Annual Meeting of the Membership

The most important meeting of the year will be held on Tuesday, May 10th at 7:00pm - the Annual Meeting of the Membership. The meeting will be held virtually via zoom. This meeting, held every year in order to elect the Board of Directors, is required by the Bylaws for Broadlands Association, Inc. and the quorum requirement is at least ten percent of the total number of votes of the association which must be present in person or by proxy. You should have received official notification of this meeting via USPS mail in April.

This year, we have four open positions – three each for three-year terms and one for a one-year term. We received nominating forms and petitions from four candidates: David Baroody, Eric Bazerghi, John Gallagher, and Jason Pualoa. Their nominating forms are included on pages 10-13 of this newsletter.

Some of the powers and duties of the Board include: providing goods and services in accordance with the documents and providing for the upkeep of the common area; designating, hiring, and dismissing personnel necessary to providing for the upkeep of the common area and providing goods and services; collecting and depositing assessments; adopting and amending rules and regulations; opening bank accounts; enforcing provisions of the documents; obtaining and carrying insurance; paying for authorized goods and services; charging reasonable fees for the use of the common area; suspending the right of an owner or occupant to vote or to use common areas; preparing and adopting an annual budget and establishing assessments; borrowing money on behalf of the association; and employing a managing agent. The full list of powers and duties can be found in the Bylaws for Broadlands.

The Articles of Incorporation provide that the Board be comprised of nine people elected to serve in staggered terms of three years each. Eligible Board Members include owners, owner's spouses, an officer, trustee, general partner or agent of an owner, the Declarant or designee of the Declarant, or a mortgagee or designee of the mortgagee. Owners or representatives of owners may not be more than sixty days delinquent in meeting financial obligations to the association.

In 2015, the Board of Directors moved from a paper voting system to an online voting system by hiring The Inspectors of Election. Official meeting notices are still mailed to all owners of record but are also emailed with a link to the website to those owners for which we have valid email addresses. The online voting process eases the ability for homeowners to participate in the elections and increases the likelihood of the HOA to achieve a quorum of owners.

Please take a few moments to log onto *tieivote.com* with your unique username and password (provided to you in the official mailing and via email for those previously registered) to submit your proxy if you are unable to attend the meeting in person. You may elect to use your proxy for quorum purposes only or you may cast votes for up to four candidates. Per Article 7, Section 7.5 (a) Additions, Alterations, or Improvements by the Owners - "No person shall make any addition, alteration, or improvement in or to any Lot or any portion of the Property... which is visible from the exterior of the Lot or such portion of the Property, without the prior written consent of the Covenants Committee."

If you are unsure if approval is required for your project, contact Robin Crews, Modifications/Resale Manager at rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or 703-729-9704, option 3. The Committee meets virtually at 7:00pm on the first and third Wednesdays of the month March-October and the third week of the month November-February. If you wish to attend a meeting, contact Robin Crew, rcrews@broadlandshoa.com. Applications must be submitted by noon on the Wednesday before the meeting by emailing them to rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or delivering them to the Nature Center drop box at 21907 Claiborne Parkway.

Please review the Design Guidelines and submission requirements at broadlandshoa.org/ design-guidelines. Failure to include all required information will delay review of your application. Once the Committee has reached a decision, the results will be delivered via email. If an email address is not provided, results will be mailed. Emails will be sent from no-reply@smartwebs365.com should you wish to add this email address to your contact list to ensure prompt delivery. Please check your inbox and junk/spam folders or contact the HOA office at 703-729-9704, option 3 if you have not received your results within 10 days following the meeting.

Only applications with complete documentation received by the deadline will be reviewed at the next subcommittee meeting.

Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidentally placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed, it notifies the HOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the seller's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement, then the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. WGB & Plastics Donations Suspended

Broadlands Community Outreach is placing a **TEMPORARY HOLD** on collecting clothing for Women Giving Back as well as the collection of plastic materials for our Plastic Bag Recycling Program. **BOTH** programs are being temporarily suspended until the community outreach staff can effectively reinstate the programs.

