Projects and Budget

Fall is always a vibrant and bustling season in Broadlands. With the return to school, a full slate of sports and extracurricular activities, travel plans, and preparations for the many upcoming holidays—including Thanksgiving, Saint Lucia Day, Winter Solstice, Christmas, Kwanzaa, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day, Three Kings Day, and Chinese New Year—our community is full of energy and movement.

The shorter days mean we're all trying to make the most of the daylight hours, and your HOA office is no exception. While the pools have long since been closed and winterized, and the long summer evenings filled with concerts and outdoor movies have given way to crisp, cool nights, our team remains hard at work behind the scenes. Fall is a time of transition, and we're busy with seasonal events, property inspections, facility rentals, and a variety of special projects that help keep Broadlands beautiful and running smoothly.

One major focus this season has been our extensive trail system. With miles of pathways winding through our community, regular maintenance is essential. This year, several sections were milled and overlayed in accordance with the reserve schedule to address damage caused by tree root intrusion, ground settling, drainage, and asphalt age and shrinkage. These repairs ensure safe and enjoyable access for walkers, runners, and cyclists alike.

Another significant project underway is the total renovation of the Claiborne tennis courts. These courts have served our community well over the years, and this renovation will ensure they continue to do so for years to come. The scope of work includes completely replacing the base, drainage improvements, new surfacing, and updated fencing and amenities to enhance both functionality and aesthetics. We're excited to bring this upgrade to our residents and appreciate your patience as we complete the work.

Fall also brings budget season. The board and management work diligently to prepare

a comprehensive and accurate budget for the upcoming year. This process involves evaluating projected utility costs across our facilities, assessing current and future maintenance needs, and planning for both operational and capital improvement projects. We also factor in broader economic trends, including increases in minimum wage, fuel and vehicle costs, labor and parts shortages, and inflation—all of which impact the expenses.

The association is committed to identifying cost-saving opportunities and maximizing the value of every dollar spent. The Board takes its fiduciary responsibility seriously and thoroughly reviews all budget details to ensure we are protecting your most valuable asset: your home. Though the budget process spans several months and requires careful planning and research, the end result is a financial plan designed to meet the needs of our community while remaining fiscally responsible.

As we prepare for the colder months ahead, I encourage you to take a moment to enjoy the beauty of the season—whether it's a walk through the colorful trails, a quiet evening under the clear autumn sky, or time spent with loved ones during the holidays. What can I recycle through this program?

Where do I drop off?

The drop off bins are located in a shed behind the Administrative Office located at 21907 Claiborne Parkway. Look for the shed on the tennis court side, adjacent to the trash corral. The bins are specifically labeled - please put your items into the correct bin and close the lids when you have dropped off your items.

This recycling program will be run maintained by community members. If you are interested in volunteering, please reach out to BroadlandsTerracycle@gmail.com.



Teen volunteers can earn service hours by checking drop-off bins, tidying the area, boxing labeling boxes, and taking them to the post office.

Feeling Political?

Per Broadlands guidelines no more than three political campaign election signs are allowed and each sign shall not exceed a maximum of four (4) square feet. These signs may be placed no more than 60 days prior to an election date and must be removed 5 days following the election. No application is required for these signs.

HOA Flag Collection Drop Off

With the support of the Ashburn American Legion Leonard W. Kidd Memorial Post, your community provides a flag collection site at the HOA office located at 21907 Claiborne Parkway. The drop-off bin is situated to the right of the lobby. You can drop off flags during normal business hours, typically Monday to Friday, between 9:00am and 5:00pm.

An Application is Required for Exterior Light Fixtures

Approval is required for any lighting fixtures or replacements that differ in style, size or color from the original builder installed fixtures.

According to the lighting design guidelines: "All exterior lighting fixtures on the same elevation of the house must be of similar style, size and color." For example, front door fixtures, garage door fixtures including the pole light fixture must all match in style, size and color.

Please Keep Common Areas Clean

Under Article 8, Section 8.2: (e) of the Declarations, "No person shall place or cause or permit anything to be placed on or in any of the Common Area. Nothing shall be altered or constructed in or removed from the Common Area..."

