### **Annual Meeting of the Membership**

The most important meeting of the year will be held on Tuesday, May 4th at 7pm— the Annual Meeting of the Membership. The meeting will be held virtually via zoom. This meeting, held every year in order to elect the Board of Directors, is required by the Bylaws for Broadlands Association, Inc. and the quorum requirement is at least ten percent of the total number of votes of the association must be present in person or by proxy. You should have received official notification of this meeting via USPS mail in early April.

This year, we have four open positions – three for threeyear terms and one for a two-year term. We received nominating forms and petitions from three candidates: Dawne Holz, William Kolster, and Tania Marceau. Their nominating forms are included on pages 11-13 of this newsletter.

Some of the powers and duties of the Board include: providing goods and services in accordance with the documents and providing for the upkeep of the common area; designating, hiring, and dismissing personnel necessary to providing for the upkeep of the common area and providing goods and services; collecting and depositing assessments; adopting and amending rules and regulations; opening bank accounts; enforcing provisions of the documents; obtaining and carrying insurance; paying for authorized goods and services; charging reasonable fees for the use of the common area; suspending the right of an owner or occupant to vote or to use common areas; preparing and adopting an annual budget and establishing assessments; borrowing money on behalf of the association; and employing a managing agent. The full list of powers and duties can be found in the Bylaws for Broadlands.

The Articles of Incorporation provide that the Board be comprised of nine people elected to serve in staggered terms of three years each. Eligible Board Members include owners, owner's spouses, an officer, trustee, general partner or agent of an owner, the Declarant or designee of the Declarant, or a mortgagee or designee of the mortgagee. Owners or representatives of owners may not be more than sixty days delinquent in meeting financial obligations to the association.

In 2015, the Board of Directors moved from a paper voting system to an online voting system by hiring The Inspectors of Election. Official meeting notices are still mailed to all owners of record but are also emailed with a link to the website to those owners for which we have valid email addresses. The online voting process eases the ability for homeowner to participate in the elections and increases the likelihood of the HOA to achieve a quorum of owners.

Please take a few moments to log onto tieivote.com with your unique username and password (provided to you in the official mailing and via email for those previously registered) to submit your proxy if you are unable to attend the meeting in person. You may elect to use your proxy for quorum purposes only or you may cast votes for us to four

# Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidentally placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed, it notifies the HOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the seller's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement, then the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. # Residents Must Apply for Tree Removal!

It has been reported that tree companies are driving through Broadlands looking for trees to remove from resident properties claiming that their company was referenced on the HOA website as an approved company for executing tree removal. The HOA does not endorse or give blanket approval for tree removal companies. Approval is required to remove any tree either dead or alive whose trunk measures 4" or more in diameter when measured at the height of 4' from the ground. Please review the guidelines at https://broadlandshoa.org/wp-content/uploads/2013/03/049-Tree-Removalapproved-6-14-16.pdf. *Please be aware removing trees or underbrush from common areas is prohibited*.

# Street Play is Not Legal Nor is it Safe

The public roadways are NOT playgrounds for kids to play in. It is not only illegal but unsafe. Not all drivers slow down in neighborhood streets and some could be distracted by electronic devices in use. Please keep your kids safe by having them play somewhere other than the streets. # Attention Tenants & Rental Property Owners:

If you are renting a property in Broadlands and would like to access our pools, please provide an Absentee Owner Statement (AOS) and a copy of a new lease or lease extension. If you had virtual pool passes last year, your pool passes will automatically be renewed upon receipt of a current AOS and lease/lease extension so you will not need to reapply for virtual pool passes. PROPERTY OWNERS: If you wish to transfer privileges of the amenities to your tenants, please ensure the HOA has a current AOS and copy of the lease for your property on file. EXISTING TENANTS: If your lease expired at any time last year (especially during June/July/August pool season months) and you renewed your rental contract, you will need to provide an updated AOS and lease/lease extension so your pool passes can be extended for the 2021 season. NEW TENANTS: Provide a newly completed AOS (signed by the owner) and a copy of your lease before registering for pool passes. Send all AOS and Lease documents to info@ broadlandshoa.com - please include your rental property address and reference "AOS Docs" in the subject line. After we update our records to reflect a valid tenancy at a Broadlands HOA address, we will direct you to register for pool passes. ### **Recycling Collection:**

- Recycling pick up day is Thursdays.
- Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- Plastic bags CANNOT be recycled. The Nature Center collects bags for proper recycling. Visit broadlandshoa.org, click on RESIDENTS then click on TRASH & RECYCLING for more information.
- Scrap metal Please call Patriot Disposal to set pick-up day 1-703-257-7100: i.e. foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.

