

- Approved the minutes of October 13th,

- Did not approve a resident request for reimbursement for vehicle towing
- Did not approve a resident appeal for tree screening
- Postponed a resident request for basketball court upgrades
- Accepted the donation of a Free Little Library
- Confirmed VDOT's recommendation to delay traffic studies due to the pandemic
- Directed a request for traffic cameras to the county
- Approved the proposed revised Design Guidelines for Political Signs and Flags
- Approved a proposal for Nature Center landscape enhancement as recommended by the Conservation Landscape Committee
- Approved the 2021 Budget and Assessments
- Wrote off one foreclosed owner account balance
- Held five violation hearings and assessed charges

We generally meet on the second Tuesday of the month at 6:00pm and attending meetings is easier than ever, being held virtually using the zoom platform. Links to the monthly board meetings are posted on the calendar portion of our website. Board packages are available for review on FSRConnect and, once approved, meeting minutes are posted there as well. Additionally, a brief synopsis of the actions of each meeting is provided each month in this newsletter.

Thank you to all those who cast your votes in our annual election. 457 units, which comprises nearly 14% of our membership cast their votes online this year, the highest we have had since hiring The Inspectors of Election (TIE Vote) to handle our online voting process in 2015. Our Annual Meetings are typically held in May, but the 2020 meeting was delayed due to the onset of COVID early in the spring. However, we expect our 2021 meeting will be held on schedule in May, virtually

if necessary, so please be on the lookout for the Call for Candidates in early spring where we will have three positions up for election and consider submitting an application for candidacy if you are willing and able to spend time giving back to the community. If serving on the Board isn't up your alley, we have several active committees that might pique your interest. If you're interested in more information about Broadlands Live!, Community Outreach, Conservation Landscape, Events, Modifications, Technology, or the Tennis Committees, please reach out to me for full details.

Looking forward, we remain hopeful that 2021 will allow for some in person celebrations and we patiently await the safe reopening of the Fitness Center.



Scoop the Poop...



Residents frequently express concern that not everyone is taking the time to pick up their pet's waste in the neighborhood. Please ensure that your family members realize how important it is to be a responsible pet owner:

Pet poop is not organic, especially in the quantities that are generated by pets. It harms the environment and threatens public health.

Forgot your waste bag? No worries! The Broadlands HOA has 80 mutt mitt stations to offer residents. Don't want to carry it with you? No problem, most of our mutt mitt stations have trash cans attached. Please be a good neighbor and do not dispose of pet waste in your neighbors' trash cans during your walks.

Even if your pet poops in the woods, you still need to clean it up. Not only is it unsightly, it can get into streams and into the water supply.

It's the law! Is it a violation of the Association Declaration, Article 8, Section 8.2(q) to not pick up your pet's waste, it is also a county ordinance violation. Please reference Loudoun County Ordinance, Chapter 612.19, Section a (9) Dog waste.

Black Metal Fencing Allowed for Single Family Homes

Black metal fencing is allowed for all single family homes except for the Overland Park Sections 26, 28 and 30 – Van Metre and Washington Homes. Please refer to the fence design guidelines for more details and submission requirements at: https://broadlandshoa.org/design-guidelines.

Townhouse Deck Guidelines Update

Before you make any modification change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review.

Guideline changes for townhouse decks are as follows:

- General guidelines for townhouse decks have been moved to a section of its own. Please see specific guidelines for each townhouse section for additional requirements.
- Ground level deck guidelines have been added.
- Black metal balusters are allowed for deck railings.

Disposing of Leaves in the Streets...Really?

When disposing of leaves, please collect them into a pile and place them into a lawn waste bag for pick up on yard waste collection day. Yard waste collection day for Broadlands is every Monday. *The community has NO county pick up for leaves*.

Disposing of leaves onto the street only leads them to blow back onto your lawn and onto your neighbor's. Also, when using a snow blower, please blow your driveway snow onto your own property not your neighbors, the street, or the sidewalk. Please be courteous of your neighbors.

2020 Trash and Recycling Holiday Schedule

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEARS

Trash and recycling will be picked up on a normal schedule. Patriot Disposal's offices will be closed on Christmas and New Year's Day.

CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION

Christmas trees will be collected the first 2 Mondays in January, on Monday, January 4th and Monday, January 11th. All trees must be placed on the curb with all tinsel/decorations removed and trees should not be placed in plastics bags.