- Please do not leave any personal items or items not intended by the HOA in the common areas. Our landscapers have been directed to remove and discard debris of all kinds from the common areas, including forts. If any items are removed by the HOA they cannot be recovered.
- Additionally, do not discard any yard debris in the common areas such as leaves, branches, grass clippings, etc. You will be responsible to remove any yard debris if placed in the common area.
- Do not dump rubbish, waste matter, refuse, garbage, trash, dead animals, or other debris of any kind. You will be responsible to remove any debris if placed in the common area.

Modified Trash & Recycling Collection Schedule During 2025-2026 Holidays

- Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, November 27th: No services will be provided. All Services will be moved to Friday, November 28th.
- Christmas Day, Thursday, December 25th: No services will be provided. All Services will be moved to Friday, December 26th.
- New Year's Day, Thursday, January 1st: No services will be provided. All Services will be moved to Friday, January 2nd.

Christmas Tree Collection:

- Christmas trees will be collected during the first full 2 weeks of January (January 5th and January 12th) on your yard waste collection day.
- All tinsel and decorations must be removed, and trees should not be placed in plastic bags.
- If a tree is placed curbside for collection on yard waste collection day and is not picked up, please advise residents to LEAVE IT OUT at the curb and collection will be completed as soon as possible.

Patriot Disposal Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection Schedule

Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Collection:

- Place toters out the night before collection day after 6:00pm or before 6:00am the day of pick up.
- Containers should be out of sight by 9:00am on the day following collection.

Trash Collection:

• Trash pick up days are Mondays and Thursdays.

Recycling Collection:

- Recycling pick up day is Thursdays.
- Recyclable materials can be co-mingled.
- Plastic bags CANNOT be recycled.
- Scrap metal Please call Patriot Disposal to set pick-u day 1-703-257-7100: i.e. foil, pie tins, trays, pots and pans, small car parts, grills, bicycles, swings, etc.

Yard Waste Collection:

- Yard Waste Collection occurs on Mondays from March 1st through December 24th.
- During January & February, yard debris (leaves, grass clippings, brush) may be mixed with trash.
 Yard waste may not be mixed with recycling.
- Grass clippings and leaves must be set out for pickup in lawn paper bags or in a bin.
- Brush must be less than 4 inches in diameter, cut into 4 foot lengths, and tied in small bundles or bagged.
- Food waste mixed in with yard waste will be accepted, as it can be composted.

Special/Bulk Pick-ups:

- Please contact Patriot Disposal, 1-703-257-7100 or customerservice@patriotdisposalservices. com, to arrange pickup of special and/or bulk items.
- Special items will be collected weekly. Some items may incur an additional charge.
- Special items include appliances, mid to large furniture and other large items.

Trash Totes/Cans Notice:

 If trash totes/cans are stored in public view outside of these times, you may receive violation notices and, if it continues, you may be called to a Hearing before the Board of Directors.

Modifications Information

Per Article 7, Section 7.5 (a) Additions, Alterations, or Improvements by the Owners - "No person shall make any addition, alteration, or improvement in or to any Lot or any portion of the Property... which is visible from the exterior of the Lot or such portion of the Property, without the prior written consent of the Covenants Committee."

If you are unsure if approval is required for your project, contact Robin Crews, Modifications/ Resale Manager at rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or 703-520-9902. The Committee meets virtually at 7:00pm on the first and third Wednesdays of the month March-October and the third week of the month November-February. If you wish to attend a meeting, contact Robin Crew, rcrews@broadlandshoa.com. Applications must be submitted by noon on the Wednesday before the meeting by emailing them to rcrews@broadlandshoa.com or delivering them to the HOA Office drop box at 21907 Claiborne Parkway.

Please review the Design Guidelines and submission requirements at broadlandshoa.org/ design-guidelines. Failure to include all required information will delay review of your application. Once the Committee has reached a decision, the results will be delivered via email. If an email address is not provided, results will be mailed. Emails will be sent from no-reply@smartwebs365.com should you wish to add this email address to your contact list to ensure prompt delivery. Please check your inbox and junk/spam folders or contact the HOA office at 703-520-9902 if you have not received your results within 10 days

Are You Selling Your Home?