We anticipate both programs will be delayed for just a few short months at most, so if you are able, please hold your plastic material and clothing donations for when we can reopen them.

Patriot Disposal Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection Schedule

Trash, Recyling, and Yard Waste Collection:

- Place toters out the night before collection day after 6:00pm or before 6:00am the day of pick up.
- Containers should be out of sight by 9:00am on the day following collection.

Trash Collection:

• Trash pick up days are Mondays and Thursdays.

Recycling Collection:

- Recycling pick up day is Thursdays.
- Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- Plastic bags CANNOT be recycled. The Nature Center collects bags for proper recycling. Visit broadlandshoa.org, click on RESIDENTS then click on TRASH & RECYCLING for more information.
- Scrap metal Please call Patriot Disposal to set pick-up day 1-703-257-7100: i.e. foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.

Yard Waste Collection:

- Yard Waste Collection occurs on Mondays from March 1st thru December 24th.
- During January & February, yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash. Yard waste may not be mixed with recycling.
- Grass clippings and leaves must be set out for pickup in lawn paper bags or in a bin.
- Brush must be less than 4 inches in diameter, cut into 4 foot lengths, and tied in small bundles or bagged.
- Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.

Special Pick-ups:

- Please contact Patriot Disposal, 1-703-257-7100 or customerservice@patriotdisposalservices.com, to arrange pickup of special and/or bulk items.
- Special items will be collected weekly. Some items may incur an additional charge.
- Special items include appliances, mid to large furniture and other large items.

Covenants Corner

Mildew, Wood Trim, Front Steps and Walkways and, Faded Shutters



Spring brings a very busy time for covenants. During the month of May, the Inspectors will be focusing on several issues: homes with mildew on the siding, stoops, front steps, walkways, etc., rotten wood trim, and faded shutters and doors. Mildew detracts from the aesthetics of the community and is often found on areas that receive little or no sunlight. Rotten wood can often be identified by paint that is cracked, peeling, or blistering, or wood that's darker than the surrounding area or green with algae. Shutters and doors that have faded from their original color should be freshened up.

The Inspectors will continue performing house to house inspections, checking the front, back, and sides of each unit for improvements that have been made without prior approval from the Modification Subcommittee.

If any violation of these types are noted, the owner will be mailed a letter providing sixty days for the violation to be resolved. If the violation is not corrected, a second violation letter will be issued, providing an additional fifteen day extension. If the violation remains unresolved, a final notice will be sent, providing seven days to rectify before a Hearing Notice is sent, and a Hearing will be held in accordance with state law, where charges may be assessed, up to \$10/day for a maximum of ninety (90) days.

If you have questions regarding these processes, or have corrected the violation(s), or if you would like to request an extension on a maintenance violation, please contact the Covenants office at covenants@broadlandshoa.com or Suzan Rodano, Covenants Manager at 703-729-9704, option 2.

Throughout the year, the Covenants team routinely inspects homes for a variety of issues ranging from trash containers in open view, parking issues, architectural modifications to leftover holiday décor. In addition, certain seasons dictate the need to focus on particular inspections where violations may occur with high frequency.

This helps preserve the property values for home ownership, promotes community harmony and ensures the high standards of living that our residents have come to expect are maintained.

Attention Tenants with Pool Passes

If you have a lease that is expiring during May/June/July/August and you plan to renew or extend your lease, please provide an updated AOS, signed by the property owner, and a copy of the new lease or lease extension so we can update our records WHICH INCLUDE POOL PASSES. Tenant Pool Passes will expire at the end of lease term unless an updated AOS and lease/lease extension is filed in our office.

PLEASE SUBMIT UPDATED DOCS as soon as possible, to ensure pool passes remain valid for the duration of the pool season. Updated AOS's and lease/lease extensions can be submitted to *info@broadlandshoa.com*. The AOS form can be found at *broadlandshoa.org/tenant-information/*. Allow 48 business hours for processing all new and updated tenant information.

