Traffic

This fall, tens of thousands of drivers will take to the roads as we return to a relative state of normalcy. Schools are heading back in session full time and many offices have or are planning to return from virtual to in-person office time over the next several months.

An event I faced while driving a few weeks ago was a poignant reminder to always be aware of everything going around you on the roads, be it other vehicles, pedestrian traffic, cyclists, animals, debris, or other. I was turning into Pagoda Terrace where the clubhouse is, a turn I make almost daily. I was being tailed closely by a large work vehicle and I was trying to get out of their way as they barreled down on me. As I turned into the neighborhood, a family was

crossing the road right in front of me. I spotted them and stopped in time, but it was a surprise to them as much as it was to me. I was too focused on stopping abruptly without stalling out to wave

apologetically, and by the time I parked and went to find them they were gone from view. Thankfully no one was injured but we all had a bit of a scare.

This is a good reminder that the start of school brings an increase in pedestrian and bicycle traffic on our roads, sidewalks, and trails. There also may be newer drivers or those who haven't been on the roads as much in the last 18 months. Broadlands is home to two elementary schools and one middle school, plus an array of daycares, churches, and after school programs. Drivers should be aware of the increased child pedestrian traffic throughout the county and mindful that school children often aren't as visible as adults due to their smaller statures. For those dropping their children off at the schools or waiting at bus stops, please remember that double parking, parking in fire lanes, blocking of intersections, as well as making u-turns in the middle of the road are all illegal. Please also be mindful of your neighbors and do not

use their driveways to turn around. There is also an increase in newer drivers as the teenagers are able transport themselves to schools. Most importantly, limit distractions while driving and don't text and drive!

Broadlands has three underground tunnels to help keep our residents safe; one on Claiborne Parkway connecting Hillside Elementary with Harvest Green Terrace, another on Claiborne Parkway which connects the Nature Center with Village Drive (close to Mill Run and Eagle Ridge), and a third on Waxpool connecting the Community Center with the LeFevre Stone House and Hillside Park (close to Eagle Ridge). We encourage all bicycle and pedestrian traffic to utilize the tunnels rather than cross these main

roads, even at stop lighted intersections. Heritage Landscape Services sweeps each tunnel for debris and graffiti every Monday in conjunction with their trash can services to help keep these tunnels clean and safe for school children

as well as the walkers, runners, and bikers who regularly use the path. However, accidents, vandalism, and spills can happen in an instant and we are not always aware of them.

Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidentally placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed, it notifies the HOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the seller's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement, then the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. Children Under 13 Years of Age Prohibited in the Fitness Center

Revised Storage Shed Guidelines

Before you make any modification change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review.

The storage shed design guidelines have been revised to include details on any proposed base or foundation for the shed, free standing sheds, and sheds attached to the house.

Residents Must Apply for Tree Removal

It has been reported that tree companies are driving through Broadlands looking for trees to remove from resident properties claiming that their company was referenced on the HOA website as an approved company for executing tree removal. The HOA does not endorse or give blanket approval for tree removal companies. Approval is required to remove any tree either dead or alive whose trunk measures 4" or more in diameter when measured at the height of 4' from the ground. Please review the guidelines at broadlandshoa.org/design-guidelines. *Please be aware removing trees or underbrush from common areas is prohibited*.

Patriot Disposal Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection Schedule

Trash, Recyling, and Yard Waste Collection:

- Place toters out the night before collection day after 6:00pm or before 6:00am the day of pick up.
- Containers shold be out of sight by 9:00am on the day following collection.

Trash Collection:

• Trash pick up days are Mondays and Thursdays.

Recycling Collection:

- Recycling pick up day is Thursdays.
- Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- Plastic bags CANNOT be recycled. The Nature Center collects bags for proper recycling. Visit broadlandshoa.org, click on RESIDENTS then click on TRASH & RECYCLING for more information.
- Scrap metal Please call Patriot Disposal to set pick-up day 1-703-257-7100: i.e. foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.

Yard Waste Collection:

- Yard Waste Collection occurs on Mondays from March 1st thru December 24th.
- During January & February, yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash. Yard waste may not be mixed with recycling.
- Grass clippings and leaves must be set out for pickup in lawn paper bags or in a bin.
- Brush must be less than 4 inches in diameter, cut into 4 foot lengths, and tied in small bundles or bagged.
- Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.

- Special items will be collected weekly. Some items may incur an additional charge.
- Special items include appliances, mid to large furniture and other large items.

Covenants Corner September Housekeeping

- Even though lawns are not growing due to the heat, your gardens and beds still need to be weeded and trimmed. Please be aware of how your neighbors see your property.
- For safety reasons, please trim the limbs of your trees back from all signs and sidewalks. Trees that overhang the sidewalk should be trimmed to provide a minimum height of eight (8) feet, measured above the sidewalk level. For more information visit broadlandshoa.org/covenants-corner
- Summer is almost over, have you taken a good look at and around your home to see if the trim needs to be painted, if there are items laying around your property that need to be removed, if your decks need to be stained (application may be required), and if your home is prepared for the winter months?
- Many homes have been sold in Broadlands this year. When Covenants did the final inspections for those properties, we found copious amounts of improvements that were never applied for and therefore did not receive approvals. Remember when you make an improvement on your property that changes anything, it may need to be approved such as staining a deck, adding a storm door, changing the color of anything including your deck, changing style, color, or size of any exterior lights, edging above 10", tree removal or planting, change in color of roofs, security devices, and many more.

Scoop the Poop...

Residents frequently express concern that not every pet owner is taking the time to pick up their pet's waste in the neighborhood. Please ensure that your family members realize how important it is to be a responsible pet owner:

Pet poop is not organic, especially in the quantities that are generated by pets. It harms the environment and threatens public health.

