A Message From the Manager

As the days get shorter and the air gets crisper, I wonder once again how the year has flown by so fast. The heat of summer and sunbathing by the pools is but a distant memory and the holidays are within grasp. The weeks until New Year's will feel more like days when it's all said and done. However, fall remains an incredibly busy time at the HOA and we aren't ready to close out the year just yet. We are immersed in fall landscaping projects, off season pool improvements, ongoing community building improvements, review of roads and sidewalk conditions, budget and reserve planning, and preparation for impending inclement weather (anyone else remember 2012 when parts of western Loudoun got five inches of snow a few days before Halloween?) The board and committees are comprised of your amazing neighbors who donate their time help plan events, review contracts, direct staff, and make difficult decisions that impact your home, your community, and your finances.

We are thrilled with some of the projects we completed in 2019, which included replacement of 3 more tot lots and installation of our solar panels at the Nature Center. Our engineer updated the reserve study, which tracks all of the common elements owned by the association, estimates their remaining useful years, average lifespan, and replacement cost, and recommends an annual contribution sufficient to fund the future repair and replacement of the items. This can include anything from roads and sidewalks, streetlights and path, common building roofs and windows, flooring and computers, pond infrastructure and retaining walls. Line item expenses ranging from \$1,000 to a million are included for all common elements expecting to need repair or replacement in the next 50 years. While state law requires this document get updated at least once every five years, management, contractors, and board members review it multiple times a year and often obtain a formal engineering update every few years to account for new infrastructure added or to adjust life expected or payment schedules.

The board worked with Van Metre to approve an easement for a traffic signal at the intersection of Broadlands Boulevard and Old Wood Way. We also negotiated the annexation of additional units into the association, which offered the HOA the opportunity to provide much input on the exterior maintenance, parking, and amenities included in the proposed areas, not to mention negotiating for additional seed money for capital improvement projects. While some of the projects are controversial, the board dedicated countless hours to ensuring that the community receives the most benefit possible from projects such as these. If you have not attended a board meeting, I encourage you to attend an upcoming meeting to observe first-hand how the business is run. Our next meeting is Tuesday, October 15th at 6:00pm at the clubhouse.

Hope to see you there.

Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidently placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed it notifies theHOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, structures that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the owner's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement then, the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. Dog poop is not natural, especially in the quantities that are generated by pets. It harms the environment and threatens public health.

Forgot your waste bag? No worries! The Broadlands HOA has 78 mutt mitt stations to offer residents.

Don't want to carry it with you? No problem, most of our mutt mitt stations have trash cans attached.

Even if your dog poops in the woods, you still

need to clean it up. Not only is it unsightly, it can get into streams and into the water supply.

It's the law! Is it a violation of the Association Declaration, Article 8, Section 8.2(q) to not pick up your pet's waste, it is also a county ordinance violation. Please reference Loudoun County Ordinance, Chapter 612.19, Section a (9) Dog waste.

Covenants Corner

Throughout the year, the Covenants Manager routinely inspects homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications to leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections where violations may occur with high frequency.

This helps preserve the property values for home ownership, promotes community harmony and ensures the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained.

If any violations of these types are noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing sixty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent, and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$10/day for a maximum of ninety (90) days.

HLS Continues to Ensure that Broadlands Landscaping is Prepared for Cooler Temps Submitted by Dave Brown, HLS Landscape Designer

Fall is just around the corner! There are several things to be excited for: the leaves turning beautiful colors, fun festivals everywhere you turn, football, and pumpkin spice flavored EVERYTHING. However, fall can also mean several new activities to do for your landscape or garden. Heritage Landscape Service is excited to continue to partner with Broadlands to keep your community looking its best.

As the temperatures begin to cool and we enter the early parts of fall, we will be looking to perform various types of landscape improvement projects throughout



the community. Dead tree removals, stump grindings, and replacements will be completed in order to maintain the community's canopy coverage. We will be looking at enhancing various areas throughout the community to help improve the curb appeal of those areas. Turf renovations will begin in late September/early October to take advantage of cooler night time temperatures where seed growth really thrives. Fall annual flower rotations are also slated to begin in early October throughout the community. The summer annuals will have run their course and violas will take their place.