Mind your Modification – Spa/Hot Tubs Update

Before you make any modification change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review.

Spas and Hot Tubs must be located in the rear yard. However, there is an exception for Courtyard homes with side-yard patios. Courtyard style homes with side-yard patios will be considered due to their unique design. The courtyard side patio must be fenced entirely at a 6-foot height.

Covenants Corner

Trash Cans and Recycling Bins...One More Time

As we continue muddling our way through this unusual year, trash cans and recycling bins being left outside on non-trash days remain a major problem within the community. To the residents that are not putting their homes up for sale this may not be an issue, but to those that are, they have a totally different viewpoint. To sellers and concerned homeowners, esthetics are very important. The overall appearance of our community has a direct effect on their property values.

Trash and recycling containers are collected on Mondays and Thursdays of each week unless notified otherwise. On an average non-trash collection day, there can be a minimum of 250 illegal trash containers throughout the community. Consequently, in one month, there can be as many as 5,000 violations noted. Undoubtedly, it is not a pretty picture to turn onto one of the beautiful streets in your community and see trash cans lined up along both sides of the street, laying in the streets, trash blown onto lawns, and trash containers sitting in front of garages.

As a community, we need to reduce the numbers of these occurrences. Covenants is doing all that we can, but we would like to educate and work with our residents to rid the community of this ongoing issue.

To help rid our community of this major concern, please follow these simple requirements:

- Write your house number on your trash container and recycling bin. Patriot Disposal allows you to print your house number on both sides of your containers. Doing so will cut down on lost containers, someone mistaking your container for theirs or a violation notice sent to you in error.
- If you have a fenced in rear yard the trash container and recycling bin can be stored inside the fence. Stored there, it will be considered to be stored out of open view.
- Apply for a simple trash enclosure on the side of your home to store your containers. There are numerous examples in the community.
 The application process is simple and no cost to you.
- If you are worried about catching COVID-19, sanitize the trash can and recycling bins' handles and lids before pulling it into your garage. This is no different than pulling your car into your garage each evening.
- Lastly, if you have a broken container, contact Patriot Disposal at 703-257-7100 for a free replacement.
- Trash and recycling containers are collected on Mondays and Thursdays unless notified otherwise.
- Trash/recycling containers may be placed at your curbside after 4:00pm the day before collection. They also must be removed by 9:00am the following day. It is a violation of our covenants to leave or store your trash/recycling containers in public view if it is *NOT* a pickup day.

By helping to lower the number of trash cans and recycling bins left out on non-trash days, you will be helping to keep Broadlands a beautiful place to live. You will also be helping to keep its property values high. Please contact me if you wish to discuss this matter or if you have any other suggestions.





Fire Safety Tips For Your Christmas Tree

Taken From ACTA website, Christmas Tree Facts And Figures

Don't let Christmas ever heat up too much—with fire that is. Did you know that Christmas trees alone result in 13 million dollars, annually, in property damage? More importantly, these fires present real risk towards family and friends. When showcasing a live tree in your home, the combination of tree dryness, electrical malfunction with lights and poorly located heating sources can make for a deadly combination.

But if your holiday is just not complete without a live tree, follow these safety precautions to keep threats at bay:

- Fresh trees are less likely to catch fire, so look for a tree with vibrant green needles that are hard to pluck and don't break easily from its branches. The tree shouldn't be shedding its needles readily.
- Always place your tree away from heat sources like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights, and keep the tree base filled with water to avoid a dry out.
- Make sure all your indoor and outdoor Christmas lights have been tested in a lab by the UL or ETL/ITSNA for safety, and throw out any damaged lights.
- Any lights you use outdoors must be labeled suitable for exterior placement, and be sure to plug them into a ground-fault circuit interrupter protected receptacle.
- Keep all your holiday candles away from your Christmas tree, surrounding furniture and décor.
- Bedtime means lights off! Don't forget to turn your Christmas tree lights off each night.

When your tree begins to drop its needles, it's time to say goodbye to your evergreen foliage until next year. So this year, follow our guidelines to avoid being another statistic in the National Fire Protection Association or United States Fire Administration report during the upcoming holiday season.