### **Yard Waste Collection:**

- Yard Waste Collection occurs on Mondays from March 1st thru December 24th.
- During January & February, yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash. Yard waste may not be mixed with recycling.
- Grass clippings and leaves must be set out for pickup in lawn paper bags or in a bin.
- Brush must be less than 4 inches in diameter, cut into 4 foot lengths, and tied in small bundles or bagged.
- Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.

- Special items will be collected weekly. Some items may incur an additional charge.
- Special items include appliances, mid to large furniture and other large items.

# **Grill Safety**Provided By: Loudoun County Fire and Rescue:

Fire in the grill is a welcome sight at the family cookout but fire anywhere else can make your summer barbecue memorable for all the wrong reasons.

### Follow these tips to stay safe during grilling season:

- Only use propane & charcoal BBQ grills outdoors.
- Keep grills at least 15ft away from any structure and away from flammable materials.
- Regularly clean grease or fat buildup from the grill and grease trap.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Keep children and pets away from the grill area.
- It is unlawful to operate an open flame grill, hibachi, gas grill, manufactured fireplace or portable fire pit, etc. within 15ft of any apartment building, condominium, commercial business, health care facility, or housing for the aged or physically and/or mentally impaired.

#### **Charcoal Grills**

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add any other flammable liquids to the fire.

- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- After grilling when ready to cleanup, soak charcoal briquettes and ashes with water placed in a metal container, soaked with water, and allowed to cool overnight in a location that is at least 15 ft. away from any building or structure. Re-check the container in the morning to ensure nothing is smoldering, then properly dispose of the wet materials.

#### **Propane Grills**

- Placement of any grill should be away from the house and not up against it!
- Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. If a propane leak is present, it will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, obvious by the odor or the soapy bubble test, but no flame, turn off the gas tank and grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department.
- If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department.
- Store a propane cylinder in a detached shed away from the home. Never store propane cylinders indoors or in enclosed areas, e.g. basement, garage, tent, etc.

ONCE FULLY REGISTERED WITH PHOTOS SUBMITTED, DO-NOT RE-REGISTER FOR FUTURE SEASONS!

STEP 1 - CREATE HOUSEHOLD ACCOUNT: Go to Cellbadge link above and under Initial Add Request, enter the information as a primary resident to create your master household account. Please enter street number and name only, no suffix (i.e., Ct, Court, Ter, Terrace, etc.). Your add request will be forwarded to HOA staff who will validate your residency and account status. Please allow up to 3 business days for the initial approval to be processed. Once validated, you will receive a text/email indicating that your registration has been added but will remain pending until all 4 steps have been completed.

**STEP 2 - ACQUIRE PIN:** After you have received a text/email that your registration has been added, please return to the same registration page and follow the instructions under **Enter or Update Household Members**. Enter your credentials to get your unique PIN via text/email to continue the process.

**STEP 3 - ADD HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS:** Enter PIN to access the **Household Members** page to add all household members, ages 5 and older. **Be sure to select the appropriate "Relation" category when adding members:** 

- Owners select "Owner-xxx" for ALL household members regardless of age.
- Tenants select "Tenant-xxx" for ALL household members if owner does not live on property.
- Apartment Renters select "Apartment-xxx" for all household members.
- Nannies/Long Term guests, please select "Other-xxx" as appropriate.

Once finished, check the box to verify you have agreed to the facility terms and click **Complete Registration**. Please allow up to 3 business days for approval, upon which you will receive a text/email indicating that *your Broadlands HOA registration has been accepted*, however, you must complete STEP 4 (pictures) to gain access to the pools.

### STEP 4 - PICTURES: Email pictures of all household members aged 5 & up following these guidelines:

- Email an \*acceptable photo (jpg or png format) of each member in your household to info@broadlandshoa.com. Copies of driver's license should be used for 18+ members. Recent copies of headshots may be used for children under 18.
- Subject line of email must be written as: "pool photos registered lastname" (i.e. pool photos Smith)
- Save and attach each photo separately to your email using naming convention: "address.firstname" (i.e. 42001Ridgeway.Susan).
- All member names must correspond with registered names in your Cellbadge pool account to allow for proper import. Pictures will be
  processed within 2-3 business days.

