Spring Events and Inspections

As I write this, winter is blowing through with one last reminder of its' presence before it hopefully runs out of here and leaves us with a beautiful and sunny spring, full of life and hope. We have suffered through enough of the cold, grey days of winter and the roar of the winds. With the arrival of spring comes the spring house cleaning and yard sales, April showers, lawn mowing, and gardening projects. For the association staff, spring brings the hectic season of pool opening preparation, reminder letters for lawn maintenance, mildew cleanup, and other maintenance, as well as an increase in modification applications.

It finally seems as if COVID maybe soon in the rearview mirror however, we continue to remain cautiously optimist, hosting outdoor spring events here in the community, starting with our annual Eggstravaganza, which was modified in 2021 into an

Egg Basket Drive-thru event, set to hatch this year on April 1st. Kids will collect a basket as the cars make their way around the Community Center parking lot. At the end of the route they can wave to Peter Cottontail and he may just be able to come wave "hello." See flyer on page 11 for full details.

We will be hosting

a Potomac Watershed Cleanup Day on Saturday, April 23rd to clean up trash that has collected in the community before it gets into our streams and flows down to the river. Check our website for detailed information. Also, on the 23rd, one of the local realtors will be sponsoring an electronics recycling event at the Community Center, where you can recycle all of your old electronics for free. Items include small appliances, printers, computers, laptops, VCRs, miscellaneous wire, random metal items, and flat screen TVs (no CRT or old-style TVs).

On April 30th, get your workout on by participating in the 30th Annual Van Metre 5K Run and One Mile Fun Run/Walk to benefit Children's National. This event is even stroller and dog friendly. See flyer on page 22 for full details. That same day will be the spring yard sale, where you can buy and sell at homes throughout the community. See flyer on page 23 for full details. You can also dispose of any accumulated or unsold junk when another local realtor will host a junk removal service at the Community Center that afternoon from 2:00pm-4:00pm.

With the thawing of the ground and the arrival

of warmer temperatures, the association steps up inspections of exterior maintenance violations. These inspections ensure that the appearance of our beautiful neighborhood is maintained. Please be aware the Association has the right of access over and through any portion of the Property (excluding the interior of the dwelling) for inspections, maintenance and to correct violation. This right is granted to the Association, its managing agent, and any other person authorized by the Board of Directors in the exercise and discharge of their respective powers and responsibilities in Section 5.3(a) of the Declaration for Broadlands. Our Covenant Inspectors can be identified by their ID cards worn on lanyards around their necks, often driving the blue Nissan Versa inspection vehicle.

been or will be notified via letter and given time to correct. If you are unable to correct in the time allotted, please be sure to contact the inspectors to request a reasonable extension to correct. If you do not correct the violation in the allotted time and, you will be sent follow up correspondence in accordance with state

statute and our Policies and Procedures Regarding Violations of Governing Documents, which could include additional violation letters, a Hearing before the Board of Directors, and the potential for violation charges as high as \$900 assessed against your account. The intent is not to assess charges, but to compel compliance in order to maintain property values. The charges are a deterrent and help to offset expenses incurred by staff time, printing, and postage for generating violation letters. Though it is not the preferred method, the association also has the ability to file a suit in General District Court to request a favorable ruling from a judge.

As a reminder, lot owners must obtain written approval from the Modifications Subcommittee prior to the commencement of all changes or improvements on or visible from the exterior of your unit. The Modifications Subcommittee meets the first and third Wednesday of the month from March through November and meets only the third Wednesday of the month during the months of December through

Per Article 7, Section 7.5 (a) Additions, Alterations, or Improvements by the Owners - "No person shall make any addition, alteration, or improvement in or to any Lot or any portion of the Property... which is visible from the exterior of the Lot or such portion of the Property, without the prior written consent of the Covenants Committee."

If you are unsure if approval is required for your project, contact Robin Crews, Modifications/Resale Manager at rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or 703-729-9704, option 3. The Committee meets virtually at 7:00pm on the first and third Wednesdays of the month March-October and the third week of the month November-February. If you wish to attend a meeting, contact Robin Crew, rcrews@broadlandshoa.com. Applications must be submitted by noon on the Wednesday before the meeting by emailing them to rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or delivering them to the Nature Center drop box at 21907 Claiborne Parkway.