Dear Homeowners,

The following pages present the approved 2021 operating Budget for Broadlands Association, Inc. as approved at the November 2020 Board of Directors Meeting. All budgetary accounts are adjusted for inflation and based on historical precedent. As done every year, the Board of Directors and Management work diligently to control expenses and generate income to keep assessments as low as possible, while continuing to provide quality services and amenities to the community. While many budget line items were maintained at 2020 levels, we have a significant decrease in revenue from sources other than assessments. The Board offset a projected \$100,838 budget deficit with prior year members' equity, but an increase in assessments is necessary to meet budgeted expenses for the Association. Therefore, the Board of Directors approved a \$3.00 monthly increase in the general assessment, which all homeowners pay to cover common expenses. The Board also approved a \$1.00 monthly increase for town homes due to increases in the trash service contract and private road maintenance, and a \$1.00 monthly increase in the courtyard homes due to increases in landscape services.

Prior to the January 1, 2021 payment deadline, please review your payment system to be sure it reflects the correct amount in order to avoid late fees.

Single Family Homes on VDOT streets	\$84.00 per month	Town Homes	\$98.00 per month
Single Family Homes on Private Street	\$105.00 per month	Villa Homes	\$116.00 per month
Courtyard Homes	\$151.00 per month	Condominium Units	\$63.00 per month

Assessment payments coupons will be mailed to all owners at the address on file with FirstService Residential. If you have not received your coupons by December 15, 2020, please contact Customer Care Call Center at 866-433-3187 or by email at AR.DCMetro@fsresidential.com. If you participate in ClickPay recurring payments (Auto Pay) through FirstService Residential, you will *NOT* receive a coupon booklet, and the 2020 assessments will be automatically deducted from your account.

Owners can make convenient and secure payments online through ClickPay. Payments can be made via e-Check (free) or Credit/Debit Card (fees apply) for a one-time payment or to set up automatic payments, eliminating a missed or late payment and the Association charging a late fee to your account. To use ClickPay to pay assessments online or to sign up for automatic payments, please visit www.ClickPay.com/FirstService and create an account using the account number on the payment coupon. Please call 888-354-0135 (option 1) for assistance with ClickPay.

If you have questions regarding the budget or assessment levels, please contact the General Manager, Sarah Gerstein, or address the Board of Directors at the next monthly Board Meeting on Tuesday December 8, 2020 at 6:00pm being held virtually via zoom – see website prior to the meeting for connection information.

We look forward to providing continued great service to our residents in 2021, whatever it may bring. Best wishes for a safe holiday season and New Year!

REPLACEMENT RESERVE STATEMENT

In accordance with the Virginia Property Owners Association Act, Broadlands Association, Inc. is funding its reserve account at or above the levels recommended in the November 7, 2019 Replacement Reserve Study completed by Miller + Dodson Associates, Inc. As of January 1, 2021, the association is projected to hold a combined \$5,170,662.70 in reserve accounts for common areas and private roads. Broadlands has budgeted 2021 reserve allocations to be in line with the Reserve Study recommendations of funding the reserves at a combined total of \$689,439 annually. The Reserve Study identified 339 items that will require periodic replacement over 40 years that are to be funded from Replacement Reserves and uses the cash flow funding method. Reserve contributions are made monthly and are administered by an independent financial advisor who distributes funds into laddered Certificate of Deposits in accordance with FDIC laws. There is sufficient cash in the accounts to cover the current funding requirement outlined by the study.



Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy Unveils Harrison Street Pollinator Meadow Interpretive Panels!

Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy installed a pollinator meadow along Harrison Street near downtown Leesburg along the Washington and Old Dominion Trail with partners, Friends of the Washington and Old Dominion Trail, Northern Virginia Regional Parks Authority, and support and funding from the Leesburg Garden Club and Loudoun Wildlife members and volunteers. An unveiling ceremony of the newly installed interpretive panels with partners and supporters was held on October 28th. The ceremony included social distancing and COVID-19 precautions.

Volunteers planted 1358 native plants including 264 grasses and sedges and 1094 forbs on 7,600 square feet. These plants provide a vital habitat for pollinators, seed eating birds, and other wildlife, providing an example of an aesthetically pleasing meadow created from native plants. Interpretative signage was installed to explain the project and educate residents about the importance of native flora and the benefits native vegetation provides to wildlife.

