## Understanding the Importance of an HOA Reserve Study and the Operating Budget Process

As we move into this fall season, it's a perfect time to reflect on the financial planning that keeps our community running smoothly and fiscally viable. Two critical components in managing our finances are the Reserve Study and the Operating Budget. Understanding these elements is essential for maintaining the long-term health and sustainability of our community.

#### What is a Reserve Study?

A Reserve Study is a comprehensive assessment that helps our association plan for future repairs and replacements of major common area components. This includes everything from roofing and HVAC systems to asphalt roads and trails and amenities like pools and playgrounds. The purpose of the study is to ensure that we have sufficient funds set aside to address these needs without placing an unexpected financial burden on residents, such as a Special Assessment.

#### Why is a Reserve Study Important?

- 1. **Financial Planning:** a Reserve Study provides a roadmap for future expenditures, helping us avoid sudden, large-scale financial demands on our community.
- 2. **Preventing Deferred Maintenance:** regular updates ensure that we address maintenance issues proactively rather than reactively.
- 3. **Protecting Property Values:** well-maintained common areas contribute to the overall attractiveness and value of our properties.
- 4. Meeting Legal Requirements: HOAs in Virginia are heavily regulated by state law, and as such are required to have a Reserve Study in place to ensure financial responsibility. Furthermore, we must (1) conduct at least once every five years a study to determine the necessity and amount of reserves required to repair, replace, and restore the capital components; (2) review the results of that study at least annually to determine if reserves are sufficient; and (3) make any adjustments to the annual budget and annual assessment the board of directors deems necessary to maintain reserves, as appropriate.

#### **How is a Reserve Study Updated?**

Updating the Reserve Study is a periodic process carried out at least every five years. Here's a brief overview of how it works:

- 1. **Assessment:** a professional reserve analyst inspects the community's common areas and evaluates the condition of major components.
- 2. **Financial Review:** the analyst reviews our current reserve fund balance, historical expenditures, and projected income.
- 3. **Projection:** based on the inspection and financial review, the analyst estimates the remaining useful life of components and the future costs for their repair or replacement.

- 4. **Update Report:** a detailed report is generated, including recommended funding levels and strategies for maintaining the reserve fund.
- 5. **Board Review and Approval:** the report is presented to the HOA Board for review and approval, and necessary adjustments are made to the budget as needed.

#### **The Operating Budget Process**

In addition to the Reserve Study, the Operating Budget is a crucial tool for managing our community's day-to-day expenses. Here's how the budgeting process unfolds:

- 1. **Budget Planning:** at the beginning of the process, management reviews past financial performance and forecasts future needs. This includes costs for utilities, landscaping, maintenance, and administrative expenses.
- 2. **Cost Estimation:** each line item in the budget is estimated based on previous expenditures and anticipated changes. This may involve obtaining quotes from vendors and adjusting for inflation or other factors.
- 3. **Drafting the Budget:** a draft budget is prepared by management, outlining all anticipated revenues and expenditures for the upcoming year.
- 4. **Review and Adjustment:** the draft budget is reviewed by the Board, and adjustments are made as necessary to align with our financial goals and the Reserve Study recommendations. Assessments are established based on the funding requirements.
- 5. **Approval:** once finalized, the budget is presented to the Board for approval at the November Board meeting.
  6. **Implementation and Monitoring:** after approval, the budget is distributed and implemented, and expenditures are monitored throughout the year to ensure adherence. Monthly financial reports keep the Board and residents informed about our financial status. Copies of these financials can be viewed on your FSRConnect resident portal.

Both the Reserve Study and Operating Budget are vital tools in ensuring the financial health and stability of our association. They help us anticipate future needs, manage current expenses, and ultimately maintain a vibrant and well-maintained community.

