We've all spent the last year and a half rearranging our lives to make for a safer living environment, and it has been truly refreshing to be able to host outdoor events that are well attended and thoroughly enjoyed by the membership. It felt like a glimpse of relative normalcy to see kids running around the playground and enjoying their faces painted and balloon animals and watch adults enjoy the beautiful weather and fantastic sounds to kick off the final long weekend of the summer.

We've been fortunate to host a number of outdoor, socially distanced events and as we

plan for 2022, we have adopted and embraced ways to transform some of our most popular events so that we can hold them safely. Reflecting back, our first COVID event was the Egg

Basket Drive-thru, a shift from our traditional Spring Eggstravaganza egg hunt. We packed baskets with treasure-filled eggs that masked and gloved volunteers handed the attendees through the windows of their vehicles as they paraded through our parking lot, their passengers catching a glimpse of the Easter bunny as they made their way around the lot.

The Pooch Pool Party was held with decreased capacity but still included plenty of fun for canines and handlers alike. We are excited to remain outdoors with Halloween festivities for the kids.

We are immersed in fall landscaping projects, another large paving and concrete project, off season pool improvements, bidding out major contracts for trash and pool management, budget and reserve planning, and preparation for impending inclement weather. The board and management worked with Van Metre to approve an easement for a traffic signal at the intersection of Waxpool Road and Demott Drive which should be functional any day now. exterior maintenance, parking, and amenities included in the proposed areas, not to mention negotiating for additional seed money for some capital improvement projects. Along with this, Van

Metre has provided extensions to the robust trail system, connecting more sections of our community. We hope to see you out enjoying fall colors and taking advantage of some of our outdoor fall events.

If you are unsure if approval is required for your project, contact Robin Crews, Modifications/Resale Manager at rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or 703-729-9704, option 3. The Committee meets at the Nature Center at 7:00pm on the first and third Wednesdays of the month. *If you wish to attend a meeting, contact Robin Crew, rcrews@broadlandshoa.com.* Applications must be submitted by noon on the Wednesday before the meeting by emailing them to rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or delivering them to the Nature Center drop box at 21907 Claiborne Parkway.

Please review the Design Guidelines and submission requirements at broadlandshoa.org/design-guidelines. Failure to include all required information will delay review of your application. Once the Committee has reached a decision, the results will be delivered via email. If an email address is not provided, results will be mailed. Emails will be sent from no-reply@smartwebs365.com should you wish to add this email address to your contact list to ensure prompt delivery. Please check your inbox and junk/spam folders or contact the HOA office at 703-729-9704, option 3 if you have not received your results within 10 days following the meeting.

Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidentally placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed, it notifies the HOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the seller's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement, then the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. CSA Farm Delivery at the Nature Center

Day Spring Farm's CSA is year-round and has two 6-month sessions from May-October and November-April. They deliver on Thursdays at the Nature Center, in the shed to the left of the fire place, on the tennis court side patio. Before you make any modification change or addition to the exterior of your home, an application is required for the Modifications Subcommittee to review. Please refer to Design Guidelines (Modifications), broadlandshoa. org/for-residents/design-guidelines/, for more details and submission requirements.

Residents Must Apply for Tree Removal

It has been reported that tree companies are driving through Broadlands looking for trees to remove from resident properties claiming that their company was referenced on the HOA website as an approved company for executing tree removal. The HOA does not endorse or give blanket approval for tree removal companies. Approval is required to remove any tree either dead or alive whose trunk measures 4" or more in diameter when measured at the height of 4' from the ground. Please review the guidelines at broadlandshoa.org/design-guidelines. *Please be aware removing trees or underbrush from common areas is prohibited.*

Patriot Disposal Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection Schedule

Trash, Recyling, and Yard Waste Collection:

- Place toters out the night before collection day after 6:00pm or before 6:00am the day of pick up.
- Containers shold be out of sight by 9:00am on the day following collection.

