moisture availability where these roots grow.

Not too much!

As beneficial as mulch is, too much can be harmful. The generally recommended depth is 2"-4". Unfortunately, Virginia landscapes are falling victim to a plague of over-mulching. The term, 'mulch volcanoes,' has emerged to describe mulch that has been piled up around the base of trees. Most organic mulches must be replenished, but the amount of replenishment required depends upon the rate of mulch decomposition within your landscape. Thoroughly inspect your mulch beds to ensure that you maintain only a 2"-4" level around your trees and shrubs.



Proper Mulching

- Rake the old mulch to break up any matted layers prior to adding new mulch.
- Keep mulch back a minimum of 2" from the trunks of trees and shrubs
- Use a well aerated and composted organic mulch to help improve soil conditions. Avoid sour smelling mulch!
- Composted wood chips that contain leaves and bark make great mulch.
- Mulch a 2"-4" layer (including existing mulch) out to the drip-line of the tree, or farther if practical.

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Keep Loudoun Beautiful

Broadlands Community Outreach is a supporter of Keep Loudoun Beautiful. In March we collected sneakers to assist in their cause, and we'll continue to support their efforts for the duration of the year. Keep an eye out for a continuing sneaker drive in the fall!

Keep Loudoun Beautiful (KLB) is an all-volunteer local non-profit organization whose goal is to institute and enforce pollution control measures, through education, clean-ups, and other environmental programs. The group started in 1972 when a group of citizens began combatting the county's litter problems by going out and collecting roadside trash. These clean-ups continue to be the main activity for KLB. Each spring, a local area leader organizes a trash clean-up day. Interested volunteers walk along roads, trails and waterways picking up litter for eventual recycling or disposal.

The local area leader for the Broadlands area is Diana Weber. She organizes the clean ups by assigning teams to locations with litter problems. Example locations include the walking trails around Broadlands and the retaining pond near the Community Center Pool. Participants can be any age (with adult supervision for younger children) and clean ups last between 1 and 3 hours.

Since a great deal of litter flows into our waterways, KLB also conducts annual watershed cleanups on sections of Goose Creek and the Potomac River. Canoes, river rafts, life jackets, paddles, and professional river guides lead participants down the waterways to pick up trash. Registration for these events, which begins April 1st, is mandatory. Watershed cleanups last from 9:00am to 3:00pm.

Welcome Spring Submitted by: Karyn Thompson, Broadlands Conservation Committee

The birds are hopping all over my yard looking for food as they get ready to start their families. So far, it's mostly Robins, Carolina Wrens and Downy Woodpeckers.

Last month, I got to hear Dr. Douglas Tallamy, trusted voice of entomology and biodiversity, speak. Did you know that the best pollinators aren't bees, but butterflies and moths?

What do you think we need to provide birds to feed their young? Caterpillars! So, to have more caterpillars, we need more butterflies. In addition, birds will not feed their young the bird seeds you may put out for them, which makes it more critical to have the healthy balance of insects for their survival.

Some plants support the caterpillars who can eat anything, while others help the picky eaters. Key plants with most value because of the number of species they support:

Birches - 321 Goldenrods - 114 Maples - 274 Oak trees - 513 Strawberries - 73 Violets - 30 Here are a couple online plant search resources to support them as they raise their nest full of chicks.

- The Audubon Society website www.audubon.org/ native-plants provides a list of native plants with pictures of which birds use them for shelter or food. Encourage a favorite bird to make your yard their home by planting those plants. It's a great list and I've seen many of the same recommendations for attracting butterflies.
- The National Wildlife Foundation also has a search tool with filters including your location www.nwf.org/ NativePlantFinder/Plants. Each plant picture has a number by it representing the number of species that can use it as a host plant.

Wouldn't you rather plant a flower or tree that can help more butterflies, which in turn can help your favorite birds? I hope you can join me as well!

