Reserve Funding - What are Reserves?

There can be a lot of confusion about HOA's and what they do with assessments that are collected by the homeowners. Particularly with a very large association like Broadlands, it can be easy to get confused by the many moving parts. One of most misunderstood parts of a budget are reserves. So, what are they?

Reserve funds are designated sums of money set aside for future expenses, such as building, road, or trail repairs or replacements. Reserve funds ensure that all owners in an association help contribute to the future repair and replacement of items they have enjoyed during the duration of their ownership. Reserve funds, unlike operating funds, pay for the major repairs and replacements on the common elements. So while the annual operating funds might pay for the annual replenishment of safety surfacing at the tot lots, reserve funds pay for the replacement of the entire structure every 25 years. Operating funds pay for the replacement of a failed belt on a pool pump, but reserve funds pay

for the replacement of the entire motor every ten years. Operating funds pay for routine maintenance for HVAC or plumbing in community buildings, but reserve funds replace the

HVAC system every 15 years and the roof every 30 years. Operating funds pay to replace the bulbs in the path and streetlights, but reserve funds pay to replace the entire fixture every 40 years. Reserve funds protect the stability of your association's finances from naturally irregular, yet predictable, future expenditures for the replacement of reserve components.

It's important for an HOA to have a healthy reserve fund in order to prevent unexpected financial burdens on individual homeowners. An adequately funded reserve account helps alleviate the need for special assessments for major maintenance and replacement of common property. Special assessments can be viewed as red flags by lenders and perspective buyers as they can be indicative of insufficient budgeting or unsuitable caps on assessments. HOA's must disclose special assessments to perspective homebuyers in the resale disclosure packages, the contents of which are dictated by state statute. Special assessments are sometimes unavoidable, and Broadlands did implement a special assessment in 2010 following an unprecedented winter with extraordinary expenses relating to snow services as well as a real estate market crash which caused an unexpected rise in delinquent owners.

The size of the reserve fund is determined by an engineering study known as a reserve study, where an outside professional assesses the current condition and projected future costs of common area assets. In Virginia, state law requires that reserve studies be updated at least once every five years. Broadlands hires an independent engineer to analyze the inventory of all items owned by the association, assess the condition of these items, estimate the remaining economic life and replacement cost of each asset, and develop a financial plan for the major repair and replacements of said items over the next forty years.

A copy of the most recent reserve study completed in fiscal year 2020 can be found in the online portal FirstService Connect. If you're unfamiliar with Connect, please check out https://broadlands.connectresident.com/ and set up your online account. This will give you access to your account history, the financial records of the association such as the monthly income and expense

statements, and other forms and the legal documents of the association. Having a solid reserve fund allows the board to maintain the community's property values and provide a

comfortable living experience for all homeowners. Reserve contributions in 2023 total \$726,417 of our annual budget, some of which are for private road maintenance, paid only by the units which they are served by. Contributions are made monthly into designated reserve accounts which are overseen by a wealth advisor and invested into laddered CD's that are FDIC insured. Once designated as such, reserve funds cannot be used for any other purpose. Per Article 7, Section 7.5 (a) Additions, Alterations, or Improvements by the Owners - "No person shall make any addition, alteration, or improvement in or to any Lot or any portion of the Property... which is visible from the exterior of the Lot or such portion of the Property, without the prior written consent of the Covenants Committee."

The Committee meets virtually at 7:00pm on the first and third Wednesdays of the month March-October and the third week of the month November-February. Applications must be submitted by noon on the Wednesday before the meeting by emailing them to rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or delivering them to the Nature Center drop box at 21907 Claiborne Parkway.

Once the Committee has reached a decision, the results will be delivered via email. If an email address is not provided, results will be mailed. Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidentally placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed, it notifies the HOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, that are not in compliance and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the seller's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement, then the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. Residents Must Apply for Tree Removal

It has been reported that tree companies are driving through Broadlands looking for trees to remove from resident properties claiming that their company was referenced on the HOA website as an approved company for executing tree removal. The HOA does not endorse or give blanket approval for tree removal companies. Approval is required to remove any tree either dead or alive whose trunk measures 4" or more in diameter when measured at the height of 4' from the ground. Please review the guidelines at broadlandshoa.org/design-guidelines. *Please be aware removing trees or underbrush from common areas is prohibited*.

Revised Deck Design Guidelines

All white or all black railings are allowed for townhouse decks. This includes the entire railing system such as the post, top and bottom rails and balusters.

• According to the deck design guidelines: A simple wood railing with 2" x 2" vertical baluster at the minimum height required by County Code is recommended. Composite railing systems or wood railing may include round or square metal vertical balusters of a minimum dimension of ½ inch without decorative elements. Railings shall be in wood tones or white. All white or all black railings are allowed. For two-tone railings, the balusters shall be black. Rail caps may match the deck boards or the primary railing color.