Lifeguards and pool assistants CANNOT provide this service at the pools.

New tenants will need to submit an AOS and lease AND register for pool passes at *broadlandshoa.org/amenities/pool/*. Please allow 48 business hours for processing. Access to the pools will NOT be allowed until proof of residency AND photos have been submitted.

Remember to Weed Your Yards and Trim Your Trees

Per the Lawn and Yard Maintenane Resolution 6.11.13 found on broadlandshoa.org/rules-and-regulations, Lot Owners and residents shall keep their properties free of excessive weeds, overgrown or unsightly shrubbery or other plant growth. Lot Owners and residents shall undertake any weeding and mulching of planted beds and pruning of shrubbery and trees which is necessary so as to keep a proper, neat and clean appearance of the Lot.

An owner of a lot which borders a sidewalk shall ensure that any trees which overhang the sidewalk are trimmed to provide a minimum height of eight (8) feet, measured above the sidewalk level, free of obstruction. No trees with a diameter of more than four inches and measuring two feet above ground level shall be removed without the express written authorization of the Covenants Committee or Board of Directors. Lot Owners and residents shall remove any and all dead plants and shrubs from their Lots.

Scoop the Poop...

Residents frequently express concern that not every pet owner is taking the time to pick up their pet's waste in the neighborhood. Please ensure that your family members realize how important it is to be a responsible pet owner:

Pet poop is not organic, especially in the quantities that are generated by pets. It harms the environment and threatens public health.

Forgot your waste bag? No worries! The Broadlands HOA has 80 mutt mitt stations to offer residents. Don't want to carry it with you? No problem, most of our mutt mitt stations have trash cans attached. Please be a good neighbor and do not dispose of pet waste in your neighbors' trash cans during your walks.

Even if your pet poops in the woods, you still need to clean it up. Not only is it unsightly, it can get into streams and into the water supply.

It's the law! Is it a violation of the Association Declaration, Article 8, Section 8.2(q) to not pick up your pet's waste, it is also a county ordinance violation. Please reference Loudoun County Ordinance, Chapter 612.19, Section a (9) Dog waste.



I grew up in Fairfax and I've lived in Virginia for many years. However, it wasn't until the pandemic began that I really started to explore my home state. I left my backyard in Broadlands and set out to see our state parks, recreation areas, national forests and hiking trails.

I had no idea that the Appalachian Trail was only a 30-minute drive from my house. Soon, I was setting out a few days a week, sometimes with my kids in tow, to take in the views across the state. In Northern Virginia alone, there's so much to see and love, including many miles of nature trails.

Then, I wrote a book, **Hiking with Kids Virginia: 52 Great Hikes for Families**, to share with moms and dads like me where to get outside in Virginia with their own kids. But first, I've got tips to help ensure your own trail adventures are fun and memorable (in a good way).

6 Tips to Make Hiking with Kids Fun

1. Never leave the house without snacks.

Bring all the snacks, the really good snacks. Even just M&Ms. The quality and quantity of trail snacks are more important than the actual hike. You may not realize how true this is until you are actually out on the hiking trail.

2. Choose a fun trail.

A hike may be five minutes from your house, but if it's

boring your kids will lose interest and they won't want to hike with you again. Kids go crazy for rock scrambles, swinging bridges, stream crossings, wooden boardwalks, waterfalls and swimming holes.

3. It's not a race.

Relax, take it slow. Your kids probably do not hike at the same pace as you do, so take it easy. Your kids will check out if they're constantly having to catch up to you with their little legs. Let your kids take the lead and allow them to be awed by nature.

4. Let them stop.

Stop for sticks, stones, frogs, flowers. There's no need to limit stops to snack and water breaks. Let your kids pause to hunt for hiking sticks or to skip stones across lively streams. If they want to toss 100 rocks into a creek, let it be. It's okay for them to get dirty, too.

