Nature Center Renovations

Built in 2002, the Nature Center was constructed to be a showcase for new home sales and to highlight the high-speed internet access that was still new to Loudoun County at the time, but a big selling point for the community. Over the years, the Nature Center evolved into a multipurpose facility, housing HOA office staff as well as a place our animals called home. The facility was built with only two private offices, a reception area, and a very tight workspace for four people. In an HOA the size of Broadlands, which was projected to be 3,792 units at buildout, this setup did not provide sufficient space for staffing of the community. The original building, while beautiful, was not very functional. The needs of the animals and the needs of the staff and homeowners to conduct business often conflicted. While soothing, the animals also created allergens and smells and noises that agitated human occupants and visitors. The animals attracted

many kids coming to the facility with parents, nannies, babysitters, and friends, and staff often found items dropped in the animal tanks that were hazardous to the

animals. The noise made by excited kids running over the bridge or shrieking at the sight of the animals made it difficult to conduct association business. At the end of the day, the building needs to function first as an office and not as a zoo.

As the facility aged, the wear and tear of the animals and associated traffic from visitors became more evident. An added challenge to animal ownership was that of providing seven day a week care for said animals. It was a struggle especially during holidays, vacations, or inclement weather. When Covid hit, the problem was exacerbated, and we were faced with the difficult decision to re-home our beloved animals so they could be provided the proper care and attention. Fortunately, we were extremely lucky to have a volunteer take in all the animals, and they now live happily on a farm in Culpeper.

Prior to Covid, the construction of a Clubhouse with a second staffing facility helped to alleviate some of the association's needs, but even with two private offices, it remained insufficient for our staffing requirements and storage needs. Between supplies for all the events, the stage for Broadlands Live, lot owner and management files, Flicks in the Sticks movie equipment, pool equipment, and more, we've been busting at the seams. So several years ago when discussing the rezoning of parcels and the intended annexation of additional units

into the community at Hillside and Demott & Silver, we worked with the Van Metre to ensure the contribution of additional funding to enhance our facilities and provide proper office and storage space. Although Van Metre has the right as the Declarant to annex in additional units without board or association approval, they provided annexation fees which would give us capital improvement funds to renovate the office space. Some of the fees were used to renovate the Southern Walk pool house and to construct the recreational pool at the Community Center, and the remaining funds afforded us the opportunity to renovate the Nature Center to include nine private offices, six additional workstations, as well as desperately needed storage space. While budgeted reserve funds for things like carpet replacement and bathroom updates will offset a small portion of the funding of the project, the majority is funded by these annexation fees and not by member

funds

Staff recently vacated the Nature Center and is temporarily relocated to the Clubhouse. Twenty (20) years of inventory and filing in the Nature

Center has been digitized, shredded, or temporarily stored. It is a big undertaking but desperately needed. Currently the entire staff has gotten cozy in the upstairs of the clubhouse with two people in a storage area, two private offices, and four people in a conference room. We anticipate the renovation will take several months and we look forward to getting back into our renovated home, organizing our storage areas, and expanding the staff to allow better service to the community. We plan to keep an element of nature by providing programming if it can be funded, staffed, and volunteered. We look forward to welcoming you back into the building once construction is complete.

Per Article 7, Section 7.5 (a) Additions, Alterations, or Improvements by the Owners - "No person shall make any addition, alteration, or improvement in or to any Lot or any portion of the Property... which is visible from the exterior of the Lot or such portion of the Property, without the prior written consent of the Covenants Committee."

If you are unsure if approval is required for your project, contact Robin Crews, Modifications/ Resale Manager at rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or 703-520-9902. The Committee meets virtually at 7:00pm on the first and third Wednesdays of the month March-October and the third week of the month November-February. If you wish to attend a meeting, contact Robin Crew, rcrews@broadlandshoa.com. Applications must be submitted by noon on the Wednesday before the meeting by emailing them to rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or delivering them to the Nature Center drop box at 21907 Claiborne Parkway.