By staying informed about these processes and participating in our community's financial planning, you play a crucial role in sustaining the quality of life in our neighborhood. Per Article 7, Section 7.5 (a) Additions, Alterations, or Improvements by the Owners - "No person shall make any addition, alteration, or improvement in or to any Lot or any portion of the Property... which is visible from the exterior of the Lot or such portion of the Property, without the prior written consent of the Covenants Committee."

If you are unsure if approval is required for your project, contact Robin Crews, Modifications/
Resale Manager at rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or 703-520-9902. The Committee meets virtually at 7:00pm on the first and third Wednesdays of the month March-October and the third week of the month November-February. If you wish to attend a meeting, contact Robin Crew, rcrews@broadlandshoa. com. Applications must be submitted by noon on the Wednesday before the meeting by emailing them to rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or delivering them to the HOA Office drop box at 21907 Claiborne Parkway.

Please review the Design Guidelines and submission requirements at broadlandshoa.org/design-guidelines. Failure to include all required information will delay review of your application. Once the Committee has reached a decision, the results will be delivered via email. If an email address is not provided, results will be mailed. ## Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, deck/fence repair, fresh coat of paint or stain maintenance, mailbox unit repair, removal of any mildew, screen window repair or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidentally placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home, you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer.

Once the request has been executed, it notifies the HOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, that are not in compliance, and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the seller's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If any violations are not rectified before settlement, then the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. 



#### **Tree Care**

It's the time of year for tree care! Many trees in our neighborhood are aging poorly. Some trees have simply grown too large for their space (I'm looking at you, red maple trees in townhouse yards); others were planted too low in the ground with girdling roots stuck growing in circles the size of their nursery container (look at those London planetrees lean). Many have been mulched improperly or grown with turf grass underneath their branches. "Mulch volcanoes" and growing lawn grass under trees significantly impact a tree's ability to grow healthy and strong.

So what should you do if you have questions about trees under your care? Search treesaregood.org/findanarborist to find an International Society of Arboriculture-certified arborist to assess your tree's health. Follow their tree care advice and if removal is recommended, follow the Broadlands HOA modification guidelines for tree removal. Replace the old tree with a native tree appropriate for your site. See https://www.plantnovanatives.org/native-trees for help choosing a replacement tree for your specific needs and for planting advice.










Your attendance at this meeting is important. A quorum of 10% (113) of the eligible owners must be present, either in person or by a properly executed proxy, before any business can be conducted. You can also fax it to 703-591-5785 (Attn: Laura Marshall) no later than 12:00 p.m. on Monday, October 28, 2024. Sending proxies via email is strongly preferred.

#### **October Covenants Corner**

The Covenants Department hopes everyone had a nice summer. As we ease into fall, here are a few reminders from previous Covenants Corner columns:

- 1. To enhance the curb appeal of your home, you may wish to use weed killer on any weeds growing through the cracks or gaps in your driveways, leadwalks, sidewalks, aprons, curbs, and gutters adjacent to your property.
- 2. Battlefield Towing is contracted to patrol HOA-owned roads in our community. For certain safety violations, they will tow vehicles parked illegally without any warning. Reminders:
- a. No vehicles are to be parked blocking a fire hydrant or along a yellow curb designated as a fire lane. Fire lanes are designated by the fire marshal's office to allow emergency responders to access properties and fire hydrants in case of emergencies.
- b. No vehicles can block a sidewalk or ramp including parking on the sidewalk while in your driveway. This allows for walkers, handicapped persons, and strollers to safely navigate the area without having to go into the roadway.
- c. All other violations such as expired tags, parking within 20 feet of an intersection, abandoned vehicles, etc. may be issued a warning, ticketed by LCSO, and eventually towed.
- d. If you live on a VDOT street, please note that we do not have enforcement power for VDOT streets. Therefore, please report all illegally parked vehicles to the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office by calling their non-emergency line at 703-777-1021. You can also complete a traffic complaint form online at https://lfportal.loudoun.gov/Forms/TrafficComplaint.
- e. If you need additional information regarding parking rules and regulations, please review the Parking Regulations and Enforcement Procedures under the Rules and Regulations section on our website, https://www.broadlandshoa.org/for-residents/rules-and-regulations/.
- 3. Please inspect, repair and paint your mailbox if needed, ensure all parts are in working order, and address numbers are visible. It is important to note that each section has an established standard style and color. If your mailbox is a different color than what is standard for your section, you will either need to apply for the change, or have your mailbox painted and restored to the standard for your area. If you are unsure as to what your neighborhood's mailbox standard is, please contact the Covenants Department at 703-520-9903.
- 4. Please ensure that your exterior pole light is in good condition, painted, and all bulbs are in working order. The pole light should come on automatically in the evening to help illuminate your community for safety and aesthetics.