5. Bring comfort items.

No, not teddy bears. Make sure you have lots of water, good snacks, bug spray, sunblock and a travel first aid kit. Kids who are bleeding, thirsty and getting eaten alive by insects are not having fun. The goal is to ensure a future hike in the great outdoors.

6. Plan for rewards.

A successful hike deserves ice cream. Even a mostly successful hike with minimal crying or complaining

deserves a scoop. Plan for an ice cream stop and know exactly how far it is from the trailhead. Go right away after the hike.

Now that you're geared up with tips for an awesome family hike, here are five of my absolute favorite family-friendly hikes in the area that will leave your kids begging to go outside.



1. Riverbend Park to Great Falls (Great Falls)

Great Falls Park has long been a popular destination for families thanks to its super-size green space filled with picnic tables and three scenic overlooks for gazing out at its namesake falls. There are hiking trails at this national park, of course, but it's also fun to hike in from Riverbend Park.

Riverbend Park sits on the banks of the Potomac River, just north of Great Falls Park. An easy 1.8-mile hike (one-way) on the Potomac Heritage Trail leads to the waterfall overlooks. Get ready to scramble rocks and cross wooden bridges. Pause for views at the Washington Aqueduct Dam.



2. Theodore Roosevelt Island (Arlington)

The 1.9-mile loop hike along the perimeter of 89-acre Theodore Roosevelt Island begins in Arlington, though the small island is officially in Washington, DC. This kid-friendly hike is big on views and offers up plenty of education on our 26th president, Theodore Roosevelt.

The centerpiece is a 17-foot-tall bronze statue of President Theodore Roosevelt. There are also four 21-foot-tall granite tablets inscribed with famous quotes. Bring bikes or rent from Capital Bikeshare. A short three-mile bike ride leads to Gravelly Point Park to watch the planes land.

3. Turkey Run Park (McLean)

The 3.9-mile loop hike at Turkey Run Park is an easy favorite with kids thanks to massive boulders, rock scrambles and splashy water crossings. This park is basically located under the George Washington Memorial Parkway. You kind of need to know that it's there.

The hike starts with a mild descent down at least 100 steps. Soak in all the refreshing views across the Potomac River before stepping across Turkey Run. Traverse a ravine on a three-inch-wide board, scramble rocks at Dead Run and revel in cascades and waterfalls before the end of this hike.

4. Bull Run Mountains Natural Area Preserve (Broad Run)

At Bull Run Mountains Natural Area Preserve in Broad Run, there are three kid-friendly hiking trails, including the Beech Ridge Loop (Yellow), Fern Hollow Loop (Green) and Dawson's Trail (Red). The 3.4-mile Fern Hollow Loop guides hikers all the way around the nature preserve.

There's a lot to see on a wooded hike, including a onetime ice house, an old wooden home, a former mill and historic family cemeteries (on Dawson's Trail). Make note that this natural area is only open to visitors on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays.



5. Bears Den (Bluemont)

The hike to Bears Den Overlook starts from a large parking area on the south side of Route 7 in Bluemont. The lot is large, but it can fill up quickly on fair-weather weekends. A forested blue-blazed connector trail leads to the iconic white-blazed Appalachian Trail.





Planting in Pots for Easy Butterfly Viewing

Some of us are deeply into gardening, but the rest of us are content with plopping a few flowers into a pot and calling it a day. This explains a lot of the popularity of annuals, most of which end up in containers and are switched out when they fade. Their colors brighten up our decks and balconies all summer, but their value in most cases is only visual. Native perennial flowers, by contrast, not only look beautiful but actually support butterflies and other life.

Most plants that are native to our area will overwinter in a pot, thus saving us the trouble of replanting year after year. Although none of them will bloom for the entire growing season, they provide interest as they develop. It is easy to get continuous color by planting several species that bloom at different times.