Please review the Design Guidelines and submission requirements at broadlandshoa.org/design-guidelines. Failure to include all required information will delay review of your application. Once the Committee has reached a decision, the results will be delivered via email. If an email address is not provided, results will be mailed. Emails will be sent from no-reply@smartwebs365.com should you wish to add this email address to your contact list to ensure prompt delivery. Please check your inbox and junk/spam folders or contact the HOA office at 703-520-9902 if you have not received your results within 10 days following the meeting.

Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, fence/deck repair, any staining touch up, or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidentally placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer. Once the request has been executed, it notifies the HOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, that are not in compliance, and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the seller's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If the violations are not rectified before settlement, then the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. Summer Lawn Mowing Tips

Summer time is here and it's a good time to analyze your lawn mowing habits to ensure a healthy lawn through the potential drought and heat. When cutting your lawn, you want to think about mowing at a height of 3-4". The height in a healthy lawn will help suppress the amount of weeds in the lawn. It is important to remember not to cut more than 1/3 the length of the blade at a time. This can stress your lawn and a stressed lawn is not a happy lawn.

Don't Let Your Recycling Go Up in Flames!

Patriot Disposal Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection Schedule

Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection:

- Place toters out the night before collection day after 6:00pm or before 6:00am the day of pick up.
- Containers should be out of sight by 9:00am on the day following collection.

Trash Collection:

• Trash pick up days are Mondays and Thursdays.

Recycling Collection:

- Recycling pick up day is Thursdays.
- Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- Plastic bags CANNOT be recycled. The Nature Center collects bags for proper recycling. Visit broadlandshoa.org, click on RESIDENTS then click on TRASH & RECYCLING for more information.
- Scrap metal Please call Patriot Disposal to set pick-up day 1-703-257-7100: i.e. foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.

Yard Waste Collection:

- Yard Waste Collection occurs on Mondays from March 1st through December 24th.
- During January & February, yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash.
 Yard waste may not be mixed with recycling.
- Grass clippings and leaves must be set out for pickup in lawn paper bags or in a bin.
- Brush must be less than 4 inches in diameter, cut into 4 foot lengths, and tied in small bundles or bagged.
- Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.

Special Pick-ups:

- Please contact Patriot Disposal, 1-703-257-7100 or customerservice@patriotdisposalservices.com, to arrange pickup of special and/or bulk items.
- Special items will be collected weekly. Some items may incur an additional charge.
- Special items include appliances, mid to large furniture and other large items.

July Covenants Corner

The Covenants Department strives to find ways to communicate with our residents in a caring manner, creating partnerships rather than dictatorships. As such, we have implemented new violation procedures hoping to create a better experience for everyone involved.

Over the years, we have had many questions as to why we mailed printed violation letters rather than emailing or calling the homeowners concerning violation issues. We hear you and are acting based on your comments. Whenever a violation issue is noted on a property for the first time, a Friendly Reminder Notice is emailed directly to the homeowner (if we have your email address on file) with the violation attached. If no email is on file for the property, then a mailed letter must be sent. For second and third notices, both an email and a mailed letter are sent to the resident. Sending notices via email expedites the delivery process. The email also gives you an immediate vehicle to communicate with us to discuss the issue. The biggest problem we have with this system is that we do not have all of your email addresses. If you only receive a mailed letter for a violation and no email, that means we do not have your email address on file. *Please provide us with your email address at*: Covenants@broadlandshoa.com as soon as possible so we can update your records for any future covenants communications. Doing so will be greatly appreciated and a big help to make this system work.

Another change we have implemented is to issue a separate letter for every violation noted on a property. We have found that by setting up communication that way not only allows us to cite the correct reference from our governing documents, but also allows us to track each violation on an individual basis so we can close out violations that are resolved and, at the same time, monitor the ones that have yet to be resolved.

Lastly, homeowners frequently request recommendations for contractors. We cannot provide a list of contractors, however, we recommend you consider one of our advertisers or classifieds in this publication or visit our forums.

BROADLANDS POOLS REGISTRATION



Pool season runs May 27th - September 4th!