#### \*What are acceptable photos and adult requirements?

- Adults aged 18 and over are <u>required</u> to show proof of residency with a **copy of a driver's license** showing the picture, address, name and date of birth. For security reasons, all other information can be crossed off. If the ID does not reflect the registered address, then settlement papers, utility bills or a change of address card may be emailed.
- For children aged 5 and older, please email a <u>current</u> headshot or ID. Children aged 4 and under do not require photos.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

**ACCESSING THE POOL:** Once your photos have been added to your account, your process is complete, and access to the pools is simple since no pass is required – just check-in with the lifeguard by providing your name or address and they will be able to access your "virtual ID card" in the system to allow entrance. **Once registered, no further action is needed for future pool seasons.** 

**GUEST VISITS:** Visits will be added to your household account each year. Additional guest visits can be purchased through our website at **broadlandshoa.org/pool**. Visits do not roll over to the next season. **Please note COVID restrictions may apply**.

**TENANTS:** You must have a <u>current</u> **Absentee Owner Statement (AOS) and lease** on file with the HOA before registering. Please see information on our website under www.broadlandshoa.org/tenant-information.

**APARTMENTS:** Tenants of The Arbors and Van Metre Apartments must <u>purchase</u> a household pool membership first at broadlandshoa.org/pool-information.

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# Beat the Summer Heat With a Native Plant Shade Garden

They say shade gardens are the gardens of the future, since it will be too hot to spend much time in the sun. That's pretty much the case already on most summer days. Although sunny butterfly gardens still provide hours of entertainment, a shady place to relax or play in your yard is a welcome addition. An added bonus is that gardening is a lot easier in the shade, because the weeds grow much more slowly.

There are plenty of native flowers available to provide color in a shade garden. You can see examples of them at plantnovanatives.org/shade-gardens on the Plant NOVA Natives website. Many of those species also make excellent ground covers. For example, Woodland Phlox and Golden Ragwort are evergreen and spread to make a mat, with blue and yellow flowers respectively in the spring. April and May are a particularly lively time in the shade, as spring ephemerals such as Virginia Bluebell and Spring Beauty pop up and bloom before the trees and shrubs leaf out, then disappear when the shade gets too heavy. They make perfect companion plants for the ferns and sedges that provide a cooling backdrop all summer long. Contrasting foliage textures create visual interest even without flowers.

Why choose native plants? A plant is native to our environment if it evolved within the local food web and has the intricate relationship with animals and other plants that this implies. Plants such as turf grass and many of the ornamentals that were brought here after the arrival of the Europeans are nearly useless (and sometimes actually harmful) from an ecosystem perspective. Choosing native plants allows us to fit into the ecosystem instead of displacing it.






### **Proper Mulching Techniques**

### **Benefits of Proper Mulching**

- Helps maintain soil moisture. Evaporation is reduced, and the need for watering can be minimized.
- Helps control weeds. A 2"-4" layer of mulch will reduce the germination and growth of weeds.
- Insulation. Mulch keeps soils warmer in the winter and cooler in the summer.
- Improved quality of soil. Many types of mulch can improve soil aeration and structure and can improve drainage.
- Some types of mulch can improve soil fertility.
- A layer of mulch can help inhibit some types of plant disease.
- Helps facilitate lawn maintenance and reduces the risk of mechanical damage from weed-whips or lawn mowers.

Trees growing in a natural forest environment have their roots anchored in a rich, well-aerated soil full of essential nutrients. The soil is blanketed by leaves organic materials that replenish nutrients and provide an optimal environment for root growth and mineral uptake. Urban landscapes, however are typically a much harsher environment with poor soils, little organic matter, and large fluctuations in temperature and moisture. Applying a 2"-4" layer of mulch can help mimic a more natural environment and improve plant health. The roots of most trees can extend to a width of 2-3 times the diameter of the canopy of the tree. Additionally, most of the fine, nutrient and moisture absorbing roots are located in the top few inches of the soil. These roots require oxygen and moisture to survive. A thin layer of mulch, applied as broadly as practical, can improve

the soil structure, oxygen levels, temperature, and moisture availability where these roots grow.


#### Not too much!


As beneficial as mulch is, too much can be harmful. The generally recommended depth is 2"-4". Unfortunately, Virginia landscapes are falling victim to a plague of over-mulching. The term, 'mulch volcanoes,' has emerged to describe mulch that has been piled up around the base of trees. Most organic mulches must be replenished, but the amount of replenishment required depends upon the rate of mulch decomposition within your landscape. Thoroughly inspect your mulch beds to ensure that you maintain only a 2"-4" level around your trees and shrubs.

#### **Proper Mulching**

- Rake the old mulch to break up any matted layers prior to adding new mulch.
- Keep mulch back a minimum of 2" from the trunks of trees and shrubs.
- Use a well aerated and composted organic mulch to help improve soil conditions. Avoid sour-smelling mulch!
- Composted wood chips that contain leaves and bark make great mulch.
- Mulch a 2"-4" layer (including existing mulch) out to the dripline of the tree, or farther if practical.\*



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