Spring Forward with these Delicious Recipes

Ginger-Peach Glazed Ham

For the Ham:

- 2 1/2 cups kosher salt
 2 1/2 cups packed light brown sugar
 2 tablespoons juniper berries, crushed
 2 tablespoons black peppercorns, crushed
 1 (2-inch) piece ginger, peeled and thinly sliced
 4 bay leaves
 1 (8-to-10-pound) skin-on, bone-in fresh ham, shank end (keep cold)
- For the Glaze: 1 cup peach preserves 1 cup packed light brown sugar 1/2 cup dijon mustard 3 tablespoons raspberry vinegar 2 tablespoons ground ginger Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper

Prepare the ham: Combine 3 gallons hot water, salt, brown sugar, juniper berries, peppercorns, ginger and bay leaves in a large nonreactive container or pot and stir until the salt and sugar dissolve. Let the brine cool. Stand the ham, cut-side down, on a cutting board and score the skin with a sharp knife in a crosshatch pattern. Place the ham in the brine, cover and refrigerate at least 24 hours or up to 2 days. Once ready to cook, preheat the oven to 450 degrees F. Remove the ham from the brine and dry completely. Strain the brine, reserving the spices. Press some of the juniper berries and peppercorns onto the flat cut side of the ham. Scatter the bay leaves in a large roasting pan and place a rack in the pan. Stand the ham, cut-side down, on the rack and roast 1 hour. Reduce the oven temperature to 325 and roast 2 more hours. *Make the glaze:* Whisk the peach preserves, brown sugar, mustard, vinegar, ginger, and salt and pepper to taste in a bowl. Brush the ham with half of the glaze; continue roasting until deep golden, about 1 more hour. Brush the ham with the remaining glaze, turn it on its side and roast until a thermometer inserted into the center registers 155 and the skin is crisp, 30 to 45 more minutes. Transfer to a cutting board, tent with foil and let rest 20 minutes before carving. Skim the fat from the roasting pan juices and discard the bay leaves. Stir to make a sauce. Carve the ham and serve with the sauce.

Prep: 1 hr, Cook: 4 hr 30 min, Yield: 8 to 10 servings Foodnetwork.com

Sage Potatoes Au Gratin

3 tablespoons unsalted butter 2 cups heavy cream Kosher salt 10 fresh sage leaves 1 pound (about 2 medium) russet potatoes Cayenne pepper, to taste 1/2 cup grated manchego cheese (about 2 ounces)

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F. Coat a 2-quart baking dish with 1 tablespoon butter. Bring the cream, 1/2 teaspoon salt and the sage to a simmer in a large saucepan over medium-low heat; cook 10 minutes. Meanwhile, peel the potatoes and slice 1/8 inch thick (use a mandoline, if you have one). Cover the bottom of the prepared dish with about one-quarter of the potatoes, overlapping the slices. Season with salt and cayenne pepper and sprinkle with one-third of the cheese. Repeat the layers 2 more times (potatoes, salt, cayenne, cheese), ending with a layer of potatoes. Strain the cream, discarding the sage. Pour the cream into the dish and press the potatoes down. Cut the remaining 2 tablespoons butter into pieces and dot over the potatoes. Cover with aluminum foil and transfer to the oven; reduce the oven temperature to 350 degrees F and bake 40 minutes, then uncover and bake until golden and bubbly, about 20 more minutes.

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Pool Season Begins May 25th... Do You Know Where Your Pool Passes Are?

Applications and forms referenced in this notice can be found online at broadlandshoa.org under amenities and pool information, or at the HOA office located in the Nature Center, and may be either dropped off in person at the Nature Center or emailed to <u>info@broadlandshoa.com</u>. For more information contact the Broadlands HOA office at 703-729-9704 or email info@broadlandshoa.com.

Everyone aged 5 and older will need a **Broadlands Photo ID Pool Pass** to gain admission to the pools. Below is information on what's needed in order to obtain a pool pass. If you need to get a pool pass for the upcoming season, and you are 18 or older, you must provide proof of residency in order to obtain a pool pass. **IF YOU ARE AN OWNER AND ALREADY HAVE POOL PASSES, YOU DO NOT NEED TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION**. Your existing pool passes will be electronically reactivated. If you cannot locate your pool passes, replacements can be issued free of charge during the month of April ONLY. Beginning May 1st, reprints will cost \$5.00 each. If you want a new picture for your replacement pass, the cost is \$7.00, regardless of when the pass is issued.