Trash Collection:

• Trash pick up days are Mondays and Thursdays.

Recycling Collection:

- Recycling pick up day is Thursdays.
- Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- Plastic bags CANNOT be recycled. The Nature Center collects bags for proper recycling. Visit broadlandshoa.org, click on RESIDENTS then click on TRASH & RECYCLING for more information.
- Scrap metal Please call Patriot Disposal to set pick-up day 1-703-257-7100: i.e. foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.

Yard Waste Collection:

- Yard Waste Collection occurs on Mondays from March 1st thru December 24th.
- During January & February, yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash. Yard waste may not be mixed with recycling.
- Grass clippings and leaves must be set out for pickup in lawn paper bags or in a bin.
- Brush must be less than 4 inches in diameter, cut into 4 foot lengths, and tied in small bundles or bagged.
- Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.

Special Pick-ups:

- Please contact Patriot Disposal, 1-703-257-7100 or customerservice@patriotdisposalservices.com, to arrange pickup of special and/or bulk items.
- Special items will be collected weekly. Some items may incur an additional charge.
- Special items include appliances, mid to large furniture and other large items.

Continuing Asphalt Repaving Project Throughout the Community

Covenants Corner October Inspections

Throughout the year, the Covenants Manager routinely inspects homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications to leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections



where violations may occur with high frequency.

This helps preserve the property values for home ownership, promotes community harmony and ensures the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained.

If any violations of these types are noted, the owner will be mailed a letter generally providing sixty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent, and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$10/day for a maximum of ninety (90) days.



Pet poop is not organic, especially in the quantities that are generated by pets. It harms the environment and threatens public health.

Forgot your waste bag? No worries! The Broadlands HOA has 80 mutt mitt stations to offer residents. Don't want to carry it with you? No problem, most of our mutt mitt stations have trash cans attached. Please be a good neighbor and do not dispose of pet waste in your neighbors' trash cans during your walks.

Even if your pet poops in the woods, you still need to clean it up. Not only is it unsightly, it can get into streams and into the water supply.

It's the law! Is it a violation of the Association Declaration, Article 8, Section 8.2(q) to not pick up your pet's waste, it is also a county ordinance violation. Please reference Loudoun County Ordinance, Chapter 612.19, Section a (9) Dog waste.







Bode's Clear(er) View

My 8-year-old Australian Labradoodle, Bode (bo-dee), is truly one special dog. I worked at Stream Valley Veterinary Hospital (SVVH). He loves visiting everyone whenever I bring him to work, loves being around his family, tolerates his younger brother, and acts as though he has a human soul. Bode is such a lovable dog that my family and I would do anything for him.

In the early years of his life, he developed severe allergies that gave him an uncontrollable itch. His skin was red, he chewed off fur, and he couldn't stop itching. He'd been through it all with numerous food and

medicine trials and allergy testing. He finally found relief after starting Cytopoint injections many years ago. We thought the worst of his health issues were over.

Unfortunately, we weren't done yet. The next road bump began in 2018, when I noticed white spots in both of Bode's eyes. I feared that Bode was developing cataracts.

By June, Bode's eyes started to look hazy. During his appointment at the vet later that month, he was diagnosed with Juvenile Cataracts. We kept tabs on his condition during various visits through the years with Dr. Corey and the SVVH team.

Bode's left cataract was much larger toward the end of 2020. His eye looked completely white, meaning the cataract obstructed his vision. He could still see well out of his right eye, at least. We had a choice to schedule cataract surgery or risk Bode losing vision in the left eye completely. We decided to investigate further with a specialist.

Dr. Corey referred us to Dr. Michelle Samuel at Ocean Veterinary Ophthalmology in Leesburg. At Bode's initial appointment on April 9th, Dr. Samuel confirmed that Bode was non-sighted in his left eye with a hypermature cataract. He was eligible for surgery in that eye. The much smaller right cataract was not advanced enough for the procedure.