An Application is Required for Attached Housing Reroofing Projects

According to the new roofing design guidelines: "For attached houses (Townhouses/Overland Park/Villas) in order to maintain uniformity among attached housing, an application is required for all reroofing projects. Architectural shingles are allowed.

Patriot Disposal Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection Schedule

Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection:

- Place toters out the night before collection day after 6:00pm or before 6:00am the day of pick up.
- Containers should be out of sight by 9:00am on the day following collection.

Trash Collection:

• Trash pick up days are Mondays and Thursdays.

Recycling Collection:

- Recycling pick up day is Thursdays.
- Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- Plastic bags CANNOT be recycled. The Nature Center collects bags for proper recycling. Visit broadlandshoa.org, click on RESIDENTS then click on TRASH & RECYCLING for more information.
- Scrap metal Please call Patriot Disposal to set pick-up day 1-703-257-7100: i.e. foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.

Yard Waste Collection:

- Yard Waste Collection occurs on Mondays from March 1st through December 24th.
- During January & February, yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash. Yard waste may not be mixed with recycling.
- Grass clippings and leaves must be set out for pickup in lawn paper bags or in a bin.
- Brush must be less than 4 inches in diameter, cut into 4 foot lengths, and tied in small bundles or bagged.
- Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.

Special Pick-ups:

- Special items will be collected weekly. Some items may incur an additional charge.
- Special items include appliances, mid to large furniture and other large items.

In the last couple of months, Covenants has concentrated on neighborhood streetlights. Your neighbors will surely be out walking on these longer days and will appreciate all the light they can get as they tour our beautiful community. Please check your lamp post from time to time and make sure it remains in working order.

In addition, we would like to bring several items to your attention:

- with limited parking in some areas of our community, we find it necessary to remind our residents of parking issues that have been brought to our attention. Please be courteous of your neighbors by not parking within 10 feet of mailboxes and driveways, do not block sidewalks and crosswalks, do not park in fire lanes or within 20 feet of any intersection and finally, please keep your tags and inspection stickers up to date whether the vehicle is parked in your driveway or on the street. We do have a towing company that patrols our streets. They are authorized to tow vehicles for certain violations without notice.

- please secure your curbside trash. Usually the months of March and April bring some of our windier days. Please ensure the lids on your cans are down and any boxes and/or bags are secure.

On another note, we would like to thank all of our residents for the improvement we have seen in putting your trash cans and recycling containers away on non- trash days. This improvement has been remarkable.

Parking Violations

Complaints of Commercial Vehicles on VDOT Roads...There are many roads in Broadlands that are VDOT controlled.

The HOA does not have jurisdiction to enforce parking on VDOT roads. Commercial vehicles and/or trailers are not permitted to be parked on these streets. Verify which streets are VDOT maintained streets in Broadlands: broadlandshoa.org/broadlands-streets-ownership

Vehicles Parked Illegally...

Per Virginia Code 46.2.1239, vehicles parked or standing, whether attended or unattended on a road in front of a driveway; or within 15 feet of a fire hydrant; or within 15 feet of an intersection are considered illegally parked and may be ticketed and towed.

Scoop the Poop...

Residents frequently express concern that not every pet owner is taking the time to pick up their pet's waste in the neighborhood. Please ensure that your family members realize how important it is to be a responsible pet owner:

Pet poop is not organic, especially in the quantities that are generated by pets. It harms the environment and threatens public health.

Forgot your waste bag? No worries! The Broadlands HOA has over 80 mutt mitt stations to offer residents. Don't want to carry it with you? No problem, most of our mutt mitt stations have trash cans attached. Please be a good neighbor and do not dispose of pet waste in your neighbors' trash cans during your walks.

Even if your pet poops in the woods, you still need to clean it up. Not only is it unsightly, it can get into streams and into the water supply.

It's the law! Is it a violation of the Association Declaration, Article 8, Section 8.2(q) to not pick up your pet's waste, it is also a county ordinance violation. Please reference Loudoun County Ordinance, Chapter 612.19, Section a (9) Dog waste.



How At-Home Composting Can Reduce Our Impact on The Planet...

So, what is composting?

Composting is the natural process of recycling organic matter, such as food scraps, into a valuable fertilizer that can enrich soil and plants. Anything that grows decomposes eventually; composting simply speeds up the process by providing an ideal environment for bacteria, fungi, and other decomposing organisms (such as worms) to do their work.

The resulting decomposed matter ends up being rich garden soil and is called compost. Fondly referred to as "black gold," compost is dense in nutrients and highly sought after by local farmers, landscapers, and home gardeners alike!

What are the benefits of composting?