Landscape maintenance continues throughout the community. As pools have closed, we will be going through the pool decks and getting the plant material ready for winter. Common area mowing, as well as pruning and other detail services, continue to be ongoing through the end of October and into November if needed.

Debris and trash management are performed on a weekly basis to ensure that the grounds stay trash and litter free. Certain types of trees are beginning to drop their leaves throughout the community. The leaves that drop early are mulched into the lawn instead of bagging and disposing of them. They are a free organic source of fertilizer for the lawn. Plant health care and Integrated Pest Management (IPM) services are on-going and the Broadlands staff will be notified if there is a problem.

Fall is the perfect time of year to enhance and improve the community landscape from all aspects.



LCSO Launches Vaping Educational Campaign to Deter Use Among Loudoun Youth Submitted by Loudoun County Sheriffs Office

In light of recent headlines regarding a surge in vapingrelated illnesses, Loudoun County Sheriff Mike Chapman is warning parents and teenagers alike of the potential dangers of vaping.

These electronic nicotine delivery systems, also known as electronic cigarettes or e-cigarettes, Vapes and JUULs, are advertised as a lower-risk alternative for smokers. In the beginning of September, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued an advisory after reporting 215 cases since late June from 25 states of severe respiratory disease possibly tied to vaping.

In an effort to educate the public on the potential health concerns with these devices, the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) released an informational video today to discuss vaping among our youth. "Unfortunately they have become popular among teenagers nationally at epidemic levels, and because they emit very low amounts of vapor or aerosol, they are often used during school hours, in school bathrooms and even classrooms," said Loudoun County Sheriff Mike Chapman in the video. "In just the past year, high-school-aged students using electronic cigarettes increased 78%. In Loudoun County, vapes have been found on students in both middle and high school," he added.

Most e-cigarettes contain nicotine, the same addictive drug in cigarettes. Some e-cigarettes may contain as much nicotine as a pack of 20 regular cigarettes. A consensus report conducted by the National Academies of Science, Engineering, and Medicine reviewed over 800 studies and also made clear that e-cigarettes both contain and emit a number of potentially toxic substances, and the inhalation of harmful chemicals can cause irreversible lung damage and lung disease.


"Even more disconcerting is what else can be inhaled from these devices," said Sheriff Chapman. "Recently members of the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office uncovered vapes containing THC, a butane hash oil. The concentration in the vape cartridges was 95 percent THC. This is well over 10 times more potent than a typical marijuana plant seized during my days as an agent with the Drug Enforcement Administration."

A nationwide study found that high school students using electronic cigarettes increased 78% last year and efforts are being made at the federal and state level to limit the access and promotion of vapor products to children. In July 2019, a new law took effect in Virginia prohibiting the purchase or possession of tobacco products, nicotine vapor products, and alternative nicotine products by a person under 21 years of age, or the sale of these products to persons under 21 years of age.

In Loudoun County, the LCSO begins discussing vaping devices in the D.A.R.E. program at both the elementary and middle school level. The agency is also working with Loudoun County Public Schools to deliver a series of educational forums on vaping. In partnership with the Prevention Alliance of Loudoun (PAL), the LCSO will hold a Vaping, JUULing, and Internet Safety seminar on November 7, 2019, from 6:30pm to 8:30pm at the Sterling Library, located at 22330 S. Sterling Boulevard.

Additional forums are being planned for this fall and will be held throughout the county at various Loudoun County Public Schools. Please follow @loudounsheriff on Facebook and Twitter for future dates, times, and locations of these forums.

As part of the educational campaign, residents can also find up-to-date information on the LCSO website at sheriff.loudoun.gov/vapes. The information includes important resources for parents, including a tip sheet on how to talk to your teen about vaping.

8 large scoops of vanilla ice cream 1 1/2 cups canned pumpkin puree 1/2 cup milk 1/2 cup caramel sauce


