The Board of Directors for Broadlands Association has contracted with Fairfax Paving & Concrete, Inc. to perform concrete sidewalk repairs on your street or near your home or where you may park your vehicle on October 20th & 21st. Damaged sections of sidewalk will be replaced. Concrete areas set to be replaced have been marked with **BLUE PAINT. If you see a blue mark on a sidewalk near your home or parking area, please pay attention to the information below.**

All work is, of course, **WEATHER PERMITTING.** In the event of rain, please check the website for updates.



Please do not park within twenty feet of concrete that has been marked with blue paint beginning October 20th. FPC representatives will remove the barricades once the concrete has dried and fully set and then you may park adjacent to the concrete. Work will take place between 7:00am and 5:00pm daily.