Thank you to all the community residents who have worked hard to improve and maintain their homes this summer. Your efforts are an inspiration to us all.

#### Patriot Disposal Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection Schedule

#### Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection:

- Place toters out the night before collection day after 6:00pm or before 6:00am the day of pick up.
- Containers should be out of sight by 9:00am on the day following collection.

#### **Trash Collection:**

Trash pick up days are Mondays and Thursdays.

#### **Recycling Collection:**

- Recycling pick up day is Thursdays.
- Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- Plastic bags CANNOT be recycled.
- Scrap metal Please call Patriot Disposal to set pickup day 1-703-257-7100: i.e. foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.

#### **Yard Waste Collection:**

- Yard Waste Collection occurs on Mondays from March 1st through December 24th.
- During January & February, yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash. Yard waste may not be mixed with recycling.
- Grass clippings and leaves must be set out for pickup in lawn paper bags or in a bin.
- Brush must be less than 4 inches in diameter, cut into 4 foot lengths, and tied in small bundles or bagged.
- Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.

#### **Special Pick-ups:**

- Please contact Patriot Disposal, 1-703-257-7100 or customerservice@patriotdisposalservices.com, to arrange pickup of special and/or bulk items.
- Special items will be collected weekly. Some items may incur an additional charge.
- Special items include appliances, mid to large furniture and other large items.

 If trash totes/cans are stored in public view outside of these times, you may receive violation notices and, if it continues, you may be called to a Hearing before the Board of Directors.



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## Project Lifesaver Offers Peace of Mind For Those You Love

#### Loudoun County Sheriff's Office Program helps quickly locate individuals with Alzheimer's, Autism, and Down Syndrome

"Nationwide, Project Lifesaver has a 100% success rate... and an average recovery time of less than 30 minutes."



The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) partners with Project Lifesaver International to help protect and quickly locate individuals with Alzheimer's, dementia, autism, Down syndrome, or other related disorders who are at risk of wandering and becoming lost.

Project Lifesaver equips vulnerable individuals with a personalized radio transmitter about the size of a wristwatch. The transmitter emits a specific radio frequency 24 hours a day that can be located by specially trained deputies using directional antennas. The signal can be triangulated on the ground for up to a mile and from the air for up to 10 miles.

Nationwide, Project Lifesaver has a 100% success rate with over 4,353 rescues and an average recovery time of less than 30 minutes. This is critical, as over 32,000 people wander from homes and care facilities each year, according to the National Alzheimer's Association.

The LCSO began using the Project Lifesaver program in 2008, and Master Deputy Daniel Martynowicz and Deputy First Class Kelsey Long lead the team. They regularly meet with potential beneficiaries and caregivers to identify individuals at increased risk of wandering off and determine eligibility. The team assists in obtaining necessary equipment and services and conducts bimonthly check-ins to ensure current information and equipment work properly.

They also provide community education and awareness programs to inform the public about the challenges of wandering and the Project Lifesaver solution. The program relies on partnerships

between law enforcement, community organizations, businesses, and caregivers. All client and family information is kept strictly confidential and only used in emergencies.

Tax-deductible donations can be made to Project Lifesaver International and designated for the LCSO program and Loudoun County. 

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