Food waste takes up more space in landfills than anything else. Composting your food scraps not only improves the structure and health of our soil by adding in organic matter, it also attracts beneficial organisms to the soil and reduces the need for pesticides and fertilizers. When compostable waste goes to a landfill, it gets buried under massive amounts of other trash, cutting off a regular supply of oxygen. This creates something called biogas, which is roughly 50 percent methane and 50 percent carbon dioxide - and highly toxic.

Composting In Loudoun County

Loudoun County is doing their best to support the growing composting movement and is currently in discussions to consider a pilot program that will let residents drop their food waste at the county landfill. One local company, Worm Works LLC, is utilizing the power of worms to keep food out of landfills by collecting residential and commercial food waste through a subscription service operating throughout Loudoun and Fairfax counties. What's more, they can even help turn weddings, graduation parties, and baby showers into "green events" by providing clean and easy composting solutions. Food scraps are collected curbside weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly, or can even be dropped off at convenient collection sites located throughout the county. The food waste is then composted locally at their facility at Gathering Springs Farm in Middleburg, Virginia. To date, they have diverted more than 70,000 pounds of food waste from local landfills since they began their services in 2020.

POOL PASS REGISTRATION OFFERED YEAR-ROUND!

Please follow the instructions below to set up electronic virtual passes for your household members. Registration is only done once, do not re-register in future seasons! Your electronic virtual passes will be active until your residency status changes.



STEP 1 - CREATE HOUSEHOLD ACCOUNT: Go to Cellbadge.com/Broadlands/register and under Initial

Add Request, enter the information as a primary resident to create your master household account. **Please enter street number** and name only, no suffix (i.e., Ct, Court, Ter, Terrace, etc.). Your add request will be forwarded to HOA staff who will validate your residency and account status. Please allow up to 3 business days for the initial approval to be processed. Once validated, you will receive a text/email indicating that your registration has been added but will remain pending until all 4 steps have been completed.

STEP 2 - ACQUIRE PIN: After you have received a text/email that your registration has been added, please return to the same registration page, and follow the instructions under **Enter or Update Household Members**. Enter your credentials to get your unique PIN via text/email to continue the process.

STEP 3 - ADD HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS: Enter PIN to access the **Household Members** page to add all household members, ages 5 and older. Be sure to select the appropriate "**Relation**" category when adding members:

- **Owners** select "Owner-xxx" for ALL household members regardless of age.
- Tenants select "Tenant-xxx" for ALL household members if owner does not live on property. Must have AOS/Lease on file.
- Apartment Renters select "Apartment-xxx" for all household members. Must <u>pay first</u> at www.broadlandshoa.org/pool.
- Nannies/Long-Term guests, select "Other-xxx" as applicable. Must pay first at www.broadlandshoa.org/pool.

Once finished, check the box to verify you have agreed to the facility terms and click **Complete Registration**. Upon approval (within 3 business days), you will receive a text/email indicating that *your Broadlands HOA registration has been accepted*, however, you must complete STEP 4 (pictures) to gain access to the pools.

STEP 4 - PICTURES: Email pictures of all household members aged 5 & up (adults must provide proof of residency):

- Email an *acceptable photo (jpg or png format) of each member in your household to pools@broadlandshoa.com. Copies of driver's license should be used for 18+ members. Recent copies of headshots may be used for children under 18.
- Subject line of email must be written as: "pool photos registered lastname" (i.e. pool photos Smith)
- Save and attach each photo separately to your email using naming convention: "address.firstname" (i.e. 42001Ridgeway.Susan).
- All member names must correspond with registered names in your Cellbadge pool account to allow for proper import. Pictures will be processed within 3 business days.

*What are acceptable photos and adult requirements?

- Adults 18 and over are <u>required</u> to show proof of residency with a **copy of a driver's license** showing the picture, address, name and date of birth. For security reasons, all other information can be crossed off. If the ID does not reflect the registered address, then settlement papers, utility bills or a change of address card may be emailed.
- o For children aged 5 and older, please email a <u>current</u> headshot or ID. Children aged 4 and under do not require photos.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

ACCESSING THE POOL: After photos are added and you received a confirmation email, access to our pools is simple since no physical pass is required – just check-in with the lifeguard by providing your name or address and they will be able to access your "virtual ID card" in the system to allow entrance. **Once registered, no further action is needed in future pool seasons.**

GUEST VISITS: 10 guest visits will be added to your household account each year at no charge. Additional guest visits can be purchased through our website at www.broadlandshoa.org/pool. Visits do not roll over to the next season. Only two (2) guests per are permitted or a maximum of six (6) per household at a time.

TENANTS: You must have a <u>current</u> **Absentee Owner Statement (AOS) and lease** on file with the HOA before registering. Please see information on our website under www.broadlandshoa.org/tenant-information.

APARTMENTS: Tenants of The Arbors and Van Metre Apartments must **purchase a household pool membership prior to registration** at broadlandshoa.org/pool-information.