Please follow the instructions below to set up electronic virtual passes for your household members. Registration is only done once, do not re-register in future seasons! Your electronic virtual passes will be active until your residency status changes.



STEP 1 - CREATE HOUSEHOLD ACCOUNT: Go to Cellbadge.com/Broadlands/register and under Initial

Add Request, enter the information as a primary resident to create your master household account. Please enter street number and name only, no suffix (i.e., Ct, Court, Ter, Terrace, etc.). Your add request will be forwarded to HOA staff who will validate your residency and account status. Please allow up to 3 business days for the initial approval to be processed. Once validated, you will receive a text/email indicating that your registration has been added but will remain pending until all 4 steps have been completed.

STEP 2 – ACQUIRE PIN: After you have received a text/email that your registration has been added, please return to the same registration page, and follow the instructions under Enter or Update Household Members. Enter your credentials to get your unique PIN via text/email to continue the process.

STEP 3 - ADD HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS: Enter PIN to access the Household Members page to add all household members, ages 5 and older. Be sure to select the appropriate "Relation" category when adding members:

- Owners select "Owner-xxx" for ALL household members regardless of age.
- Tenants select "Tenant-xxx" for ALL household members if owner does not live on property. Must have AOS/Lease on file.
- Apartment Renters select "Apartment-xxx" for all household members. Must pay first at broadlandshoa.org/pool.
- Nannies/Long-Term guests, select "Other-xxx" as applicable. Must <u>pay first</u> at broadlandshoa.org/pool.

Once finished, check the box to verify you have agreed to the facility terms and click Complete Registration. Upon approval (within 3 business days), you will receive a text/email indicating that *your Broadlands HOA registration has been accepted*, however, you must complete STEP 4 (pictures) to gain access to the pools.

STEP 4 - PICTURES: Email pictures of all household members aged 5 & up (adults must provide proof of residency):

- Email an *acceptable photo (jpg or png format) of each member in your household to pools@broadlandshoa.com. Copies of driver's license should be used for 18+ members. Recent copies of headshots may be used for children under 18.
- Subject line of email must be written as: "pool photos registered lastname" (i.e. pool photos Smith)
- Save and attach each photo separately to your email using naming convention: "address.firstname" (i.e. 42001Ridgeway.Susan).
- All member names must correspond with registered names in your Cellbadge pool account to allow for proper import. Pictures will be processed within 3 business days.
 - *What are acceptable photos and adult requirements?
 - O Adults 18 and over are <u>required</u> to show proof of residency with a **copy of a driver's license** showing the picture, address, name and date of birth. For security reasons, all other information can be crossed off. If the ID does not reflect the registered address, then settlement papers, utility bills or a change of address card may be emailed.
 - o For children aged 5 and older, please email a <u>current</u> headshot or ID. Children aged 4 and under do not require photos.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

ACCESSING THE POOL: After photos are added and you received a confirmation email, access to our pools is simple since no physical pass is required – just check-in with the lifeguard by providing your name or address and they will be able to access your "virtual ID card" in the system to allow entrance. Once registered, no further action is needed in future pool seasons.

GUEST VISITS: 10 guest visits will be added to your household account each year at no charge. Additional guest visits can be purchased through our website at broadlandshoa.org/pool. Visits do not roll over to the next season. Only two (2) guests per member are permitted or a maximum of six (6) per household at a time.

TENANTS: You must have a <u>current</u> Absentee Owner Statement (AOS) and lease on file with the HOA before registering. Please see information on our website under broadlandshoa.org/tenant-information.

APARTMENTS: Tenants of The Arbors and Van Metre Apartments must purchase a household pool membership prior to registration at broadlandshoa.org/pool-information.

Keep Your Cool in Hot Weather!

Learn about heat-related illness and how to stay cool and safe in hot weather Sourced From: CDC - Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

High temperatures kill hundreds of people every year. Heat-related deaths and illness are preventable, yet more than 700 people die from extreme heat every year in the United States.