Once blooming begins, the parade of associated pollinators is fascinating. Being able to view the flowers up close on a deck or balcony reveals the variety of critters that you might not notice from afar, from tiny metallic-blue bees to the whole range of butterflies. There are four hundred species of native bees in Virginia, none of which will sting you as they forage for food. Butterflies range in size from the tiny Least Skipper to the classic Eastern Tiger Swallowtail. With luck, you may even see a Monarch Butterfly, especially if you plant any of a number of the several local milkweed species. The milkweed Butterfly Weed (Asclepias tuberosa) is particularly ornamental and just the right size for container gardening. Just as

Monarch caterpillars require milkweed to survive, every other butterfly has its preferred host plant with which it evolved. This is why adopting locally native plants is so important. The annuals sold in garden centers are not native and thus do not help butterflies complete their life cycles.

Birds also enjoy native plants in containers, as much as they would if planted in a garden. The seeds of Blackeyed Susan and other Rudbeckias are particularly popular with goldfinches. Of course, you will only see them if you allow the seed heads to remain. The shapes and colors of the dead stalks of native plants add a lot of interest to an otherwise barren deck in winter. You can also draw in hummingbirds when you use the red-flowered plants such as Cardinal Flower (Lobelia cardinalis) that they prefer.

Shade is no obstacle to container gardening with native plants. Particularly pleasing is the native Bleeding Heart (Dicentra eximia). The lacy, slightly bluish foliage is beautiful by itself, and blooms keep coming from April to the first frost.

You can learn all about container gardening with native plants on the Plant NOVA Natives website, https://plantnovanatives.org/container-gardening. The soil used in containers is designed to have good drainage, which means you can start planting earlier in the spring than in the rest of the garden, where working the wet soil would lead to harmful compaction.

STEP 1 - CREATE HOUSEHOLD ACCOUNT: Go to Cellbadge.com/Broadlands/register and under Initial

Add Request, enter the information as a primary resident to create your master household account. Please enter street number and name only, no suffix (i.e., Ct, Court, Ter, Terrace, etc.). Your add request will be forwarded to HOA staff who will validate your residency and account status. Please allow up to 3 business days for the initial approval to be processed. Once validated, you will receive a text/email indicating that your registration has been added but will remain pending until all 4 steps have been completed.

STEP 2 - ACQUIRE PIN: After you have received a text/email that your registration has been added, please return to the same registration page, and follow the instructions under **Enter or Update Household Members**. Enter your credentials to get your unique PIN via text/email to continue the process.

STEP 3 - ADD HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS: Enter PIN to access the **Household Members** page to add all household members, ages 5 and older. Be sure to select the appropriate "**Relation**" category when adding members:

- Owners select "Owner-xxx" for ALL household members regardless of age.
- **Tenants** select "Tenant-xxx" for ALL household members if owner does not live on property.
- Apartment Renters select "Apartment-xxx" for all household members.
- Nannies/Long-Term guests, select "Other-xxx" as applicable. Non-residents must pay first at broadlandshoa.org/pool

Once finished, check the box to verify you have agreed to the facility terms and click **Complete Registration**. Upon approval (within 3 business days), you will receive a text/email indicating that *your Broadlands HOA registration has been accepted*, however, you must complete STEP 4 (pictures) to gain access to the pools.

STEP 4 - PICTURES: Email pictures of all household members aged 5 & up (adults must provide proof of residency):

- Email an *acceptable photo (jpg or png format) of each member in your household to <u>pools@broadlandshoa.com</u>.
 Copies of driver's license should be used for 18+ members. Recent copies of headshots may be used for children under 18.
- Subject line of email must be written as: "pool photos registered lastname" (i.e. pool photos Smith)
- Save and attach each photo separately to your email using naming convention: "address.firstname" (i.e. 42001Ridgeway.Susan).
- All member names must correspond with registered names in your Cellbadge pool account to allow for proper import. Pictures will be processed within 3 business days.

