The following actions were taken by the Board of Directors at *their meeting held on May* 14th, 2019:

- Appointed John Zuccaro to the board to fill a vacant seat, term expiring May 2020
- Appointed officers to the following one year terms: David Baroody as President, Dawne Holz as Vice President, and Heidi Eaton as Secretary/Treasurer
- Approved the amended minutes of April 9th, 2019 meeting
- Amended the Community Center rental agreement for non-profit groups to charge a \$10/hour fee, allowing a maximum of two hours per use, a maximum of one day per week, with ability for staff to negotiate to one man hour of community service per use
- Approved the aquatic facilities use agreement with National Capital Swim Club
- Tabled approval of the Broadlands Boulevard/Van Metre Drive Traffic Signal Easement Agreement
- Approved the 2018 Draft Audit prepared by Malvin, Riggins & Company, P.C.
- Approved a common area landscaping application, with conditions
- Approved Belmont Ridge Road Easement Acquisition Agreement from Loudoun County
- Held nine violation hearings and assessed violation charges
- Approved reversal of late, NSF, demand charges on one account

Annual Meeting Elections & Community Updates

The twenty-second Annual Meeting of the Membership was held on Tuesday, May 7th. I would like to congratulate David Baroody, Eric Bazerghi, and John Zuccaro on their election and appointment to the Board of Directors. Thank you to those who attended the meeting and those who submitted proxies, enabling us to surpass our 10% quorum requirement in advance of the meeting. I've worked with associations before that struggle to get quorum and there's nothing fun about wasting time having to reconvene at a later date and spending thousands more dollars on mailings to try to encourage participation. I look forward to another year of productive meetings as we continue to embrace nature, provide the best events in the area, maintain and update our facilities and infrastructure, and provide the routine services you've come to expect from your HOA. If you haven't attended a Board Meeting, I encourage you to come meet the board, see how the business operates, and

provide your feedback as it relates to the community. We generally meet on the second Tuesday of the month at 6:00pm at the Clubhouse. Once approved, our minutes are available for review on FSRConnect or available from me by written request. Additionally, a brief

synopsis is provided each month in this newsletter.

the messes.

We've made it to June which means the pools have opened, the days are getting longer, and school will be letting out soon. The dog days of summer stretch out ahead of us with all the wonderful outdoor activities available for you to enjoy. I love summer for the hiking and biking on the trails, bbq's, festivals, and pool parties, tan lines, movies, and concerts. Unfortunately during summer break, we see a huge increase in all types of vandalism throughout the community. We notice spikes in vandalism every time there is a break from school (winter, spring, and summer), but we get hit the hardest during the summer since the weather and daylight is conducive to being outside even late into the night and not all kids have a set routine with early morning alarms, sports, and homework to keep them occupied.

We see everything from spray painting on overpasses, streets, sidewalks, tunnels, and tot lots, to the breaking of light fixtures in the tunnels and tennis courts, setting fire to things, knocking over light poles on the walking trails, breaking into the pools and throwing furniture into the deep end, putting firecrackers into and smashing

mailboxes, tipping over or stealing portable restrooms, and stealing fire extinguishers from Broadlands Live tents. We've even had instances of people breaking into the pools overnight and defecating in them, which is not only foul for those having to clean up the mess, but also disrupts the on time opening of the pools to the rest of the residents or swim teams.

These acts of vandalism cost the association in valuable resources, from staff time spent contacting the sheriff's department to file police reports and supervising the cleanup to paying employees and contractors to clean up the messes. These efforts take resources away from other association funded activities and improvements. Nobody wants to take their young child to a tot lot for a play outing only to find the slide covered in phallic symbols. The association has and will continue to press charges against those caught in the act and will fully cooperate with the sheriff's department in these cases. I have been

subpoenaed as a witness for hate crimes that have taken place on association property. I have called parents who thought their children were safe at a sleepover but snuck out and have been caught trespassing in the middle of the night. I have taken calls from residents who

have heard the teens yelping when jumping off the diving board into the chilly waters of the Southern Walk pool in September after the pools have been partially drained, which could easily lead to a broken neck or back.

