

Board of Directors Meeting Highlights

The following actions were taken by the Board of Directors at *their meeting held on August 13th*, 2019:

- Approved the amended minutes of July 9th, 2019 meeting
- Tabled approval of a traffic signal easement at Van Metre Drive and Broadlands Blvd
- Approved a Common Area Grading Request, pending approval from the Army Corps of Engineers
- Approved an Eagle Scout tree planting project request, pending additional information
- Approved a \$15K annual allowance for root pruning along the trails by Potomac Tree and Shrub
- Discussed the Fit Trail area behind Becontree, directed management to poll the forums
- Approved the replacement of the Leopard Gecko in the Nature Center
- Approved the Fire System Monitoring Contract from VSC for the Nature Center
- Approved the Pool Pass Software proposal from Cellbadge
- Held two violation hearings and assessed violation charges

In the blink of an eye, Summer is over once again. We've made it to fall and the kids have gone back to school, the pools are closing, the days are shorter, and commute times have increased. We had a great time celebrating Summer at our popular float nights, summer celebration, Flicks in the Sticks outdoor family movie nights, and Broadlands Live! free concert series. Many thanks to our wonderful volunteers who make these events happen year after year. If any of these are favorites of yours, please consider helping out so they don't go by the wayside.

If you're worried the time for fun is over, don't panic as we have plenty of fun fall events to peak your interest. Check out our Pooch Pool Party, Succulent Craft, Holiday Appetizers and Wine, Holiday Craft Fair, Antique Car Show, and the always popular Halloween and Santa events, not to mention our array of nature activities including the everpopular Friday night Family Camp Outs. We hope to see you out and about as you get settled into your fall routine.

Speaking of which, as we settle back into the school and work routines, we'd like to remind our residents that the start of school brings an increase in pedestrian and bicycle traffic on our roads, sidewalks, and trails. Broadlands is home to two elementary schools and one middle school, plus an array of daycares, churches, and after school programs. Drivers should be aware of the increased child pedestrian traffic throughout the county and mindful that school children often aren't as visible as adults due to their smaller statures.

For those dropping their children off at the schools or waiting at bus stops, please remember that double parking, parking in fire lanes, blocking of intersections, as well as making u-turns in the middle of the road are all illegal. Please also be mindful of your neighbors and do not use their driveways to turn around. There is also an increase in newer drivers as the teenagers are able transport themselves to schools. Most importantly, limit distractions while driving and don't text and drive!

Broadlands has three underground tunnels to help keep our residents safe; one on Claiborne Parkway connecting Hillside Elementary with Harvest Green Terrace, another on Claiborne Parkway which connects the Nature Center with Village Drive (close to Mill Run and Eagle Ridge), and a third on Waxpool connecting the Community Center with the LeFevre Stone House and Hillside Park (close to Eagle Ridge). We encourage all bicycle and pedestrian traffic to utilize the tunnels rather than cross these main roads, even at stop lighted intersections. Heritage Landscape Services sweeps each tunnel for debris and graffiti every Monday in conjunction with their trash can services to help keep these tunnels clean and safe for school children as well as the walkers, runners, and bikers who regularly use the path. However; accidents, vandalism, and spills can happen in an instant and we are not always aware of them. If you are aware of an unsafe or vulgar condition in the tunnels, please report them to the HOA office at 703-729-9704 or email info@broadlandshoa.com.

If you have a child attending school this year, please be sure to check out the article in the August newsletter all about back to school safety. It can be found at https://www.broadlandshoa.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/07/AUG-19.pdf, page 12. The Nature Center can be used as an official safe house for the schools in case of an emergency. Our normal business hours are Monday through Friday from 9am-5pm, with staff members available to assist in contacting the police in case of an emergency. Please stop by to ensure that your child knows where we are located. They may want to stop by regularly on their way home from school just to visit our friendly animals!

Are You Selling Your Home?


Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidently placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed it notifies theHOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, structures that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the owner's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement then, the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. Residents frequently express concern that not everyone is taking the time to pick up their pet's waste in the neighborhood. Please ensure that your family members realize how important it is to be a responsible pet owner:

Dog poop is not natural, especially in the quantities that are generated by pets. It harms the environment and threatens public health.