*What are acceptable photos and adult requirements?

- O Adults 18 and over are <u>required</u> to show proof of residency with a **copy of a driver's license** showing the picture, address, name and date of birth. For security reasons, all other information can be crossed off. If the ID does not reflect the registered address, then settlement papers, utility bills or a change of address card may be emailed.
- o For children aged 5 and older, please email a <u>current</u> headshot or ID. Children aged 4 and under do not require photos.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

ACCESSING THE POOL: After photos are added and you received a confirmation email, access to our pools is simple since no physical pass is required – just check-in with the lifeguard by providing your name or address and they will be able to access your "virtual ID card" in the system to allow entrance. **Once registered, no further action is needed in future pool seasons.**

GUEST VISITS: 10 guest visits will be added to your household account each year at no charge. Additional guest visits can be purchased through our website at broadlandshoa.org/pool. Visits do not roll over to the next season.

TENANTS: You must have a <u>current</u> Absentee Owner Statement (AOS) and lease on file with the HOA before registering. Please see information on our website under <u>broadlandshoa.org/tenant-information</u>.

APARTMENTS: Tenants of The Arbors and Van Metre Apartments must <u>purchase</u> a household pool membership first at broadlandshoa.org/pool-information.

Swim Lessons General Information & Schedule

Broadlands, in conjunction with High Sierra Pools, is offering swimming lessons this summer. For more information and registration, please visit our website highsierrapools.com.





Swim lessons are a critical resource given that drowning is the number one cause of accidental death for children under the age of four. Fortunately, research shows that a toddler who participates in swim lessons reduces this risk by 88%. Children of any age can quickly benefit from learning the skills to keep themselves safe in and around water. At High Sierra Pools, we are dedicated to preventing drowning by teaching children and their families to be safer. Our goal is that every student feels confident, in and out of the pool, with memories to last a lifetime.

SESSION DETAILS:

Each session is composed of eight 30 minutes lessons taught over two weeks. All lessons are taught Monday thru Thursday, with Friday as a make-up day. A group session's cost is \$100 per child, and a private session is \$300 per student. A child must be at least 3 years old to enroll in lessons. The deadline to register will be one week before the session start date.

HSP offers the following types of lessons each session:

- Private Lessons: One-on-one lessons. Children above 3 years old and adults are welcome to register. Our private classes can help your child achieve and exceed their swimming goals. These lessons help even the most reluctant adults to conquer their fears. The cost is \$300 per person.
- Book An Instructor for a Pod: these lessons are reserved for PODs that would like to be together (neighbors, friends). Children must be at least 3 years old to enroll in this class. The maximum number per group is four students with similar swim skills and age. The cost is \$300 per group.
- Group Lessons: There is a minimum of three children needed to run the group lesson. The maximum number of children per group is five. We create a supportive environment that combines safety skills with age-appropriate swim techniques. The cost is \$100 per student.

LEVEL DESCRIPTION:



Sea Turtles: This beginning level for children teaches them to be comfortable and safe in the water. Instructors will focus on introducing children to the water and improving their safety and comfort in the swimming pool. The class will feature activities such as: face in the water, blowing bubbles, submerging, front glide, back glide, breath control, body position, arm and leg movement, and floating. Skills connected with swim techniques and all while having fun in class with aquatic recreation, gaining confidence and interest in swimming, a fun learning experience! We highly recommend this level for children who have never taken lessons, preferably children between 3 and 5 years old but all children are welcomed.



Dolphins: This level marks the beginning of independent aquatic locomotion skills. Children continue to explore using simultaneous and alternating arm and leg actions on the front and back to gain more proficiency for strokes. At this level, arm position, leg exercises, breathing, turns, treading water, and diving will be practiced. Breaststroke and Butterfly will be introduced in this class. Students who successfully complete this level will be comfortable swimming in deep water, be proficient in front crawl and back crawl. This level is recommended for children that are confident in the water but never had lessons, or children that have taken and passed the Sea Turtles level.