Please review the Design Guidelines and submission requirements at broadlandshoa.org/design-guidelines. Failure to include all required information will delay review of your application. Once the Committee has reached a decision, the results will be delivered via email. If an email address is not provided, results will be mailed. Emails will be sent from no-reply@smartwebs365.com should you wish to add this email address to your contact list to ensure prompt delivery. Please check your inbox and junk/spam folders or contact the HOA office at 703-729-9704, option 3 if you have not received your results within 10 days following the meeting.

Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidentally placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed, it notifies the HOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the seller's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement, then the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. Patriot Disposal Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection Schedule

Trash, Recyling, and Yard Waste Collection:

- Place toters out the night before collection day after 6:00pm or before 6:00am the day of pick up.
- Containers should be out of sight by 9:00am on the day following collection.

Trash Collection:

• Trash pick up days are Mondays and Thursdays.

Recycling Collection:

- Recycling pick up day is Thursdays.
- Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- Plastic bags CANNOT be recycled. The Nature Center collects bags for proper recycling. Visit broadlandshoa.org, click on RESIDENTS then click on TRASH & RECYCLING for more information.
- Scrap metal Please call Patriot Disposal to set pick-up day 1-703-257-7100: i.e. foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.

Yard Waste Collection:

- Yard Waste Collection occurs on Mondays from March 1st thru December 24th.
- During January & February, yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash. Yard waste may not be mixed with recycling.
- Grass clippings and leaves must be set out for pickup in lawn paper bags or in a bin.
- Brush must be less than 4 inches in diameter, cut into 4 foot lengths, and tied in small bundles or bagged.
- Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.

- Special items will be collected weekly. Some items may incur an additional charge.
- Special items include appliances, mid to large furniture and other large items.

Covenants Corner

Mildew, Wood Trim and Faded Shutters



Spring brings a very busy time for covenants. During the month of April, the Inspector will be focusing on several issues: homes with mildew on the siding, stoops, etc., rotten wood trim, and faded shutters and doors. Mildew detracts from the aesthetics of the community and is often found on areas that receive little or no sunlight. Rotten wood can often be identified by paint that is cracked, peeling, or blistering, or wood that's darker than the surrounding area or green with algae. Shutters and doors that have faded from their original color should be freshened up.

The Inspector will continue performing house to house inspections, checking the front, back, and sides of each unit for improvements that have been made without prior approval from the Modification Subcommittee.

If any violation of these types are noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing sixty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent, and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$10/day for a maximum of ninety (90) days.

If you have questions regarding these processes, or have corrected the violation(s), or if you would like to request an extension on a maintenance violation, please contact the Covenants office at covenants@broadlandshoa.com or Suzan Rodano, Covenants Manager at 703-729-9704, option 2.

Throughout the year, the Covenants Manager routinely inspects homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications to leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections where violations may occur with high frequency.

This helps preserve the property values for home ownership, promotes community harmony and ensures the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained.

Pet poop is not organic, especially in the quantities that are generated by pets. It harms the environment and threatens public health.

Forgot your waste bag? No worries! The Broadlands HOA has 80 mutt mitt stations to offer residents. Don't want to carry it with you? No problem, most of our mutt mitt stations have trash cans attached. Please be a good neighbor and do not dispose of pet waste in your neighbors' trash cans during your walks.

Even if your pet poops in the woods, you still need to clean it up. Not only is it unsightly, it can get into streams and into the water supply.

It's the law! Is it a violation of the Association Declaration, Article 8, Section 8.2(q) to not pick up your pet's waste, it is also a county ordinance violation. Please reference Loudoun County Ordinance, Chapter 612.19, Section a (9) Dog waste.

February. In 2021, the subcommittee reviewed a record breaking 1,053 applications for improvements. Please note the deadline for application submissions is noon on the Wednesday before the meeting in order to ensure time for processing applications. All applications must be complete before they will be forwarded to the committee. The Design Guidelines and application are available online at broadlandshoa.org. If you have any questions regarding this process, please contact Robin Crews, Modifications Manager at rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or 703-729-9704, press 3.