The association contracts with an independent security company to help patrol the community and they have caught several vandals in the act over the years; however, they cannot be omnipresent. We rely on our residents to help keep an eye on our precious assets and speak to and know the whereabouts of their children and teens. If we make ourselves aware of the issues affecting our surroundings, we can keep Broadlands a vibrant and safe community. Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidently placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed it notifies theHOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, structures that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the owner's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement then, the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. Parking Regulations

With Summer approaching, please be courteous to your neighbors and abide by the community parking regulations. The following regulations exist with regards to the parking of vehicles, they are:

- 1. Vehicles shall not obstruct the safe, free-flow of moving vehicular traffic or other vehicles or pedestrians into or out of parking spaces on Public Streets, or Private Roads.
- 2. No vehicle shall be parked in violation of any posted sign.
- 3. All vehicles shall be parked wholly within space lines, as applicable.
- 4. No vehicle shall be parked on any grassy or landscaped area.
- 5. Vehicles may not be parked within 10 feet on either side of a mailbox.
- 6. No vehicle may be parked in a manner which blocks any portion of a sidewalk. Even partial obstruction of the sidewalk is considered obstruction and is prohibited.
- 7. No vehicle may be parked in a fire lane. Even partial obstruction of the fire lane is considered obstruction and is prohibited.

Broadlands Fitness Center

Residents are invited to join the Broadlands fitness Center located at 43360 Rickenbacker Square. The fitness center includes: 5 treadmills, 4 elliptical, 5 strength machines, 2 stationary bikes, 2 multifunctional weight trainers, and a row machine.

Access cards are \$25 each. Tenants, make sure you have an AOS on file from the owner of the property granting you access to the fitness center. Hours of operation are from 5:00 a.m. to 11:00pm, 7 days a week. Children ages 13-17 must be accompanied by an adult card holder. *No children under the age of 13 are permitted at any time in the building.* Please refer to Broadlandshoa.org/fitness-center to review the application process and rules.



Scoop the Poop...

Residents frequently express concern that not everyone is taking the time to pick up their pet's waste in the neighborhood. Please ensure that your family members realize how important it is to be a responsible pet owner:

Dog poop is not natural, especially in the quantities that are generated by pets. It harms the environment and threatens public health.

Forgot your waste bag? No worries! *The Broadlands HOA has 78 mutt mitt stations to offer residents.*

Don't want to carry it with you? No problem, most of our mutt mitt stations have trash cans attached.

Even if your dog poops in the woods, you still need to clean it up. Not only is it unsightly, it can get into streams and into the water supply.

It's the law! Is it a violation of the Association Declaration, Article 8, Section 8.2(q) to not pick up your pet's waste, it is also a county ordinance violation. Please reference Loudoun County Ordinance, Chapter 612.19, Section a (9) Dog waste.

Covenants Corner



Mildew, Wood Trim & Faded Shutters

Summer brings a very busy time for covenants. This month, the Inspector will be focusing on several issues: homes with mildew on the siding, stoops, etc., rotten wood trim, and faded shutters and doors. Mildew detracts from the aesthetics of the community and is often found on areas that receive little or no sunlight. Rotten wood can often be identified by paint that is cracked, peeling, or blistering, or wood that's darker than the surrounding area or green with algae. Shutters and doors that have faded from their original color should be freshened up.

The Inspectors will also continue performing house to house inspections, checking the front, back, and sides of each unit for improvements that have been made without prior approval from the Modification Subcommittee.

If any violation of these types are noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing sixty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent, and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$10/ day for a maximum of ninety (90) days.

If you have questions regarding this processes, or have corrected the violation(s), or if you would like to request an extension on a maintenance violation, please contact the Covenants office at *covenants@broadlandshoa.com* or Suzan Rodano, Covenants Manager at 703-729-9704, option 2.

Throughout the year, the Covenants Manager routinely inspects homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications to leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections where violations may occur with high frequency.

This helps preserve the property values for home ownership, promotes community harmony and ensures the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained.

Summer Lawn Mowing Tips Courtesy of HLS

Summer time is here and it's time to start mowing the lawn consistently. When cutting your lawn, you want to think about mowing at a height of 3-4". The height in a healthy lawn will help suppress the amount of weeds in the lawn. It is important to remember not to cut more than 1/3 the length of the blade at a time. This can stress your lawn and a stressed lawn is not a happy lawn.