Forgot your waste bag? No worries! The Broadlands HOA has 78 mutt mitt stations to offer residents.

Don't want to carry it with you? No problem, most of our mutt mitt stations have trash cans attached.

Even if your dog poops in the woods, you still need to clean it up. Not only is it unsightly, it can get into streams and into the water supply. It's the law! Is it a violation of the Association Declaration, Article 8, Section 8.2(q) to not pick up your pet's waste, it is also a county ordinance violation. Please reference Loudoun County Ordinance, Chapter 612.19, Section a (9) Dog waste.

Covenants Corner

Throughout the year, the Covenants Manager routinely inspects homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications to leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections where violations may occur with high frequency.

This helps preserve the property values for home ownership, promotes community harmony and ensures the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained.

If any violations of these types are noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing sixty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent, and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$10/day for a maximum of ninety (90) days.



HELLO BEAUTIFUL FALL

After every very hot summer, I welcome the beautiful fall in Virginia. It is also the time to spend cleaning up gardens and picking up leaves. Let's admit that most people enjoy butterflies and birds visiting their gardens. We can find the balance of providing these habitats and keeping our gardens tidy as well. Maybe, we can redefine the meaning of "tidy garden" as the shelter of the next spring.

Delaying your garden's clean up until the spring is a blessing for the creatures living there-Instead of heading out to clear out everything dry and brown this fall, wait until next April. By then, all the critters living there will be emerging from their long winter nap and find their way out.



Leaves - Transfer leaves to a corner or beneath a hedge. Many butterfly and moth species overwinter as pupae in leaf litter.

Twigs - Put bundles of twigs at the back of borders, or in a plant pot on its side, where invertebrates and small mammals can shelter.

Plant pots - Leave stacks of plant pots in a sheltered spot to offer shelter for bees and other insects.



Nest boxes - Birds will use clean nest boxes to stay warm and dry.

Edges - Leave herbaceous plants intact in winter so decaying plants can act as a 'winter duvet' for small mammals and insects. Clumps of ornamental grasses may offer the perfect hibernaculum while hollow plant stems and seedheads provide nooks and crannies for invertebrates.



Backyard Sheds - Some adult butterflies overwinter and will enter our homes in autumn, where they find conditions cool and dry. However, when the central heating is turned on, they wake up and expend energy flying around. If you find a butterfly inside your home, transfer it to your shed or garage, where temperatures will remain constant. Use an empty shoe box to move it, keeping the lid on until it has settled down. Make sure it can exit safely in spring, via a window or door.

Ponds - Male frogs often spend winter in the muddy depths of ponds, breathing through their skin. But if the pond freezes over, gases caused by

decaying plant material can get trapped and poison them. Remove debris now and float a tennis ball on the surface to prevent ice from sealing it.

So, enjoy the extra time this fall and your gardens as living habitats!

Census Day Information and Job Workshops

Census Day is coming up on April 1, 2020. Everyone living in the county must be counted, regardless of age or citizenship. The Census is extremely important to Loudoun County not only for determining representation for elected office but also how much funding the county receives for vital education, healthcare, transportation, and social services. Last year Loudoun received almost \$31 million in federal funding based on the population data from the last census for programs including Head Start, Free & Reduced School Lunch, Healthcare, Affordable Housing, Road Projects, and SNAP (food stamps). Residents will be able to respond by phone (provided in 13 languages), mail, or online (provided in 13 languages).

The Census Bureau will be hiring more than 1,000 additional personnel in Loudoun County to help conduct the Census. Enumerator positions are compensated at \$25 per hour, plus reimbursement for mileage, etc. If you are considering applying, you may be interested in one of four workshops in September on the 6th, 13th, 16th, and 23rd conducted by Loudoun County's Workforce Resource Center. These sessions will offer instructions and tips on completing the 2020 Census employment application. Participants will have an opportunity to ask questions relating to the application process. 