The success rate of canine cataract surgery was around 90%. The remaining 10% posed possible complications before and after the surgery. However, Dr. Samuel's knowledge and confidence in the procedure reassured us that Bode would be safe. I scheduled Bode's surgery for July 1st; we were ready to go.

However, what transpired just days before the surgery

required us to push it back two weeks. We didn't have his pre-op medicine yet and Bode hadn't gone through pre-cataract surgery testing!

Fortunately, Bode passed every test, which included an ultrasound, an electroretinogram to test the retina, and a gonioscopy to check the front of his eye. However, given the overly mature status of the cataract, there was a 12-15% chance of retinal detachment. The risk was small, but my family and I were still concerned.

We rescheduled the surgery to Thursday, July 15th. That morning, my brother and I dropped Bode off at Ocean Vet. We gave our sweet pup hugs goodbye and off he went with a technician. Poor thing didn't know what he was getting into!

Around 9:30am, I received a call that Bode was sedated and the operation would soon begin. Time, thankfully, passed quickly. Dr. Samuel called back at 12:30pm to notify me that the surgery was complete. Bode was snoozing peacefully in recovery.

Cataract surgery is a very intricate procedure. Dr. Samuel replaced the natural lens with a fresh synthetic lens using the smallest surgical tools. It requires 100% precision to avoid any damage to the eye. Fortunately, the procedure went exceptionally well. Bode was on his way to recovery!

The next day, Friday July 16th, my mom and I picked Bode up from TLC. He was thrilled! My doodle looked quite disheveled, as the fur around his left eye and a small section of his right leg were almost shaved down to the skin. The shaving was done so the fur wouldn't get in the way of the procedure or the IV in his leg. We drove back to Ocean Vet the following day for a 24-hour recheck, where Dr. Samuel determined that he was sighted in both eyes. His left pupil was constricted, although it wasn't an unexpected change post-surgery. Overall she was pleased with his progress overnight and we headed home with a number of medications, of course!


The first weekend post-surgery was challenging. Poor Bode had a tough time figuring out life with a cone around his head!

We kept him separate from his younger brother, Boomer, as well. We couldn't let them interact for a few days because of Bode's fragile condition.

Taking 5 different eye drops, eye lubrication, and 3 pills did not make Bode happy. It took a few tries to get the drops in and treats to hide the pills, but we made it work. Bode







actually became used to the process. He even liked the treats so much that he looked forward to pill time!

Wearing the cone was another story. He'd bump into nearly everything in his path. We fed him by hand and gave him water in a cup for several days because the cone was in the way. We couldn't take it off at all either—only eye drops or wet cloths could go near his eye.

At the next few appointments, Dr. Samuel continued to taper down the medicines because of his excellent recovery. He could even spend time with Boomer on a regular basis. We were almost back to normal.

On Thursday, August 5th,

Dr. Samuel gave us permission to take off the dreaded cone! Bode was very excited to be back to the "pre-cone" days. It was easy to tell that Bode's vision returned. He no longer had his nose to the ground when walking around. In fact, he held his head up high for all to see.

Finally, at his most recent appointment on September 3rd, Dr. Samuel shared the great news that he continues to recover perfectly. We're now down to just two different drops in the left eye and one in the right. Overall, we're so pleased with the results.

We couldn't be more grateful to Dr. Samuel and the team at Ocean Veterinary Ophthalmology for all the incredible




work they've done to give Bode a new lease on life. He loves being able to see his loved ones more clearly and to take in the sights of the great outdoors. He's much, much happier. The thought of surgery as we maneuvered through this journey was scary, but the results are amazing. I highly recommend Ocean Vet to anyone looking for an ophthalmologist for their pet!




Girl Scout Ambassador Earns Gold Award

Leah Nguyen, of Girl Scout Ambassador Troop 1380, earned the prestigious Girl Scout Gold Award this year. The Gold Award is the highest award that a Girl Scout can earn.