To sell your home this year, you will need to provide the contract purchaser with a resale disclosure package within 14 days of contract execution. Resale packages can be ordered online through FirstService Residential at fsresidential. com/washington-dc/resale-and-lender-documents. A Resale Package includes all of the governing documents of the association, a financial statement of your account, and includes a physical inspection performed by HOA staff to identify any violations or missing modification applications. The HOA performed 191 resale inspections in 2021. If you are purchasing or refinancing your unit and your lender requires a PUD questionnaire, you do not need to order these through FSR. Forms are completed by Broadlands staff for a \$50 fee. Please contact 703-729-9704 or joannehang@broadlandshoa. com to submit your form and arrange for payment. Please ensure that you have obtained written approval from the Modifications Subcommittee for all exterior modifications prior to requesting resale disclosure packages.

I hope to see you all out taking advantage of the extensive trail systems, utilizing one of the many play courts throughout the community, or attending one of our events as the weather continues to improve.

Proper Mulching Techniques


Benefits of Proper Mulching


- Helps maintain soil moisture. Evaporation is reduced, and the need for watering can be minimized.
- Helps control weeds. A 2"-4" layer of mulch will reduce the germination and growth of weeds.
- Insulation. Mulch keeps soils warmer in the winter and cooler in the summer.
- Improved quality of soil. Many types of mulch can improve soil aeration and structure and can improve drainage.
- Some types of mulch can improve soil fertility.
- A layer of mulch can help inhibit some types of plant disease.
- Helps facilitate lawn maintenance and reduces the risk of mechanical damage from weed-whips or lawn mowers.

Trees growing in a natural forest environment have their roots anchored in a rich, well-aerated soil full of essential nutrients. The soil is blanketed by leaves organic materials that replenish nutrients and provide an optimal environment for root growth and mineral uptake. Urban landscapes, however are typically a much harsher environment with poor soils, little organic matter, and large fluctuations in temperature and moisture. Applying a 2"-4" layer of mulch can help mimic a more natural environment and improve plant health. The roots of most trees can extend to a width of 2-3 times the diameter of the canopy of the tree. Additionally, most of the fine, nutrient and moisture absorbing roots are located in the top few inches of the soil. These roots require oxygen and moisture to survive. A thin layer of mulch, applied as broadly as practical, can improve the soil structure, oxygen levels, temperature, and moisture availability where these roots grow.

Not too much!

As beneficial as mulch is, too much can be harmful. The generally recommended depth is 2"-4". Unfortunately, Virginia landscapes are falling victim to a plague of over-mulching. The term, 'mulch volcanoes,' has emerged to describe mulch that has been piled up around the base of trees. Most organic mulches must be replenished, but the amount of replenishment required depends upon the rate of mulch decomposition within your landscape. Thoroughly inspect your mulch beds to ensure that you maintain only a 2"-4" level around your trees and shrubs.





Proper Mulching

- Rake the old mulch to break up any matted layers prior to adding new mulch.
- Keep mulch back a minimum of 2" from the trunks of trees and shrubs
- Use a well aerated and composted organic mulch to help improve soil conditions. Avoid sour smelling mulch!
- Composted wood chips that contain leaves and bark make great mulch.
- Mulch a 2"-4" layer (including existing mulch) out to the drip-line of the tree, or farther if practical.

Millions of Trees at Risk in Northern Virginia? Introducing Tree Rescuers!

Northern Virginia's oldest and best-loved trees are in danger, and the threat is in plain sight – and yet there are few who can see it.

But help is on the way! Tree Rescuers – a new community education and outreach program – is shining a light on non-native invasive vines, which pose a mortal threat to millions of mature trees in Northern Virginia.

More than 130 people from neighborhoods across Northern Virginia have already volunteered with Tree Rescuers, a new campaign sponsored by Plant NOVA Trees and aimed at preserving our area's mature trees.

"We were amazed at how many people were ready to do something like this for the trees but didn't know how to get started," said Margaret Fisher, one of the coordinators of Plant NOVA Trees. "This is a great time to start, since the leaves are down and the vines can be seen more easily."

As many as three million trees in Northern Virginia may be at risk, said Fisher.

Many people are unaware that invasive vines like English Ivy can eventually make a tree hazardous (and expensive to remove). Tree Rescuers volunteers learn how to identify problematic vines, then walk their neighborhoods spotting trees that need help.