Take measures to stay cool, stay hydrated, and stay informed. Getting too hot can make you sick. You can become ill from the heat if your body can't compensate for it and properly cool you off.

The main things affecting your body's ability to cool itself during extremely hot weather are:

- High humidity. When the humidity is high, sweat won't evaporate as quickly. This keeps your body from releasing heat as fast as it may need to.
- Personal factors. Age, obesity, fever, dehydration, heart disease, mental illness, poor circulation, sunburn, and prescription drug and alcohol use all can play a role in whether a person can cool off enough in very hot weather.
- People aged 65 and older are at high risk for heat-related illnesses.

Those who are at highest risk include people 65 and older, children younger than two, and people with chronic diseases or mental illness.

Closely monitor people who depend on you for their care and ask these questions:

- Are they drinking enough water?
- Do they have access to air conditioning?
- Do they need help keeping cool?

People at greatest risk for heat-related illness can take the following protective actions to prevent illness or death:

- Stay in air-conditioned buildings as much as you can. Air-conditioning is the number one way to protect yourself against heat-related illness and death. If your home is not air-conditioned, reduce your risk for heat-related illness by spending time in public facilities that are air-conditioned and using air conditioning in vehicles. Contact your local health department or locate an air-conditioned shelter in your area.
- Do not rely on a fan as your main cooling device during an extreme heat event.
- Drink more water than usual and don't wait until you're thirsty to drink.
- Check on a friend or neighbor and have someone do the same for you.
- Limit use of the stove and oven—it will make you and your house hotter.

Even young and healthy people can get sick from the heat if they participate in strenuous physical activities during hot weather:

- Limit your outdoor activity, especially midday when the sun is hottest.
- Pace your activity. Start activities slowly and pick up the pace gradually.
- Drink more water than usual and don't wait until you're thirsty to drink more. Muscle cramping may be an early sign of heat-related illness.
- Wear loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing.

If you play a sport that practices during hot weather, protect yourself and look out for your teammates:

- Schedule workouts and practices earlier or later in the day when the temperature is cooler.
- Monitor a teammate's condition and have someone do the same for you.
- Seek medical care right away if you or a teammate has symptoms of heat-related illness.
- Learn more about how to protect young athletes from heat-related illness by taking this CDC course, cdc.gov

Everyone should take these steps to prevent heat-related illnesses, injuries, and death during hot weather:

- Stay in an air-conditioned indoor location as much as you can.
- Drink plenty of fluids even if you don't feel thirsty.
- Schedule outdoor activities carefully.
 - Wear loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing and sunscreen.
 - Pace yourself.
- Take cool showers or baths to cool down.
- Check on a friend or neighbor and have someone do the same for you.
- Never leave children or pets in cars.
- •Check the local news for health and safety updates.

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Nurturing Soft Skills: A Guide for Today's Teenagers Submitted By: Dr. Michael Oberschneider of Ashburn Psychological and Psychiatric Services

In our ever-evolving world, the emphasis on soft skills is increasing in all spheres of life. These personal attributes, which enable individuals to interact effectively, productively and harmoniously with others, are as valuable as technical skills -- for teenagers especially, soft skills lay the foundation for future success.

To understand how well developed your teen's soft skills are, ponder these questions. How well does your teen handle social situations? Is he or she polite and well-mannered? Does he or she treat others with respect? Is your teen an effective communicator? Is he or she a team player? How comfortable is your teen with being in a leadership role? Is your teen good natured, creative, adaptable and confident? Does your teen have integrity, and does he or she show interest in others?

If you answered yes to most of the above questions, your teen is likely developing adequate soft skills. If, however, you are less certain of your teen's soft skills, learning more about the following skills and tips may be helpful.

Patience is the ability to tolerate delay or difficulty without frustration. For example, a teenager learning to play a musical instrument might struggle initially. Instead of giving up, the teen who demonstrates patience will persist, understanding that mastery takes time. To cultivate patience, teenagers can practice mindfulness, engage in activities that require sustained effort, and learn to reframe challenges as opportunities for growth.