Sharks: The goal is to make the students comfortable swimming and practicing in deep water, make significant improvements to rotary breathing with front crawl, demonstrate proficiency in the other strokes being introduced, and develop endurance by increasing distances they can swim. In this class, the swimmers will improve their movement in the backstroke, freestyle, breaststroke, and butterfly. The correct position to dive will also be an essential skill learned in the class. This class is recommended for children that successfully finished Dolphins level or children with previous swimming experience.

Due to scheduled school renovations, this year's camps will be held at two different locations. The first camp will be held June 27 – June 30 at Countryside Elementary School in Sterling, VA. The second camp will be held July 11-July 14 and also at Countryside Elementary School. The third camp will be held July 18 – July 21 at Pinebrook Elementary School in Aldie, VA.

The camp continues to offer morning and afternoon sessions. All camps run Monday through Thursday from 8:30am to 11:00am and 12:30pm to 3:00pm. A graduation ceremony for all campers will be held on July 22, 2022 (location and time to be announced at a later date).

Grill Safety Provided By: Loudoun County Fire and Rescue:

Fire in the grill is a welcome sight at the family cookout but fire anywhere else can make your summer barbecue memorable for all the wrong reasons.

Follow these tips to stay safe during grilling

- Only use propane & charcoal BBQ grills outdoors.
- Keep grills at least 15ft away from any structure and away from flammable materials.
- Regularly clean grease or fat buildup from the grill and grease trap.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Keep children and pets away from the grill area.
- It is unlawful to operate an open flame grill, hibachi, gas grill, manufactured fireplace or portable fire pit, etc. within 15ft of any apartment building, condominium, commercial business, health care facility, or housing for the aged or physically and/or mentally impaired.


Charcoal Grills

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add any other flammable liquids to the fire.

- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- After grilling when ready to cleanup, soak charcoal briquettes and ashes with water placed in a metal container, soaked with water, and allowed to cool overnight in a location that is at least 15 ft. away from any building or structure. Re-check the container in the morning to ensure nothing is smoldering, then properly dispose of the wet materials.

Propane Grills

- Placement of any grill should be away from the house and not up against it!
- Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. If a propane leak is present, it will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, obvious by the odor or the soapy bubble test, but no flame, turn off the gas tank and grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department.
- If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department.
- Store a propane cylinder in a detached shed away from the home. Never store propane cylinders indoors or in enclosed areas, e.g. basement, garage, tent, etc.

Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy May Programs & Field Trips Submitted By: Doreen Varblow, Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy

Celebrate Birds, Go Birding! To celebrate spring migration the Loudoun Wildlife Conservancy sponsors a series of walks and other events in several of Loudoun's richest natural areas. All of them, except for the Big Sit, start at 8:00am. Registration, https://loudounwildlife.org/events/, is required and limited on most programs and field trips. Join us for one or more of the following:

- Algonkian Regional Park Sunday, May 1. Join Allison Gallo and Bryan Henson on a search for birds at this large popular park in eastern Loudoun with extensive frontage along the Potomac River. Its rich bottomland forests, extensive wetlands, and grassy areas are home to numerous species of birds. We'll comb the park searching for migrants, residents, and lingering winter birds. Limit 15. *Registration required*.
- JK Black Oak Wildlife Sanctuary Wednesday, May 4. Join Gerco Hoogeweg for a bird walk at this very special place near Lucketts. As chairman of LWC's Black Oak Committee, Gerco has been frequently surveying the wildlife there and is intimately familiar with it. Limit 10. *Registration required*.
- Goodstone Inn Wednesday, May 11. Join Mary Ann Good and Scott Harris for a bird walk at this private country estate in southwestern Loudoun. We'll hang out near the Gatehouse and watch, listen for, and talk about birds. If you are interested in bird watching but haven't yet given it a try, come on out! 