Forgot your waste bag? No worries! The Broadlands HOA has 80 mutt mitt stations to offer residents. Don't want to carry it with you? No problem, most of our mutt mitt stations have trash cans attached. Please be a good neighbor and do not dispose of pet waste in your neighbors' trash cans during your walks.

Even if your pet poops in the woods, you still need to clean it up. Not only is it unsightly, it can get into streams and into the water supply.

It's the law! Is it a violation of the Association Declaration, Article 8, Section 8.2(q) to not pick up your pet's waste, it is also a county ordinance violation. Please reference Loudoun County Ordinance, Chapter 612.19, Section a (9) Dog waste.

Loudoun County Seeks Volunteers to Serve on Lyme Disease Commission

The Loudoun County Lyme Disease Commission has a critical need for volunteer members so that it can resume its work to help mitigate Lyme disease in the county. Anyone interested in serving on the Lyme Commission is encouraged to visit loudoun.gov/advisory for information on how to apply.

The commission is preparing to hold meetings again after not meeting for the past year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. At full capacity, the commission has nine members who are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and needs a majority of those members for a quorum. There are currently openings for four members.

The commission was established by the Board of Supervisors in 2012 to work with county staff to implement the Board's 10-point action plan to mitigate Lyme disease in Loudoun County. Lyme disease is caused by bacteria that some people get after being bitten by ticks infected with an organism named Borrelia burgdorferi. The organism that causes Lyme disease is maintained in wild rodents, deer, other mammals and certain ticks, most commonly the black-legged (deer) tick. It is transferred to people by the bite of an infected tick. Infections occur throughout the year, but are more common during the late spring and summer and in people who work or play outdoors.

"Lyme Disease Commission members have played an important role in helping to raise awareness about Lyme disease and how to prevent it through a variety of outreach efforts, including the distribution of educational materials in the community and participating in community events," said Loudoun County Health Department Director Dr. David Goodfriend. "Lyme disease continues to affect people in Loudoun and the commission's activities are a key part of our prevention efforts."

Loudoun County encourages residents to become actively involved in their county government by serving on the advisory boards, commissions and committees that advise the Board of Supervisors on a variety of topics. 

Fewer Inputs to Your Landscape, More Butterflies and Birds Submitted by: Plant NOVA Natives

As more and more people buy native plants to beautify their yards, control stormwater and attract birds and butterflies, they are discovering additional opportunities to harmonize their property with the local ecosystem while maintaining a beautiful landscape. They are dropping some of their standard yard chores in favor of a slightly more relaxed approach.

Maintenance of native trees and shrubs is little different from maintenance of non-native ones, but chemical fertilizers are not generally recommended, and of course pesticides would be counterproductive, as they destroy the very ecosystem that the native plants were installed to enhance. The value of the native trees and shrubs is greatly increased if their fallen leaves are left in place. Within that leaf layer is where fireflies, butterflies, and many other interesting and beneficial insects complete their life cycles. Leaving the leaves where they lie has the added benefit of eliminating the chore and the incessant racket of gaspowered leaf blowers that disturb humans and songbirds alike.

Flower gardens with native plants also can be treated much the same as any other, as long as the gardener recognizes that most of these plants are perennial and not annual. The advantage of perennials is that they only need to be planted once. The disadvantage is that weeding will be needed, along with the ability to distinguish emerging weeds from emerging desirable plants, a task made easier for beginners by limiting the number of different species planted to three or four or by sticking to native groundcovers. These gardens cannot be handled the way maintenance crews typically deal with the plantings in public spaces. That method requires no knowledge of plant identification and consists of removing all the plant material each season, installing new annual plants, mulching heavily, then spraying any bare mulch with

herbicides to kill everything else. (This practice explains the expanses of empty (and chemical-laced) mulch beds that we see in so many business areas.)

Of course, leaf mulch can be used in flower beds without applying herbicides and is a valuable addition to new plantings, cooling the soil and adding organic matter. In time, though, as the plants fill in, mulch becomes unnecessary and just an aesthetic choice. The plants themselves will shade the soil, and their dead foliage and stems if left over the winter add habitat for frogs and nesting areas for native bees. The days of "cleaning out" flower gardens in the fall so that only empty beds remain are rapidly fading away, as gardeners are learning that this is an unnecessary and somewhat harmful practice.

The watering requirements of native plants are generally light, if appropriate plants are chosen for the site. Unlike turf grass, which evolved in Europe and is poorly suited to Virginia summers, and annuals which start out the summer with very few roots, well-established native plants are adapted to our climate. Watering is needed right after planting, and for the first year or two in the case of trees larger than seedlings, depending on the size. Native plants in medium or large pots will need continued watering primarily when the temperature exceeds 90 degrees. Beyond that, supplemental watering may actually be bad for some plants.

Details on low-input yard maintenance can be found on the https://www.plantnovanatives.org/. For those who don't want to do the gardening themselves (which is most people, after all), there are landscaping companies that specialize in maintaining naturalized landscapes and who have workers who can identify the native plants and protect them. The website has a list of Northern Virginia companies that have self-identified as having the requisite expertise.

An Introduction to Ornithology — Wednesdays, September 15, 22, & 29, 7:00pm – 9:00pm, Morven Park, Stone Barn, and Saturday, October 9 field trip (time and location TBD). Birdwatching as a past-time activity, along with participating in monitoring programs such as bluebird trails and hawk watches, have increased significantly in recent years. Many people find this a great way to connect with nature and enjoy the outdoors. While in the field, many of us collect data and submit it to citizen science projects and long-term programs. This data is used by professionals to study bird populations, conservation, migration, disease spread, climate change, and trends. 