Save yourself time and aggravation by ensuring you have approved applications for all exterior changes or additions made on your property before listing your home. Walk around your home and look for any maintenance violations such as siding repair, exterior trim maintenance, deck/fence repair, fresh coat of paint or stain maintenance, mailbox unit repair, removal of any mildew, screen window repair or roof repair. Refer to your property plat to locate your property lines because you may have accidentally placed something in the common area that will need to be removed before settlement.

When you sell your home, you are required to request a resale disclosure package for the buyer.

Once the request has been executed, it notifies the HOA to come to your property to perform a resale inspection. The inspectors will look for any structures that have not been approved by the Modifications Subcommittee, that are not in compliance, and for maintenance violations. The results of the resale inspection are embedded in the resale disclosure package that is provided for the buyer. It is the seller's responsibility to rectify all violations found on the property before settlement of the home. If any violations are not rectified before settlement, then the new owner will be responsible.

There are submission procedures on the HOA website, broadlandshoa.org, to help guide you through the application process. Please refer to the online Design Guidelines for detailed information.

The Design Guidelines provide a framework to maintain design quality and encourage consistency throughout the community. November Covenants Corner

We hope that everyone had a safe and happy summer. Now, as we ease into the fall and winter months, we have a few reminders for issues that may need to be brought to your attention:

Yard Debris:

• Please bag all your leaves and yard debris and dispose of them on yard recycling day, which is only on Mondays. Do not leave them in common areas or rake them into the street. Instead, please bag them or place them in a toter labeled yard waste and place them in front of your property after 5:00 PM on Sunday, the evening before the designated recycling day. We do not provide a service for picking up loose leaves from the street.

Sidewalk

• Each homeowner is responsible for maintaining their own sidewalks by ensuring that all snow and ice are removed to keep children and residents safe. If you have a school bus stop on your property, please remove the snow in the area where the children must stand so that they do not stand in the street.

Vehicles:

- All vehicle issues on VDOT streets must be reported to the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office by calling their nonemergency line at 703-777-1021. The HOA has no authority to enforce on a VDOT street.
- Battlefield Towing patrols our community streets during off-hours. They are authorized to tow only vehicles that are parked illegally. This includes vehicles blocking a fire hydrant, parked along a yellow curb designated as a fire lane, or obstructing a sidewalk. No vehicle should be parked in a way that blocks a sidewalk, including those parked in driveways.
- The HOA monitors all other vehicle parking issues on the HOA streets. Please contact the HOA during the hours of 9:00am to 5:00pm at 703-729-9704, option 2, or email covenants@broadlandshoa.com to report any parking issues. We will be glad to help you. If you need any additional information regarding our parking rules and regulations, please refer to the Broadlands HOA website

Safety Issues:

- We suggest you mount and maintain house numbers on your home and mailbox for all emergency vehicles.
- We will begin the night inspections for your pole lights in November. Please make sure your pole lights are in working order. Many of your neighbors walk during the evening hours and need to be able to see where they are walking. The light should come on automatically at dusk and off at dawn. If it does not work, it could be either the bulb, the dusk-to-dawn sensor, or the GFI switch that needs to be reset. Please contact the Covenants Department at

HOME CHECKLIST

Clean and Keep Free of Mildew/Build-Up:

- ☐ Siding
- \square Basement walk-ups and surrounding areas
- ☐ Front stairs and sidewalks
- ☐ Decks, fences, sheds

Damaged Exterior Trim/Rotting Wood

- \square Trim around doors, windows, garage & corners
- \square Roof line (fascia and rake boards) trim and wrap
- ☐ Soffits are properly secured
- ☐ Windows (dormer, bay, etc.)
- ☐ Bump-out areas
- ☐ Porches, decks, sheds
- ☐ Mailbox post

Fresh Coat of Paint/Stain

A fresh coat should be uniform and consistent in appearance. Application is required for color changes or new stains.