Here in Broadlands, HLS is in full swing with their landscape maintenance services. In March, snow stakes were removed throughout the community as weather forecasts began to show periods of gradual warming. Spring clean-up and mulch took place in the common areas of the community throughout the month of March. Fertilizer and crabgrass preventative applications took place in early April. Routine trash removal occurs on a weekly basis. Mowing services commenced in early April as well and, we will continue to monitor the property for pest and disease issues at part of our Integrated Pest Management Program at the property.

As we head into warmer months, look out for pruning services to begin. Summer annuals were installed in mid-May to add large impacts of color at the entrances to the community. Mowing, edging, trash and litter cleanup, and pet station service will continue throughout the summer.

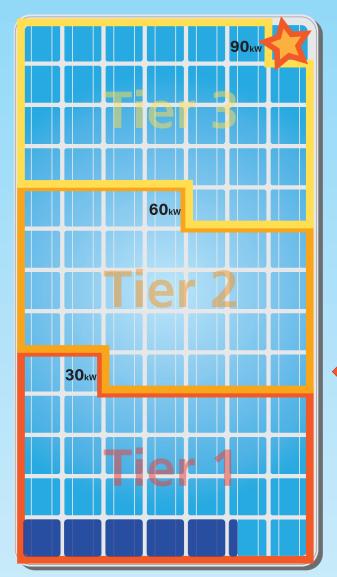

How the Co-op Program Works

Example: A resident purchases a 6.8 kW system near the beginning of the Co-op Program period at Tier 1 pricing. During the Co-op Program period, the total kW installed in the community reaches 78kW. All residents now qualify for Tier 3 pricing. The resident above receives a rebate from mtvSolar, as the price per watt is less in Tier 3 pricing. (Please ask an mtvSolar representative for current pricing for each Tier.)

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Virginia House of Delegates Member David Reid Highlights Recent Session Accomplishments

Higher Education

As the first person in my family to get a college education, I know first-hand the importance of higher education. Unfortunately, the rising cost of college is causing parents and students to take on an ever-increasing amount of student loan debt. To reduce the financial burden of higher education and to provide transparency on financial aid award letters, I successfully developed the following legislation:

- HB 1704 Financial Aid Award Letter Transparency was passed unanimously by the House and Senate and is headed to the Governor for his signature. This bill provides a standard format for all universities in Virginia to provide parents and students with transparent information on their financial aid package.
- HB 2476 In-State Tuition Freeze was passed by the Education Committee 17-3, and then sent to the Appropriations Committee, where the intent of the bill was included in the 2019 Budget. To reduce the cost of college, the following items were included in the final budget:
 - \$57.5mn in additional college funding to support 2019-2020 Tuition Freeze
 - \$15.5mn in new in-state undergraduate financial aid
 - \$3.5mn in additional Tuition Assistance Grant (TAG) funding to increase the annual award from \$3,350 to \$3,400

K-12 Education

Since the end of last session, I have been working with Del. John Bell, community organizations, and concerned families to end the use of seclusion and restraint against special needs students. I'm happy to report that HB 2599, known as "Gigi's Law", passed the House and Senate unanimously and is headed to the Governor for signature! The process to draft and pass this legislation demonstrates the power that citizens have to change their laws, improve their lives, and improve the lives of their children. Additional K-12 Education legislation I worked on included:

- HB 1652 Local Control of School Calendar was Chief Co-Patroned by me and Del. Roxann Robinson (VA-27). It passed the House and Senate this year, ending a nearly two-decade long fight for local control of the school calendar.
 - An Additional 2% salary increase for teachers, bringing the total increase to 5%
 - \$12mn for additional school counselors in elementary, middle, and high schools

• \$2.3mn in planning funds for the Northern Virginia Children's Science Museum at Kincora, right here in the 32nd District

Renewables First Act (RFA)

In recognition of the need to transition away from fossil fuels and towards a renewable energy economy, I patroned HB 1686, the Renewables First Act (RFA). The RFA would have required the 5500 MW of renewable energy declared "in the public interest" to be completed "first" before any new fossil fuel-based facilities were brought on-line. I worked with great partners, specifically Zero Carbon Virginia from Loudoun County, to research and draft the legislation. The bill gained significant state-wide recognition for its pragmatic approach before it failed in the Commerce & Labor Subcommittee. Despite this setback, I remain committed to finding an economically viable transition to renewable fuels.