The Tree Rescuers don't remove any vines themselves, but they warn landowners by dropping off a brochure explaining the problem and ways to fix it.

Data gathered by Tree Rescuers will also help improve knowledge of the actual number of trees at risk, since the collected data is being aggregated and mapped. A map of neighborhoods surveyed can be viewed at plantnovatrees.org.

Tree Rescuers is part of Plant NOVA Trees, a fiveyear campaign by local governments and nonprofit organizations to increase tree cover in Northern Virginia. Native trees are a key part of the solution to many community problems, from extreme weather and air and water quality to the health of birds, wildlife, and the Chesapeake Bay.



Bicycle Safety - Bicycle Rules of the Road

Source: Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles

Bicycles are subject to the same laws as motor vehicles. When passing a bicyclist, motor vehicles must proceed at a reasonable speed and travel at least three feet to the left of the overtaken bicycle.

Riders should practice safe and legal bike operation:

- Ride with traffic.
- Stop and look both ways before entering the street.
- Stop at all intersections.
- Before turning, use hand signals and look all ways.
- Ride defensively anticipate the actions of other road users and watch for road hazards.
- Pass vehicles with extreme care turning vehicles may not see you.
- Be aware of motor vehicle blind spots while riding or when stopped at an intersection.
- Walk your bicycle when you get into traffic situations beyond your cycling abilities.
- Exercise great caution when riding in bus traffic watch out for buses pulling to and from curbs and passengers getting on and off buses.
- Park your bicycle so you do not block sidewalks, disabled accesses, building accesses or emergency lanes.

Dress for Safety

Stay safe by making sure that you are visible to motorists:

- Wear a helmet, wear bright colored clothing, and secure loose pant legs.
- Maximize your visibility at night wear relective clothing and apply reflective tape to your bicycle.

Parent Information

Learning to ride a bicycle is an exciting accomplishment for a child. Making sure that riding is a safe and enjoyable experience for your child is important:

- Provide your children with helmets approved by the Consumer Product Safety Commission. Teach them to wear the helmets correctly on every ride.
- Ensure young children are properly supervised and never allow them to ride their bicycle in the street.
- The decision to allow older children to ride in the street should depend on traffic patterns, individual maturity, and an adequate knowledge and ability to follow bicycle rules.
- Your children should never ride at dusk or in the dark.
- Teach your children how to keep their bikes in good repair, and to check the tires, brakes, and seat and handlebar height annually.

Please follow instructions below to set up electronic virtual passes for all household members.

Once fully registered with photos submitted, DO-NOT re-register in future seasons!

Your electronic virtual passes will be active until your residency status changes.

STEP 1 - CREATE HOUSEHOLD ACCOUNT: Go to Cellbadge.com/Broadlands/register and under Initial

Add Request, enter the information as a primary resident to create your master household account. Please enter street number and name only, no suffix (i.e., Ct, Court, Ter, Terrace, etc.). Your add request will be forwarded to HOA staff who will validate your residency and account status. Please allow up to 3 business days for the initial approval to be processed. Once validated, you will receive a text/email indicating that your registration has been added but will remain pending until all 4 steps have been completed.

STEP 2 - ACQUIRE PIN: After you have received a text/email that your registration has been added, please return to the same registration page, and follow the instructions under **Enter or Update Household Members**. Enter your credentials to get your unique PIN via text/email to continue the process.

STEP 3 – ADD HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS: Enter PIN to access the Household Members page to add all household members, ages 5 and older. Be sure to select the appropriate "Relation" category when adding members:

- Owners select "Owner-xxx" for ALL household members regardless of age.
- **Tenants** select "Tenant-xxx" for ALL household members if owner does not live on property.
- **Apartment Renters** select "Apartment-xxx" for all household members.
- Nannies/Long-Term guests, select "Other-xxx" as applicable. Non-residents must pay first at broadlandshoa.org/pool

Once finished, check the box to verify you have agreed to the facility terms and click **Complete Registration**. Upon approval (within 3 business days), you will receive a text/email indicating that *your Broadlands HOA registration has been accepted*, however, you must complete STEP 4 (pictures) to gain access to the pools.