New Owners: To have pool passes issued, complete an *"Owner - 2019 Pool Membership Application"*, bring it to the HOA office at the Nature Center and have photos taken of each individual. Pool passes are issued to members aged 5 and older living in the household. A household consists of all persons living in the dwelling, including college students, other non-resident children spending the swim season in Broadlands, and live-in care providers or others showing proof of residency in the form of a valid driver's license or other government issued ID or utility bill.

Tenants (new and existing): Owners who wish to transfer their pool rights to their tenant must complete the "Absentee Owner Statement (AOS) – Facilities Use Agreement for Tenants" form and submit it, along with the tenant lease, to the HOA office. Tenants must then complete the "Tenant - 2019 Pool Membership Application" form and show proof of residency in the form of a valid driver's license or other government issued ID or utility bill to obtain a pool pass. In this instance, pool passes will ONLY be issued to the tenants; and NOT to owners. Existing tenants with valid AOS forms on file may use previously issued pool passes however; tenant pool passes will only be valid through the end of their lease date. If a lease date has expired and will be renewed, it is the tenant/owner responsibility to complete a <u>new</u> AOS form and submit it, along with a copy of the new lease and/or extension of the existing lease, to the HOA office PRIOR to the lease expiration.

Children: Children who have turned 5 years old, or will be 5 years old by June 1, 2019, must have a pool pass for the upcoming pool season. An "*Owner – 2019 Pool Membership Application*" must be filled out by the parent and the child shall be brought to the HOA office to have a photo taken and a pool pass issued. Families with children under 5 years old may obtain pool passes in order for them to bring guests to the pool. This will allow members under the age of 5 the opportunity to have older guests accompany them when other family members are not available. *Children whose passes have outdated photos that appear to be older than the last five (5) years will need to have their photos updated. New photos shall be taken at the Nature Center and updated pool passes will be provided. There is no charge for updating a photo for a child's pool pass. Any individual who has turned 18 since the last pool season will need a new adult pass and will be required to provide proof of residency. There is no charge for providing a new adult pool pass to these individuals.*

Long-Term Guest Passes: Long-Term Guess Passes are offered to allow visiting guests to use the pools unaccompanied by residents. The cost for the entire 2019 season is \$100 per person. This price will reduce on July 1 to \$75 per person and again on August 1 to \$50 per person. They should be noted as a long-term guest on the pool application. The fee must be paid at the time their photo is taken and the pass is issued. The resident member must accompany the long-term guest to the photo session and show proof of identity and address.

Guest passes: 10 resident guest passes are allocated to each *residence*. Additional guest passes, good for 10 visits, may be purchased for \$20. Members are limited to bringing 3 guests per member per visit to the pool. Guest passes are added to the electronic account of each residence and no physical passes will be issued. Guests must be accompanied by a pool pass holder to gain admittance to the pool facility. Rules regarding the use of guest passes can be found online at broadlandshoa.org.

Pictures: Beginning April 1, 2019, pictures will be taken at the Nature Center from 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday on a first come first served basis. **Walk-in applications will not be processed for same day delivery if received after 4:00pm.** In order to expedite lines and shorten your wait time, you may submit your application in advance via email to info@broadlandshoa.com or mail/hand delivery to 21907 Claiborne Parkway or fax to 703-729-9733.

Proof of Residency: Prior to having a photo taken, all adults 18 and older must show a photo ID with proof residency at a Broadlands Association residential address. **Photos will not be taken if acceptable proof of identity and address are not available.**

If ID does not show a Broadlands Association address, the following will be accepted:

- Driver's License
- School, Military ID
- Current Passport
- Utility bill issued within the last 60 days
- Settlement Papers or Deed
- Current Virginia Voter Registration Card

- NO tape players, CD players or radios unless waterproof and used with personal headphones.
- NO floatation devices except water wings, U.S.C.G. approved life vests and U.S.C.G. approved swimwear floatation devices
- **NO DISPOSABLE DIAPERS**. Children not yet toilet trained must wear plastic pants or "Swimmies" (swim diaper) under their bathing suit.
- Pool members are responsible for the conduct of their guests.
- Adults are responsible for the safety and conduct of all children in their care.
- Pool membership may be temporarily suspended or revoked for failing to comply with the pool rules.
- Members and their guests using the pools do so at their own risk.
- No lifeguards are on duty at the wading pools.