- ☐ Trim (exterior trim should have a consistent color throughout)
- ☐ Shutters, front doors, railings
- ☐ Fences, sheds, trash enclosures
- ☐ Mailbox post

Repair & Replace

- ☐ Falling/damaged lattice on decks and fences
- ☐ Fence/gate repairs such as warped, cracked, missing, and peeled (splintered) boards, including top rails

Home Exterior

- ☐ Missing shutters
- ☐ Loose siding or wrapped trim
- ☐ Crooked, missing, and broken light fixtures
- ☐ Damaged mailboxes (i.e. rusted, missing flags)
- ☐ Trash and recycling containers stored out of sight
- ☐ Garage doors in good condition (i.e. no dents/broken panels)

Landscaping

- ☐ Neat appearance of the lawn, free of weeds, and edged
- ☐ Landscape beds free of weeds, fresh mulch applied (no red)
- ☐ Bags of mulch, dirt, etc. properly stored out of view
- ☐ Remove dead bushes and trees (may need approval)

Exterior Modifications

The following items require approval from the Modifications Subcommittee before starting these projects. This list includes common projects but is **not a complete list** of all projects needing approval:

- ☐ Decks, fences, sheds, trash enclosures
- ☐ Paint/stain color changes
- ☐ Addition of storm/screen doors
- ☐ Play equipment, including trampolines and basketball goals
- ☐ Changes to light fixtures if style/color/size are not the same as the originally installed fixtures
- ☐ Patios, walkways, retaining walls, pools
- ☐ Addition of lattice/privacy screens and change in building materials



The renovation project for the Claiborne Tennis Courts is nearing completion. Since September, the light bases surrounding the courts have been reset and properly cemented to ensure stability and prevent sagging due to soft soil. Additionally, fencing has been installed to enclose the walkway between Courts 2 and 3, along with a gate for easier access to the tennis courts. The walkway has also been paved with asphalt, replacing the previous grass surface. The final phase of the project, which involves adding the new court colors and lines, is scheduled to be completed in Spring 2026. In the meantime, temporary lines will be painted on the courts to allow for usage throughout the winter.

In the interim, all tennis programming will be held at the Rickenbacker tennis court and pickleball programming will be held at the Stonehouse courts. With the court construction in progress, there are temporary restrictions for booking. Please refer to the updated policies listed in Court Reserve. When Your Child or Teen May Need Help from a Mental Health Professional

Seeking mental health services can be overwhelming and stressful for anyone, but when it comes to your child or adolescent, the stakes may seem higher, and the process can feel even more daunting. From recognizing when help is needed, navigating insurance, choosing the right provider, and deciding on the appropriate services, to having the conversation with your child and fitting everything into a busy schedule, it can seem like an uphill battle. This article walks you through the first crucial step: identifying when psychological services might be beneficial for your child or adolescent. You're not alone—help is available, and early intervention is key.

Research consistently shows that early mental health awareness for children and adolescents is essential. Studies highlight the positive impact early interventions can have on long-term outcomes. Identifying mental health concerns early allows caregivers, teachers, and healthcare professionals to take action before problems escalate, potentially preventing more severe challenges later in life.

Warning Signs and Symptoms

Recognizing when your child might need support from a licensed mental health provider can be tricky. However, certain behavioral changes or symptoms are indicators that extra help could be necessary. These signs often point to a significant shift in a child's typical behavior or functioning, and they may be affecting multiple areas of their life, such as school performance, home dynamics, or self-esteem. Below are some common warning signs to watch for. Note that these signs are not listed in order of significance, and looking for patterns or a combination of symptoms over time is important.

1. Mood Changes

Rapid or intense mood swings—shifting from happiness to sadness, irritability, or anger—can be red flags. Watch for withdrawal from activities your child once enjoyed. Mood changes can also be tied to sleep and attention issues, such as difficulty staying awake or feeling excessively tired.

2. Attention and Focus Issues

Difficulty concentrating, excessive distractibility, restlessness, or trouble completing tasks can indicate an underlying concern. Notice if your child is struggling to focus on schoolwork, follow through on multistep tasks, or engage in activities that require sustained attention.

3. Sleep Disturbances

Problems with sleep—whether it's trouble falling asleep, staying asleep, or sleeping excessively—can be linked to emotional distress or broader mental health concerns.