Birds seen enjoying the meadow include the white-throated sparrow, American goldfinch, ruby-throated hummingbird, gray catbird, and tufted titmouse. Many butterflies including monarchs, red admirals, viceroys, and eastern tail swallowtails are frequently seen, as well as red-legged grasshoppers, common eastern bumble bees, honey bees and spotted orb weavers.

"We are extremely grateful for funding from the Leesburg Garden Club to be able to install signage along this beautiful pollinator meadow. This meadow provides tremendous benefits to our pollinators and other wildlife, and it's a great example of how wildlife habitat can be created in small spaces. We hope the residents of Leesburg and recreational users of the W&OD Trail enjoy this meadow as much as we do," states Michael Myers, Executive Director of Loudoun Wildlife.

Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy appreciates all that helped bring this project to fruition, including Earth Sangha and Watermark Woods for supplying the native plants, Pulse Design for fabricating the interpretive panels, Manuel Rivas of Northern Virginia Property Services for installing the interpretive signs and maintenance, Susan Abrahams, Conservation Landscaper, for her time and instruction on how to design and maintain a meadow, Ann Garvey for bringing a vision to reality, and the 20 volunteers that donated more than 100 hours of their time.

Celebrating the Holidays Safely During the COVID-19 Pandemic

The Loudoun County Health Department encourages residents to plan their holiday celebrations and travel carefully to lower the risk of getting and spreading the virus that causes COVID-19. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) advises that staying home is the best way to protect yourself and others. Those who choose to gather and travel over the holiday season should avoid high-risk activities.

"It is important that Loudoun residents consider the impact of the coronavirus on our festivities this year," said Loudoun County Health Director Dr. David Goodfriend. "The potential for the virus to spread through traditional holiday activities is high and so I urge caution to keep your families safe over Thanksgiving and throughout this holiday season."

Lower-Risk Activities

Celebrating virtually or with members within your household poses the lowest risk for spread of COVID-19. While transmission of COVID-19 continues, the CDC recommends that families participate in these lower-risk activities that can be enjoyed with family and friends at a safe distance:

- Small dinner gatherings with only people who live in your household.
- Preparing traditional family recipes for family and neighbors, especially those at higher risk of severe illness from COVID-19, and delivering them in a way that doesn't involve contact with others.
- Having a virtual dinner and sharing recipes with friends and family.
- Shopping online rather than in person on the day after Thanksgiving or the next Monday.
- Watching sports events, parades and movies from home

Moderate- and Higher-Risk Activities

To help prevent the spread of COVID-19, the Health Department does not recommend participating in moderate- and higher-risk activities, which include:

- Outdoor gatherings with family and friends in your community.
- Visiting pumpkin patches and orchards.
- Attending outdoor or indoor sports events.
- Attending large indoor gatherings with people from outside your household.
- Going shopping in crowded stores just before, on, or after Thanksgiving.

- Participating or being a spectator at a crowded race.
- Attending crowded parades.
- Using alcohol or drugs, which can cloud judgment and increase risky behaviors.

If You Travel

Traveling during this holiday season increases your chances of getting and spreading COVID-19. Many jurisdictions also have imposed local restrictions on visitors that may impact your travel plans. If you choose to travel during the holiday season, the CDC strongly encourages the following precautions:

- Do not travel if you are sick or have been around someone with COVID-19 within 14 days of travel.
- Wear a face covering to keep your nose and mouth covered when in public settings, including on public transportation and in transportation hubs such as airports and rail or bus stations.
- Avoid close contact by staying at least 6 feet apart from anyone who is not from your household.
- Wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer.
- Avoid contact with anyone who is sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Learn more about traveling safety during the pandemic by visiting the CDC's website, cdc.gov/coronavirus.

"There are a number of factors that increase the risk of getting infected and spreading the virus to others," said Dr. Goodfriend. "These include the level of COVID-19 transmission in a community and whether events are indoors in places with poor ventilation for a longer durations of time, and the number of people gathering; considering these impacts in your holiday planning will help reduce your risk."

Everyday Safety Precautions

As you plan your celebrations this holiday season, remember that each of us has a role to play in slowing the spread of COVID-19. Keep in mind the simple steps that everyone should take every day to help keep yourself, your family and your community safe. These steps include:

 Stay home and away from others if you are sick; avoid contact with people who are sick.