Families and Foster Care

As many of you know, I grew up in the Children's Home in Richmond, not far from where I now serve at the Capitol. Based on my experience in foster care, I've made foster care reform a major component of my legislative portfolio. This session I passed HB 1728, which allows adopted children to enter into a post-adoption communication agreement with their birth parents. I was also Chief Co-Patron of HB 1730 which would freeze access to credit reports of foster children, so they are not taken advantage of by identity thieves.

CURB APPEAL with CONSERVATION LANDSCAPING

Landscaping our homes with a purpose to support the biodiversity as well as keeping the curb appeal can be challenging, but it's not impossible. Once you come to the awareness of the potential positive impact, practical information is there for you. Here is a great resource to help you with how to transform your garden into a sanctuary of bird and butterflies.

Home gardens should suit personal tastes and lifestyle, but sometimes people need a starting point. For those new to native plants, it is suggested to start small by introducing a few natives over time, which is both economical and allows a person to get to know each plant well. Try more informal, curved garden edges since they are easier to maintain over time. *Another pointer:* keep things simple by planting swaths of a few different plants and colors together. The results often look better than when a lot of different things are mixed together at once.

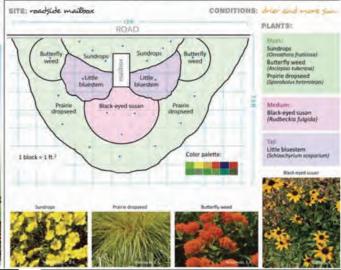

Summer Grain Bowls

Rainbow Couscous and Tzatziki Chicken Bowl

Total time: 60 minutes Yield: 4

Bowl Ingredients:

1 1/2 cups dry pearl couscous (about 3 cups prepared)

16 oz. of chicken breasts (or shredded chicken)

1 cup of cherry tomatoes, halved

1 cup of yellow bell pepper, cubed (1 bell pepper)

1 cup of carrots, cubed (3–4 carrots)

1 cup of cucumber, cubed (1/2 cucumber)

1 cup of red cabbage., chopped (1/4 head of cabbage)

1 tsp salt

1 tsp garlic powder

Crumbled feta

Tzatziki Sauce Ingredients:

2 cups plain Greek yogurt (full fat)

1/2 cucumber, halved and seeded

1 1/2 Tbsp fresh dill, chopped 2 cloves of garlic, minced

1/2 tsp salt

2 Tbsp olive oil

2 Tbsp lemon juice

TIP: To save time (and avoid chopping) put the garlic and cucumber through a garlic press. Perfectly minced ingredients in less than 30 seconds!

Stir all the Tzatziki sauce ingredients in a small bowl until well combined. Store in a sealed container in the fridge until ready to use. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Place the chicken breasts on a baking sheet, season with salt and put in the oven for 30-35 minutes. After the chicken is done cooking, shred with two forks. Set aside. Cook the couscous according to package instructions. Replace water with chicken stock for extra flavor. Season the couscous with the salt and garlic powder. Toss the shredded chicken with ½ cup of the Tzatziki sauce and toss with couscous, vegetables, feta and a additional Tzatziki sauce if desired. Zestedlemon.com

Seasonal 3-Grain Bowl

Total time: 35 minutes Yield: 6

Bowl Ingredients:

5 1/2 cups reduced sodium chicken broth

3 cups grains: Quinoa, bulgur and/or millet

4 cups baby spinach

2 cups blackberries

1 fennel bulb, halved and thinly sliced

1 bunch green onions, sliced

1 cup each halved cherry tomatoes crumbled goat cheese (chèvre) coarsely chopped pistachio nuts

Dressing Ingredients:

1/2 cup olive oil

1 tsp lemon zest

1/4 cup lemon juice

1 Tbsp chopped fresh oregano

1/2 tsp kosher salt

1/4 tsp black pepper

In a 3- to 4-qt. saucepan bring broth to boiling. Stir in Grains. Return to boiling; reduce heat. Simmer, covered, 15 minutes or until broth is absorbed. Meanwhile, combine dressing ingredients. 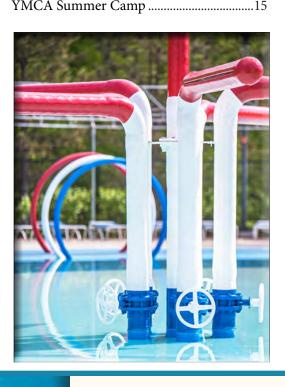