4. Changes in Eating Habits

Significant changes in eating patterns—such as eating less or withdrawing from meals, or conversely, overeating—can potentially suggest mental health struggles. Likewise, rapid or excessive weight changes may indicate a need for intervention.

5. Physical Complaints

Physical symptoms, such as headaches, stomach aches, dizziness, chest pain, or muscle tension can sometimes be the body's way of expressing emotional pain or distress. These symptoms should not be ignored, as they can be

linked to internalizing mental health problems.

6. Behavioral Concerns

Aggressive behavior, defiance of rules, tantrums, or disruptive conduct are behaviors that likely require attention. Social withdrawal or isolation, difficulty maintaining relationships, or avoiding social situations can also be significant indicators. In some cases, behavioral regression (e.g., a child reverting to earlier stages of development like bedwetting or thumb-sucking) can indicate severe distress. In children, this can commonly look like tantrums, increased clinginess, baby talk, bedwetting, thumb-sucking, or difficulty sleeping or eating. Adolescents may also revert to bedwetting, finger and thumb-sucking, or language regression, as well as increased dependence on caregivers and decreased independence.

7. Academic or School Performance Issues

Changes in academic performance—declining grades, missing school, or lack of participation are important to note. Keep an eye out for a loss of interest in school or social activities as well.

8. Risky Behaviors

Increased substance use, risky sexual behaviors, or expressions of self-harm or thoughts of death are notable and serious warning signs. Any talk or behaviors related to harming oneself or others should be taken seriously and addressed immediately.

The Role of Parents and Caregivers in Identifying Mental Health Needs

The earlier you seek help, the better the outcome for your child. Early intervention can prevent minor concerns from growing into more serious mental health problems. It can also foster healthy long-term habits, improve academic performance, strengthen social skills, and provide support for the entire family unit. Parents are often the first to notice when something is wrong. They are in the best position to observe changes in behavior, mood, and functioning. Other trusted adults involved in your child's life—such as teachers, coaches, and close family members can also offer valuable perspectives on your child's wellbeing across different settings. Trust your instincts. If something doesn't feel right, don't ignore your intuition, and instead seek professional help. You don't need to wait for things to get worse before taking action. Licensed mental health professionals are rigorously trained to assess and address these concerns, and seeking help early can lead to better outcomes for your child and your own peace of

Seeking psychological services is an important step in supporting your child's well-being. While it may feel like a challenging process, remember that help is available, and you're not alone. Early identification of mental health concerns, followed by the appropriate intervention, can significantly improve your child's mental health, resilience, and overall quality of life. Tips for Safe Nighttime Driving

Driving at night can be tricky—especially through neighborhoods or dimly lit landscapes—so it's important to keep in mind a few basic guidelines to make sure you and your vehicle are both well-prepared for the trip. Consider the following suggestions to help you get to your destination safely.

Ensure Headlights Are Aimed Properly

If you think your headlights are casting light too far above or below your line of vision on the road, you may need to adjust their aim. You can do this either by following instructions in your vehicle owner's manual or seeking help from a vehicle maintenance professional.

Dim Dashboard Lights

Most vehicle makes and models come with a dimmer for the instrument panel. Make sure it's set to the lowest brightness to limit distraction. Also, turn off overhead or visor lights while driving, which can also limit visibility at night.

Beware of Tinted Glasses

Yellow lenses sold to enhance nighttime driving could actually decrease visibility instead of amplify colors and objects. If you wear prescription lenses, opt for an anti-reflective coating and clean them thoroughly and frequently to optimize effectiveness at night.

Learn How to Spot Animals and Objects

While driving at night, be on the lookout for wildlife creatures' eyes, which can easily be spotted as pairs of glowing retinas. Animals' eyes—like raccoons or deer—typically will reflect the light from your headlights long before their true shapes come into view.

Don't Focus on Headlights in Oncoming Traffic

Keep your eyes on the road in front of you and avoid looking into the headlights of oncoming traffic—especially if you notice a car using the high-beam headlight setting. If the headlights on the car behind you cause a glare in your rearview mirror, adjust the mirror.