Teamwork involves working together to achieve a common goal. For instance, a group project at school requires students to divide tasks, cooperate, and communicate effectively. This fosters mutual respect, a consideration for other ideas and perspectives and a sense of belonging. Joining clubs, participating in team sports, or volunteering for community projects are excellent ways for teens to enhance their teamwork skills.

Effective Communication includes expressing oneself clearly, listening attentively, and interpreting non-verbal cues correctly. A teenager who can articulate their thoughts during a class presentation, listen to a friend's concerns empathetically, or perceive a teacher's non-verbal cues during a lecture, showcases effective communication. Public speaking, working, debating, and role-playing activities can help teens improve these skills.

Time Management refers to the efficient use of one's time. For example, a teenager balancing schoolwork, a part-time job, and extracurricular activities demonstrates effective time management. Teens can enhance these skills by setting clear goals, prioritizing tasks, and minimizing distractions.

Problem-Solving entails identifying an issue and devising an effective solution. For example, a teenager who notices a rise in bullying at school and initiates an awareness campaign shows problem-solving skills. Teens can enhance these abilities by adopting a proactive mindset, seeking diverse perspectives, and practicing reflection.

Leadership involves guiding and influencing others positively. For instance, a teenager who captains a sports team, leads a study group, or mentors a younger student exemplifies leadership. Leadership roles in school clubs, community service, and learning from inspiring role models can help nurture these skills.

Critical Thinking is the ability to analyze information objectively to make informed judgments. For example, a teenager who evaluates multiple sources of information for a

research paper displays critical thinking. Encouraging curiosity, promoting diverse viewpoints, and engaging in problem-based learning can foster critical thinking skills.

Organization involves maintaining order and efficiency in one's tasks and environments. For instance, a teenager who keeps a clean study space and systematically plans their study schedule shows organization skills. Keeping spaces tidy, maintaining a personal planner, and chunking large tasks into manageable pieces can help teens enhance their organizational skills.

Decision Making refers to selecting the best course of action from several alternatives. A teenager choosing to spend time studying for an important test instead of going to a party is demonstrating decision-making skills. Weighing pros and cons, seeking advice from trusted individuals, and reflecting on past experiences can help improve these skills.

Adaptability is the ability to adjust to changing conditions. A teenager who moves to a new city and manages to adjust to the new environment exhibits adaptability. Encouraging an open mindset, teaching stress management techniques, and providing diverse experiences can help foster adaptability.

Creativity goes beyond artistic expression—it's about innovative thinking and problem-solving. For instance, a teenager who devises an original science project or writes a unique short story showcases creativity. Brainstorming sessions, arts and crafts, and open-ended projects can help nurture creativity in teens.

Integrity means being honest and adhering to ethical principles consistently. A teenager who admits to a mistake instead of blaming others or who stands up against cheating in an examination demonstrates integrity. Parents, educators, and role models can instill integrity in teenagers through their actions and conversations, setting a positive example.

Manner's Matter. From "please" and "thank you," to opening the door for someone and greeting people respectfully; being polite, courteous and considerate of others will pay back in dividends for your teenager later in life. Using proper table manners when eating, asking permission, maintaining good eye contact when having a conversation, avoiding your phone when talking to someone, waiting your turn, apologizing when you have done something wrong and practicing good hygiene are some things parents can reinforce in the home for their teens. The Golden Rule: treat others the way you want to be treated, is a very helpful rule to follow in life.

In conclusion, soft skills equip teenagers with the necessary tools to navigate the complexities of life effectively. As we prepare our youth for the future, let us remember that these skills are as crucial as academic knowledge. The nurturing of these soft skills in teenagers paves the way for their personal growth, societal contribution, and professional success. Let us commit ourselves to foster these skills in our children and teens, and in doing so, ensure a promising future for our younger generations.

Above all, it's vital to remember that soft skills, like all other skills, require time and practice to develop. Teenagers should be encouraged to grow at their own pace, learning from their experiences, both successful and otherwise, and continually striving for personal improvement.