STEP 4 - PICTURES: Email pictures of all household members aged 5 & up (adults must provide proof of residency):

- Email an *acceptable photo (jpg or png format) of each member in your household to pools@broadlandshoa.com.
 Copies of driver's license should be used for 18+ members. Recent copies of headshots may be used for children under 18.
- Subject line of email must be written as: "pool photos registered lastname" (i.e. pool photos Smith)
- Save and attach each photo separately to your email using naming convention: "address.firstname" (i.e. 42001Ridgeway.Susan).
- All member names must correspond with registered names in your Cellbadge pool account to allow for proper import. Pictures
 will be processed within 3 business days.

*What are acceptable photos and adult requirements?

- Adults 18 and over are <u>required</u> to show proof of residency with a **copy of a driver's license** showing the picture, address, name and date of birth. For security reasons, all other information can be crossed off. If the ID does not reflect the registered address, then settlement papers, utility bills or a change of address card may be emailed.
- o For children aged 5 and older, please email a <u>current</u> headshot or ID. Children aged 4 and under do not require photos.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

ACCESSING THE POOL: After photos are added and you received a confirmation email, access to our pools is simple since no physical pass is required – just check-in with the lifeguard by providing your name or address and they will be able to access your "virtual ID card" in the system to allow entrance. **Once registered, no further action is needed in future pool seasons.**

GUEST VISITS: 10 guest visits will be added to your household account each year at no charge. Additional guest visits can be purchased through our website at <u>broadlandshoa.org/pool</u>. Visits do not roll over to the next season.

TENANTS: You must have a <u>current</u> **Absentee Owner Statement (AOS) and lease** on file with the HOA before registering. Please see information on our website under <u>broadlandshoa.org/tenant-information</u>.

APARTMENTS: Tenants of The Arbors and Van Metre Apartments must <u>purchase</u> a household pool membership first at broadlandshoa.org/pool-information.

The Importance of Extracurricular Activities in a Post Pandemic World

COVID-19 may be ending, or at the very least its control over us all as a pandemic may be coming to an end. But what does getting back to life as normal (or some version of it) look like for our children? Research has shown that the protracted changes, adjustments, and uncertainties due to COVID-19 have taken a toll on children; in significant ways, these past two years have negatively impacted our children's social, emotional and academic development, and functioning.

As a child psychologist, I've seen firsthand the ways in which children have been most impacted by COVID-19, and the social impact is what concerns me most. Children can always catch up academically (i.e. their hard skills and content learning), but getting back to a solid social self isn't going to be easy for a lot of children. Research in this area has already shown that, over the past two years, children have missed out on learning durable soft skills that make it necessary to succeed at both college and the workplace. And those delays or gaps are occurring for children of all ages with research showing that even babies born during COVID-19 have higher reported rates of social and motor delays.

One recent study revealed that universities and employers are reporting that today's applicants are lacking several durable soft skills, the two most important ones being communication skills and leadership skills. Surprisingly, another study found that only 3% of high school students actually view leadership skills as something important to them. This is latter finding is disturbing given that leadership is one of the most sought out skill for universities and employers and later success in life.

So, how do you help your child actively cultivate the skills they need to do well in college and beyond after a global pandemic? Extracurricular activities. By reintroducing your children to clubs, camps (at home or away), sports teams, enrichment programs, etc., you will be providing them with experiences – very important ones – that will serve to get them back on track.

It's important to note though that the transition back to extracurricular activities will not go smoothly for all children, and parents need to be sensitive to that. While many children can't wait to get back out there, others may feel anxious about re-entry. Also, so many children have over relied on technology during the pandemic, which has in turn negatively impacted socialization. Thus, managing screen or technology time is an important step to take to get your child more engaged and social, but that task is easier said than done for a lot of parents and children. In my experience, the best way to increase socialization for a child that overuses technology is to communicate your social expectations of them openly and positively. If your son or daughter is outside of the house on a sports team or in a club, he or she is not at home on a screen. As a parent, you may be able to avoid restrictions (and fights) altogether if you can proactively convince your child of the importance of getting out of the house, of getting engaged with others again and of striving for balance.

This has been a very long two years, but the light at the end of the tunnel is bright. Now that it's safe to be social again, I encourage parents to increase their children's involvement in extracurricular activities; not only is it good for them now, but it will pay back in dividends later.