Clean Your Windshield

Use a clean microfiber cloth or newspaper to clean the windshield—inside and out. Make sure the windshield is free of streaks and smudges before driving at night, and try to avoid wiping window condensation with your hands. Fingerprints and oils from your skin can cause streaks that limit visibility in the dark.

Know When to Use Your Fog Lights

Many vehicles come equipped with fog lights, which typically are located underneath the front headlights and are aimed low, where fog usually appears on the road. Fog lights can also be useful on a particularly dark road to further illuminate your path.

Adjust Your Exterior Mirrors

Pointing your side-view mirrors down slightly can help reduce glare from other drivers' headlights and still allow you to see by tipping your head forward a few inches.

Have Your Eyes Checked

Your ability to scan the landscape while driving at night is crucial for safety, rather than concentrating on just one spot.. Visit your eye doctor for regular checkups to determine whether prescription lenses could help you see better at night.



VDOT News

With the school year underway and daylight hours shortening, pedestrians face an increased risk, so the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) is reminding everyone to be extra cautious and alert and follow the rules of the road so everyone reaches their destination safely.

Pedestrians are among the most at-risk road users because they lack the protection of a vehicle. Crashes involving pedestrians have continued to climb in Virginia over the last several years, increasing 43% between 2020 and 2024. In the last decade, there were more than 39,000 crashes involving pedestrians, and more than 1,300 pedestrians died.

About 45% of pedestrian fatalities occur at or within 150 feet of an intersection. Of those, 75% are people crossing the roadway, and 70% occurred during darkness. Of the 55% of fatalities between intersections, 40% are people crossing, and 80% occurred when dark.

Marked crosswalks are intended to provide pedestrians with a visible and detectable place to cross the road. Most crosswalks are at intersections with stop signs or traffic signals and may have supplemental pedestrian signing; however, crosswalks may also be installed between intersections. Drivers most expect to see pedestrians on the road within intersections and midblock crosswalks.

Pedestrians may decide to cross mid-block rather than walk to the nearest intersection or marked crosswalk to get across the street for a variety of reasons, including speed limit, the number of lanes, traffic conditions, and how much time would be saved by crossing between intersections, according to research done by Old Dominion University and funded by VDOT's Virginia Transportation Research Council. The council published a study last year examining the factors influencing pedestrian decisions to cross at mid-block locations without a marked crosswalk and identifying potential countermeasures to enhance pedestrian safety.

Given the increasing number of severe pedestrian crashes, with many involving people crossing the roadway, VDOT has focused dedicated federal and state safety funding on upgrading signalized intersections to provide crosswalks, adding crosswalks at stop-controlled intersections and mid-block locations with a tendency for people to cross. Where needed, median refuge islands and curb ramps are included in those projects. Other construction funding sources are providing new pedestrian and bicyclist facilities, traffic calming and intersection enhancements for pedestrian safety.

VDOT has a few reminders for pedestrians and motorists to help everyone get where they're going safely.

If You're Driving:

- Anticipate pedestrians at intersections and mid-block marked crosswalks.
- Stop and yield for pedestrians in crosswalks.
- When turning, your line of sight may be obstructed, so look multiple times in all directions to yield the right of way to pedestrians.
- Put your phone away and pay attention so you're alert if pedestrians enter your path.
- Follow the posted speed limit and adjust to traffic and weather conditions.
- Be cautious when passing stopped buses or other vehicles that can block your view of pedestrians who may enter the roadway.

If You're Walking:

- Cross the street at intersections or crosswalks, where drivers are most expected to see pedestrians. Follow the pedestrian signal instructions, and look left, right, and then left again before crossing. If the pedestrian signal is flashing DON'T WALK, do not enter the crosswalk, as the message allows enough time for people already in the crosswalk to complete their crossing.
 Make eye contact with drivers before crossing the street to ensure the driver
- is aware of you.

 Use sidewalks or paths, and if there isn't one, walk on the left side of the road facing oncoming traffic as far from traffic as possible.
- When walking, keep your eyes on the road, be aware of traffic, and listen for any vehicles. Minimize the time spent on electronic devices and ensure that the volume is kept low.
- Dress to be seen. Especially at night; don't wear dark clothing and use reflective materials and a light when feasible.
